A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Thursday, August 15, in the conference room in the office of the Kansas Real Estate Commission, Three Townsite Plaza, Suite 200, 120 S.E. 6th Ave., Topeka, to consider the adoption of an amendment to regulation 86-3-25.

This 60-day notice of public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulation. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Kansas Real Estate Commission, Three Townsite Plaza, Suite 200, 120 S.E. 6th Ave., Topeka, 66603-3511. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulation during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

The regulation is proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the regulation and its economic impact follows.

Regulation 86-3-25 prescribes a mandatory form which licensees must provide to prospective sellers and buyers of real estate for which the present or intended use is one to four residential units. The cost to the agency will be providing the camera-ready form to brokerage firms. The cost of printing the form is estimated at \$200 and the cost of mailing at \$1,000. The cost to firms will be the cost of copying the form and providing it to their licensees.

**Notice Concerning Variance Request  
from Hazardous Waste Regulations**

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is providing public notice that on March 22, 1996, the EPA Region 7 RCRA Storage Facility, 25 Funston Road, Kansas City, Kansas, submitted a request for renewal of a variance from specific hazardous waste regulations in accordance with K.A.R. 28-31-13(a). The current variance request will expire December 5, 1996. The variance is requested from K.A.R. 28-31-4 and 40 CFR 265.176, which require the storage of containers holding ignitable hazardous waste must be located at least 15 meters (50 feet) from the facility's property line.

The EPA stores ignitable solvents. The room is separate from the laboratory facility, is the most acceptable location for the storage of ignitable wastes, and is designed to be explosion proof. Positive ventilation is provided to reduce vapor concentrations in the event of a spill, thereby reducing the chance of explosive concentrations. The EPA believes locating the room at another location is not possible due to space limitations. KDHE has reviewed the variance request and concluded that the variance is justified.

In accordance with K.A.R. 28-31-13(b), public notice was provided that KDHE considered the request for a variance justified and made a tentative decision to grant the variance. A public comment period to receive comments regarding this tentative decision was established between April 25 and May 25, 1996. No public comments were received.

Therefore, in accordance with K.A.R. 28-31-13(b), KDHE announces its decision to approve this request for a variance and not to include any special conditions. The variance shall become effective on June 6, 1996, and shall remain in effect until June 6, 2006.

### Kansas Lottery

#### Temporary Administrative Regulations

#### Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS

**111-2-1.** Application to become a lottery retailer. (a)  
Persons or businesses wanting to sell lottery tickets or

shares shall apply to the Kansas lottery on forms available through the lottery headquarters in Topeka or through any lottery regional office.

(b) Each application to become an instant lottery retailer shall be accompanied by a fee of \$50.00. All fees shall be non-refundable.

(c) The application fee to become an on-line retailer shall be \$100.00. Additionally, on-line retailers shall be subject to the following:

(1) Effective June 30, 1996, retailers required to have dedicated telephone lines will be charged \$10.00 per week.

(2) Certain retailers whose businesses are seasonal or are based at events in which Kansas lottery staff is participating, regularly occur four or fewer days a week during the season, may qualify for cellular telephone services rather than dedicated telephone lines. There shall be no service charges for those on-line retailers selected to receive cellular telephone services available from the lottery.

(d) To become an on-line lottery retailer, an applicant must also be an instant lottery retailer and actively offer for sale at least one of the current instant games offered by the lottery, unless approved by the executive director as a "social environment establishment" defined at K.A.R. 111-6-1.

(e) An applicant receiving a lottery retailer certificate pursuant to K.S.A. 74-8708, as amended, may apply for a temporary lottery retailer certificate, good for no more than fourteen days, at a specific location, for special lottery events and other events approved by the executive director. An application for a temporary lottery retailer certificate shall designate the event and the specific location where tickets will be sold.

(f) No sale shall be made at any location not authorized by the executive director or his designee. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8708 and K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710 and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-88-38, Sept. 28, 1987, amended, T-88-61, Dec. 19, 1987; amended, T-111-12-1-88, Dec. 1, 1988; amended, T-111-2-28-95, Feb. 17, 1995; amended, T-111-5-22-96, May 15, 1996.)

**111-2-30. Retailer bonus; Powerball and Cash Lotto.** (a) On all Powerball and Cash Lotto drawings in which the prize claimed and awarded is the "jackpot prize" offered in the game it represents, the Kansas lottery-retailer(s) selling the ticket(s) shall receive \$10,000 for Powerball and \$1,000 for Cash Lotto, or share equally in a bonus if there are multiple winners. The bonus shall be in addition to compensation specified in K.A.R. 111-2-4.

(b) A "jackpot prize" is the highest prize awarded for correctly matching all the numbers reflected in the prize structure of the Powerball or Cash Lotto game it represents.

(c) For all Powerball or Keno \$100,000 winners for drawings occurring on and after May 15, 1996, the Kansas lottery retailer selling the ticket shall receive \$1,000. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-8-5-94, July 15, 1994; amended, T-111-3-22-95, March 16, 1995; amended, T-111-5-22-96, May 15, 1996.)

**111-2-47. "Ask for the sale" promotion.** (a) During the period beginning June 1, 1996, and ending June 30, 1996, in addition to compensation provided for in K.A.R. 111-2-4, the Kansas lottery also offers all Pic Quik stores located in Kansas an opportunity to participate in a bonus retailer "ask for the sale" incentive promotion of lottery tickets.

(b) On each Friday in June 1996, including June 7, 14, 21, and 28, all Pic Quik stores' personnel selling Kansas lottery tickets will ask every adult customer making a purchase if the customer would like to purchase a lottery ticket. If the employee fails to ask adult customers for the purchase of a lottery ticket and the customer brings it to the clerk's attention before leaving the premises, the retailer shall give the adult customer \$1.00 instant lottery ticket at no charge.

(c) All retailer employees at each location shall wear promotional buttons and display special point-of-sale materials provided by the lottery each Friday from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. during the promotion announcing the promotion to its customers. These promotional materials consist of:

(1) A tent card to be displayed at the point where tickets are sold.

(2) A window/monitor banner to be displayed at the front entrance of the business and/or below the lottery information display system monitor.

These materials must be on display during all hours of the promotion at the times and dates established in subsections (b) and (c) for a store to be eligible for a prize.

(d) The Kansas lottery will provide each location with a credit of \$35. This will be credited to each store's account at the beginning of the promotion.

(e) Any tickets given away above the \$35 allowance representing 35 tickets per location will be the responsibility of Pic Quik stores.

(f) Each retail location shall maintain a ticket log form to be completed every time a lottery ticket is given away. The log will be picked up by the Kansas lottery district manager servicing the retailer location at the end of the promotion.

(g) At the end of the promotion, the Pic Quik store with the greatest percentage increase in lottery ticket sales for the period from June 1, 1996, through June 30, 1996, over the period from June 1, 1995, through June 30, 1995, will win a portable compact disc player and promotional items. The second and third place stores will receive promotional items provided by the lottery. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8708; effective, T-111-5-22-96, May 15, 1996.)

#### Article 4.—INDIVIDUAL GAME RULES

##### LENEXA BARBEQUE DRAWING

**111-4-572. Name of drawing.** (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant ticket drawing entitled "Lenexa BarBeQue Drawing." The date of the drawing shall coincide with the annual "Lenexa BarBeQue Championship" at Sar-Ko-Par Park in Lenexa, Kansas.

(b) The drum shall be open during lottery selling hours at the "Lenexa BarBeQue" on June 21, 1996, and June 22,

1996, until immediately prior to the drawing on June 22, 1996. Ten tickets shall be drawn at 4:30 p.m. on June 22, 1996. This drawing shall take place at the lottery selling booth at the west end of Sar-Ko-Par Park, 87th Street and Lackman, Lenexa, Kansas.

(c) Rules applicable to the "Lenexa BarBeQue Drawing" are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-572 through 111-4-578. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-20-94, May 13, 1994; amended, T-111-5-3-95, April 27, 1995; amended, T-111-5-22-96, May 15, 1996.)

**111-4-574. Location of drawings.** "Lenexa BarBeQue Drawing" shall be held at Sar-Ko-Par Park in Lenexa, Kansas on June 22, 1996. The drawing will be held at the Lottery selling location at the west end of Sar-Ko-Par Park, 87th Street and Lackman, Lenexa, Kansas. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-20-94, May 13, 1994; amended, T-111-5-3-95, April 27, 1995; amended, T-111-5-22-96, May 15, 1996.)

**111-4-575. Prizes.** The 10 winners selected at the "Lenexa BarBeQue Drawing" specified in subsection (b) of K.A.R. 111-4-572 on June 22, 1996, shall receive a prize of not less than \$100. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-20-94, May 13, 1994; amended, T-111-5-3-95, April 27, 1995; amended, T-111-5-22-96, May 15, 1996.)

**111-4-576. Entry into drawing.** Entry into the "Lenexa BarBeQue Drawing" is accomplished by the process detailed in the following subparagraphs:

(a) Obtain a valid Kansas instant \$1.00 lottery ticket purchased from the lottery selling location at the 1996 "Lenexa BarBeQue Championship."

(b) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with any instant game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the "Lenexa BarBeQue Drawing" and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules.

(c) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for winning the drawing and the holder of the ticket may enter the "Lenexa BarBeQue Drawing."

(d) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner.

(e) The holder of the non-winning ticket must take the non-winning ticket with the completed information form to the location of the "Lenexa BarBeQue Drawing" and place it in the receptacle or drum provided.

(f) The receptacle or drum shall be available, and entries may be made at the times stated in K.A.R. 111-4-572. Entries shall be allowed until the actual winner selection process begins.

(g) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the "Lenexa BarBeQue Drawing" or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(h) The drawings will be conducted at the approximate times listed in K.A.R. 111-4-572.

(i) There is no limit to the number of entries a participant may make. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710(b); effective, T-111-5-20-94,



May 13, 1994; amended, T-111-5-3-95, April 27, 1995; amended, T-111-5-22-96, May 15, 1996.)

**111-4-577. Determination of "Lenexa BarBeQue Drawing" winners.** (a) At least 5 minutes before the drawing, the person designated by the executive director shall announce to the audience that the winner selection process will begin. Any persons wishing to enter the drawing who have not yet done so shall immediately place their tickets into the receptacle or drum at this time.

(b) Prior to sealing the receptacle or drum, the person designated by the executive director shall announce that entries into the "Lenexa BarBeQue Drawing" are closed. No further entries will be accepted.

(c) The receptacle or drum shall be sealed and capable of being mixed with a shovel or by other means for two minutes or rotated a minimum of 10 times to ensure random selection.

(d) The executive director shall designate one individual of his choice to participate in the selection process.

(e) The selection of "Lenexa BarBeQue Drawing" winners on June 22, 1996, shall be accomplished by the individual designated by the executive director, using a bare arm technique, who shall remove 10 tickets, one at a time, from the receptacle or drum in which all entries were placed at approximately 4:30 p.m. A person representing the executive director and a person representing Kansas lottery security shall review the selected ticket to determine if the name stated on the information form located on the back of the selected ticket is legible. If the name is determined to be legible, the name of the winner shall be announced to the audience. This process shall be repeated until 10 valid winners have been selected.

(f) The named person is not required to be present in order to win the "Lenexa BarBeQue Drawing" prizes described in K.A.R. 111-4-575. The security representative conducting the drawing shall be responsible for the final determination concerning the legibility of the name on any ticket drawn, but regardless of the number of entries a person whose name appears on a valid entry drawn in the "Lenexa BarBeQue Drawing" has made, he or she shall not be eligible to win more than one prize. The first prize winning ticket drawn for such an entrant invalidates all other entries for the "Lenexa BarBeQue Drawing" for that entrant.

(g) A person whose valid ticket has been drawn from the receptacle or drum at each drawing shall be determined a "Lenexa BarBeQue Drawing" winner.

(h) Each winner shall be given a prize claim form to be completed and returned to the lottery.

(i) If the name on any ticket drawn is not legible, the ticket drawn will be void and the selection process shall be repeated until a valid winning ticket is selected. The drawing will be held at the lottery selling location west of building 40. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-20-94, May 13, 1994; amended, T-111-5-3-95, April 27, 1995; amended, T-111-5-22-96, May 15, 1996.)

**111-4-582. Prizes.** The 10 winners selected at the "Corporate Woods Jazz Festival Drawing" specified in subsection (b) of K.A.R. 111-4-579 on June 9, 1996, shall receive a prize of not less than \$100 each. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-20-94, May 13, 1994; amended, T-111-5-3-95, April 27, 1995; amended, T-111-5-22-96, May 15, 1996.)

**111-4-583. Entry into drawing.** Entry into the "Corporate Woods Jazz Festival Drawing" is accomplished by the process detailed in the following subparagraphs:

(a) Obtain a valid Kansas \$1.00 instant lottery ticket.

(b) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with any instant game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the "Corporate Woods Jazz Festival Drawing" and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules.

(c) If the ticket is a valid non-winning \$1.00 ticket, and was purchased at the Kansas lottery selling location at the "Corporate Woods Jazz Festival," the ticket is eligible for winning the drawing and the holder of the ticket may enter the "Corporate Woods Jazz Festival Drawing."

**111-4-584. Determination of "Corporate Woods Jazz Festival Drawing" winners.** (a) At least 5 minutes before the drawing, the person designated by the executive director shall announce to the audience that the winner selection process will begin. Any persons wishing to enter the drawing who have not yet done so shall immediately place their tickets into the receptacle or drum at this time.

(b) Prior to sealing the receptacle or drum, the person designated by the executive director shall announce that entries into the "Corporate Woods Jazz Festival Drawing" are closed. No further entries will be accepted.

(c) The receptacle or drum shall be sealed and capable of being mixed with a shovel or by other means for two minutes or rotated a minimum of 10 times to ensure random selection.

(d) The executive director shall designate one individual of his choice to participate in the selection process.

In this instant game, the game symbols are printed in black ink in 10 point WGI Symbol font with matching captions in WGI Cap font. A game symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and in the "LUCKY NUMBERS" area within the play area. (b) "Game symbol captions" are the words or portions of words, letters or numbers printed beneath each game symbol in the play area and are used to repeat or explain the game symbol. The game symbol caption associated with each game symbol is as follows:

(c) "Ticket validation number" means a unique number appearing on each ticket which is used to validate winning tickets. For this instant game, the ticket validation number is an 11-digit number which appears under the latex covering on the front of each instant ticket.

(d) "Book-ticket number" means the unique number appearing on each ticket which includes the number of the book from which it was removed and the serially assigned number of the ticket within that book. For this instant game, the book-ticket number is an 8-digit number followed by a dash and than a 3-digit ticket number. The ticket numbers in each book start with 000 and end with 149. The book-ticket number is printed in black ink on the back of each instant game ticket both above the information form and below the bar code.

**111-4-858. Determination of instant prize winners.** An instant prize winner is determined for this instant game when the player removes or "scratches off" the removable layer of material covering play areas entitled "YOUR NUMBERS" and "LUCKY NUMBERS" to reveal the game symbols and captions in the play area. If any of the ten numbers under the "LUCKY NUMBERS" area matches either number in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, the player wins the amount shown directly under the matching number or numbers in the "LUCKY NUMBERS" area. Should the "PICK" symbol appear in the "LUCKY NUMBERS" area, the player automatically wins the amount under the pick. A player can win up to ten times on a single ticket. **111-5-36. Prizes.** The prize winners selected in the Powerball Raffle Drawing shall receive the following prizes:

**111-5-37. Method of entry.** Entry into the Powerball Raffle Drawing shall be accomplished by the following steps:

(a) With every single Powerball ticket purchase of \$5.00 or more issued by Dara's Fast Lane stores between 6:00 a.m. on May 28, 1996, and 1:00 a.m. on June 16, 1996, the ticket purchaser will also receive an entry ticket for the Powerball Raffle Drawing. Only entry tickets based upon single Powerball ticket purchases of \$5.00 or more generated by terminals in Dara's Fast Lane stores will be eligible to win a prize. **111-5-38. Certification of drawing.** (a) The Powerball Raffle Drawing shall be personally observed by a Kansas lottery security official and by a promotion coordinator.

(b) Upon completion of each drawing, the security official and the draw manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of the prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710(b); effective, T-111-5-22-96, May 15, 1996.)

**111-5-39. Selection of winners.** The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the Powerball Raffle Drawing:

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing Powerball Raffle Drawing envelopes at the United States Post Office in Lawrence, Kansas, on a daily basis.

The last mail pick up will be made at approximately 7:00 a.m. on Tuesday, June 25, 1996, and only entries picked up by that time will be eligible for the drawing.

(b) Lottery personnel shall transport the mail to the mail room where the entries will be removed from the envelopes and placed in a secure receptacle by lottery security personnel.

(c) The selection process shall be held at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, June 27, 1996. The drawings shall be held at lottery headquarters in a place accessible to the public and be open for public attendance and with lottery security personnel present. The drawings shall be audio and videotaped.

(d) Prior to each drawing, the drum or receptacle shall be sealed and the contents mixed by rotating the drum five times, if a drum is used, or by mixing the contents with a shovel or by other means for at least three minutes if another type receptacle is used.

(e) The designated individual shall then unseal the drum or receptacle, and using the bare-arm technique, remove one ticket entry from the drum or receptacle. The above procedure shall be repeated until all three valid entries have been drawn, with the first valid entry receiving the first prize, the second valid entry receiving the second prize, and the third valid entry receiving the third prize.

(f) After all three entries have been drawn and certified valid, three more entries will be drawn, one at a time, to serve as alternate entries. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, and 3A. The alternate ticket entries will be used only if one or more of the original winners cannot be located or declared ineligible. If an alternate entry is used, all other entries will be moved up, in the order drawn, to the appropriate prize level.

(g) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each ticket drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the Powerball Raffle Drawing in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid non-winning ticket and the name is legible, the draw manager and the security person all record the name of the winner and the winner shall be promptly notified.

(h) If an entry ticket is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded, and other ticket removed. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.

(i) The person whose name appears on the back of the entry ticket on the entry drawn shall win the prize identified in K.A.R. 111-5-36, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(j) All Powerball Raffle Drawing tickets remaining in the drum or receptacle on June 27, 1996, after all winners have been selected and certified shall be destroyed. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710(b); effective, T-111-5-22-96, May 15, 1996.)

**111-5-40. Rights of participants.** Any Kansas Powerball entry ticket entered into the Powerball Raffle Drawing is disqualified from any other Kansas lottery prize or eligibility for which that entry ticket may have been redeemable. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710(d); effective, T-111-5-22-96, May 15, 1996.)

Article 2.—BUSINESS RECOVERY—  
CONTINGENCY PLANNING

**121-2-1. Contingency planning.** (a) Plan establishment. Each credit union shall develop and maintain a current written contingency and business recovery plan (the "plan") meeting the requirements of subsection (b) to provide an established basis for action in the event that the credit union is affected by a natural disaster or other event causing the disruption of operations.

(b) Plan requirements. The plan shall establish processes and procedures to reduce the duration of extended disruptions of key or critical services of the credit union to its members, minimize financial loss to the credit union and ensure a timely resumption of operations. The plan shall:

- (1) identify key or critical products or services provided by the credit union;
- (2) identify and assess the credit union's exposure to specific and general risks, including the failure of operating systems and interruption of service from third-party service providers, if applicable, which may interfere with the credit union's operations in providing the key or critical products or services;
- (3) state the key assumptions on which the plan is predicated;
- (4) state the credit union's response to the identified risk, including steps which shall be taken before a disruption of service from the identified risks to minimize the potential impact of the disruption;
- (5) address data reconstruction and provide for secure and remote backup storage of data files, programs, and records;

(6) state the alternative responses to the event triggering the interruption of service, if the credit union's response is dependent upon the anticipated duration of the service interruption; and

(7) provide for the relocation of the credit union, recovery of necessary data and operating systems and resumption of key or critical products and services.

(c) Testing. The credit union shall annually conduct one or more operational tests of the plan for each identified key or critical product or service. The credit union shall document results of the test or tests, including identified weaknesses and corrective action taken.

(d) Plan review. The board of directors shall at least annually review and approve the credit union's plan. The review and approval shall be reflected in the minutes of the credit union.

(e) Compliance date. Each credit union in existence on the effective date of this regulation shall comply with the provisions of this regulation not later than one year after the effective date of this regulation. Each other credit union shall comply with the requirements of this regulation not later than one year after the credit union becomes a Kansas chartered credit union. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 17-2206(a); effective June 21, 1996.)

Article 10.—ANIMAL HEALTH

**112-10-38. Vaccinations.** (a) Every greyhound at each racing facility shall be periodically vaccinated against each disease that the animal health officer has determined is communicable to other greyhounds at the facility.

(1) The racing secretary shall maintain records of vaccinations of each greyhound housed at the racing facility and shall make such records available to the animal health officer or the animal health officer's designee upon request.

(2) No licensee may permit a greyhound to remain on its grounds unless the trainer or kennel owner of the greyhound provides proof of the necessary vaccinations to the racing secretary within three racing days of the greyhound's arrival at the racing facility.

(3) The record of each vaccination series shall be signed by the licensed veterinarian administering the vaccine and shall include the vaccine's trade name and expiration date.

(b) Every greyhound kenneled at a racing facility shall be vaccinated against rabies by a licensed veterinarian and shall receive booster vaccinations on an annual basis.

(c) Every trainer or kennel owner bringing a greyhound into a racing facility shall file with the racing secretary for each greyhound a copy of its registration cer-

(continued)

tificate and an individual certificate of vaccination which shall include the following:

- (1) the name of the greyhound;
  - (2) the sex of the greyhound;
  - (3) the whelping date of the greyhound;
  - (4) a complete history of rabies vaccinations; and
  - (5) a description of any and all identification including:
    - (A) tattoos; and
    - (B) color.
- (d) The certificate required by subsection (c) above shall be filed with the racing secretary before any start made by the greyhound and shall remain on permanent file with the secretary.

(e) Each greyhound entering Kansas, regardless of the state or country in which it was whelped, shall be accompanied by a small animal health certificate issued by the division of animal health of the state or country of departure. This certificate shall list the following:

- (1) the names of both the consignor and the consignee;
- (2) both addresses;
- (3) the name and age of the greyhound; and
- (4) the greyhound's rabies vaccination status which shall be signed by a veterinarian and shall include the vaccine's trade name and expiration date.

The certificate shall be dated within 30 days before arrival in Kansas. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8804; implementing K.S.A. 74-8806; effective Dec. 22, 1995; amended June 21, 1996.)

#### Article 17.—COUNTY FAIR OR HORSEMEN'S NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION

**112-17-15. Distribution of monies from horse fair racing benefit fund.** The procedure for distributing monies from the horse fair racing benefit fund shall be as follows:

(a) Each applicant shall submit an application for funds to the commission which shall include:

- (1) the name, address and telephone number of the applicant;
- (2) the total amount of funds requested by the applicant, as well as a statement of justification for the request;
- (3) the applicant's tax identification number;
- (4) the applicant's proposed budget for the race meeting covered by the application;
- (5) a detailed narrative, including invoices and receipts, specifically identifying the amount of funds requested by the applicant; and
- (6) additional information as requested by the commission.

(b) Monies from the horse fair racing benefit fund shall be expended as follows:

(1) For administrative expenses reimbursable to the commission, which may include:

(A) the cost of stewards, racing judges, and assistant animal health officers performing services at the race meetings conducted by applicant;

(B) travel and lodging expenses of commissioners, commission employees or agents of the commission performing services at race meetings conducted by the applicant;

(C) lab fees; and

(D) such other administrative expenses as may be determined by the commission;

(2) for the cost of totalisator expenses incurred by the applicant;

(3) for the cost of background investigations of members of the applicant as required under the Kansas pari-mutuel racing act;

(4) for purse supplements at race meetings conducted by the applicant;

(5) for basic operating assistance grants to the applicant as determined by the commission; and

(6) for costs to the applicant for employment of key racing officials, as determined by the commission.

(c) Applications shall be submitted to the commission yearly, no later than December 31st of the calendar year preceding the race meeting for which funds are requested.

(d) Each application shall be reviewed and evaluated by commission staff for the purpose of making a recommendation to the commission.

(e) Each application shall be evaluated using the following criteria:

- (1) The applicant's compliance with K.S.A. 74-8838;
- (2) the adequacy of the detail in the application; and
- (3) the quality of the justification stated in the application;

(f) Each applicant to whom funds are distributed shall provide audited financial statements within 60 days of the end of its fiscal year, including a statement of revenue and expenditures and a balance sheet. Within 45 days after the close of each race meeting, each applicant receiving funds shall provide payment documentation of the precise expenditures covered by the funds. 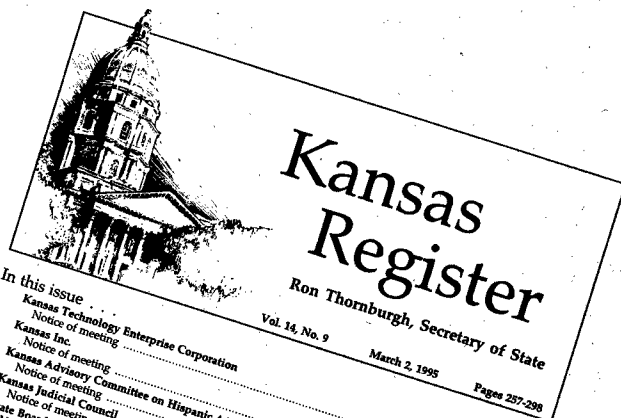
