Request for Proposals

The Kansas Commission on National and Community Service, a part of the Kansas State Board of Education, announces the availability of funding to be awarded to applicants based upon successful competitive proposals to conduct service learning programs as defined in the state plan. Approximate funding available by priority is listed below.

1. Learn and Serve America School-based programs focusing on integration of service learning in the curriculum of kindergarten through high school age youth. Approximately \$179,000 is available to support approximately 21 new and renewal programs. New programs are eligible to apply for up to \$10,000 for a project to begin in September 1996. The deadline for applications is 5 p.m. May 30.

2. Learn and Serve America Community-based programs focusing on service learning for youth, ages 5 through 19, during out-of-school hours. Approximately \$95,000 is available to support approximately 10 new and renewal programs. New programs are eligible to apply for up to \$10,000 for a project to begin in September 1996. The deadline for applications is 5 p.m. May 30.

3. AmeriCorps program serving the unmet needs in Southwest Kansas. Priority will be given to an appli-

cant that proposes to serve more than one community in the Southwest Kansas area. Approximately \$180,000 is available to support one project in this priority to begin in January 1997. The deadline for applications is 5 p.m. June 17.

4. AmeriCorps partnership program comprised of up to four AmeriCorps Kansas members and four AmeriCorps VISTA members who would act as service learning coordinators in public school settings. A grant to support the AmeriCorps VISTA component would provide 100 percent of the benefits received by the corps members. Approximately \$60,000 is available to support the AmeriCorps Kansas members. This grant would require a cash match of 15 percent of their living allowances and benefits and 33 percent of the cost of program operation. The deadline for applications is 5 p.m. June 17 for a project to begin in January 1997.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Monday, July 15, in the conference room of the Office of the State Bank Commissioner, Suite 300, 700 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed changes to administrative regulations of the Kansas Banking Department and K.A.R. 104-1-2, a joint regulation of the Bank Commissioner, Credit Union Administrator and Consumer Credit Commissioner. These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis.

I. New Regulations

New Article 1. Definitions.

K.A.R. 17-1-1 is a newly created article, which defines the term "commissioner" to mean the Kansas state bank commissioner. Its purpose is for simplification of language in all subsequent regulations. There is no economic impact.

New Article 9. Investment Securities.

K.A.R. 17-9-1 through 17-9-10, inclusive, creates an entirely new article and is composed of the investment securities regulations that were previously found at K.A.R. 17-11-1 through 17-11-12. Prior to this amendment, Article 11 had contained a mixed group of subjects. It was decided to move all regulations dealing with investment securities to a new article, so that Article 11 could be devoted solely to documentation requirements. Changes in the language as it appears in new Article 9 are for clarification and cleanup purposes, and do not include any new requirements; therefore, there are no new costs associated with the promulgation of these regulations.

Article 11. Documentation Requirements.

K.A.R. 17-11-23 was created, but contains no new requirements. It separates the issue of charged-off assets and assets acquired in lieu of payment of a debt, which previously were both addressed in 17-11-19. The new regulation deals solely with other assets taken in payment of a debt. K.A.R. 17-11-19 deals solely with charged-off assets.

II. Revoked Regulations

Article 10. Reserves.

The only regulation in this article, K.A.R. 17-10-1, provided a method for computing necessary reserves. Implementation of the Federal Reserve Board's Regulation D in 1980 made this state regulation unnecessary. Revo-

cation will have no economic impact, as it has not been in use since the early 1980s.

Article 11. Documentation Requirements.

K.A.R. 17-11-1 through 17-11-12 dealt with investment securities, most of which were moved to Article 9. K.A.R. 17-11-20, entitled "descriptive matter," was incorporated into 17-11-16, entitled "bonds; records."

Article 16. Charter Applications.

K.A.R. 17-16-3 was substantially incorporated into 17-16-1. There is no economic impact. K.A.R. 17-16-5 required that a public hearing be held for new charters. The intent of the public hearing was to allow the public the opportunity to comment on the application. The same objective is accomplished more effectively through comment letters with much less expense. Revocation of this regulation causes K.A.R. 17-16-6 through 17-16-8 to be unnecessary, as they dealt with aspects of the hearing. There is an economic impact in copying and mailing expenses. There were also possible room rental fees, transcript copy fees, consultant or attorney fees, and court reporter fees, which should be eliminated.

Article 18. Open-end Investment Companies.

K.A.R. 17-18-1 through 17-18-4, inclusive, are being revoked because they have been ineffective since 1987, when they were superseded by Special Order 1987-1 issued by the commissioner. As these regulations currently have no effect, revocation will have no economic impact.

Article 21. Bank Holding Companies; Application for the Acquisition of a Kansas Bank or Bank Holding Company.

The statute which authorized K.A.R. 17-21-7 has since been repealed. Therefore, the regulation is being revoked with no economic impact.

III. Amended Regulations

B. The proposed substantive amendments to the following regulations are summarized below:

Article 11. Documentation Requirements.

K.A.R. 17-11-14. Director's meetings.

This regulation is being amended to clarify and set out specifically what the department is currently requiring of all banks. Rather than setting out these recordkeeping requirements in policy form, it was deemed beneficial to specify them in the body of this regulation. Because there are no "new" requirements, the department does not an-

ticipate any economic impact as a result of these amendments.

K.A.R. 17-11-16. Bonds; records.

This regulation is being updated to reflect current record keeping methods, and to further specify what the examiners will be looking for in the bank's file for each bond. These changes do not constitute any new requirements for banks, and therefore there is no economic impact associated with the proposed amendments.

K.A.R. 17-11-17. Bank-owned real estate; records.

This regulation is being amended first to clarify that it only applies to bank-owned real estate. It also clarifies what types of appraisals will be acceptable for bank-owned real estate. Specifically, the amendments make it clear that a bank is not obligated to use a certified or licensed appraiser on bank-owned real estate. Two officers of the bank, or some other qualified individual, may do these appraisals and/or appraisal updates. This has been the department's interpretation of the language in the current regulation and the amendments are being proposed to clarify this interpretation. The department does not anticipate any economic impact to result from implementation of this clarifying language.

K.A.R. 17-11-18. Loans; documentation requirements.

Many of the proposed amendments to this regulation are intended to clarify existing language and to restructure the regulation. The amendments which impose different requirements concern the required documentation for loans in excess of \$15,000. The proposed amendment increases the floor for these requirements to loans in excess of \$25,000 instead of the current amount of \$15,000. Although it is recognized that banks may sometimes absorb costs relating to these documentation requirements, they are most often passed on to the borrower. Therefore, in most circumstances, the proposed amendments will result in cost savings to the borrower on loans between \$15,000 and \$25,000 for such items as title insurance, appraisals, and credit reports.

K.A.R. 17-11-21. Appraisals and evaluations.

This regulation sets out requirements for appraisals and evaluations of real estate. Currently, an evaluation is required on real property loans greater than \$15,000 but less than \$250,000. The proposed amendments increase the base amount from \$15,000 to \$25,000, and add other exemptions from appraisal and evaluation requirements. In general, the costs for evaluations or appraisals are passed on to the borrower, and the proposed amendments should help to eliminate those costs.

Article 16. Charter Applications.

K.A.R. 17-16-1. Application; filing.

This regulation is being amended to reduce the number of copies of the application that must be filed with the Office from 13 to nine. The change in number of copies will have a minimal economic impact for applicants related to photocopying and mailing expenses.

K.A.R. 17-16-2. Application; contents.

The application contents set out in the amendments are substantially the same requirements as the current regulation, but provide clarification for items required to be submitted, including a specification that financial statements must be less than 90 days old. With regard to the applicant submitting a list of all financial institutions within a 25-mile radius, discretion is given to the commissioner to require something less than this in major metropolitan areas.

K.A.R. 17-16-4. Comment letters; notification of the applicant.

Because K.A.R. 17-16-5 removes the requirement that a public hearing be held in connection with a new charter application, the provisions in this regulation relating to appointment of an investigating subcommittee for the hearing are no longer needed. In place of the hearing, the proposed amendments to K.A.R. 17-16-4 establish a procedure for concerned parties to submit comment letters for consideration by the Banking Board. Because the applicant was responsible for paying all expenses associated with the hearing, these proposed amendments will eliminate costs to the applicant, such as rental of a hearing room and preparation of a transcript. The amendments will not have any measurable economic impact on the department.

K.A.R. 17-16-9. Application; consideration by the board.

In the current regulation, the Banking Board considers the transcript from the hearing on the application and makes its decision. The proposed amendments required the board to consider the comment letters received. The other proposed amendment is only a clarification of the time frame in which the board must make its decision and does not constitute a new or different requirement.

Article 21. Bank Holding Companies; Application for the Acquisition of a Kansas Bank or Bank Holding

Company.

The regulations contained in Article 21 concern bank holding companies and applications for the acquisition of a Kansas bank or bank holding company. The proposed amendments include removal of geographic restrictions to comply with the Riegle-Neal Interstate Banking and Branching Efficiency Act of 1994, and a change in the definition of "control" in K.A.R. 17-21-2. In addition, the proposed amendments change time frames for filing applications and add a requirement in 17-21-4 that the applicant file a notice of intent with the Office of the State Bank Commissioner. The economic impact associated with these amendments is negligible.

This 60-day notice of hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving public comments on the proposed regulations. Written comments shall be submitted prior to the hearing to W. Newton Male, State Bank Commissioner, at the address listed above. Interested persons will be given reasonable opportunity at the hearing to present their views and arguments on the adoption of the proposed regulations; however, presentations should be in writing whenever possible. Any person requiring assistance because of disability should contact the department so appropriate arrangements can be made.

Schools—Organization, Powers and Finances of Boards of Education—Organization Order for Unified School Districts; Contracts; Authority; Indemnification Clause; Irrevocable Letter of Credit. John L. Vratil, Counsel, Unified School District No. 229, Overland Park, April 9, 1996.

A unified school district may not enter into a contractual provision which obligates the school district to incur liability for the actions of persons who are not employees of the school district or which requires the unified school district to secure payment of its obligations in any manner other than those set forth in state statute. A fire district organized pursuant to K.S.A. 19-3601 *et seq.* may enter into a contract with a city within the district to enforce the latter's fire prevention code to the extent it furthers the purpose of the fire district statutes to protect lives and property from the hazards of fire. The neighborhood revitalization act authorizes a municipality to designate only one or more areas for revitalization and not the entire municipality. Additionally, the act allows rebates only to the taxpayer who made the improvements to his or her property and not to subsequent owners of the property. Furthermore, should the act be repealed, a taxpayer will be entitled to continue receiving rebates for improvements to his or her property. Taxation—Bingo—Definitions; Instant Bingo Dispensing Machines. Senator Ben Vidricksen, 24th District, Salina, April 23, 1996.

Instant bingo pull tab dispenser machines, as described herein, are not prohibited by the provisions of the bingo law if used in accordance with the bingo act and any properly adopted rules and regulations of the Department of Revenue. Cited herein: K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 79-4701; 79-4706. JLM

Counties and County Officers—County Commissioners; County Purchasing Agent—Appointment of Purchasing Officer in Johnson and Sedgwick Counties; Requirement that District Court in Johnson and Sedgwick Counties Requisition Supplies from County Purchasing Officer. Judge Ron Rogg, Administrative Judge for the 18th Judicial District, Wichita, April 25, 1996.

K.S.A. 19-260b, which requires that judges of the district courts in Johnson and Sedgwick counties requisition all purchases through a county purchasing officer, does not violate the separation of powers doctrine. However, a charter resolution which exempts a county from K.S.A. 19-260b and which requires the judges of the district court to utilize the services of a county director of purchasing is an invalid use of home rule power because it violates the provisions of K.S.A. 19-101a and 19-101b. Constitution of the State of Kansas—Finance and Taxation—System of Taxation; Classification; Commercial and Industrial Machinery and Equipment; Equipment Defined.

Taxation—Property Valuation, Equalizing Assessments, Appraisers and Assessment of Property—Appraisal of Real and Tangible Personal Property at Fair Market Value in Money; Exceptions; Commercial and Industrial Machinery and Equipment; Equipment Defined. Representative Carol Beggs, 71st District, Salina, April 25, 1996.

Nonconsumable, noninventory items such as beds, sheets and forks necessary to conduct an income producing venture should be valued and taxed as commercial and industrial machinery and equipment as long as they are used for that purpose. A production contract entered into by a corporation and a person engaged in farming pursuant to K.S.A. 17-5904(b) is not subject to the prohibition against corporate farming. A swine facility resulting from a production contract between a corporation and a landowner-contractor, engaged in farming, is not subject to K.S.A. 17-5908, which requires county approval of a swine production facility as defined by the act. This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Director, Room 304-N, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Persons wishing to provide written testimony are asked to limit their correspondence to no more than three typewritten letter-size pages for each regulation. Written testimony should be received in the office of the director no later than Friday, July 5.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting the director at (913) 296-4505.

The regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of proposed regulations and their economic impact follows.

K.A.R. 105-3-2. Eligibility to serve. Amendments to this regulation assist the board in implementing a capital defense system which will ensure that only prequalified death penalty attorneys are appointed to represent capital defendants. New language in the regulation requires that the capital coordinator screen or prequalify all attorneys desiring to be included in the capital appointments panel. The regulation also states that the court may waive all eligibility requirements (except those for capital and other homicide cases) if the attorney selected by the judge has sufficient training, resources (new language) and experience to undertake the case in question. There is no appreciable or measurable fiscal impact on any person, agency, governmental unit or group of persons.

K.A.R. 105-3-12. Appointments in capital cases. This new regulation implements the system for ensuring quality representation of capital defendants. Under the proposed regulation, the court is required to appoint counsel who have been screened by the capital coordinator. All such appointments shall be made after notice to the capital coordinator. This appointment process covers capital and all homicide cases filed pursuant to K.S.A. 21-3401, 21-3402 or 21-3403. The court is required, under this regulation, to appoint the state appellate defender to appeals from conviction of capital and homicide cases. There is no fiscal impact attached to this new regulation.

K.A.R. 105-4-2. Definition of terms. Changes to this regulation are intended to give the board more flexibility in revising the table of reasonable and necessary living expenses, which is the table used in the formula for determination of indigency. Currently, the table of reasonable and necessary living expenses represents 125 percent of the federal poverty income guideline. The board, although having to approve this table in conjunction with any change in the federal guideline, did not perceive the guideline to be indicative of the current "living expenses" as it is defined in the indigency formula.

There is no immediate or perceived fiscal impact since the board has not revised its table of reasonable and necessary living expenses. The potential exists, by changing this regulation, that the board will incur additional costs by loosening the threshold definition of indigency or, by the same token, the board could save state dollars by tightening the definition of indigency by revising the table of living expenses downward. Either of these scenarios is possible but the impact would be minimal and incremental.

K.A.R. 105-5-4. Multiple attorneys. Changes in this regulation allow the board to compensate more than one attorney when the court determines that co-counsel is necessary for an effective defense. This regulation is especially critical in implementing the capital defense system, since the ABA Guidelines require the appointment of two attorneys to represent capital defendants.

The fiscal impact of co-counsel in capital cases is estimated to be approximately \$300,000 annually. The board does not have other options available; however, the appointment of salaried staff attorneys will be made whenever possible in order to reduce the reliance on private counsel.

Article 4.—ACCIDENT AND HEALTH INSURANCE

40-4-35. Medicare supplement policies; minimum standards; requirements. Sections 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, and 24 and appendices A, B, and C of the national association of insurance commissioners' "model regulation to implement the national association of insurance commissioners' medicare supplement insurance minimum standards model act," April 1995 edition, are hereby adopted by reference, subject to the following additions or exceptions:

(a) Section 3 is hereby amended to read as follows: "B.

This regulation shall not apply to:

"(1) A policy or contract of one or more employers or labor organizations, or of the trustees of a fund established by one or more employers or labor organizations, or a combination thereof, for employees or former employees, or a combination thereof, or for members or former members, or a combination thereof, of the labor organizations; and

"(2) individual policies or contracts issued pursuant to a conversion privilege under a policy or contract of group or individual insurance when the group or individual policy or contract includes provisions which are inconsistent with the requirements of this regulation."

(b) Section 3 is hereby amended by the addition of subsection C, which shall read: "This regulation shall supersede any other Kansas administrative regulation to the extent the regulation or any provision of it is inconsistent

with or contrary to this regulation."

(c) Section 7(A)(3) is hereby amended to read as follows: "Each medicare supplement policy or certificate shall provide that benefits designed to cover cost-sharing amounts under medicare will be changed automatically to coincide with any changes in the applicable medicare deductible amount and co-payment percentage factors. Subject to the requirements of section 14B of this regulation or any applicable statutory requirements, premiums may be modified to correspond with such changes."

(d) Section 7(B)(2) is hereby amended to read as follows: "Coverage for all of the medicare part A inpatient

hospital deductible amount."

(e) Section 8(A)(3) is hereby amended to read as follows: "Each medicare supplement policy or certificate shall provide that benefits designed to cover cost-sharing amounts under medicare will be changed automatically to coincide with any changes in the applicable medicare deductible amount and co-payment percentage factors. Subject to the requirements of section 14B of this regulation or any applicable statutory requirements, premiums may be modified to correspond with such changes."

(f) Section 11(A) is hereby amended to read as follows: "An issuer shall not deny or condition the issuance or effectiveness of any medicare supplement policy or certificate available for sale in this state, nor discriminate in

the pricing of a policy or certificate because of health status, claims experience, receipt of health care, or medical condition of an applicant in the case of an application for a policy or certificate that is submitted prior to or during the six-month period beginning with the first day of the first month in which an individual is both 65 years of age or older and enrolled for benefits under medicare part B, or becomes enrolled for benefits under medicare part B without regard to age. An issuer shall not deny coverage to an applicant under 65 years of age who enrolled for benefits under medicare part B prior to the effective date of this regulation when the applicant applies for coverage during the six-month period beginning with the effective date of this regulation. Each medicare supplement policy and certificate currently available from an issuer shall be made available to all applicants who qualify under this subsection without regard to age."

(g) Section 14(B) is hereby amended to read as follows: "An issuer shall not use or charge premium rates for a medicare supplement policy or certificate unless the rates, rating schedule, and supporting documentation have been filed with and approved by the commissioner in accordance with the filing requirements and procedures prescribed by the commissioner. An issuer shall not charge individuals who become eligible for medicare by reason of disability after the effective date of this regulation, and who are under the age of 65, premium rates for any medicare supplement insurance benefit plan offered by the issuer that exceed the issuer's premium rates charged for such plan to individuals who are age 65 or older. An issuer shall not charge those individuals who become eligible for medicare by reason of disability prior to the effective date of this regulation, and who are under the age of 65, premium rates for any medicare supplement insurance benefit plan offered by the issuer that exceed 150% of the rate charged for such plan to medicare supplement insureds who are age 80."

(h) Section 14(C)(2) is hereby amended to read as follows: "With the approval of the commissioner, any issuer may offer up to three additional policy forms or certificate forms of the same type for the same standard medicare supplement benefit plan. One additional form may be of-

fered for each of the following cases:

"(a) The inclusion of new or innovative benefits;

"(b) The addition of either direct response or agent marketing methods; or

"(c) The addition of either guaranteed issue or under-

written coverage."

(i) Section 16(A)(5) is hereby amended to read as follows: "Medicare supplement policies or certificates shall have a notice prominently printed on or attached to the first page of the policy or certificate stating in substance that the policyholder or certificateholder shall have the right to return the policy or certificate within 30 days of its delivery and to have the premium refunded if, after examination of the policy or certificate, the insured person is not satisfied for any reason. Any refund made pursuant to this section shall be paid directly to the applicant by the insurer in a timely manner. The notice shall be printed in not less than 10-point type and shall be printed in bold face type or in some other manner that distin-

guishes it from the print otherwise appearing in the policy"

(j) Section 16(C) is hereby amended by the addition of

the following:

"(5) A description of policy provisions relating to renewability, cancellation, or continuation of coverage, including any reservation of rights to change premium.

"(6) The amount of premium for this policy. The premiums for the policy or certificate shall be shown separately from the premiums for any optional or supplemental riders.

"(7) The name and address of the insurance agent, or the employee of the insurer who assumes responsibility

for completing the outline."

(k) Section 17(E) is hereby amended by the deletion of paragraphs (1) and (2), relating to preexisting conditions,

in their entirety.

(l) Section 17(F) is hereby amended to read as follows: "If a medicare supplement policy or certificate of insurance issued for delivery in this state replaces an existing medicare supplement policy, regardless of the company issuing the policy, the insurer issuing the new policy, in applying any preexisting conditions provisions, waiting periods, elimination periods, and probationary periods, shall make available by rider or otherwise, coverage which provides credit for the satisfaction or partial satisfaction of the same or similar provisions under a previously existing plan."

(m) Section 22 is hereby amended to read as follows: "A. If a medicare supplement policy or certificate replaces another medicare supplement policy or certificate, the replacing issuer shall waive any time periods applicable to preexisting conditions, waiting periods, elimination periods, and probationary periods in the new medicare supplement policy or certificate to the extent such time was

spent under the original policy.

"B. If a medicare supplement policy or certificate replaces another medicare supplement policy or certificate which has been in effect for at least six months, the replacing policy shall not provide any time period applicable to preexisting conditions, waiting periods, elimi-

nation periods, and probationary periods."

(n) This regulation shall become effective April 28, 1996. Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS

111-2-46. "Ask for the sale" promotion. (a) During the period beginning May 1, 1996, and ending May 31, 1996, in addition to compensation provided for in K.A.R. 111-2-4, the Kansas lottery also offers all participating Pump Mart stores located in Kansas an opportunity to participate in a bonus retailer "ask for the sale" incentive

promotion of lottery tickets.

(b) On each Wednesday, May 1, 8, 15, 22, and 29, 1996, from 6:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., all Pump Mart store personnel selling Kansas lottery tickets will ask every adult customer making a purchase if the customer would like to purchase a lottery ticket. If the employee fails to ask adult customers for the purchase of a lottery ticket and the customer brings it to the clerk's attention before leaving the premises, the retailer shall give the adult customer one \$1.00 instant ticket at no charge.

(c) All retailer employees at each location shall wear promotional buttons and display special point-of-sale materials provided by the lottery each Wednesday from 6:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. during the promotion announcing the promotion to its customers. These promotional ma-

terials consist of:

(1) A tent card to be displayed at the point where tickets are sold.

(2) A window/monitor banner to be displayed at the front entrance of the business and/or below the lottery information display system monitor.

These materials must be on display during all hours of the promotion at the times and dates established in subsections (b) and (c) for a store to be eligible for a prize.

(d) The Kansas lottery will provide each location with a credit of \$25 to its account at the beginning of the promotion. If a store increases its instant ticket sales over its predetermined base by 15 percent or more, an additional \$10 will be credited to its account.

(e) Any tickets given away above the \$25 allowance representing 25 tickets or the \$35 allowance representing 35 tickets per location will be the responsibility of the

Hurlbut Corporation.

(f) Each retail location shall maintain a ticket log form to be completed every time an instant ticket is given away. The log will be picked up by the Kansas lottery district manager servicing the retailer location at the end

of the promotion.

(g) At the end of the promotion, the Pump Mart stores with a 15 percent or more increase in instant ticket sales for the 31 day period from May 1, 1996, through May 31, 1996, over an average based upon a 62 day period from February 4, 1996, through April 5, 1996, will be entered into a random drawing for a chance to win a portable compact disc player and will receive 10 additional tickets. The first, seconds and third place stores, based on their percentage increases in instant ticket sales, will receive promotional items provided by the lottery. 111-4-840. Definitions. The following definitions shall apply to the "Quick Change" instant lottery game:

- (a) "Game symbols" are the numbers, letters, symbols, or pictures printed in the play area of each instant game ticket and which determine if the ticket bearer is entitled to a prize. In this instant game, the game symbols are printed in black ink in 10 point WGI font with matching captions in WGI Cap font. A game symbol appears, in each of eight play spots within the play area. SENATE BILL No. 95

An ACT making and concerning appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, and for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997, for state agencies; authorizing certain transfers, capital improvement projects and fees, imposing certain restrictions and limitations, and directing or authorizing certain receipts and disbursements and acts incidental to the foregoing; amending K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 79-2959, 79-2964, 79-3425i and 79-34,147, as amended by section 52 of 1996 Senate Bill No. 428, and repealing the existing sections.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) For the fiscal year ending June 30, 1996, appropriations are hereby made, restrictions and limitations are hereby imposed, and transfers, capital improvement projects, fees, receipts, disbursements and acts incidental to the foregoing are hereby directed or authorized as provided in sections 2 through 50 and sections 147 and 148 of this act.

(b) For the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997, appropriations are hereby made, restrictions and limitations are hereby imposed, and transfers, capital improvement projects, fees, receipts, disbursements and acts incidental to the foregoing are hereby directed or authorized as provided in sections 51 through 151 of this act.

Sec. 2. The department of revenue is hereby authorized and directed to pay the following amounts from the motor-vehicle fuel tax refund fund, for claims not filed within the statutory filing period prescribed in K.S.A. 79-3458 and amendments thereto, to the following claimants:

(c) On July 1, 1996, October 1, 1996, January 1, 1997, and April 1, 1997, the director of accounts and reports shall transfer \$6,775,000 from the state highway fund of the department of transportation to the division of vehicles operating fund of the department of revenue for the purpose of financing the cost of operation and general expense of the division of vehicles and related operations of the department of revenue.

(d) On August 1, 1996, the director of accounts and reports shall transfer \$109,401 from the accounting services recovery fund of the department of administration to the setoff services revenue fund of the department of revenue for reimbursing costs of recovering amounts owed state agencies under K.S.A. 75-6201 et seq., and amendments thereto.

(e) On August 1, 1996, the director of accounts and reports shall transfer \$50,000 from the social welfare fund of the department of social and rehabilitation services to the child support enforcement contractual agreement fund of the department of revenue to reimburse costs of administrative expenses of child support enforcement activities under the agreement.

(f) On August 1, 1996, and on the first day of each month thereafter during fiscal year 1997, the secretary of revenue shall report to the director of the budget and the director of the legislative research department (1) the amount of any increase in the amount of taxes, interest and penalties collected in the immediately preceding month that is attributable to the implementation of the automated tax systems authorized by K.S.A. 75-5147 and amendments thereto, and (2) that portion of such monthly increase in the amount of taxes, interest and penalties which is currently required to pay one or more vendors pursuant to contracts entered into under K.S.A. 75-5147 and amendments thereto for the acquisition or implementation of such automated tax systems. Upon receipt of each such report from the secretary of revenue, the director of the budget and the director of the legislative research department shall jointly certify to the director of accounts and reports the amount reported that is required to be paid to such vendors and the director of accounts and reports shall transfer the amount certified from the state general fund to the automated tax systems fund of the department of revenue. On or before October 10, 1996, January 10, 1997, and April 10, 1997, the secretary of revenue shall submit a report accounting for all amounts credited to and expended from the automated tax systems fund of the department of revenue to the director of the budget, the director of the legislative research department, the chairperson of the house committee on appropriations and the chairperson of the senate committee on ways and means and shall submit a report on the implementation of the automated tax systems to the joint committee on computers and telecommunications.

(d) No expenditures shall be made from the lottery operating fund for additional computer equipment or for expenses associated with a hot backup site except upon approval of the state finance council acting on this matter which is hereby characterized as a matter of legislative delegation and subject to the guidelines prescribed by subsection (c) of K.S.A. 75-3711c and amendments thereto: *Provided, however*, That, prior to approval by the state finance council of any such expenditures from the lottery operating fund, a plan for such expenditures from the lottery operating fund shall be reviewed by the joint committee on computers and telecommunications.

balance as of June 30, 1996, in such account of the state general fund that is reappropriated for fiscal year 1997 and that is in excess of the amount authorized to be expended for fiscal year 1997 from such reappropriated balance, as determined by the director of accounts and reports: Provided further, That, in addition to the limitations prescribed by K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 75-37,115 and amendments thereto, the total amount of any such salary bonus payments to any individual employee during fiscal year 1997 shall not exceed \$1,000. And provided further, That the provisions of this subsection shall apply only to that portion of any such account from which expenditures may be made for state operations.

(b) In addition to other expenditures authorized by law, expenditures may be made from any special revenue fund appropriated by this act for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997, for a state agency named in this act that is participating in the Kansas quality program under K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 75-37,115 and amendments thereto, for the following purposes: (1) Salary bonus payments to permanent full-time or regular part-time employees of the state agency pursuant to subsection (c) of K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 75-37,115 and amendments thereto at the discretion of the agency head, (2) purchase or other acquisition of technology equipment which was included in the budget estimates for fiscal year 1997 submitted by the state agency pursuant to K.S.A. 75-3717 and amendments thereto, , and (3) professional development training in support of the Kansas quality program: Provided. That all such expenditures from such fund for the fiscal year 1997 shall be in addition to any expenditure limitation imposed on such fund or any account thereof for fiscal year 1997: Provided, however, That the total amount of such expenditures from such fund for fiscal year 1997 shall not exceed the amount equal to 50% of the unexpended portion of the amount authorized to be expended from such fund for fiscal year 1996 for state operations, as determined by the director of accounts and reports: Provided further, That, in addition to the limitations prescribed by K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 75-37,115 and amendments thereto, the total amount of any such salary bonus payments to any individual employee during fiscal year 1997 shall not exceed \$1,000: And provided further, That the provisions of this subsection shall apply only to: (1) That portion of the moneys in each account of a special revenue fund from which portion expenditures may be made for state operations, and (2) that portion of the moneys in a special revenue fund, that does not have any such accounts specified in this or other appropriation act, from which portion expenditures may be made for state operations.

(c) Any unencumbered balance in excess of \$100 as of June 30, 1996, in any Kansas quality management account or KQM expenditures account of the state general fund of any state agency named in this act, which was established under the Kansas quality program under K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 75-37,115 and amendments thereto and which is not otherwise specifically appropriated or limited by this or other appropriation act of the 1996 regular session of the legislature, is hereby reappropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997, for the same use and purpose as the same was heretofore appropriated.

(d) Any unencumbered balance in any Kansas quality management account or KQM expenditures account of any special revenue fund of any state agency named in this act, which was established under the Kansas quality program under K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 75-37,115 and amendments thereto and which is not otherwise specifically appropriated or limited by this or other appropriation act of the 1996 regular session of the legislature, is hereby appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997, for the same use and purpose as the same was heretofore appropriated. All expenditures from any such Kansas quality management account or KQM expenditures account of any such special revenue fund shall be in addition to any expenditure limitation imposed on such special revenue fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997.

Sec. 147. Appeals to exceed position limitations. The limitations imposed by this act on the number of full-time and regular part-time positions equated to full-time, excluding seasonal and temporary positions, paid from appropriations made in this act or in any appropriation act of the 1995 regular session of the legislature or in any other appropriation act of the 1996 regular session of the legislature may be exceeded upon approval of the state finance council.

Sec. 148. Appeals to exceed limitations. Upon written application to the governor and approval of the state finance council, expenditures from special revenue funds may exceed the amounts specified in this act.

Sec. 149. Savings. Any unencumbered balance as of June 30, 1996, in any special revenue fund, or account thereof, which is not otherwise specifically appropriated or limited by this or other appropriation act of the 1996 regular session of the legislature, is hereby appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997, for the same use and purpose as the same was heretofore appropriated.

Sec. 150. Federal grants. Each federal grant or other federal receipt which is received by a state agency named in this act and which is not otherwise appropriated to that state agency by this or other appropriation act of the 1996 regular session of the legislature, is hereby appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997, for that state agency for the purpose set forth in such federal grant or receipt, except that no expenditure shall be made from and no obligation shall be incurred against any such federal grant or other federal receipt, which has not been previously appropriated or reappropriated or approved for expenditure by the governor, until the governor has authorized the state agency to make expenditures therefrom.

Sec. 151. Any transfers of money during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997, from any special revenue fund of any state agency named in this act to the audit services fund of the division of post audit under K.S.A. 46-1121 and amendments thereto shall be in addition to any expenditure limitation imposed on any such fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997.

Sec. 152. On July 1, 1996, K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 79-2959 is hereby amended to read as follows: 79-2959. (a) There is hereby created the local ad valorem tax reduction fund. All moneys transferred or credited to such fund under the provisions of this act or any other law shall be apportioned and distributed in the manner provided herein.

(b) On January 15 and on July 15 of each year, the director of accounts and reports shall make transfers in equal amounts which in the aggregate equal 4.5% of the total retail sales and compensating taxes credited to the state general fund pursuant to articles 36 and 37 of chapter 79 of Kansas Statutes Annotated and acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto during the preceding calendar year from the state general fund to the local ad valorem tax reduction fund, except that: (1) The transfers on January 15 and July 15 of each year shall be in equal amounts which in the aggregate equal 3.630% of such taxes credited to the state general fund during the preceding calendar year; and (2) the amount of the transfer on each such date during state fiscal year 1996 1997 shall be equal to 103.7% 101.4% of the amount transferred on the same date during state fiscal year 1995 1996. All such transfers are subject to reduction under K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 75-6704 and amendments thereto. All transfers made in accordance with the provisions of this section shall be considered to be demand transfers from the state general fund.

(c) The state treasurer shall apportion and pay the amounts transferred under subsection (b) to the several county treasurers on January 15 and on July 15 in each year as follows: (1) Sixty-five percent of the amount to be distributed shall be apportioned on the basis of the population figures of the counties certified to the secretary of state pursuant to K.S.A. 11-201 and amendments thereto on July 1 of the preceding year; and (2) thirty-five percent of such amount shall be apportioned on the basis of the equalized assessed tangible valuations on the tax rolls of the counties on November 1 of the preceding year as certified by the director of property valuation.

Sec. 153. On July 1, 1996, K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 79-2964 is hereby amended to read as follows: 79-2964. There is hereby created the county and city revenue sharing fund. All moneys transferred or credited to such fund under the provisions of this act or any other law shall be allocated and distributed in the manner provided herein. The director of accounts and reports in each year on July 15 and December 10, shall make transfers in equal amounts which in the aggregate equal 3.5% of the total retail sales and compensating taxes credited to the state general fund pursuant to articles 36 and 37 of chapter 79 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated and acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto during the preceding

calendar year from the state general fund to the county and city revenue sharing fund, except that: (a) The transfers on July 15 and December 10 of each year shall be in equal amounts which in the aggregate equal 2.823% of such taxes credited to the state general fund during the preceding calendar year; and (b) the amount of the transfer on each such date during state fiscal year 1996 1997 shall be equal to 193.7% 101.4% of the amount transferred on the same date during state fiscal year 1995 1996. All such transfers are subject to reduction under K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 75-6704 and amendments thereto. All transfers made in accordance with the provisions of this section shall be considered to be demand transfers from the state general fund.

Sec. 154. On July 1, 1996, K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 79-3425i is hereby amended to read as follows: 79-3425i. On January 15 and July 15 of each year, the director of accounts and reports shall transfer a sum equal to the total taxes collected under the provisions of K.S.A. 79-6a04 and 79-6a10, and amendments thereto, and credited to the state general fund during the six months next preceding the date of transfer, from the state general fund to the special city and county highway fund, created by K.S.A. 79-3425, and amendments thereto, except that: (1) Such transfers are subject to reduction under K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 75-6704, and amendments thereto; and (2) the amount of the transfer on each such date during state fiscal year 1906 1997 shall not exceed the amount equal to 193.7% 101.4% of the amount transferred on the same date during state fiscal year 1995 1996. All transfers under this section shall be considered to be demand transfers from the state general fund.

Sec. 155. On July 1, 1996, K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 79-34,147, as amended by section 52 of 1996 Senate Bill No. 428, is hereby amended to read as follows: 79-34,147. (a) On each January 1, April 1, July 1 and October 1, the secretary of revenue shall certify to the director of accounts and reports the amount equal to 7.628% of the total revenues received by the secretary from the taxes imposed under the Kansas retailers' sales tax act and deposited in the state treasury and credited to the state general fund during the preceding three calendar months.

(b) Upon receipt of each certification under subsection (a), the director of accounts and reports shall transfer from the state general fund to the state highway fund an amount equal to the amount so certified, on each January 1, April 1, July 1 and October 1, except that: (1) the amount of the transfer on each such date during state fiscal year 1996 1997 shall not exceed the amount equal to 103.7% 101.4% of the amount transferred on the same date during state fiscal year 1995; and (2) the amount transferred on April 1, 1996, shall be adjusted so that the total of all amounts transferred during state fiscal year 1996 does not exceed the amount equal to 102.1445% of the total of all amounts transferred during state fiscal year 1995 1996. All transfers made pursuant to this section are subject to reduction under K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 75-6704, and amendments thereto.

(c) All transfers made in accordance with the provisions of this section shall be considered to be demand transfers from the state general fund. Sec. 156. On July 1, 1996, K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 79-2959, 79-2964, 79-3425i and 79-34,147, as amended by section 52 of 1996 Senate Bill No.

428, are hereby repealed.

Sec. 157. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Kansas register.

State of Kansas

Office of the Governor

Message to the Senate of the State of Kansas:

Pursuant to Article 2, Section 14 of the Constitution of the State of Kansas, I hereby return Senate Bill 95 with my signature approving the bill, except for the items enumerated below.

That portion of Section 80(b) which reads as follows has been line-item vetoed:

"Public broadcasting capital equipment

\$90,611

Provided, That all expenditures from the public broad-casting capital equipment fund shall be made to provide matching funds for federal capital equipment grants awarded to eligible public broadcasting stations: Provided further, That expenditures from this fund may be made to provide matching funds for capital equipment projects funded from any non-state source in the event federal capital equipment grants are not awarded: And provided further, That in the event the federal facility programs cease to exist or fail to conduct grant solicitations, expenditures may be made from this fund to provide matching funds for capital equipment projects funded from any non-state source without first applying for federal capital equipment grants."

Section 80(g) has been line-item vetoed in its entirety.

That portion of Section 127(b) which reads as follows has been line-item vetoed:

"Economic development initiatives grant

\$134,025

Provided, That expenditures may be made from the economic development initiatives grant fund for state operations: Provided further, That expenditures from this fund for state operations shall not exceed \$13,400: Provided further, That expenditures from this fund, other than expenditures for state operations, shall be made only for the purpose of matching an equal or greater amount of federal grant moneys or local grant moneys, or both, for arts programming: And provided further, That expenditures from this fund shall be made in a manner to benefit the maximum number of Kansas communities in the development of Kansas art and talent."

Section 127(c) has been line-item vetoed in its entirety.

That portion of Section 130(b) which reads as follows has been line-item vetoed:

"EDIF other operating expenditure fund \$43,648 EDIF Kansas humanities council fund 25,000."

Sections 130 (c) and (d) have been line-item vetoed in their entirety.

That portion of Section 140(a) which reads as follows has been line-item vetoed:

"Economic development fund \$115,000"

Section 140(b) has been line-item vetoed in its entirety.

All of the line-item vetoes enumerated above related to expenditures from the Economic Development Initiatives Fund do not directly relate to my vision of an economic development infrastructure for Kansas. These items include arts programming, operation of historical sites, a grant to the Kansas Humanities Council, operation of the State Fair and capital outlay for public broadcasting. I included the amount for operations of the State Fair from the State General Fund in my initial budget recommendations and encourage the Legislature to restore the financing as I have recommended. All other items enumerated above represent increases to the amount I recommended for these areas. Although I believe that my initial recommendations were adequate for these areas, I am submitting a Governor's Budget Amendment to finance all of the above items from the State General Fund. This is in recognition of the priority of the Legislature to fund these items and my priority to finance only items directly related to economic development from the Economic Development Initiatives Fund. I encourage the Legislature to adopt this budget amendment.

Section 16 has been line-item vetoed in its entirety.

The item noted above relates to the reimbursement of legal costs requested by a former bank examiner following employment litigation between the examiner and the Office of the State Bank Commissioner. The former state employee was rightfully dismissed after pleading guilty to the charge of aiding and abetting a violation of a fed-

eral law prohibiting certain loan activities between banks and bank examiners. The former employee's claim was added to the claims bill only as the result of a floor amendment. I support the conclusion of the agency, the Kansas Attorney General, and the 1995 Joint Committee on Special Claims against the State. The taxpayers of Kansas and the Office of the State Bank Commissioner bear no legal liability to pay for this wrongful claim.

Section 73 has been line-item vetoed in its entirety.

That portion of Section 74 which reads as follows has been line-item vetoed:

"Ombudsman of Corrections 4.0"

The line-item vetoes above relate to the FY 1997 appropriation made by the Legislature to the Ombudsman of Corrections, an agency created to address complaints and legal concerns of inmates. Since inmate concerns can be addressed by more efficient means, I do not recommend an appropriation for the continuation of the Ombudsman of Corrections agency or its related positions. Instead, I recommend \$85,000 from the State General Fund for the Board of Indigents' Defense Services to increase the grant amount awarded to Legal Services for Prisoners, Inc. (LSP). This increased grant amount will allow LSP to provide comprehensive legal assistance and complaint resolution services to inmates in addition to inmate complaint resolution services already provided by the Department of Corrections.
