Cities and Municipalities—Emergency Telephone Services—Emergency Telephone Tax; Wireless Service; Associated Costs. Craig Cox, Harvey County Counselor, Newton, December 21, 1995.

K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 12-5305, 12-5306 and 12-5307 do not impose upon a county or city an absolute duty to pay for the costs of installing telephone lines from the local cellular tower to the local public service answering point. However, if such costs appear to be necessary in order to provide for receipt of 911 emergency telephone services, they may permissibly and discretionarily be paid for by a city or county. Notice to Private Activity Bond Applicants

Applications for allocation of 1994 Private Activity Bond (PAB) authority are now being accepted for qualified uses, as defined by the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, and amendments thereof, with the exception of qualified mortgage bonds. Notice of allocation application procedures for qualified mortgage bonds will be made at a later date.

The State of Kansas currently receives \$150 million of federal authority for the issuance of PABs on an annual basis. Historically, the primary uses of this federal authority have included "qualified small issue bonds" used for construction and equipping of manufacturing facilities and beginning farmer programs; "exempt facility bonds" used by for-profit entities providing a public benefit, i.e., certain waste treatment facilities, qualified residential rental facilities, etc.; and "qualified mortgage bonds" issued to benefit first-time homebuyers. Allocations awarded by the Secretary of Commerce and Housing are subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 74-5060 et seq. and the limitations of the state volume cap.

Fees associated with private activity bond application and issuance are as follows:

(1) Application Fee—A nonrefundable fee must accompany the application before the request can be processed. The application fee is determined as presented:

_____	\$250 allocation request up to \$5,000,000
_____	\$500 allocation request from \$5,000,000 to \$10,000,000
_____	\$1,000 allocation request of \$10,000,001 and above

(2) Annual Fee—.10% of the outstanding principal balance of bonds issued shall be remitted to the Department of Commerce and Housing over the life of the issue. Fees shall be accrued and remitted to the Department of Commerce and Housing on an annual basis. The due date for remittance of annual fees will be 15 days following the anniversary date of issuance.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. Attica Municipal Power Plant has applied for a Class II operating permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-540. Emissions of oxides of nitrogen were evaluated during the permit review process. The purpose of a Class II permit is to limit the potential-to-emit for these pollutants to below major source thresholds.

Attica Municipal Power Plant owns and operates an electric generating station located at 120 N. Harper, Attica.

from Hazardous Waste Regulations

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is providing public notice that on September 28, 1995, Kansas Plating, Inc., 1110 N. Mosley, Wichita, submitted a request for a variance from specific hazardous waste regulations in accordance with K.A.R. 28-31-13(a).

The variance is requested from K.A.R. 28-31-4(j), which allows a Kansas or EPA generator to accumulate as much as 55 gallons of each type of hazardous waste in not more than one container at or near any point of generation where waste initially accumulates and which is under the control of the operator of the process generating the waste.

Kansas Plating, Inc. generates used 30" x 30" waste paint screens. The screens are currently being cut up into small pieces to fit into 55-gallon drums. Kansas Plating Inc. proposes to use one cubic yard satellite containers for the accumulation of the waste paint screens, which will eliminate the generation of hazardous paint dust from the cutting procedure. The proposed containers have a plastic liner, are 33" x 33" x 33", and permit the handling of the waste paint screens safely. KDHE has reviewed the variance request and concluded that the variance is justified.

In accordance with K.A.R. 28-31-13(b), public notice was provided that KDHE considered the request for a variance justified and made a tentative decision to grant the variance. A public comment period to receive comments regarding this tentative decision was established between December 5, 1995 and January 4, 1996. No public comments were received.

Therefore, in accordance with K.A.R. 28-31-13(b), KDHE announces its decision to approve this request for a variance and not to include any special conditions. The variance shall become effective on January 18, 1996, and shall remain in effect until January 18, 2003.

Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Tuesday, March 19, in Conference Room 108, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed changes in existing rules and regulations proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A short summary of the contents follows:

K.A.R. 28-4-558 adds, when appropriate, that the funding sources to be used to pay for other services that the child needs but are not required under Part H of IDEA be included on the IFSP. This regulation also includes modified wording to clarify intent.

K.A.R. 28-4-559 includes modified wording to clarify intent.

K.A.R. 28-4-560 adds that an interim IFSP shall be necessary if services begin for the child before the evaluation, as well as the assessment, are completed.

K.A.R. 28-4-561 adds that, at least 90 days before the child's third birthday, a conference shall be convened to plan the transition to Part B early childhood special education. This regulation also includes modified wording to clarify intent.

K.A.R. 28-4-562 includes modified wording to clarify intent.

K.A.R. 28-4-563 omits a reference to required continuing education for service providers because this requirement is referenced in K.A.R. 28-4-564.

K.A.R. 28-4-567 includes modified wording to clarify intent.

K.A.R. 28-4-570 deletes time extension granted by a mediator or hearing officer in resolution of complaint proceedings.

These regulation changes should impose no measurable increased economic impact on the agency proposing the regulation, other governmental agencies, private citizens or consumers of services that are the subject of the regulations.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of considering adoption of proposed changes in existing rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments to Kay Domingo at the address above.

All parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the revised regulations during the hearing. It may be necessary to request each participant limit oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the hearing and may request the proposed regulations and fiscal impact state-

failure or refusal by the purchaser thereof to accept delivery of and pay for the bonds in accordance with the terms of this notice. All expenses in relation to the assignment and printing of CUSIP numbers on the bonds will be paid by the issuer.

Delivery and Payment

The bonds will be registered in the name of Cede & Co., as bondowner and nominee for the Depository Trust Company (DTC), New York, New York. DTC will act as securities depository for the bonds. Purchases of the bonds will be made in book-entry form. Purchasers will not receive certificates representing their interest in bonds purchased. So long as bonds are registered in the name of Cede & Co., references herein to the bond owners or registered owners shall mean Cede & Co., as nominee of DTC, and shall not mean the beneficial owners (as defined herein) of the bonds. The successful bidder will be furnished with a certified transcript of the proceedings evidencing the authorization and issuance of the bonds and the usual closing documents, including a certificate that there is no litigation pending or threatened at the time of delivery of the bonds affecting their validity and a certificate regarding the completeness and accuracy of the official statement. Payment for the bonds shall be made in Federal Reserve funds, immediately available for use by the issuer.

The denominations of the bonds and the names, addresses and social security or taxpayer identification numbers of the registered owners shall be submitted in writing by the successful bidder to the bond registrar at least one week prior to the date of delivery of the bonds. In the absence of such information, the issuer will deliver one bond of each maturity registered in the name of the manager of the successful bidder.

Certification as to Offering Prices

To provide the issuer with information necessary for compliance with Section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, the successful bidder will be required to complete, execute and deliver to the issuer prior to the delivery of the bonds a certificate regarding the "issue price" of the bonds (as defined in Section 148 of the code), reflecting the initial offering prices (excluding accrued interest and expressed as dollar prices) at which a substantial amount (i.e., 10 percent or more) of the bonds of each maturity have been or are expected to be sold to the public. The term "public" excludes bond houses, brokers or similar persons or organizations acting in the capacity of underwriters or wholesalers. Such certificate shall state that 10 percent or more of the bonds of each maturity have been or are expected to be sold to the public at prices not higher than such initial offering prices. However, such certificate may indicate that the successful bidder will not offer the bonds for sale to the public.

Preliminary Official Statement and Official Statement

The issuer has prepared a preliminary official statement dated January 16, 1996, copies of which may be obtained from the clerk or from the financial advisor. Upon the sale of the bonds, the issuer will adopt the final official statement and will furnish the successful bidder, without cost, with a sufficient number of copies thereof in order

to comply with the requirements of Rule G-32 of the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board. Additional copies may be ordered at the successful bidder's expense. The issuer's acceptance of the successful bidder's proposal for the purchase of the bonds shall constitute a contract between the issuer and the successful bidder for purposes of the rule.

Continuing Disclosure

The Securities and Exchange Commission has promulgated amendments to its Rule 15c2-12 requiring continuous secondary market disclosure for issues sold on or after July 3, 1995. In the resolution, the issuer has voluntarily covenanted to annually provide certain financial information and operating data and other information necessary to comply with the rule, and to transmit the same to certain national repositories and the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board, as applicable. This covenant is for the benefit of and is enforceable by the owners of the bonds. For further information, reference is made to the caption "Continuing Disclosure" in the preliminary official statement.

Said opinion will also include the opinion of bond counsel relating to the exclusion of the interest on the bonds from gross income for federal income tax purposes and from computation of Kansas adjusted gross income. Reference is made to the preliminary official statement for further discussion of federal and Kansas income tax matters relating to the interest on the bonds.

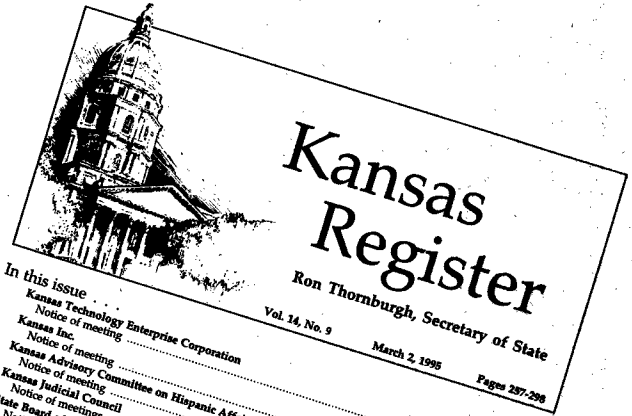
