## Kansas Racing Commission

Notice of Hearing on Proposed  
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Friday, May 24, in the conference room at the Kansas Racing Commission office, 3400 Van Buren, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed permanent regulations of the Kansas Racing Commission. This 60-day notice constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting the secretary at the Kansas Racing Commission, (913) 296-5800.

A copy of the full text of the regulations and the economic impact statement may be reviewed or obtained at the commission office. The following is a summary of the proposed amendments.

**K.A.R. 112-10-38. Vaccinations.** This regulation is designed to safeguard the health of the greyhounds and the safety of their human handlers at racetrack facilities by requiring periodic vaccinations of each greyhound against each disease the animal health officer has determined is communicable to other greyhounds at the racing facility. It requires that a record of vaccinations be maintained for each greyhound and proof of vaccinations be provided for new greyhounds coming to a racetrack within three days of the greyhound's arrival at the racetrack facility.

Section (b) specifically requires every greyhound housed at a facility be vaccinated against rabies and receive an annual booster by a licensed veterinarian.

Trainers or kennel owners shall provide a copy of the registration certificate, an individual certificate of vaccination for each greyhound brought to a racing facility, and a small animal health certificate issued by the animal health division for the state or county of departure.

## Economic Impact:

The commission has agreed to bear the expense of vaccinating each greyhound at each of its racing facilities. The vaccine is purchased through the state contract system, and the cost of vaccinating each greyhound is approximately 45 cents. In 1994, the commission vaccinated 565 greyhounds at the Wichita racetrack facility and 650 greyhounds at the Woodlands racetrack facility at a cost of \$546.75. In 1995, the commission vaccinated 397 greyhounds at the Wichita racetrack facility, 848 greyhounds at the Woodlands racetrack facility and 1,398 greyhounds at the Camptown facility at a cost of \$1,189.35. So far in 1996, the commission has vaccinated 1,289 greyhounds at the Wichita racetrack facility and 1,100 greyhounds at the Woodlands racetrack facility for a cost of \$1,075.05. It has not been determined at this time as to whether Camptown will reopen in 1996; therefore, no prediction can be made concerning how many greyhounds would pass through the facility and require vaccinations.

Greyhound owners and/or trainers shall bear the expense of vaccinating each greyhound against diseases, as determined by the animal health officer, to be communicable to other greyhounds at the racetrack facility. The cost is estimated to range from \$3 to \$10 per greyhound depending on the number of greyhounds vaccinated at any one time and the fee the owner negotiates with his or her veterinarian.

If, in the future, the commission chooses to continue to provide vaccinations by its veterinarians, the commission may require owners and/or trainers to purchase the rabies vaccine from the commission at a cost of approximately 45 cents per greyhound. The cost of any other vaccinations which must be borne by greyhound owners and/or trainers depends on the disease to be vaccinated against.

**K.A.R. 112-17-15. Distribution of monies from horse fair racing benefit fund.** This regulation establishes a procedure for distribution of monies from the county fair horse racing benefit fund. The amendments to this regulation were made at the request of the 1994 Legislature, wherein it asked for a definition of "costs/administrative" expenses relating to race meetings conducted by fair associations that are reimbursable to the commission.

## Economic Impact:

The agency projected revenues of \$300,000 per year in 1993. The following schedule shows the actual revenue that was credited to the fund:

## State of Disaster Emergency Proclamation

By virtue of the authority vested in me by the Kansas Emergency Preparedness Act, Chapter 48, Article 9, of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, to meet the inherent dangers of disasters to which the State and its citizens have been exposed, and upon advice of the State Adjutant General as the Director of the Division of Emergency Management, I hereby proclaim a State of Disaster Emergency as follows:

## NATURE OF THE DISASTER:

The grassland and croplands of Kansas form an important part of our economy, provide for protection of watersheds, forage for livestock, refuge for wildlife and recreational opportunities. Wildfire endangers these resources, real and personal property and the lives of residents and visitors in those areas. Extremely dry and windy weather conditions have created an extreme fire hazard in the grasslands and croplands of Kansas. Fire departments across the State have reported an inordinate number of fires. Once started, these fires are difficult to control and strain both paid and volunteer fire departments' manpower and resources. The fire danger is extreme across the State of Kansas. The dry conditions and fire danger will continue unabated until sufficient rainfall occurs in the State of Kansas.

## DATE THAT DISASTER AFFECTED THE AREA:

Commencing February 22, 1996 and continuing.

## AREA AFFECTED BY THE DISASTER:

The entire State of Kansas.

Further, effective immediately, I hereby prohibit, by all citizens and visitors in the State of Kansas, the following:

1. Careless use of smoking materials, including cigarettes, cigars, and smoking pipes. Discard shall be in a manner to preclude threat from smoldering remains.
2. Building, maintaining, attending or using any open fire or campfire except in permanent stove or fireplaces, or barbecue grills in developed recreation sites or residential lawns.
3. Prescribed burning of all fence rows, fields, wild lands, ravines, trash and debris. Prescribed burning may be exempted from this order if such burning is necessary for crop survival and has been specifically approved in writing by the fire chief in a jurisdiction where the burning is taking place. Crop survival is defined as stubble burning in preparation of second crop planting. I hereby direct all law enforcement and fire departments in the State of Kansas to enforce this order.

I hereby proclaim, direct and order the Adjutant General of the State of Kansas to activate the disaster response and recovery portions of the State Disaster Emergency Plan. Local and inter-jurisdictional disaster plans applicable to the political subdivisions of areas affected by this Proclamation shall be coordinated by the Adjutant General.

Any or all of the power conferred upon the Governor by the Kansas Emergency Preparedness Act may be delegated to the Adjutant General as deemed appropriate during this period of proclaimed State of Disaster Emer-

gency. This may be delegated by written orders, or oral orders subsequently reduced to writing with reference to this Proclamation.

This Proclamation shall be in full force and effect for a period not to exceed fifteen (15) days from the declared effective date set forth herein below unless extended in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 48-924.

This Proclamation shall be filed promptly with the Division of Emergency Management, the Office of the Secretary of State and each city clerk or county clerk, as appropriate, in the area to which this Proclamation applies. Further dissemination of this Proclamation shall occur by means calculated to bring its contents to the attention of the general public.

## Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 1625

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION providing for the extension of the state of disaster emergency proclamation commencing February 22, 1996, addressing prohibitions of careless use of smoking materials; building, maintaining, attending or using fires or campfires; and prescribed burning of fence rows, fields, wild lands, ravines, trash and debris.

WHEREAS, In accordance with K.S.A. 48-924 the governor shall be responsible for meeting the dangers to the state and people presented by disasters; and

WHEREAS, The grassland and croplands of Kansas form an important part of our economy, provide for protection of watersheds, forage for livestock, and refuge for wildlife and recreational opportunities; and

WHEREAS, Wildfire endangers these resources, real and personal property and the lives of residents and visitors in those areas; and

WHEREAS, Extremely dry and windy weather conditions have created an extreme fire hazard in the grasslands and croplands of Kansas; and

WHEREAS, Fire departments across the state have reported an inordinate number of fires; and

WHEREAS, Once started, these fires are difficult to control and strain both paid and volunteer fire departments' manpower and resources; and

WHEREAS, The fire danger is extreme across the state of Kansas; and

WHEREAS, The dry conditions and fire danger will continue unabated until sufficient rainfall occurs in the state of Kansas: Now, therefore,

Be it resolved by the Senate of the State of Kansas, the House of Representatives concurring therein: That the Legislature of the state of Kansas pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 48-924 ratifies continuance of the state of disaster emergency proclamation signed by the governor on February 23, 1996.

## Article 16.—TRAVEL REIMBURSEMENT

**1-16-18a. Designated high cost geographic areas.**

(a) For official travel to and from, or within, any high cost geographic area designated in subsection (c) in which the traveler is required to sleep away from home, the applicable subsistence allowance rate for that designated high cost geographic area may be paid. However, reimbursement on this basis shall not be allowable when such an area is only an intermediate stopover at which no official duty is performed, or when the subsistence expenses incurred relate to relocation, travel to seek residence quarters or to report to a new permanent duty station or to temporary quarters.

(b) Reimbursement for travel in high cost geographic areas shall be at the prescribed high cost geographic rate unless the agency establishes a reduced rate as provided in K.A.R. 1-16-15. When an out-of-state trip is to two or more destination cities, and when one of these cities is designated as a high cost geographic area, the subsistence allowance rate shall change from the high cost geographic area rate to the regular rate, or from the regular rate to the high cost geographic area rate, subject to and on application of the appropriate quarter-day allowance as determined by the time of arrival at the second destination city.

(c) The boundaries of designated high cost geographic areas shall include all locations within the corporate limits of the cities listed, unless otherwise specified. The designated high cost geographic areas shall be as follows:

## (1) In-state high cost geographic areas:

(A) Kansas City (all locations within Johnson and Wyandotte Counties);

(B) Manhattan (all locations within Riley County); and

(C) Wichita (all locations within Sedgwick County); and

## (2) Out-of-state high cost geographic areas:

(A) Afton, Oklahoma (Shangri-La Resort);

(B) Alexandria, Virginia (see Washington, D.C.);

(C) Anchorage, Alaska;

(D) Arlington, Virginia;

(E) Aspen, Colorado (all locations within Pitkin County);

(F) Atlantic City, New Jersey (all locations within Atlantic County);

(G) Avon and Beaver Creek, Colorado;

(H) Barrow, Alaska;

(I) Bethesda, Maryland;

(J) Boca Raton, Florida;

(K) Boston, Massachusetts (all locations within Suffolk County);

(L) Cambridge, Massachusetts;

(M) Carmel, California;

(N) Chicago, Illinois (all locations within Du Page, Lake and Cook Counties);

(O) Edison, New Jersey (all locations within Middlesex County);

(P) Fairbanks, Alaska;

- (III) all areas approved as high cost areas pursuant to subsection (d).
- (d) State agencies may request the director of accounts and reports to conduct a study of subsistence costs in any area not designated as a high cost area in subsection (c). If the study findings of an area justify such an action, the director of accounts and reports may recommend to the secretary of administration that the area be added to the list of high cost geographic areas. If the secretary approves the addition of that area, subsistence payments for travel to the area may be made at the rate designated for high cost geographic areas.
- (e)(1) If an employee is required or authorized to attend a conference in an area which is not designated as a high cost area in subsection (c), the location may be designated by the secretary of administration as a high cost area on a temporary basis if:
- (A) the agency head is provided with conference materials indicating that the conference will be held at or in connection with a lodging establishment with rates which exceed both the applicable lodging expense limitation established under K.A.R. 1-16-18 and the exception provided in K.S.A. 75-3207a(e); and
- (B) prior to the date of travel, the agency head submits to the secretary of administration a request for approval of a temporary high cost area. The request shall include the title, dates, and location of the conference, the name or names of the employees traveling to the conference, and a verification that the lodging establishment rates exceed the applicable lodging expense limitations.
- (2) The temporary high cost area designation shall be effective only for the duration of the conference and shall be applicable only to the state employee or employees attending the conference.
- (3) For purposes of this subsection, the term "conference" means any seminar, association meeting, clinic, colloquium, convention, symposium or similar gathering which is attended by a state employee in pursuit of a goal, obligation, function or duty imposed upon a state agency or performed on behalf of a state agency.
- (f) This regulation shall take effect on and after April 1, 1996. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 75-

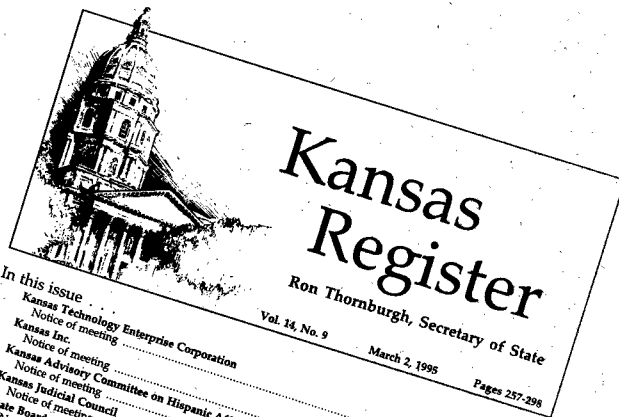
