Kansas SmokeLess Kids Initiative, Inc.**Request for Proposals**

Kansas SmokeLess Kids Initiative, Inc., in cooperation with the Kansas Health Foundation, announces the call for proposals for the Community Tobacco Use Reduction Initiative (CTRI) grant. The program is designed to reach Kansas communities and coalitions that have not yet been funded for tobacco use prevention projects by the Kansas Department of Health and Environment and the Kansas Health Foundation. The program's purpose is to foster projects focusing on social changes to reduce the physical and economic impact of tobacco use on Kansans, particularly children and teens. Two communities will be awarded funds of up to \$10,000 for tobacco prevention projects.

The method of selection for the grant is competitive. A diverse review committee will consider all letters of intent, and those accepted will be sent an application packet. From the completed packets, two communities will be chosen. Proposals with a focus on environmental or social change, rather than behavioral change, will be given priority. The deadline for the letters of intent is November 30. Notification of application packets will be made by January 2, 1996, and final awards will be made by March 12, 1996.

Elections—City Elections—Nonpartisan Elections; Exceptions for Certain Cities; Affiliated Voter Filing As Independent Candidate. Robert J. Watson, City Attorney, Overland Park, October 6, 1995.

To become an independent candidate for city office in a city which conducts its elections on a partisan basis, a person must follow the procedure established in K.S.A. 25-2110 or 25-2110a and file with the city clerk a statement of such candidacy on a form provided by the county election officer. The statement must be accompanied by a filing fee or a petition containing the proper number of signatures as established in K.S.A. 25-2110 or 25-2110a. The provision in K.S.A. 25-303 precluding a person who has retained party affiliation from accepting an independent nomination is inapplicable to city elections. Estimating retail cost when new of a piece of commercial or industrial machinery or equipment in accordance with the guidelines established by the Division of Property Valuation in its 1995 Personal Property Guide when the actual retail cost when new is unascertainable is not violative of Article 11, Section 1 of the Kansas Constitution. Whether machinery and equipment should be classified as commercial or industrial will depend on the use to which the machinery and equipment is put. A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Tuesday, December 19, in the SRS board room, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed changes in an existing rule and regulation on a permanent basis effective January 31, 1996. Teleconference will not be available.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulation. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Secretary of Social and Rehabilitation Services, Room 603-N, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the proposed regulation during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

The adoption of the January 31, 1996, permanent regulation will take place at 8 a.m. Thursday, December 21, in the SRS executive conference room, 603-N, Docking State Office Building. Teleconference will not be available.

A summary of the proposed regulation and its economic impact follows.

Article 4.—PUBLIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

30-4-85a. Eligibility factors specific to the emergency assistance program. This regulation is being amended to change the assistance provided services from six months to 364 days.

Economic Impact: This change is not expected to have any discernible impact on expenditures. It will maximize federal financial participation for expenditures currently funded with state funds. Currently, the FY 96 budget includes \$6.7 million in IV-A dollars in support of field staff salaries and operating expenses. With the approval of the amended regulation, it is projected that SRS would see an increase of an additional one-third funding from IV-A, which would result in approximately \$2.2 million.

Article 4.—INDIVIDUAL GAME RULES

111-4-607. Name of drawings. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a series of drawings, entitled the "Heartland Park Sears Craftsman Drawings." The "Heartland Park Sears Craftsman Drawings" shall take place on Sunday, October 1, 1995, at Heartland Park, 1805 S.W. 71st, Topeka, Kansas 66619. Rules applicable are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-2 *et seq.* and 111-4-607 through 111-4-615. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710, as amended by L. 1995, Chapter 261, §1; effective, T-111-8-26-94, Aug. 19, 1994; amended, T-111-10-12-95, Aug. 18, 1995.)

111-4-609. Prizes. The winners selected at the "Heartland Park Sears Craftsman Drawings" conducted pursuant to the K.A.R. 111-4-607 *et seq.* shall receive prizes as follows.

Twelve tickets shall be drawn consecutively, immediately prior to the finals. Prizes shall be determined by the winning driver's speed in each of the twelve different classes with the winning dollar amount representing the actual speed of the winning driver with the minimum and maximum dollar amounts as follows:

All prize awards are subject to lottery validation, set-offs and deductions provided by law.

111-4-610. Entry into drawings. Entry into the "Heartland Park Sears Craftsman Drawings" is accomplished by the process detailed in the following subparagraphs:

(a) Obtain a valid Kansas instant lottery ticket from the lottery's selling location at Heartland Park Topeka;

(b) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with any instant game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the "Heartland Park Sears Craftsman Drawings," and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules;

(c) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket purchased at the Heartland Park selling location, the ticket is eligible for winning a drawing and the holder of the ticket may enter the "Heartland Park Sears Craftsman Drawings."

(d) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner and sign it.

(e) The holder of the ticket need not be present to win at the time of the "Heartland Park Sears Craftsman Drawings."

(f) There is no limit to the number of entries a participant may make.

(g) For the racing events occurring on September 28, 29, 30, and October 1, 1995, the receptacle(s) or drum(s) shall be open during lottery selling hours.

(h) The holder of a non-winning ticket must take each non-winning ticket with the information form on the back completed, to the location of either of two receptacle(s) or drum(s) at the "Heartland Park Sears Craftsman Drawings" and place it in the receptacle(s) or drum(s) provided by the lottery.

(i) On Sunday, October 1, 1995, the Kansas lottery will sponsor its "Heartland Park Sears Craftsman Drawings." Players enter the drawings by placing non-winning tickets purchased at Heartland Park Topeka into the receptacle(s) or drum(s) located near the lottery's selling location in the pit area. Twelve tickets will be drawn from the contents of the receptacle(s) or drum(s). Following validation by lottery security personnel, the winners' names shall be announced.

(j) Drawings shall be held by the lottery selling location on the east side of the pit area.

(k) Anyone wishing to purchase lottery tickets to enter the Heartland Park Sears Craftsman Drawings without buying a ticket to the races may do so by making a request for lottery tickets at the Heartland Park ticket office. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710, as amended by L. 1995, Chapter 261, §1; effective, T-111-8-26-94, Aug. 19, 1994; amended, T-111-10-12-95, Aug. 18, 1995.)

111-4-611. Determination of winners. (a) The receptacle or drum shall be sealed and mixed to ensure random selection.

(b) The executive director shall designate one individual of his choice to participate in the selection process.

(c) The selection of the "Heartland Park Sears Craftsman Drawings" winners shall be accomplished by the individual designated by the executive director, using a bare arm technique, removing only one ticket at a time from the contents of the receptacle(s) or drum(s) for each of the twelve drawings. Four additional entries will be drawn after the twelfth ticket is drawn to serve as alternate winners in the event any of the original twelve winners cannot be located or notified. The same certification by security will be performed as for the original twelve drawn entries. Lottery security shall review the selected ticket to determine if the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the name is determined to be legible and the ticket was purchased at Heartland Park Topeka. If these requirements are met, the name of the ticket holder shall be announced to the audience.

(d) The named person need not be present at a drawing, but must in any event provide proper identification in order to claim the "Heartland Park Sears Craftsman Drawings" prize.

(e) The person whose ticket has been drawn from the receptacle or drum shall be determined the "Heartland Park Sears Craftsman Drawings" winner, but regardless of the number of entries a person whose name appears on a valid entry drawn in the "Heartland Park Sears Craftsman Drawings" has made, he or she shall not be eligible to win more than one prize. The first entry drawn for a person whose name is drawn more than once shall be the only eligible entry for that person.

(f) After proper identification is produced, the winner shall be given a prize claim form to be completed and returned to the lottery.

(g) If the ticket is not a valid ticket, is a winning ticket; the name on the ticket is not legible or the ticket was not purchased at the Heartland Park selling location, the ticket drawn will be void and the selection process shall be repeated until a winner is selected. 111-4-613. Ticket disqualification. Any Kansas instant game lottery ticket entered into the "Heartland Park Sears Craftsman Drawings" shall become the property of the Kansas lottery and is disqualified from any other Kansas lottery prize or drawing. **RULES FOR INSTANT GAME NO. 33
"ACES HIGH"**

111-4-750. Name of game. The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Aces High" commencing on or after August 21, 1995. The specific rules for the "Aces High" game are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-750 through 111-4-753. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710, as amended by L. 1995, Chapter 261, §1; effective, T-111-10-12-95, Aug. 18, 1995.)

111-4-751. Definitions. The following definitions shall apply to the "Aces High" instant lottery game:

(a) "Game symbols" are the numbers, letters, symbols, pictures or dollar amounts printed in the play area of each instant game ticket and which determine if the ticket bearer is entitled to a prize. In this instant game, the game symbols are printed in black ink in 15 point WGI font with matching captions in WGI Cap font. A game symbol appears in each of four play spots within the play area. Each game symbol for this instant game is one of the following: 2 - 3 - 4 - 5 - 7 - 8 - 9 - 10 - J - Q - K - A - \$1.⁰⁰ - \$2.⁰⁰ - \$4.⁰⁰ - \$5.⁰⁰ - 10.⁰⁰ - 20.⁰⁰ - \$500\$ - \$2000.

(b) "Game symbol captions" are the words or portions of words printed beneath each game symbol in the play area and are used to repeat or explain the game symbol. The game symbol caption associated with each game symbol is as follows:

(c) "Ticket validation number" means a unique number appearing on each ticket which is used to validate winning tickets. For this instant game, the ticket validation number is an 11-digit number which appears on the front of each instant ticket and will be covered by latex.

(d) "Book-ticket number" means the unique number appearing on each ticket which includes the number of the book from which it was removed and the serially assigned number of the ticket within that book. For this instant game, the book-ticket number is an 8-digit book number followed by a dash and then a 3-digit ticket number. The ticket numbers in each book start with 000 and end with 299. The book-ticket number is printed in black ink on the back of each instant game ticket below the bar code

(e) "Retailer validation code" means the small letters found under removable covering in the play area of each instant game ticket. The retailer uses this code to verify and validate winners which are to be paid by the retailer. In this instant game, the retailer validation code is a three letter code printed and appearing in three of FIVE varying locations among the game symbols. The codes and their meanings are as follows: ONE = \$1.00; TWO = \$2.00; FOR = \$4.00; FIV = \$5.00; TEN = \$10.00; SXN = \$16.00; TWY = \$20.00; FRY = \$40.00; ETY = \$80.00; FHN = \$500.00.

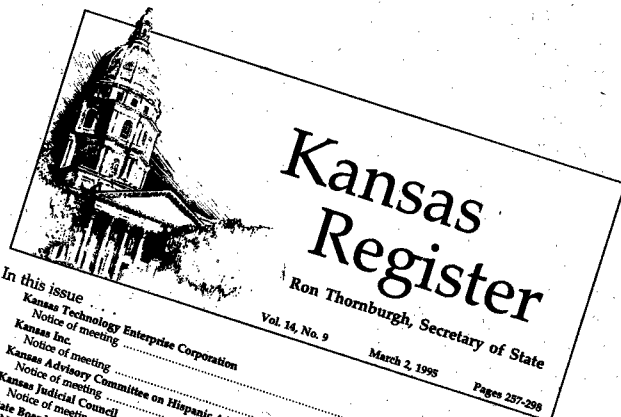
