Notice is hereby given of the commencement of negotiations for limited master planning services for Kansas State University and the City of Manhattan, Kansas. The project will include preparation of a scope of work for the development of the concept and master plan for the joint development of a coordinated campus/city bicycle pathway. The master plan should include such items as: fire protection access, lighting, on-site and off-site vehicular parking, pedestrian and bicycle parking as well as tie-ins to existing and planned bikeway systems throughout the campus and city. There will be no discrimination against anyone because of race, age, religion, color, sex, handicap, or national origin in the award of contracts.

Each bidder shall file a sworn statement executed by or on behalf of the person, firm, association or corporation submitting the bid, certifying that such person, firm, association or corporation has not, either directly or indirectly, entered into any agreement, participated in any collusion, or otherwise taken any action in restraint of free competitive bidding in connection with the submitted bid. This sworn statement shall be in the form of an affidavit executed and sworn to by the bidder before a person who is authorized by the laws of the state to administer oaths. The required form of the affidavit will be provided by the state to each prospective bidder. Failure to submit the sworn statement as part of the bid-approval package will make the bid nonresponsive and not eligible for award consideration.

Courts—District Courts—District Judges; Power and Authority; Contingency Fee Contract to Collect Court Costs, Fines, Restitution and Attorney Fees. Terry Bullock, Administrative Judge, Third Judicial District, Topeka, October 11, 1995.

A district court does not have the inherent power to contract with a collection agency to collect unpaid court costs, fines, attorney fees and restitution. Insurance—General Provisions—Examination of Individual Applicants for Agents' Licenses; Fee; Classes of Insurance; Issuance of License, When; Record of Licenses Issued and Companies Agents Certified to Represent. Senator Marian Reynolds, 38th District, Dodge City, October 12, 1995.

The six-month waiting period imposed by K.S.A. 40-241 before an insurance agent license applicant may take a licensure examination after four prior failed attempts applies regardless how much time has passed since the initial three attempts took place. Cited herein: K.S.A. 40-241. GE

Opinion No. 95-103

Cities and Municipalities—Buildings, Structures and Grounds; Development and Redevelopment of Areas in and Around Cities—Redevelopment of Central Business District Areas; Relocation Assistance Plan. Representative Cliff Franklin, 23rd District, Merriam, October 17, 1995.

A city may not initiate a redevelopment project until a relocation assistance plan is approved by the governing body. Issues concerning the sufficiency of the relocation assistance plan may be the subject of litigation between a displaced person and the city. The redevelopment statutes place the burden of relocation assistance on the city. Cited herein: K.S.A. 12-1772; 12-1773; 12-1777. MF

State Boards, Commissions and Authorities—Kansas Guardianship Program—Status of Program as a Non-profit Corporation. Senator Barbara Lawrence, 30th District, Wichita, October 17, 1995.

Public Health—Regulation of Nursing—Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioner; Categories, Education, Training, Qualifications and Expanded Role; Nurse Anesthetists; Requirement to Obtain Certificate of Qualification.

Public Health—Regulation of Nursing; Registered Nurse Anesthetists—Requirement to be Authorized. Representative Melvin J. Neufeld, 115th District, Ingalls, October 23, 1995.

Under the registered nurse anesthetist statutes, the advanced registered nurse practitioner statutes and the advanced registered nurse practitioner regulations, a professional nurse who wishes to practice nurse anesthesia is required to be authorized as a registered nurse anesthetist and to be certified as an advanced registered nurse practitioner in the nurse anesthetist category. Public Health—Regulation of Dentists and Dental Hygienists—Improper Use of Certain Names by Dentists; Exceptions; Suspension or Revocation of License. Dr. Estel Landreth, President, Kansas Dental Board, Topeka, October 23, 1995.

Dentists are prohibited from practicing dentistry under any name other than their own, with several exceptions. Under the corporate name exception, dentists may practice dentistry under a corporate name if they associate with one or more dentists in a professional corporation pursuant to the professional corporation law. The requirements of this exception are met when more than one dentist practices dentistry in the corporation. Cited

Opinion No. 95-107

Domestic Violence—Federal Violence Against Women Act—Full Faith and Credit Given to Foreign Protection Orders. Robert J. Watson, Overland Park City Attorney, Overland Park, October 23, 1995.

The federal violence against women act (VAWA) requires that a valid protection order issued by a court of another state or an Indian tribe be accorded full faith and credit by a Kansas court and enforced as if it were a Kansas protection order, provided the due process requirements of 18 U.S.C. § 2265(b) are satisfied. In some instances, full faith and credit may not be granted to foreign mutual protection orders. There is no requirement that the foreign protection order be filed pursuant to the uniform enforcement of foreign judgments act. A Kansas law enforcement officer is not in a position to determine whether the due process requirements were satisfied or whether a mutual protection order is entitled to full faith and credit; this is a decision for a court. Finally, both United States courts and Kansas courts may entertain violations of foreign protection orders. Opinion No. 95-108

State Departments; Public Officers and Employees—Department on Aging; General Provisions—State Long-Term Care Ombudsman; Authority to Designate Representatives of the Office of State Long-Term Care Ombudsman. Thelma Hunter Gordon, Secretary, Department on Aging, Topeka, November 1, 1995.

The state long-term care ombudsman has the statutory authority and discretion, within certain limitations, to designate individuals to represent the office of the state long-term care ombudsman on a volunteer basis. To qualify for designation as a representative of the office, the individual must meet the training requirements set forth in K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 5-5918(f) and 75-5918a. The state long-term care ombudsman may not designate an individual who is subject to a conflict of interest, as defined by K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 75-5916(h). While the state long-term care ombudsman may designate an employee of an area agency on aging that provides ombudsman services, the area agency employee must otherwise qualify for designation as a representative. The provisions of the Kansas long-term care ombudsman act do not restrict eligibility for designation as a representative of the office of state long-term care ombudsman to a greater extent than permitted by 42 U.S.C. §§ 3058d and 3058g(a)(5)(C). RegulationsArticle 5.—SEDATIVE AND GENERAL
ANAESTHESIA

71-5-1. Definitions. As used in these regulations and for the purpose of administering Article 5, the terms in this regulation shall be defined as follows.

(a) "Conscious sedation" means a minimally depressed level of consciousness in which the patient retains the ability to independently and continuously maintain an airway and respond appropriately to physical stimulation and verbal command.

(b) "Deep sedation" means a controlled state of depressed consciousness, accompanied by partial loss of protective reflexes, with occasional inability to respond purposefully to verbal command and maintain an adequate airway.

(c) "General anaesthesia" means a controlled state of unconsciousness, accompanied by a partial or complete loss of protective reflexes, including inability to independently maintain an airway and respond purposefully to physical stimulation or verbal command.

(d) "Board" means the Kansas dental board. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-1406 and implementing K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 65-144; effective Nov. 27, 1995.)

71-5-2. Level I and II permits; scope of treatment.

(a) Level I permit. Except as set out under subsection (b), any licensed dentist who has been issued a Level I permit may administer conscious sedation in a dental office setting in accordance with these regulations. No licensed dentist shall administer intravenous or parenteral inhalation sedation agents other than nitrous oxide without first obtaining a Level I permit issued by the board.

(b) Level I permit; restrictions. A licensed dentist holding a Level I permit shall not be authorized to use any of the following agents:

(1) Ultra-short acting barbiturates, such as:

(A) thiopental; or

(B) methohexitol;

(2) ketamine; or

(3) propofol.

(4) A Level I permit holder shall not use any inhalation anaesthetic agent other than nitrous oxide.

(c) Level II permits. Any licensed dentist who has been issued a Level II permit may administer conscious sedation, deep sedation or general anaesthesia in accordance with these regulations. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 74-1406 and implementing K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 65-1444; effective Nov. 27, 1995.)

71-5-3. Level I permit requirements. (a) A Level I permit for administration of conscious sedation in a dental office shall be issued to each licensed dentist who:

(1) meets the education or experience requirements in subsection (b);

(2) meets the requirements regarding facilities set out in subsection (c); and

(3) has current certification in basic life support or its equivalent.

(b) Each licensed dentist applying for a Level I permit shall provide evidence of:

(1) satisfactorily completing:

(A) a minimum of 60 hours of instruction in intravenous conscious sedation, including didactic and supportive courses, provided by a training program approved by the board; or

(B) an internship or residency program which includes supervised experience in intravenous conscious sedation equal to the 60 hours of instruction required in paragraph (A); or

(2) having regularly engaged in the administration of conscious sedation in a competent manner for a period of three years immediately before the effective date of this regulation.

(c) Each licensed dentist applying for a Level I permit shall provide evidence satisfactory to the board that the dentist maintains a properly equipped facility which shall include the following:

(1) a blood pressure monitor and stethoscope;

(2) an oxygen delivery system with full face masks, including connectors capable of delivering oxygen under positive pressure; and

(3) emergency drugs and equipment.

(d) Each Level I permit shall be renewed annually on December 1, on a form prescribed by the board. The annual renewal fee shall be \$50.

(e) Each licensed dentist applying for renewal of a Level I permit shall demonstrate that the dentist has maintained competence in administration of conscious sedation, by providing evidence of having performed a minimum of 10 Level I procedures during the year preceding renewal. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-1406 and implementing K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 65-1444; effective Nov. 27, 1995.)

71-5-4. Level II permit requirements. (a) A Level II permit for administration of deep sedation and general anaesthesia shall be issued to each licensed dentist who:

(1) meets the education or experience requirements in subsection (b);

(2) meets the requirements regarding facilities set out in subsection (c); and

(3) has current certification in basic life support or its equivalent.

(b) Each licensed dentist applying for a Level II permit shall provide evidence of:

(1) meeting the requirements for a Level I permit established under 71-1-3; and

(2)(A) satisfactorily completing:

(i) a course of study and residency program in anaesthesia approved by the board of healing arts;

(ii) an advanced oral and maxillofacial surgery program approved by the board; or

(iii) a minimum of one year of advanced training in anaesthesiology with standards not less than those established in the "Guidelines for Teaching the Comprehensive Control of Pain and Anxiety in Dentistry," as published in 1992 and implemented in July, 1993 by the American dental association; or

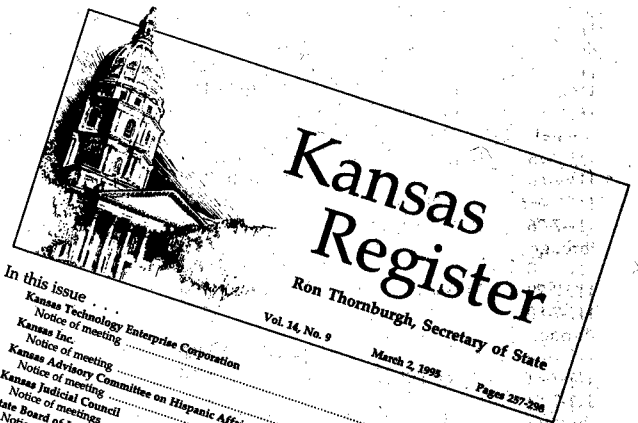
