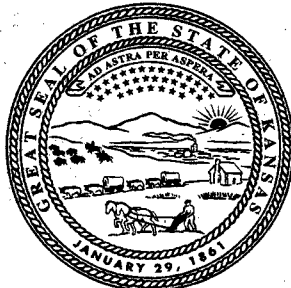

Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted at 3 p.m. Friday, October 13, in the conference room, 3601 S.W. 29th, Topeka, to consider the adoption of a proposed addition to the existing rules and regulations of the Kansas Dental Board.

The period prior to the public hearing will permit a time for written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Kansas Dental Board, 3601 S.W. 29th, Suite 134, Topeka, 66614. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

The regulations, proposed for adoption on a permanent basis, are submitted by the Kansas Dental Board under its general rule making power and are not mandated by federal law. A summary of the proposed regulations and economic impact follows.

K.A.R. Article 5, Qualifications and requirements for the use of sedative and general anaesthesia agents: 71-5-1, definition of terms; 71-5-2, Level I and Level II permits, scope of treatment permitted; 71-5-3, Level I permit educational and facility requirements; 71-5-4, Level II permit educational and facility requirements; 71-5-5, Level I and Level II permits, general requirements and procedures; and 71-5-6, Level I and II permits cause for revocation, suspension or limitation.

The regulations will require inspection and may involve testing by the board's inspector. Increased scheduling and record keeping will be required by the board. Additional cost impact for most dental offices currently using sedative and general anaesthesia should be minimal.

Environmental Protection Agency**Request for Comments on Hazardous Waste Emission Test Burn**

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Region 7, 726 Minnesota Ave., Kansas City, Kansas, is seeking public comment on the trial burn for the Lafarge Corporation Plant in Fredonia, Kansas, in connection with the hazardous waste permit application review process.

The Lafarge Corporation owns and operates a cement plant on Cement Plant Road in Fredonia. Two wet process rotary kilns at this facility are used to produce Portland cement. The primary fuel fed to both kilns is hazardous waste-derived fuel, which provides up to 100 percent of the energy required by the kilns each year. The hazardous waste-derived fuel consists of liquid waste fuel and containerized solid fuel. Coal and natural gas

may also be fed to the kilns as supplementary fuels, as well as nonhazardous waste that may include used oils, petroleum coke, carbon black, wood products and plastics.

Lafarge has satisfied the interim status Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) requirements to conduct hazardous waste combustion. Lafarge has applied for a RCRA permit, and the trial burn plan is part of that permit application. The trial burn plan describes the emissions testing that will be conducted at Lafarge to assure that Lafarge is in compliance with RCRA combustion standards and to make certain the facility poses no threat to human health and the environment. Information obtained from the trial burn will be used to establish operating conditions, which will become part of any RCRA permit.

The EPA is reviewing the trial burn plan for adequacy. If the trial burn plan is approved, emissions testing will probably take place during the fall of 1995. In an effort to solicit public comment, the EPA is making the trial burn and quality assurance project plans available to the public for a 30-day period beginning August 7.

Comments related to the trial burn plan should be directed in writing to Tim Foster, EPA Region 7, RCRA/PRMT, 726 Minnesota Ave., Kansas City, KS 66101. Comments should be submitted prior to the expiration of the public comment period August 31.

The EPA will consider relevant comments from the public in addition to sending its own comments to Lafarge Corporation at the end of the public comment period. Lafarge will then modify the trial burn plan to accommodate these comments and provide the EPA and the Kansas Department of Health and Environment with a copy for approval of the final trial burn plan.

A draft of the permit decision also will be made available to the public for comment. The public will have the opportunity to comment on the draft permit decision either during the public comment period or during a public hearing. Relevant comments the EPA receives from the public will be considered when the final permit decision is made.

Transportation Improvement Program

In accordance with Federal Highway Administration and Federal Transit Administration requirements, the Kansas Department of Transportation requests comments on the draft Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP).

The STIP is a project-specific document which includes a list of all highway and transit projects in the state for a three-year period (October 1, 1995 to September 30, 1998). The STIP has been categorized into three general sections:

1. All street and highway projects administered by KDOT.
2. Statewide public transit projects.
3. Federal Lands Highway Program projects.

The comprehensive list of programmed projects provided under category one above includes *all* projects, regardless of funding source, to be administered by KDOT. This list includes projects for counties, cities and metropolitan planning organization areas, as well as projects on the state highway system. This approach allows currently scheduled projects to be converted to federal aid, if necessary, without undue delay and revision to the STIP.

Facility Description: This is a milk receiving station and manufactures milk byproducts. Process water and Imhoff sanitary waste effluent are treated in two aeration ponds and a clarifier with chemical addition. Clarifier effluent is either discharged to French Creek or retained in two holding lagoons. Boiler blowdown and water softener regenerate are directed to a nonoverflowing pond, but these discharges will be redirected as specified in the schedule of compliance. The wastewater flow is 135,000 gallons per day. Land application of whey solids occurs on an infrequent basis. Written comments on the proposed determinations may be submitted to the permit clerk, or Dorothy Geisler for agricultural permits, Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Environment, Bureau of Water, Forbes Field, Building 283, Topeka, 66620. All comments postmarked or received on or before September 8 will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding this public notice. Please refer to the appropriate public notice number (KS-AG-95-107/110, KS-95-69) and the name of applicant as listed when preparing comments.

If no objections are received during the public notice period, the Secretary of Health and Environment will issue the final determinations. If response to this notice indicates significant public interest, a public hearing may be held in conformance with state regulation 28-16-61. Media coordination (newspapers, radio) for publication and/or announcement of the public notice or public hearing is handled by the Kansas Department of Health and Environment.

The application, proposed permit, including proposed effluent limitations and special conditions, fact sheets as appropriate, comments received, and other information are on file and may be inspected at the Kansas Depart-

Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS

111-2-37. "Blackjack Doublor" retailer incentive.

(a) During the period between the start of the "Blackjack Doublor" game and ending 5:00 p.m., September 17, 1995, in addition to compensation provided for in K.A.R. 111-2-4, the Kansas lottery shall also offer for all retailers the "Blackjack Doublor" retailer incentive promotion. It will be held in conjunction with the Kansas lottery's "Blackjack Doublor" game (K.A.R. 111-4-732 through 111-4-736) as follows:

(b) With each book of "Blackjack Doublor" tickets activated, a retailer will automatically be entitled one entry card. Entry cards for each eligible book of tickets will be completed by the lottery based upon computer records identifying the activation of each book of "Blackjack Doublor" by a retailer, and entered into the random drawing. Only "Blackjack Doublor" books activated by 5:00 p.m., September 17, 1995, will be eligible for the drawing.

(c) The drawing will be held at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, September 22, 1995, at lottery headquarters. The first card drawn from all cards entered will entitle the retailer named thereon to win the first prize, a trip from Kansas City to Las Vegas, Nevada, for two, for four days and three nights, including hotel and air fare, provided by KCFX of Kansas City, Missouri, and the Kansas lottery. The first prize will also include \$500 cash. Ten additional cards will be drawn and the retailer identified on each will be awarded \$100. "WIZARD OF ODDS"**

111-4-737. Name of game. The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Wizard of Odds" commencing on or after August 21, 1995. The specific rules for the "Wizard of Odds" game are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-737 through 111-4-740. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710, as amended by L. 1995, Chapter 261, §1; effective, T-111-7-31-95, July 21, 1995.)

111-4-738. Definitions. The following definitions shall apply to the "Wizard of Odds" instant lottery game:

Article 5.—POWER BALL

111-5-34a. Powerball doubler promotion. (a) The "Powerball Doubler Promotion" is a limited extension of the "Powerball" game and is conducted in accordance with the Powerball game rules and applicable on-line generic rules contained in K.A.R. 111-6-1 *et seq.* The promotion will begin on September 6, 1995, and will continue for a total of eight drawings. The promotion will offer to the owners of a qualifying play a chance to double the amount of any cash set prize won in a drawing held during the promotion.

(b) A qualifying play is any play included in a five-play or five-board ticket which contains at least five plays at a total cost of \$5 eligible for a single drawing held during the eight-drawing promotion. The five-play or five-board ticket eligible for a single drawing held during the promotion may be part of a multiple draw play.

(c) A qualifying play which wins one of the eight cash set prizes (paying \$1 through \$100,000) will pay double if, in a separate random drawing announced during the

live "Powerball" drawing, the "Double Prize" chance is selected.

(d) MUSL will conduct an additional random "Double Prize" drawing and announce results during each of the regular "Powerball" drawings held during the promotion. The "Double Prize" drawings will be designed to guarantee that, at least once during the promotion, the set prizes will be doubled. The probability of the set prizes being doubled during each drawing of the promotion will never be greater than one in eight. On the first drawing of the promotion, the probability of the set prizes being doubled will be one in eight. If the prizes are not doubled during the first drawing, then on the second drawing of the promotion, the probability of the set prizes being doubled will be one in seven. The probability of the set prizes being doubled will be reduced for each drawing during the promotion until the "Double Prize" chance is selected. Once the "Double Prize" chance is selected, the drawing process will start over with the probability of the "Double Prize" chance being selected at one in eight. The probability of the "Double Prize" chance being selected during the promotion is as follows:

(e) The payment of double prizes shall be made from the MUSL "Set Prize Reserve Account." If the total of the regular set prizes and the doubled set prizes awarded in a drawing exceeds the percentage of the prize pool allocated to the set prizes, plus the doubled amounts, then the amount needed to fund the set prizes, including the doubled prizes, awarded shall be drawn from the following sources, in the following order: (i) the amount allocated to the set prizes and carried forward from previous draws, if any; (ii) an amount from the "Set Prize Reserve Account," if available in the account, not to exceed twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000) per drawing for all MUSL members. If, after these sources are depleted, there are not sufficient funds to pay the set prizes awarded, including the doubled prizes, then the highest set prize, including the doubled prize, shall become a parimutuel prize. If the amount of the highest set prize, when paid on a parimutuel basis, drops to or below the next highest set prize and there are still not sufficient funds to pay the remaining set prizes awarded, then the next highest set prize shall become a parimutuel prize. This procedure shall continue down through all set prize levels, if necessary, until all set prize levels become parimutuel prize levels. In that instance, the money available from the funding sources listed in this rule shall be divided among the winning plays in proportion to their respective prize percentages. Conditions of Bids

Proposals will be received on the bonds bearing such rate or rates of interest as may be specified by the bidders, subject to the following conditions: The same rate shall apply to all bonds of the same maturity. Each interest rate specified shall be a multiple of $\frac{1}{8}$ or $\frac{1}{20}$ of 1 percent. Basis of Award

If there is any discrepancy between the net interest cost and the average annual net interest rate specified, the specified net interest cost shall govern and the interest rates specified in the bid shall be adjusted accordingly. Security for the Bonds

The bonds will be general obligations of the city payable as to both principal and interest in part from ad valorem taxes which may be levied without limitation upon all the taxable tangible property, real and personal, within the territorial limits of the city.

Internal Revenue Code of 1986

The Internal Revenue Code of 1986 imposes requirements on the city which must be met subsequent to the issuance of the bonds by the city and, as a result, the city will and does hereby covenant that it will diligently undertake those steps necessary to maintain the tax-exempt status of the bonds. The city's failure to comply with such requirements could adversely affect the tax-exempt status of the bonds. Purchasers of the bonds should be aware that should the bonds lose their status as tax-exempt obligations as a result of the city's failure to comply with such requirements, the bonds are neither callable nor will the rate of interest on the bonds be adjusted to reflect such circumstances.

The code includes interest on tax-exempt obligations, such as the bonds, in the adjusted current earnings of certain corporations in the calculation of alternative min-

imum taxable income, with certain other adjustments. Furthermore, Section 59A of the code, as added by the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act of 1986, provides for an environmental tax generally based on corporate alternative minimum taxable income. The amount of the tax is equal to 0.12 percent of the excess of alternative minimum taxable income, without regard to net operating losses and the deduction for this tax, over \$2 million. The environmental tax is imposed whether or not the taxpayer is subject to the alternative minimum tax. The environmental tax may subject certain bondowners to additional taxation for interest earned on the bonds.

The code also requires property and casualty insurance companies to reduce the amount of their deductible underwriting losses by a percentage of the amount of tax-exempt interest received or accrued on such obligations. With the exception of certain "qualified tax-exempt obligations," the code provides that banks and thrift institutions may not deduct any portion of the interest cost of purchasing or carrying tax-exempt obligations such as the bonds. The city does intend to designate the bonds as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" under Section 265 of the code.

Legal Opinion

The bonds will be sold subject to the legal opinion of Nichols and Wolfe Chartered, Topeka, Kansas, bond counsel, whose approving legal opinion as to the validity of the bonds will be furnished and paid for by the city, printed on the bonds and delivered to the successful bidder when the bonds are delivered. Said opinion will also state that in the opinion of bond counsel, assuming continued compliance by the city with the provisions of the ordinance authorizing the issuance of the bonds and the code, under existing law, the interest on the bonds is excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes. Interest on the bonds may also be excludable from the computation of Kansas adjusted gross income.

Delivery and Payment

The city will pay for printing the bonds and will deliver the bonds, without cost to the successful bidder, prepared, executed and registered, on or about September 14, 1995, at such bank or trust company in the state of Kansas or greater Kansas City, Missouri, metropolitan area as may be specified by the successful bidder. Article 12.—KANSAS HORSE BREEDING DEVELOPMENT FUND

112-12-10. Kansas-bred or Kansas-owned races. (a) Each organization licensee shall in good faith offer at least one race limited to Kansas-bred or Kansas-owned horses on each racing day and shall make a good faith attempt to conduct an average of one Kansas-bred or Kansas-owned race per day. Kansas-bred horses shall be preferred entries. Awards and monies shall be paid only to the owners of Kansas-bred horses. If there are seven Kansas-bred entries, a Kansas-bred only race shall be run. If there are fewer than seven Kansas-bred entries, and there are Kansas-owned entries, a Kansas-bred and Kansas-owned race shall be run.

(b) The organization licensee shall file with the commission and the official registering agency two official programs, an affidavit verifying that the registry regulations have been followed and other requested information, including:

(1) the value of the purses offered by the organization licensee;

(2) the name and address of each owner who is to share in the total purses and awards and the amount in which each owner is to share; and

(3) any other information the commission or registry may require.

(c) Each program and affidavit shall be filed with the commission and the official registering agency within seven days after the date of the Kansas-bred or Kansas-owned race conducted by the organization licensee. Article 36.—ABSENTEE AND ADVANCE VOTING

7-36-1. Absentee and advance voting ballot envelopes. (a) Each absentee and advance voting ballot envelope to be signed by a voter shall contain the following statement: "NOTICE TO VOTER: Your (absentee/advance voting) ballot will be separated from this signed (absentee/advance voting) ballot envelope in order to guarantee the confidentiality of your vote."

(b) Absentee and advance voting ballot envelopes shall be preserved in accordance with K.S.A. 25-2708. The envelopes shall be placed in separate envelopes or sacks, appropriately labeled and sealed. Access to the envelopes shall be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 25-2708 and K.S.A. 25-3107. (Authorized by K.S.A. 25-1131, as amended by 1995 SB 232, section 34, and K.S.A. 25-1225; implementing K.S.A. 25-1120, as amended by 1995 SB 232, section 18, and K.S.A. 25-1219; effective Feb. 21, 1994; amended, T-7-7-3-95, July 3, 1995; amended Aug. 25, 1995.)

7-36-2. Advance voting voter; classification as permanent. A voter shall not be classified as a permanent advance voting voter by the county election officer unless the voter, or a person on the voter's behalf, has completed in its entirety an application for permanent advance voting voter status. The completed application shall specify the character of the voter's permanent disability or illness. (Authorized by K.S.A. 25-1131, as amended by 1995 SB 232, section 34; implementing K.S.A. 25-1122, as amended by 1995 SB 232, section 20; effective Feb. 21, 1994; amended, T-7-7-3-95, July 3, 1995; amended Aug. 25, 1995.)

7-36-3. Advance voting voter; assistance. For purposes of assisting an elector pursuant to K.S.A. 25-1124(b) and (c), as amended by 1995 SB 232, section 23, the phrase "marking and transmitting an advance voting ballot" shall include, but not be limited to, the following acts: (a) transmitting an unmarked advance voting ballot to an elector;

(b) assisting the elector in marking the advance voting ballot;

(c) transmitting the marked ballot to the county election officer; or

(d) any combination of the above acts. (Authorized by K.S.A. 25-1131, as amended by 1995 SB 232, section 34; implementing K.S.A. 25-1124, as amended by 1995 SB 232, section 23; effective Feb. 21, 1994; amended, T-7-7-3-95, July 3, 1995; amended Aug. 25, 1995.)

7-36-5. Advance voting ballots; counting. Each county election officer shall adopt procedures to ensure that ballots received after the time the polls close on election day shall not be counted. (Authorized by K.S.A. 25-1131, as amended by 1995 SB 232, section 34; implementing K.S.A. 25-1132, as amended by 1995 SB 232, section 35; effective Feb. 21, 1994; amended, T-7-7-3-95, July 3, 1995; amended Aug. 25, 1995.)

7-36-6. Advance voting list with voting place. (a) Each county election officer shall adopt procedures to prevent a voter from casting both an advance voting ballot and a regular ballot at the voter's polling place.

(b) The procedures shall include, but not be limited to, updating the poll books by adding the names of voters who returned advance voting ballots after the poll books were prepared to the list of names of all advance voting voters from whom advance voting ballots were received by the time the poll books were prepared.
