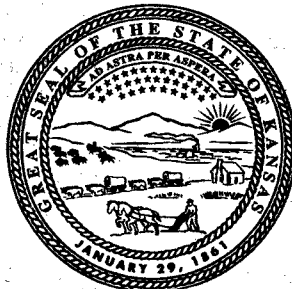

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Tuesday, August 27, at the offices of the Kansas State Grain Inspection Department, 110 N.E. Lyman Road, Topeka, to consider the proposed revocation of K.A.R. 25-4-1, which fixes the fees charged by the Inspection Division. These fees no longer require approval by the Joint Committee on Rules and Regulations, making the regulation unnecessary.

The revocation is not mandated by federal law as a requirement for participating in or implementing a federally subsidized or assisted program. There will be no economic impact as a result of this revocation.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality construction permit. Seaboard Farms, Inc. has applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300 to construct a feed mill. Emissions of total particulate (PM) and particulate matter of less than or equal to 10 microns (PM<sub>10</sub>) were evaluated during the permit review process.

Seaboard Farms, Inc., Shawnee Mission, owns and operates the stationary source located at Sec. 18, T33S, R37W in Stevens County, at which the feed mill is to be constructed and operated.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting nonconfidential documentation and all information relied upon during the permit application review process is available for public review during normal business hours at the KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, Building 283, Forbes Field, Topeka, and at the KDHE southwest district office, 302 W. Notice of Hearing on Proposed  
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10:30 a.m. Friday, August 30, in the Conservation Division hearing room, Room 2078, Wichita State Office Building, 130 S. Market, Wichita, to consider the adoption of proposed permanent regulations for the conservation of crude oil and natural gas.

The 60-day notice period from the date of this publication to the date of the public hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. Comments may be submitted to John McCannon, Assistant General Counsel, State Corporation Commission, Wichita State Office Building, 130 S. Market, Room 2078, Wichita, 67202.

Any person requiring special accommodations under the Americans With Disabilities Act should give notice to the commission at least 10 days prior to the scheduled hearing date.

Copies of the proposed regulations and the economic impact statements may be obtained at the address above. Persons requesting a copy of the proposed regulations and economic impact statements, in accordance with K.S.A. 45-129, will be required to compensate the commission for the cost of reproduction. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to present their views orally or in writing in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations.

All written or oral comments submitted by interested parties by August 30 will be considered by the commission as a basis for making changes to these proposed permanent regulations.

The following is a brief summary of the proposed regulations and economic impact statements:

**K.A.R. 82-3-101.** Several minor clarifications were made to definitions. Reference was also made to the definitions contained in K.A.R. 82-3-700 for cathodic protection boreholes.

**K.A.R. 82-3-103.** A reference was made to K.A.R. 82-3-701 for filing intents to drill cathodic protection boreholes. Minor clarifying changes were made.

**K.A.R. 82-3-700.** This is a new regulation that contains all the definitions to be used in connection with cathodic protection facilities.

**K.A.R. 82-3-701.** This is a new regulation that sets out the requirement for filing a notice of intent to drill cathodic protection boreholes. The regulation provides for up to a \$1,000 penalty for drilling a cathodic protection borehole without an approved intent to drill. There is an exception for distributed anode systems, shallow single bellhole galvanic anode systems and individual anode systems that are less than 25 feet deep and do not penetrate an aquifer. Operators drilling cathodic protection boreholes in groundwater management districts No. 2 and No. 5 shall apply directly to the groundwater management district for a permit to drill.

**K.A.R. 82-3-702.** This regulation sets out the construction requirements for cathodic protection boreholes. It requires each cathodic protection borehole to be logged as set out in the regulation. A final completion report must be filed with the Conservation Division within 60 days of the start date of the cathodic protection borehole. Cathodic protection boreholes located in groundwater management districts No. 2 or No. 5 are exempted from this regulation and are made subject to the standards and policies of the appropriate groundwater management district. A penalty of up to \$2,500 is provided for the failure to comply with the regulation, and a penalty of \$100 is provided for failing to submit a report.

**K.A.R. 82-3-703.** This regulation lists the construction requirements for the surface installation in connection with cathodic protection boreholes. Surface installations in groundwater management districts No. 2 and No. 5 will be constructed in accordance with their standards and policies and are exempt from this regulation. Failure to construct the surface installation in accordance with this regulation shall carry a penalty of up to \$500.

**K.A.R. 82-3-704.** This regulation provides the methods and procedures for plugging cathodic protection boreholes and for site restoration. A plugging report is required to be filed with the Conservation Division within 60 days after plugging is completed. Cathodic protection boreholes in groundwater management districts No. 2 and No. 5 will be plugged in accordance with their standards and policies and are exempt from this regulation. The regulation provides for up to a \$1,000 penalty for failure to comply.

**Economic Impact Statement:** The regulation of cathodic protection boreholes is a new area of regulation for the State Corporation Commission. By the adoption of regulations, the commission is intending to protect the fresh and usable water of the state. Before these proposed

regulations, cathodic protection boreholes were drilled without specific construction standards and with no requirement that the hole be plugged when abandoned. Many cathodic protection boreholes were drilled prior to these proposed regulations, but there is no record of the locations and no record of how they were constructed or if they were plugged.

There is no federal mandate that requires the proposed regulations; however, cathodic protection boreholes have to be drilled, since 49 C.F.R. Part 192.455 requires that all pipelines have cathodic protection.

There will be some increase in cost to the agency in processing reports, etc., and in witnessing a percentage of the pluggings. The agency believes that this increase can be handled by existing personnel.

Industry will have approximately a 25-30 percent increase in the cost of drilling and completing a cathodic protection borehole under these proposed regulations. The increased cost to industry will vary depending on whether the borehole does not penetrate an aquifer or penetrates one or more aquifers. For boreholes that do not penetrate an aquifer, the additional cost is estimated at \$2,000-\$4,000, depending on depth. The additional cost for boreholes that penetrate one or more aquifers is estimated at between \$4,000-\$8,000, depending on depth.

These proposed regulations were the result of a study committee composed of environmental representatives, industry and state agency staff. Many alternatives were presented and discussed. The committee consensus was that the proposed regulations would effectively protect fresh and usable water while not adding overly burdensome costs to industry.

**K.A.R. 82-3-206.** This regulation was amended to increase the conservation assessment on oil from 21.0 mills to 28.5 mills per barrel of crude oil or petroleum marketed or used each month.

**K.A.R. 82-3-307.** This regulation was amended to increase the conservation assessment on gas from 5.5 mills to 6.1 mills on each 1,000 cubic feet of gas sold or marketed each month.

**Economic Impact Statement:** By proposing these regulations, the commission is intending to fund its \$400,000 per year contribution to the abandoned oil and gas well fund created by House Substitute for Senate Bill No. 755 and to fund increases in its general operating expenses.

There will be no increase in the cost to the agency by adopting these amendments. Costs to the oil and gas industry will increase 7.5 mills per barrel of oil and .6 mills per 1,000 cubic feet of gas. On a yearly basis, this is an increase of approximately \$289,000 for oil and \$427,000 for gas. This equates to a 75 cent a barrel increase in oil and a 6 cent increase for 1,000 cubic feet of gas.

A number of funding scenarios were examined by commission staff. The proposed amendment is based on a three-year projection of receipts and expenses that include the commission's yearly contribution to the abandoned oil and gas well fund.

## Pooled Money Investment Board

### Temporary Administrative Regulations

#### Article 3.—INVESTMENT OF STATE MONEYS

**122-3-11.** (a) The director of investments may invest up to 50 percent of the pooled money investment portfolio in the types of commercial paper authorized by K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 75-4209(a)(2)(E), as amended by 1996 S.B. 476. No more than 10 percent of such investments in commercial paper shall be invested in any single business entity.

(b) By written and published policies, the above limitations on investments in commercial paper may be further restricted by the board.

(c) For purposes of computing the limitation on investments in commercial paper, the pooled money investment portfolio shall be comprised solely of investments made pursuant to subsection (a), (c) and (d) of K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 75-4209, as amended by 1996 S.B. 476, and K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 75-4262, including interest receivable on such investments. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. K.S.A. 75-4209, as amended by 1996 S.B. 476, § 17; effective, T-122-6-19-96, June 19, 1996.)

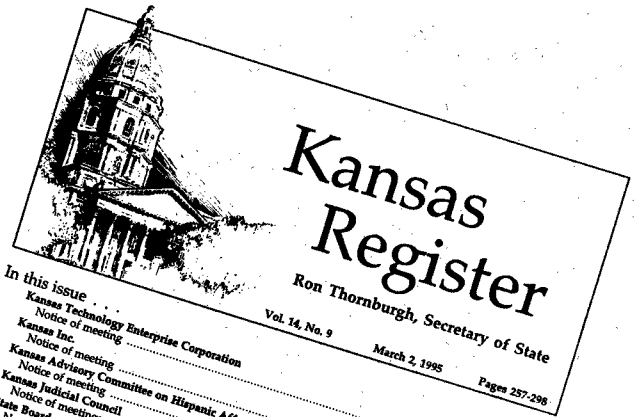
