**Notice of Comprehensive Development  
Program Application Workshops**

The Kansas Department of Commerce and Housing will be presenting the first of three rounds of workshops designed for the department's new Comprehensive Development Program. The comprehensive application program was established in the recently approved Consolidated Plan for the State of Kansas. Each workshop round will be presented in both the western and eastern parts of the state.

The first workshop will be August 20 at the Ramada Inn, 420 E. 6th, Topeka. This same workshop will be presented August 22 at the Holiday Inn, 3603 Vine, Hays. Times for both workshops will be from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., with registration beginning at 8:30 a.m.

Because of the nature of the comprehensive applications, communities are encouraged to bring teams of three to five persons to these workshops. Ideally, these teams will include local public officials, business and civic leaders, nonprofit association representatives, plus any persons dedicated to their community's growth.

The second and third rounds of workshops will be presented in September and October. These workshops are tied together to help develop a final, comprehensive application. It is important for the communities interested in this process to attend all three workshop rounds.

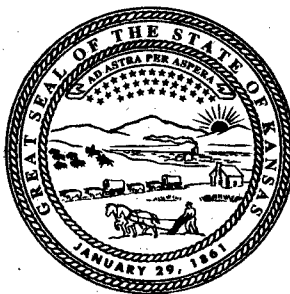

## Notice of Individual Artist Program Deadlines

The Kansas Arts Commission has announced opportunities for Kansas artists available through the Individual Artist Program for 1997, including Kansas Artist Fellowships and the Kansas Touring Program.

The commission will award five Kansas Artist Fellowships of \$5,000 each to a qualified artist in each of the following disciplines: music composition, choreography, film/video, interdisciplinary/performance art and playwriting. These disciplines alternate biennially with those of fiction, poetry, two-dimensional visual art, three-dimensional visual art and crafts.

Up to 12 mini-fellowships of \$500 each will be offered for 1997. An artist may apply for a mini-fellowship in any one of the following disciplines: fiction, poetry, two-dimensional visual art, three-dimensional visual art, crafts, music composition, choreography, film/video, interdisciplinary/performance art and playwriting.

The application deadline for both the 1997 Kansas Artist Fellowships and the mini-fellowships is October 16. Completed application forms, with required documentation and support materials, must be received in the commission office not later than 5 p.m. on that date.

The commission is accepting applications from individual performing artists who live in Kansas and from Kansas-based groups, companies and ensembles for three-year appointments to the roster of the Kansas Touring Program.

This roster of solo and ensemble artists generally includes—but is not limited to—storytelling, mime, dance, theater for adults and children, and classical, folk, ethnic, blues, jazz and gospel music.

The application deadline for the Kansas Touring Program roster is October 1. Completed application forms with required support materials must be received in the commission office not later than 5 p.m. on that date.

Each eligible application and its support materials will be reviewed by a panel of professionals and experts. The Kansas Touring Program panels will meet during October, and the commission will act upon their recommendations during November. The fellowship panels will meet this winter, and the commission will act upon their recommendations during February 1997.

### Summary of 1996 Cigarette and Tobacco Legislation

This notice is intended to explain a number of changes in the Cigarette and Tobacco Act. The 1996 Kansas Legislature passed a bill that, in general, provides for increased regulation of the sale of cigarettes and tobacco products, provides fines for cigarette and tobacco infractions, and changes licensing and recordkeeping requirements for cigarette wholesalers, vending machine owners and retailers. All changes are effective July 1, 1996.

#### Licensing and Recordkeeping

The biennial fee for a Kansas cigarette license increased from \$12 to \$25 per location; the biennial fee for a Kansas cigarette vending machine license also increased to \$25 per machine.

Cigarette dealers (any person who manufactures or sells cigarettes) are required to preserve all records pertaining to the sale of cigarettes for three years. The records must be available for inspection by the Director of Taxation (or the director's designee) at the dealer's business location.

#### New Regulations and Fines

##### Sales to Minors

It is now unlawful for any person under 18 to possess or attempt to possess cigarettes or tobacco products. It is also unlawful for a minor to purchase or attempt to purchase cigarettes or tobacco products. Both infractions are punishable by a \$25 fine.

The crime of selling or furnishing cigarettes or tobacco products to a minor is now punishable by a fine of up to \$200. It is a defense to prosecution if the defendant had

a reasonable cause to believe the person was 18 years of age or older, and the minor presented a driver's license, Kansas identification card, or other official or apparently official document containing a photograph of the minor that claimed to establish the minor was of legal age at the time of purchase.

#### Vending Machine Sales Restricted

Vending machines for cigarette and tobacco products may no longer be located in any establishment or portion of an establishment that is open to minors, except when:

- the vending machine is installed for use by the establishment's proprietor, the proprietor's agents or employees, and is located behind a counter or in a place or portion of the business that minors are prohibited by law from entering; or
- the vending machine is installed and used in a commercial building or industrial plant not customarily open to the public, and the machines are intended for the sole use of adult employees working in the building or plant; or
- the vending machine has a lock-out device that renders the machine inoperable and requires manual activation by the person supervising the operation of the machine each time cigarettes or tobacco products are purchased from the machine.

#### Administrative Fines Established

The Secretary of Revenue may now administer a fine of up to \$1,000 against cigarette retailers who violate the Cigarette and Tobacco Products Act. This fine may be in addition to, or instead of, any other civil or criminal penalty imposed. The secretary may consider mitigating circumstances when the retailer has been cited for selling cigarettes or tobacco products to a minor if the retail employee who violated the act has completed a training program approved by the secretary.

#### Posted Sales Notice Required

All cigarette retailers are required to *post* and *maintain* in a conspicuous place in their business establishment a notice that states:

**BY LAW, CIGARETTES AND TOBACCO PRODUCTS  
MAY BE SOLD ONLY TO PERSONS  
18 YEARS OF AGE AND OLDER.**

## Opinion No. 96-57

**Publications, Bibliography and Calendar—Legal Publications—Newspapers in Which Legal Publications May be Made; Second Class Mail; Redesignation as Periodicals; Effect.** Ron Thornburgh, Secretary of State, Topeka, July 9, 1996.

K.S.A. 64-101 sets forth criteria for newspapers in which legal notices, advertisements and publications required by state law may be published. Subsection (a)(2) of K.S.A. 64-101 provides that eligible newspapers be entered at the post office of publication as second class mail matter. Newspapers which, after July 1, 1996, are entered at the post office as periodicals meet the standards required by the legislature when it enacted the provision. Therefore, newspapers entered at the post office as periodicals are deemed to comply with subsection (a)(2) of K.S.A. 64-101. ## Opinion No. 96-58

**Crimes and Punishments; Kansas Criminal Code; Classification of Crimes and Sentencing—Sentencing Guidelines; Grid for Drug Crimes Applied in Felony Cases Under Uniform Controlled Substances Act; Retroactive Application.** Barbara S. Tombs, Executive Director, Kansas Sentencing Commission, Topeka, July 17, 1996.

Because Section 11(d) of 1996 Senate Bill No. 585 provides for a substantive rather than a procedural or remedial change, and in the absence of legislative intent that it operate retroactively, in our opinion it should be applied prospectively to felony drug offenses committed after July 1, 1996, and not retroactively to felony drug offenses committed on or after July 1, 1993, but before July 1, 1996, even if the sentencing occurs after July 1, 1996. ## Opinion No. 96-59

**Crimes and Punishments; Kansas Criminal Code; Classification of Crimes and Sentencing—Sentencing Guidelines—Battery; Domestic Battery; Place of Imprisonment; Determinate Sentence; Good Time Credits.** Charles E. Simmons, Secretary, Department of Corrections, Topeka, July 17, 1996.

A third or subsequent domestic battery conviction is a "non grid" felony punishable by imprisonment in a state penal institution. A defendant should be sentenced for a third and subsequent domestic battery conviction to a determinate sentence within the range of 90 days to one year. An inmate serving a sentence in the custody of the secretary of corrections for a third or subsequent conviction of domestic battery is eligible to earn good time credits. ## Opinion No. 96-60

**Taxation—Property Exempt from Taxation; Hay and Silage, and Farm Storage and Drying Equipment.** Representative Joann Flower, 47th District, Oskaloosa July 17, 1996.

K.S.A. 79-201d allows an eight-year property tax exemption for certain farm storage and drying equipment. Once the property has been exempted for eight years, it is to be placed on the tax rolls. The exemption for farm machinery and equipment under K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 79-201j applies only to personal property actually and regularly used exclusively in any farming or ranching operation. Whether a particular piece of property is real or personal property is a question of fact. Cited herein: K.S.A. 79-102; 79-201d; K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 79-201j; 79-210; 79-213. JLM

**Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct****Advisory Opinion No. 96-25**

Written July 12, 1996, to Carmen Evers Sellens, Human Resources Manager, Kansas Department on Aging, Topeka.

This opinion is in response to your letter of June 28, 1996, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct concerning the state level conflict of interest laws (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*). We note at the outset that the commission's jurisdiction is limited to the application of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule and regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

**Factual Statement**

We understand you request this opinion as human resources manager of the Department on Aging on behalf of the director of the department's CARE program. You advise us that everyone seeking nursing home care must be assessed by the CARE program before they can enter the nursing home. The purpose of CARE is to help people find appropriate long term care services and to collect data on the need for home- and community-based services by providing information about long term care options in the person's community. Your agency further advised us by telephone that CARE assessors are not involved with making recommendations about insurance. Certain employees of the CARE program are interested in selling long term care insurance or mutual funds to individuals living in Missouri.

**Question**

Is it a violation of the state level conflict of interest laws for employees of the Kansas Department on Aging CARE

program to sell long term care insurance or mutual funds to individuals living in Missouri?

**Opinion**

We have reviewed the state level conflict of interest laws in their entirety, and nothing in those laws prohibits a CARE program employee from selling long term care insurance or mutual funds to individuals living in Missouri.

**Advisory Opinion No. 96-26**

**Factual Statement**

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as human resources manager for the Kansas Department on Aging on behalf of Jake Reisinger, the director of the SHICK program. In addition to your written request, your agency had informed us by telephone that the SHICK program provides Medicare education to the general public and is funded by an annual grant from the federal government. The program is now in the process of being privatized through negotiated bids.

Your agency further advised us that Mr. Reisinger will not be on the bid oversight panel or be involved in the bid process. He is interested in continuing to work for the program when the successful bidder is chosen.

**Question**

Is it a violation of the conflict of interest laws for the director of the SHICK program to be employed by the business that successfully bids for the privatized program?

**Opinion**

K.S.A. 46-233(a) may apply to your question. That section in pertinent part states:

(a) . . . . Whenever any individual has, within the preceding two years participated as a state officer or employee in the making of any contract with any person or business, such individual shall not accept employment with such person or business for one year following termination of employment as a state officer or employee.

Based on the information you provided the commission, we understand that Mr. Reisinger will not participate in the bidding process or in the selection of the successful bidder. Therefore, he will not be participating in the making of a contract with the successful bidder, and this section would not apply.

Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Tuesday, October 1, in Room 108, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed permanent rules and regulations of the Kansas Livestock Commissioner, Animal Health Department.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Debra Duncan, Animal Facilities Inspection Director, Animal Health Department, Suite 4-B, 712 S. Kansas Ave., Topeka, 66603. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Debra Duncan at (913) 296-2326. Handicapped parking is located at the south end of the Landon State Office Building, and the north entrance to the building is accessible.

Copies of the complete text of the regulations and the economic impact statements may be obtained by contacting the Animal Health Department. Summaries of the proposed regulations and their economic impact follow.

**Article 10.—Public Livestock Markets**

**K.A.R. 9-10-31, Occasional livestock sale fees, and K.A.R. 9-10-32, Public livestock markets,** are new permanent regulations. The proposed regulations implement L. 1996, Chapter 133, which created an exemption to K.S.A. 47-1001, the statute requiring licensure of livestock markets. Currently, K.S.A. 47-1001 requires anyone selling livestock at a public livestock market to obtain a license to operate that market. The legislation created a special category, called "occasional sales," for markets holding 12 or fewer sales per year. K.A.R. 9-10-31 sets out fees for these sales, ranging from \$25 to the statutory maximum of \$100. An exemption from licensing is created by K.A.R. 9-10-32 for sales held in conjunction with a county, district, regional or state exhibition of junior exhibitors.

The change in the statute eases many of the requirements for livestock market sales; therefore, the license fee for occasional markets will be \$225 to \$300 less than a full license. It is estimated that not more than 20 occasional livestock market licenses will be issued at an average fee of \$50. No economic impact on the state or local governmental agencies or the general public is anticipated.

**Article 18.—Animal Facility Inspection Program;  
License and Registration Fees**

**K.A.R. 9-18-1, Fees,** is proposed for amendment on a permanent basis. The existing fee structure does not change, but is amended to reflect modifications and revisions to licensing categories resulting from L. 1996, Chapter 151. In addition, new licensing categories for out-of-state distributors, temporary pet shop licenses and closing permits are included.

The licensing fee for out-of-state distributors ranges from \$150 to \$300, and is expected to generate approximately \$1,650 in additional revenue. The licensing fee for the "temporary" pet shop category ranges from \$50 to \$125. The number of entities that would qualify for the "temporary" pet shop category is unknown. However, it is anticipated that fewer than 20 temporary licenses will be issued each year, and that most of these will be at the \$50 fee level. Closing permits, which will cost \$75, will result in a cost savings of \$74 to \$225 per facility when compared to the cost of a full license. Costs to the department for administering these new categories and for performing inspections are expected to be minimal. No economic impact on other governmental agencies or the general public is anticipated.

**Article 19.—Animal Breeders and Distributors; Facility  
Standards, Animal Health, Husbandry, and  
Operational Standards**

**K.A.R. 9-19-1, Housing facilities, general; K.A.R. 9-19-2, Indoor housing facilities; K.A.R. 9-19-3, Sheltered housing facilities; K.A.R. 9-19-4, Outdoor housing facilities; K.A.R. 9-19-5, Primary enclosures, minimum requirements for dogs and cats; K.A.R. 9-19-6, Compatible grouping; K.A.R. 9-19-7, Exercise for dogs; K.A.R. 9-19-8, Feeding; K.A.R. 9-19-9, Watering; K.A.R. 9-19-10, Cleaning, sanitization, housekeeping, and pest control; and K.A.R. 9-19-11, Employees,** are proposed for amendment on a permanent basis. L. 1996, Chapter 151 modified and renamed several licensing categories in the Kansas Animal Dealer Act. All licensees who are currently licensed as "animal dealers" will now be licensed as either "animal breeders" or "animal distributors." The amendments to these regulations update the current animal dealer regulations to change the licensee categories accordingly and update the language of the regulations to reflect the current language of regulations of the United States Department of Agriculture (9 C.F.R. 3.1 through 3.12), as required by K.S.A. 47-1712(b). No economic impact on the licensees, the Animal Health Department, other governmental agencies or the general public is anticipated.

**Article 25.—Retail Breeders Facility Standards; Animal  
Health, Husbandry, and Operational Standards**

**K.A.R. 9-25-1, Housing facilities, general; K.A.R. 9-25-2, Indoor housing facilities; K.A.R. 9-25-3, Sheltered housing facilities; K.A.R. 9-25-4, Outdoor housing facilities; K.A.R. 9-25-5, Primary enclosures; K.A.R. 9-25-6, Cleaning, sanitization, housekeeping, and pest control; K.A.R. 9-25-7, Compatible grouping; K.A.R. 9-25-8, Exercise for dogs; K.A.R. 9-25-9, Feeding; K.A.R. 9-25-10,**

*(continued)*

Watering; K.A.R. 9-25-11, Employees; K.A.R. 9-25-12, Age of animal; K.A.R. 9-25-13, Access to and inspection of records and property; K.A.R. 9-25-14, Records; and K.A.R. 9-25-15, Adequate medical veterinary care, are proposed new regulations that implement L. 1996, Chapter 151, which modified and renamed several licensing categories in the Kansas Animal Dealer Act. Prior law combined commercial pet shops and dog and cat breeders, who sell their animals directly to the public, into one licensing category (pet shops). Under the statutory amendments, commercial pet shops are still licensed as "pet shops," but dog and cat breeders were separated into a new license category named "retail breeders." Retail breeders are the counterpart to animal breeders with the distinction that puppies and kittens are sold at retail, rather than wholesale. The substance of new Article 25 covering retail breeders is the same as Article 19, which covers animal breeders, with the following exceptions. K.A.R. 9-25-10 requires retail breeders to provide water continuously if the temperature surrounding the animal exceeds 85 degrees Fahrenheit. K.A.R. 9-25-12 requires animals sold by retail breeders to be at least six weeks of age and weaned, and K.A.R. 9-25-13 provides that the commissioner or the commissioner's trained representatives may enter the breeder's place of business to examine records, make copies of records and take photographs. K.A.R. 9-25-14 pertains to recordkeeping requirements, and K.A.R. 9-25-15 requires each retail breeder to provide adequate veterinary medical care as defined by statute.

Because the new category of retail breeder licensees were previously regulated under existing licensure categories, there is no change in the cost of the program to the Animal Health Department. The proposed regulations contain some additional detail which may cause a few licensees to make minor renovations to their existing kennels. While the number of licensees that may be affected and the cost is unknown, it is not expected to be significant. There is no anticipated economic impact on other governmental agencies or the general public.

Facility Closure Plan

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has received a Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) closure plan along with a closure certification report from the National Cooperative Refinery Association (NCRA) for the final closure of the three surface impoundments, also known as lime ponds. The NCRA refinery is located in McPherson. The lime ponds were located on the northern edge of the refinery in Section 32, Township 19 South, Range 3 West. Before removing these impoundments from service, the lime ponds were operated as a part of the refinery's wastewater treatment system. The sludges accumulated in these impoundments were found to be contaminated with RCRA listed hazardous waste F037.

The NCRA "Closure Plan and Closure Report for Three Surface Impoundments" and "Appendices of the Closure Plan and Closure Report for Three Surface Impoundments" were submitted to KDHE as required by Title 40 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Part 265 Subpart G, as adopted by K.A.R. 28-31-8. In late 1992, the NCRA notified the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Region VII and the KDHE that the three surface impoundments (lime ponds) might contain the listed hazardous waste (F037), that in the near future would become subject to the federal land disposal restrictions. The listed waste, F037, is defined as an oil/water/solids separation sludge from petroleum refinery operations. In 1994, the NCRA moved forward with closure of the above impoundments without the normal regulatory authority and public review and approval of the closure plan prior to implementation of the closure effort. The closure of the impoundments without an approved closure plan was imperative due to expiration of the national capacity variance for the lime pond sludge (F037) in June 1994 and to reduce the potential risks to human health and the environment associated with this hazardous waste.

Since March 1994, the NCRA has conducted closure activities for all three impoundments for the purpose of complying with the closure performance standard of 40 CFR 265.111. In this effort, the NCRA followed procedures described in 40 CFR 265 Subpart G for closure and post closure. Once the lime ponds were removed from service, the existing sludges and soils that contained hazardous constituents were removed, and the impoundments were backfilled with clean, uncontaminated soil. In the closure report, the NCRA submitted confirmation sample results from the bottom and sides of the lime ponds to demonstrate that no residual contamination of concern was left following excavation and closure. The NCRA complied with all applicable regulations in conducting these activities.

The NCRA implemented two approaches for handling the sludges removed from the lime ponds. A portion of the sludge removed was used in the production of a commercial fertilizer following the guidance of 40 CFR 266.20(b). The remaining sludge was removed from the impoundments for disposal off-site at a RCRA-permitted treatment, storage and disposal (TSD) facility. The NCRA contracted with US Pollution Control Incorporated (USPCI) to provide for removal of stained material and any remaining sludge existing in the lime ponds that could not be recycled in the manufacturing of commercial fertilizer. Verification sampling was performed in accordance with the procedures described in the closure plan. Verification sampling demonstrated that concentrations of the constituents of concern were at or below cleanup guidelines established by the State of Kansas. During the closure activities for each of the lime ponds and after each removal activity had been completed, the lime ponds were inspected by an independent registered professional engineer and by the NCRA. A risk-based clean closure of the three lime ponds was accomplished in accordance with the closure plan and completed on July 28, 1994. No groundwater contamination was found in the wells monitoring these regulated units.

In accordance with 40 CFR 265.112(d)(4), the public must be given the opportunity to review and comment on the NCRA "Closure Plan and Closure Report for Three Surface Impoundments" and "Appendices of the Closure Plan and Closure Report for Three Surface Impoundments." These documents are available for public review through August 30 at the McPherson Public Library, 214 W. Marlin, McPherson, from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday through Thursday, from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Friday and Saturday, and from 2 to 5 p.m. Sunday. **Facility Description:** The proposed permit is for re-issuance of an existing permit for operation of an existing nonoverflowing wastewater treatment plant. The facility is engaged in beef packinghouse operations. The average process design capacity is 5,700 head/day and is

expected to increase to 6,000 head/day in the next two years. Treatment consists of a brine storage/evaporation pond, evaporator, dissolved air flotation system, a two-cell anaerobic pond, a one-cell complete mix activated sludge pond, two final clarifiers, a three-cell irrigation pond and an inactive two-cell brine pond which is under a schedule of compliance to be decommissioned. Disposal of the lagoon wastewater is by percolation, evaporation and irrigation.

Written comments on the draft permits must be submitted to the attention of Lisa Duncan for agricultural permits, or to the permit clerk for all other permits, Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Environment, Bureau of Water, J Street and 2 North, Forbes Field, Building 283, Topeka, 66620. ### Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS

**111-2-30. Retailer bonus; on-line games.** (a) On all Powerball, Cash Lotto, and Kansas Cash drawings in which the prize claimed and awarded is the "jackpot prize" offered in the game it represents, the Kansas lottery-retailer(s) selling the ticket(s) shall receive \$10,000 for Powerball and \$1,000 for Cash Lotto or Kansas Cash, or share equally in a bonus if there are multiple winners. The bonus shall be in addition to compensation specified in K.A.R. 111-2-4.

(b) A "jackpot prize" is the highest prize awarded for correctly matching all the numbers reflected in the prize



structure of the Powerball, Cash Lotto, or Kansas Cash game it represents.

(c) On all Powerball drawings where the prize claimed and awarded is not less than \$100,000, and which occurs on and after May 15, 1996, the Kansas lottery retailer selling the ticket shall receive \$1,000.

(d) On all Keno drawings where the prize claimed and awarded is not less than \$100,000, or for the parimutuel prizes awarded for matching 10 in the 10 spot game as specified by subsection (e) of K.A.R. 111-7-81, and which occurs on and after May 15, 1996, the Kansas lottery retailer selling the ticket shall receive \$1,000. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-8-5-94, July 15, 1994; amended, T-111-3-22-95, March 16, 1995; amended, T-111-5-22-96, May 15, 1996; amended, T-111-6-27-96, June 21, 1996; amended, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**Article 4.—INDIVIDUAL GAME RULES**

**RULES FOR INSTANT GAME NO. 58**

**"STRIKE IT RICH"**

**111-4-855. Name of game.** The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Strike It Rich" commencing on or after July 22, 1996. The specific rules for the "Strike It Rich" game are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 et seq. and 111-4-855 through 111-4-859. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-22-96, May 15, 1996; amended, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-4-871. Determination of instant prize winners.** This game is played similarly to the traditional "BINGO" game. The player removes the scratch-off material on the area of the ticket indicated as the "CALLER'S CARD" and "BONUS NUMBERS" to reveal 24 and four "BINGO" letter/number combinations, respectively. The player then checks to see if any of the letter/number combinations on the "CALLER'S CARD" match the letter/number combinations on any of the four "PLAYER'S CARDS." The player may then mark matching combinations by scratching or marking the matched spot on the "PLAYER'S CARDS." A "W in a circle" uncovered on the "CALLER'S CARD" or "BONUS NUMBERS" area may be used to fill any unmarked space on each of the four "PLAYER'S CARDS." If the player gets a "BINGO" by matching the letter/number combinations on one of the four "PLAYER'S CARDS" in any horizontal, vertical, or diagonal line as shown in illustration number one on the back of each "BINGO" card; by matching combinations in all four corners as shown in illustration number two on the back of each "BINGO" card; or by matching combinations in both diagonals forming an "X" as shown in illustration number three on the back of each "BINGO" card, the player wins the prize amount indicated on the appropriate winning "PLAYER'S CARD." Players can win up to four times on this ticket, but can win only one way on any of the four "PLAYER'S CARDS" on each ticket; that is there will only be one winning pattern per "PLAYER'S CARD." Prizes a player can win are as follows:

**"DOUBLE DOUGH"**

**111-4-873. Name of game.** The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Double Dough" commencing on or after August 12, 1996. The specific rules for the "Double Dough" game are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 et seq. and 111-4-873 through 111-4-876. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-4-874. Definitions.** The following definitions shall apply to the "Double Dough" instant lottery game:

(a) "Game symbols" are the numbers, letters, symbols, or pictures printed in the play area of each instant game ticket and which determine if the ticket bearer is entitled to a prize. In this instant game, the game symbols are printed in black ink in 15 point WGI font with matching captions in WGI Cap font. A game symbol appears in each of six play spots within the play area. Each game symbol for this instant game is one of the following: FREE - \$2.<sup>00</sup> - \$5.<sup>00</sup> - 10.<sup>00</sup> - 20.<sup>00</sup> - \$2500 - \$5000 - \$\$.

(b) "Game symbol captions" are the words or portions of words, letters or numbers printed beneath each game symbol in the play area and are used to repeat or explain the game symbol. The game symbol caption associated with each game symbol is as follows:

(c) "Ticket validation number" means a unique num-

ber appearing on each ticket which is used to validate winning tickets. For this instant game, the ticket validation number is an 11-digit number which appears below the top four game symbols under the removable covering in the play area on the front of each instant ticket.

(d) "Book-ticket number" means the unique number appearing on each ticket which includes the number of the book from which it was removed and the serially assigned number of the ticket within that book. For this instant game, the book-ticket number is an 8-digit book number followed by a dash and then a 3-digit ticket number. The ticket numbers in each book start with 000 and end with 299. The book-ticket number is printed in black ink on the back of each instant game ticket both above the information form and below the bar code.

(e) "Retailer validation code" means the small letters found under removable covering in the play area of each instant game ticket. The retailer uses this code to verify and validate winners which are to be paid by the retailer. In this instant game, the retailer validation code is a three letter code printed and appearing in three of six varying locations among the game symbols. The codes and their meanings are as follows: FRE = FREE; TWO = \$2.00; FOR = \$4.00; FIV = \$5.00; TEN = \$10.00; TWY = \$20.00; FRY = \$40.00.

(f) "Bar code" means the 16-digit bar-coded number appearing on the back of each ticket. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-4-875. Determination of instant prize winners.** An instant prize winner is determined for this instant game when the player removes or "scratches off" the removable layer of material covering the play area to reveal the six game symbols and captions. This is a match three of six game which includes a doubler. If three of the six concealed prize amounts match, the player wins the amount shown. If two of the six concealed prize amounts match and a doubler symbol is found, the player wins double the prize amount. No ticket will be eligible to win more than one prize. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710(b), (c) and (i); implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710(b), (c) and (i), and K.S.A. 74-8720(b) and (d); effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-4-876. Number and value of instant prizes.** (a) There will be approximately 2,400,000 tickets ordered for this instant game. The expected number and value of the instant prizes are as follows:

(b) The executive director may terminate the sale of tickets prior to the complete sale of all tickets. In this event, the number and value of prizes will be approximately proportional to the number of tickets actually sold. The odds of winning a prize in this game are one in 5.42.

(c) All prizes are subject to deductions provided by law. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710(b), (c) and (f); implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710(b), (c) and (f), and K.S.A. 74-8720; effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**STATE FAIR DRAWINGS**

**111-4-877. Name of drawing.** (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct a series of instant ticket drawings entitled "State Fair Drawings." The dates of the drawings shall coincide with the days of the Kansas state fair in Hutchinson, Kansas, starting on the first day of the fair each year. The times and dates of the drawings shall be as follows:

The drum shall close immediately before each drawing and at the close of business each day at the state fair lottery location through the last Saturday of the fair.

(b) "State Fair Drawings" shall be held in the Kansas lottery building on the state fairgrounds in Hutchinson, Kansas, on the dates at the times stated in K.A.R. 111-4-877.

(c) The rules and regulations for the "State Fair Drawings" are contained in K.A.R. 111-4-877 through 111-4-884, and applicable generic rules are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 et seq. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-4-878. Definitions.** (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 et seq.) and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference and govern unless otherwise indicated.

(b) "Kansas State Fair" or "State Fair" means the annual fair held in Hutchinson, Kansas.

(c) "Kansas Lottery State Fair Drawings" or "State Fair Drawings" means the acts of drawing prizes conducted by the Kansas lottery at the state fair in which participants are selected to win various prizes as described in K.A.R. 111-4-879.

(d) "Co-sponsor drawings" means an act of drawing for prizes which may be held at the state fair for the benefit of co-sponsors subsequent to the "State Fair Drawings."

(e) "Co-sponsor(s)" means the person, retailer or organization designated by the executive director to assist in organizing the "Kansas Lottery State Fair Drawings."

(f) "Non-winning ticket" means any valid \$1.00 instant game lottery ticket sold at the Kansas state fair selling location for the "State Fair Drawings."

(g) "Receptacle" or "drum" means a container into which non-winning Kansas instant game lottery tickets are placed and from which the "State Fair Drawings" are made. Receptacles or drums shall be sealed and drums shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution.

(h) "Bare arm technique" means a type of drawing where the person drawing the winning ticket from the receptacle or drum wears a long-sleeved shirt with sleeve rolled up above the elbow, a short-sleeved shirt (sleeve not extending past the elbow) or a no-sleeve shirt which exposes the drawer's bare arm. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-4-879. Prizes.** (a) Each winner selected at the "State Fair Drawings" specified in K.A.R. 111-4-877 shall receive a prize of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100). Five \$100 prizes will be awarded at each daily "State Fair Drawing."

(b) A player who purchases at least \$5.00 worth of any combination of instant and/or on-line tickets at the lottery state fair building is entitled to one spin of the lottery wheel at the state fair lottery building to win a lottery promotional prize. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-4-880. Method of entry.** (a) Entry into the daily "State Fair Drawings" is accomplished as follows:

(1) Only valid \$1.00 Kansas instant lottery tickets sold at the Kansas state fair selling location are eligible.

(2) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with specific game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the "State Fair Drawings" and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules.

(3) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for the drawing and the holder of the ticket may enter the "State Fair Drawings."

(4) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner.

(5) The holder of the non-winning ticket must take the non-winning ticket with the completed information on the back of the ticket to the location of the "State Fair Drawings" and place it in the receptacle or drum provided during the "State Fair."

(6) A receptacle or drum shall be available and entries may be made at the Kansas lottery building at the state fair at the times stated in K.A.R. 111-4-877.

(7) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the "State Fair Drawings" or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(8) The drawings will be conducted at the approximate times listed in K.A.R. 111-4-877.

(9) There is no limit to the number of entries a participant may make, but regardless of the number of entries a person whose name appears on a valid entry drawn in the "State Fair Drawings" has made, he or she shall not be eligible to win more than one \$100 prize on each drawing date.

(b) No person employed by a co-sponsor or person living in the same household as an employee of a co-sponsor shall be eligible to enter a drawing or win a prize resulting from such a drawing. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710(b); effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-4-881. Determination of "State Fair Drawings" winners.** (a) At least 10 minutes before the drawings, the co-sponsor or person designated by the executive director, shall announce to the audience the time that the winner selection process will begin. Any persons wishing to enter the drawing who have not yet done so, shall immediately place their tickets into the receptacle or drum at this time.

(b) Prior to sealing the receptacle or drum, the co-sponsor or person designated by the executive director shall announce that entries into the "State Fair Drawings" are closed. No further entries will be accepted.

(c) All non-winning tickets placed in receptacles or drums at the locations identified in subsections (a)(5) and (6) of K.A.R. 111-4-880 shall be under the supervision of the lottery security personnel present prior to each "State Fair Drawing."

(d) Daily drawings shall be conducted only from valid entries placed in the receptacle or drum at the state fair lottery location. After the first daily drawing, subsequent daily drawings shall be drawn from entries received from the close of each daily drawing until the close of the next daily drawing. Following each daily drawing, lottery security shall remove all entries for the just completed drawing from the receptacle, and retain custody of the tickets until they can be destroyed.

(e) The receptacle or drum shall be sealed and rotated a minimum of 10 times or mixed thoroughly with a shovel for two minutes by lottery security personnel present to ensure random selection.

(f) The executive director shall designate one individual of his choice to participate in the selection process.

(g) The selection of "State Fair Drawings" winners shall be accomplished by the individual designated by the executive director, using a bare arm technique, removing only one ticket from the receptacle in which all entries were placed. The lottery security officer present and the lottery draw manager shall review the selected ticket to determine if the name stated on the information form located on the back of the selected ticket is legible. Lottery security shall determine whether the name on the ticket is legible and whether the ticket is valid. This process shall be repeated until five valid entries have been drawn.

(h) The named person is not required to be present in order to win the "State Fair Drawings" prizes described

(continued)

in K.A.R. 111-4-879. The security person conducting the drawing shall be responsible for the final determination concerning the legibility of the name on any ticket drawn and its validity.

(i) The five persons whose tickets have been drawn from the receptacle or drum and who meet the entry and validation requirements at each drawing shall be determined "State Fair Drawings" winners.

(j) Each winner shall be given a prize claim form to be completed and returned to the lottery.

(k) If the name on any ticket drawn is not legible, the ticket drawn will be void and the selection process shall be repeated until a valid ticket eligible for the drawings identified in K.A.R. 111-4-877 is selected.

(l) After five tickets have been drawn for each daily drawing, five additional tickets shall be drawn and given to lottery security to hold as alternates designated as 1A, 1B, 1C, 1D, and 1E in the event any of the tickets previously drawn do not meet entry or validation requirements or the prize winners cannot be located by telephone or United States mail within 30 days of the drawing. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-4-882. Security of drawing.** (a) The receptacle or drum located at the Kansas lottery building, into which drawing participants place their ticket entries, shall be monitored from the commencement of ticket entries until completion of the event by lottery security.

(b) The actual "State Fair Drawing" events shall be recorded on both audio and video tape by law by lottery security. The audio and video tape shall contain no material other than the actual drawing, beginning with the sealing of the receptacle or drum and continuing through the announcement and verification of the winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-4-883. Ticket disqualification.** Any non-winning Kansas instant game lottery ticket entered into a "State Fair Drawing" which is not drawn shall remain eligible for other prizes donated by sponsors occurring on the same day, but will not be eligible for other monetary prizes or drawings on any other day. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-4-884. Co-sponsor drawings.** Co-sponsors of "State Fair Drawings" may hold co-sponsor drawings in conjunction with local retailers, businesses and organizations at the drawing event. In no instance shall these drawings take place prior to the lottery "State Fair Drawing." Such drawings, if conducted, shall be a part of the lottery "State Fair Drawing" and prizes, in addition to cash prizes presented by the lottery, may be donated by the co-sponsor(s). The person drawing tickets for the lottery may draw additional tickets for the co-sponsor(s). At the end of the drawing event(s), all tickets shall be returned to the receptacle or drum. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

"BIG BUCKS"**

**111-4-885. Name of game.** The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Big

In this instant game, the game symbols are printed in black ink in 15 point WGI Symbol font with matching captions in WGI Cap font. A game symbol appears in each of the eight play spots within the play area. Each game symbol for this instant game is one of the following: \$1.<sup>00</sup> - \$2.<sup>00</sup> - \$5.<sup>00</sup> - 10.<sup>00</sup> - 20.<sup>00</sup> - 40.<sup>00</sup> - \$2500 - \$5000 - 10000.

(b) "Game symbol captions" are the words or portions of words, letters or numbers printed beneath each game symbol in the play area and are used to repeat or explain the game symbol. The game symbol caption associated with each game symbol is as follows:

(d) "Book-ticket number" means the unique number appearing on each ticket which includes the number of the book from which it was removed and the serially assigned number of the ticket within that book. For this instant game, the book-ticket number is an 8-digit book number followed by a dash and then a 3-digit ticket number. The ticket numbers in each book start with 000 and end with 299. The book-ticket number is printed in black ink on the back of each instant game ticket above the information form and below the bar code.

(e) "Retailer validation code" means the small letters found under removable covering in the play area of each instant game ticket. The retailer uses this code to verify and validate winners which are to be paid by the retailer. In this instant game, the retailer validation code is a three letter code printed and appearing in three of eight varying locations among the game symbols. The codes and their meanings are as follows: ONE = \$1.00; TWO = \$2.00; FIV = \$5.00; TEN = \$10.00; TWY = \$20.00; FRY = \$40.00.

(f) "Bar code" means the 16-digit bar-coded number appearing on the back of each ticket. (Authorized by and

implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-4-887. Determination of instant prize winners.** An instant prize winner is determined for this instant game when the player removes or "scratches off" the removable layer of material covering the play area to reveal the eight game symbols and captions. This is a match three of eight game. If three of the eight concealed prize amounts match, the player wins the amount shown. No ticket will be eligible to win more than one prize. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710(b), (c) and (i); implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710(b), (c) and (i), and 74-8720(b) and (d); effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

(a) "Game symbols" are the numbers, letters, symbols, or pictures printed in the play area of each instant game ticket and which determine if the ticket bearer is entitled to a prize. In this instant game, the game symbols are printed in black ink in 15 point WGI font with matching captions in WGI Cap font. A game symbol appears in

each of the eight play spots within the play area. Each game symbol for this instant game is one of the following: FREE - \$1.<sup>00</sup> - \$2.<sup>00</sup> - \$4.<sup>00</sup> - 10.<sup>00</sup> - 20.<sup>00</sup> - 40.<sup>00</sup> - \$100\$ - \$1000 - 2 - 3 - 4 - 5 - 7 - 8 - 9 - 10 - J - Q - K - A.

(d) "Book-ticket number" means the unique number appearing on each ticket which includes the number of the book from which it was removed and the serially assigned number of the ticket within that book. For this instant game, the book-ticket number is an 8-digit book number followed by a dash and then a 3-digit ticket number. The ticket numbers in each book start with 000 and end with 299. The book-ticket number is printed in black ink on the back of each instant game ticket both above the information form and below the bar code.

(e) "Retailer validation code" means the small letters found under removable covering in the play area of each instant game ticket. The retailer uses this code to verify and validate winners which are to be paid by the retailer. In this instant game, the retailer validation code is a three letter code printed and appearing in three of eight varying locations among the game symbols. The codes and their meanings are as follows: FRE = FREE TICKET; ONE = \$1.00; TWO = \$2.00; THR = \$3.00; FOR = \$4.00; TEN = \$10.00; TWY = \$20.00; FRY = \$40.00; HUN = \$100.

(f) "Bar code" means the 16-digit bar-coded number appearing on the back of each ticket. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-4-891. Determination of instant prize winners.** An instant prize winner is determined in this "beat the dealer" instant game when the player "scratches off" the removable layer of material covering the play area to reveal the four separate games, each containing a "YOUR CARD" area, a "DEALERS CARD" area, and a "PRIZE" area for each game. A solid line is imaged between "Game 1" and "Game 2," "Game 2" and "Game 3" and between "Game 3" and "Game 4." "Cards" in "Game 1," "Game 2," "Game 3" and "Game 4" relate to each specific game only and not to any of the other three games. A player can win up to four times on a single ticket. If "YOUR CARD" (player's card) is higher than the "DEALER'S CARD" in a single game, the player wins the dollar amount shown in the prize area for that game. If the "YOUR CARD" is an "ACE" (A), the player wins double the dollar amount shown in the prize area for that game. "Ace" (A) is the highest card, followed in descending order by "King" (K), "Queen" (Q), "Jack" (J), "10," "9," "8," "7," "5," "4," "3," and "2." #### Article 5.—POWERBALL

**111-5-46. Prize.** The prize winners selected in each of the "Powerball Caravan Drawings" shall receive a

1997 Dodge Grand Caravan ES and cash, with a total value of \$44,268.83, and \$1,200 worth of gasoline from Kwik Shop. The prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs and deductions authorized by law. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-27-96, June 21, 1996; amended, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

#### Article 6.—ON-LINE GENERIC

**111-6-1. Definitions.** (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 et seq.) and amendments thereto, and lottery regulations adopted pursuant to the Kansas lottery act are hereby incorporated by reference.

(b) "On-line Game" or "game" means a lottery game in which a player selects a combination of numbers or symbols, the type of game and amount of play, and the drawing date(s) by use of a computer. In return for paying the appropriate fee, the player receives a computer-generated ticket with the player's selection printed on it. The Kansas lottery (lottery) will conduct a drawing to determine the winning combination in accordance with the rules of the specific game being played. Each ticket holder whose valid ticket includes a winning combination shall be entitled to a prize if the ticket and a valid claim form are submitted within the specified time period.

(c) "On-line Retailer" or "retailer" means a person or business authorized by the Lottery to sell on-line tickets.

(d) "On-line Terminal (OLT)" or "terminal" means the computer hardware by which an on-line retailer or player enters the combination selected by the player and by which on-line tickets are generated and claims are validated.

(e) "On-line Ticket" or "ticket" means a computer-generated ticket issued by an on-line terminal to a player as a receipt for the combination a player had selected. That ticket shall be the only acceptable evidence of the combination of numbers or symbols selected.

(f) "Drawing" includes the procedure determined by the executive director by which the lottery selects the winning combination in accordance with the rules of the game or the procedure of removing non-winning tickets or other types of entry forms from a receptacle or drum in a drawing event conducted by the lottery. Various types of drawings and procedures involve the following:

(1) Those utilizing ball sets are open to the public, and are required to be witnessed by a lottery security officer and a drawing manager. Furthermore, the equipment used in any drawing must be inspected by the lottery security official present before the drawing.

(2) Winning number combinations may be generated through the use of a computer-driven random number generator located at lottery headquarters as provided by specific game rules. The generator shall be statistically analyzed, tested, and certified by an independent qualified statistician for integrity. Periodic checks shall be made to ensure the security and integrity of the system at least quarterly.

(3) Drawing events requiring non-winning tickets or entry forms from a receptacle or drum shall be conducted

in accordance with specific game rules and K.A.R. 111-6-6.

(4) All drawings and inspections are required to be recorded on both video and audio tape.

(g) "Quick pick" means the random selection of numbers or symbols which appear on a ticket and are played by a player in a game.

(h) "Winning combination" means one or more numbers or symbols randomly selected at each on-line game drawing which shall be used to determine winning plays contained on a game ticket.

(i) "Validation" means the process of determining whether an on-line ticket presented for payment is a winning ticket.

(j) "Ticket holder" or "holder" means the person who has possession of an unsigned ticket or the person whose signature appears in the area upon a ticket designated for signature.

(k) "Executive director" means the executive director of the Kansas lottery or the person designated by the executive director.

(l) "Social environment establishment" means a retailer licensed to serve cereal malt beverage and/or alcohol for consumption on premises in which "Keno" ticket sales constitute at least 60% of total lottery sales. Determination that a retailer meets the 60% "Keno" sales requirement to be a social environment establishment shall be waived until at least 10 full weeks after lottery ticket sales are authorized.

(m) "Attempt(s) to cancel" means that a retailer enters cancellation data into an on-line terminal or is informed by a player, prior to the first drawing for which the ticket was eligible, that the ticket was produced in error either because of a terminal malfunction or by miscommunication between a player and a retailer.

(n) "Problem ticket" means any on-line ticket erroneously produced either by terminal malfunction or by miscommunication between a player and a retailer.

(o) "Receptacle" or "drum" means a container in which non-winning tickets or entry forms are placed and from which the drawings are made. Receptacles or drums shall be sealable and drums shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-89-4, Jan. 21, 1988; amended, T-111-1-27-89, Jan. 26, 1989; amended, T-111-10-10-90, Sept. 15, 1990; amended, T-111-12-21-90, Dec. 14, 1990; amended, T-111-9-20-91, Sept. 20, 1991; amended, T-111-7-1-92, June 26, 1992; amended, T-111-9-1-92, Aug. 28, 1992; amended, T-111-3-26-93, March 19, 1993; amended, T-111-3-3-94, Feb. 25, 1994; amended, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-6-5. Payment of prizes.** (a) Following the drawing for which an on-line ticket was purchased, and prior to the payment of any prize, the claimant shall present the winning on-line ticket to any on-line retailer, or any Kansas lottery office for validation.

(b) The procedure for payment of a single game prize of \$599, or less, except for a jackpot prize, is as follows:

(1) The holder of the ticket may present it to any on-line retailer. If the on-line retailer cannot validate the

claim, or if the amount of the claim exceeds \$599, the claimant may obtain and complete a claim form and submit it with the ticket to the lottery by mail or in person. Upon validation of the ticket, the retailer shall immediately pay the holder of the ticket.

(2) Prizes payable by on-line retailers shall be paid during all normal business hours of the retailer, provided the on-line system is operational and claims can be validated.

(3) An on-line retailer may pay prizes in cash or by business check, certified check, or money order, or any combination thereof. An on-line retailer who pays a prize with a check which is dishonored may be subject to suspension or termination of its contract.

(4) A winning on-line ticket offering a free ticket or tickets may be claimed at any on-line retailer location or at any Kansas lottery office. If a winning on-line ticket offers the player 15 or more free tickets, the prize must be claimed at lottery headquarters. A player claiming a free ticket prize at the lottery may be issued either a free ticket or a \$1.00 prize payment at the discretion of the executive director.

(c) To claim an on-line prize of more than \$599, the claimant shall obtain and complete a claim form and submit it with the winning ticket to the lottery's headquarters in Topeka by mail or in person. Prizes greater than \$599 can only be paid from the lottery's headquarters in Topeka. Upon determination that the ticket is a winning ticket, the lottery shall process for payment the amount due, less any withholding required by state and federal laws. The amount due shall be calculated according to the rules adopted for the particular on-line game. If the ticket is determined to be a non-winning ticket, the claim shall be denied and the claimant shall be promptly notified.

(d) If the claim is presented to a lottery regional office or to lottery headquarters, the claimant may complete a claim form regardless of the prize amount and submit it with the winning ticket, either by mail or in person. Upon determination that the ticket is a winning ticket, the lottery shall present or mail a check to the claimant in payment of the amount due, less any withholding required by state and federal laws.

(e) All prizes must be claimed within 365 days including the first day of the game or the drawing in which the prize was won. In the event the final day of the 365-day period falls on a day lottery headquarters is not open for business or a federal holiday, the claim period will be extended to end on the next business day. Any prizes not claimed within the specified period shall be added to the prize pools of subsequent Kansas lottery games.

(f) If the ticket is determined to be a non-winning ticket, the claim shall be denied and the claimant shall be promptly notified. Non-winning tickets will not be returned to the claimant.

(g) A validated ticket shall be the only proof of a game play or plays, and the submission of a winning ticket to and receipt of the ticket by the lottery or its authorized retailer shall be the sole method of claiming a prize.

(h) Claims in excess of \$599 shall not be paid by lottery retailers. The lottery has no obligation to reimburse re-

**111-6-7a. Ticket responsibility.** (a) If there is no signature on the back of any on-line ticket in the area designated for a signature, a ticket shall be owned by the physical possessor of the ticket. When a signature appears on the back of the ticket in the designated place, the person whose signature appears in such area shall be the owner of the ticket and shall be entitled, subject to all validation requirements, to any prize attributable to the ticket.

(b) If the signature of more than one person appears on the back of the ticket in the designated place, all persons whose signatures appear must identify one person to whom payment should be made. If all persons whose signatures appear in the appropriate space cannot identify one person to whom payment should be made, the lottery shall keep the prize until a determination of entitlement is made by the parties. In no event shall more than one person be entitled to a particular prize.

(c) The Kansas lottery shall not be responsible for lost or stolen tickets, and shall not be responsible for lost or stolen entry forms of any type which may be used for entry into a lottery drawing. (Authorized by 1995 Supp. K.S.A. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8720; effective, T-111-7-9-93, June 25, 1993; amended, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

#### Article 7.—CASH LOTTO GAME RULES

**111-7-11. Multi-Draw.** (a) In addition to a single play involving two boards for each \$1.00, a player may also have his or her selections entered in multiple drawings. Multi-draw tickets must be purchased for consecutive drawings beginning with the next drawing. This is done by marking one of the multi-draw boxes designated by 2, 3 or 4 on the play slip. The additional draw period(s) for which the ticket is valid will then appear on the computer generated ticket given to the player by the retailer.

(b) A player must pay an additional \$1.00 per two (2) boards for each additional drawing in which he or she wishes to play.

(c) Unless one of the multi-draw boxes is marked and the additional amount paid, the play will only be eligible for the current drawing up to approximately 6:45 p.m. the day of the drawing.

(d) A player may purchase only the same numbers on the same boards for multiple drawings.

(e) No multi-draw tickets may be purchased after the draw break on August 3, 1996. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-17-88, June 17, 1988; amended, T-111-6-7-90, June 1, 1990; amended, T-111-9-20-91, Sept. 13, 1991; amended, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-7-75. Multi-Draw.** (a) In addition to a single play involving a wager of \$.50 or \$1.00, a player may also have his or her selections entered in multiple drawings. Multi-draw tickets must be purchased for consecutive

drawings beginning with the next drawing. This is done by marking one of the multi-draw boxes designated by 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6 on the play slip. The additional draw period(s) for which the ticket is valid will then appear on the computer generated ticket given the player by the retailer.

(b) A player must pay an additional \$.50 or \$1.00 per play depending on the amount he or she wishes to wager for each additional drawing in which he or she wishes to play.

(c) Unless one of the multi-draw boxes is marked and the additional amount paid, the play will only be eligible for the current drawing up to the end of ticket sales the day of the drawing.

(d) A player may purchase only the same numbers on the same boards for multiple drawings. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-12-18-91, Dec. 13, 1991; amended, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

#### KENO

**111-7-76. Name of the game; rules and regulations.** The Kansas lottery shall conduct a lotto game "Keno," beginning at 6:00 a.m., October 29, 1992. The specific rules for the "Keno" game are contained in K.A.R. 111-6-1, et seq. and 111-7-76 through 111-7-83. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-1-92, Aug. 28, 1992; amended, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-7-77. Definitions.** The following definitions shall apply to "Keno."

(a) "Exchange ticket" means the ticket issued to replace a consecutive game ticket that is validated before the last game on the ticket.

(b) "Game board" or "board" means that area of the game slip which contains 80 numbers from one through 80.

(c) "Game slip" means the form used in marking a player's game plays and contains one board.

(d) "Spot" or "spots" means the amount of numbers a player may play per game.

(e) "Winning numbers" means the 20 numbers between 1 and 80, randomly selected at each drawing, which shall be used to determine winning plays contained on a game ticket. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-1-92, Aug. 28, 1992; amended, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-7-78. Game description; retail sale of tickets.**

(a) "Keno" is a 10 of 20 of 80 lottery game with fixed prize amounts. For each game, a player may select from one to 10 spots. The lottery then selects 20 winning numbers from one to 80. Prizes are awarded based on the total amount of winning numbers matched by a player for the number of spots played for that game.

(b) To play, a player must use a game slip.

(c) The player must mark the amount of spots to be played. A player can pick from one to 10 spots per game slip.

(d) The player must mark the number of dollars to be wagered per game: \$1, \$2, \$3, \$4 or \$5.



(e) The player may then select the spots to be played by one of two methods. The player may mark the player's own selections on the game slip; if this method is used, the number of spots marked on the game slip must equal the number of spots which were selected to play. The other method of play is to select "quick pick," in which the number of spots randomly generated by the computer will match the number of spots indicated by the player.

(f) The player shall indicate the number of consecutive games to be played: 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 10, 20, 50 or 100.

(g) The player shall present the completed game slip to the retailer. The cost of the ticket equals the amount wagered per game times the number of consecutive games indicated by the player.

(h) The minimum wager shall be \$1.00 per game; the maximum wager shall be \$5.00 per game. The maximum wager per game slip is \$100. Any game slip with a wager greater than \$100 shall be rejected. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-1-92, Aug. 28, 1992; amended, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-7-81. Determination of winners.** (a) "Keno" tickets may be sold every day of the year between 6:00 a.m. and 11:50 p.m. with validations allowed until 12:00 midnight. Upon implementation of software changes, tickets may be sold between 6:00 a.m. and 12:50 a.m. with validation allowed until 1:00 a.m.

(b) The selection of winning numbers shall take place as nearly as possible, at five-minute intervals. The first drawing will be at 6:05 a.m. with subsequent drawings every five minutes thereafter with the last drawing at 11:50 p.m. With the one-hour time expansion specified in subsection (a), the last drawing will occur at 12:50 a.m. All drawings will occur either on the hour or at multiples of five minutes past the hour. If a drawing cannot be held at the scheduled drawing time, the delayed drawing will take place at the next scheduled drawing time. Ticket sales for each drawing will end momentarily immediately prior to the scheduled drawing and then resume for the next drawing without delay. Keno wagering will not be inhibited between games. Each game is identified by a 6-digit consecutive game number that is assigned by the central system and the game number(s) for the drawing(s) for which the ticket was purchased will appear on the ticket. In the event a drawing does not occur at the drawing time scheduled, sales for that drawing will remain closed. Sales for the following drawing will remain open until five minutes after the results of the delayed drawing have been posted by the system. Winning game number selections for any games remaining on a player's ticket at the end of daily sales shall take place the next day.

(c) Winning number combinations shall be generated every five minutes through the use of a computer-driven random number generator located at lottery headquarters. The generator shall be statistically analyzed, tested, and certified by an independent qualified statistician for integrity. Periodic checks shall be made to ensure the security and integrity of the system at least quarterly.

(d) The Kansas lottery director of security shall establish the procedures for the operation and security of the

random number generator, including the specification of those individuals who shall have access to the system. A security officer shall accompany anyone needing access to the secured area containing the generator for any reason.

(e) All Keno prizes shall be the prizes set forth in subsection (a) above except for the 10 spot match 10 category prize when total prizes for that prize category for a single draw exceeds \$1,500,000. If that occurs, each valid winner's share for the 10 spot match 10 \$100,000 prize category shall be calculated as a parimutuel prize from a prize pool of \$1,500,000. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; and K.S.A. 74-8720; effective, T-111-9-1-92, Aug. 28, 1992; amended, T-111-8-5-94, July 15, 1994; amended, T-111-12-18-95, Dec. 14, 1995; amended, T-111-6-27-96, June 21, 1996; amended, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-7-83. Treatment of equipment.** The equipment provided to a "Keno" retailer by the lottery shall be used only for the performance of lottery authorized games under the terms of the retailer agreement. Equipment provided includes a lottery terminal, television monitor, remote control unit, controller, and mounting bracket. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-1-92, Aug. 28, 1992; amended, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

#### KANSAS CASH GAME RULES

**111-7-119. Name of the game; rules and regulations.** The Kansas lottery shall conduct a modification of the Cash Lotto game entitled "Kansas Cash," starting on August 18, 1996. The specific rules for the "Kansas Cash" game are contained in K.A.R. 111-6-1 *et seq.* and 111-7-119 through 111-7-127. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710, effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-7-120. Definitions.** The following definitions shall apply to Kansas Cash.

(a) "Retailer" means a person or entity authorized by the Kansas lottery to sell lottery tickets.

(b) "Drawing" means the formal process of selecting winning numbers which determines the number of winners for each prize level of the game as provided by subsection (f) of K.A.R. 111-6-1.

(c) "Quick pick" means the random selection by the computer system of six different numbers from one through 35 which appear on a ticket and are played by a player in the game.

(d) "Game board" or "boards" means that area of the play slip which contains 35 boxes, numbered one through 35.

(e) "Game ticket" or "ticket" means a computer generated ticket issued by an on-line terminal to a person as a receipt for the combination a person has selected.

(f) "Kansas Cash" means a lottery game wherein a player selects six numbers out of a set of numbers one through 35. A player wins a prize if three, four, five, or six of the numbers selected by the player match the randomly drawn numbers in the drawings conducted by the Kansas lottery on the applicable drawing date.

(continued)

- (g) "Lottery" means the Kansas lottery.
- (h) "Play" means the six different numbers from one (01) through 35 which appear on a ticket as a single lettered selection and are to be played by a player in the game. In Kansas Cash, a player is entitled to play two boards for \$1.00.
- (i) "Play slip" means a card used in marking a player's game plays and contains 10 boards.
- (j) "Price" means the cost of playing the Kansas Cash game which shall be \$1.00 for playing two boards.
- (k) "Terminal" means a device which is authorized by the lottery to function in on-line, interactive mode with the lottery's computer system, for the purpose of issuing lottery tickets and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including purchases, validating tickets and transmitting reports.
- (l) "Winning numbers" means the six numbers one through 35, randomly selected at each drawing, which shall be used to determine winning plays contained on a game ticket.
- (m) "Validation" or "validate" means the process of determining whether a ticket presented for a prize is a winning ticket. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710, effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-7-121. Game description; retail sale of tickets.**

(a) Kansas Cash is a six of 35 lotto game which pays prizes for correctly matching all six of the six numbers drawn with a minimum guaranteed prize of \$100,000 as provided by subsection (d) of K.A.R. 111-7-123. Prizes for correctly matching five of six numbers and four of six numbers shall be determined on a parimutuel basis with a minimum prize of \$2.00. Correctly matching three of six numbers provides a prize of one free \$1.00 Kansas Cash quick pick ticket.

(b) To play Kansas Cash, a player shall select sets of six different numbers one through 35, for input into a terminal. Tickets may be purchased from a terminal operated by a retailer. When purchased from a retailer, the player may select each two sets of numbers by: (1) communicating the numbers to the retailer; (2) by marking two, four, six, eight or 10 boards with six numbers on each board on a play slip and submitting the play slip to the retailer; or (3) requesting a quick pick from the retailer.

(c) A validated ticket shall be the only proof of a game play or plays, and the submission of a winning ticket to and receipt of the ticket by the lottery or its authorized retailer shall be the sole method of claiming a prize or prizes. A play slip has no pecuniary or prize value and shall not constitute evidence of ticket purchase, or numbers selected or prizes to be paid.

(d) A ticket may be cancelled as provided in K.A.R. 111-6-20.

(e) Starting August 18, 1996, ticket sales will end at approximately 8:59 p.m. central time (CT) on Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays and resume at approximately 9:05 p.m. for the next drawing.

(f) Drawings will be conducted three times a week, on Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays as soon as possible after the game is closed at approximately 8:59 p.m. central

time, and the lottery draw official has verified that the game is closed, under conditions and procedures promulgated by the executive director of the lottery.

(g) It shall be the sole responsibility of the player to verify the accuracy of the game plays and other data printed on the ticket. The placing of plays is done at the player's own risk through the on-line retailer who is acting on behalf of the player in entering the plays. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-7-122. Prize pool.** (a) The prize pool in the lottery prize payment fund for all prize categories shall consist of 49.45 percent of sales for each draw including free tickets awarded as prizes. The prize pool shall include all sums previously designated for the Cash Lotto jackpot prize if that jackpot is not won on the August 17, 1996, drawing. The Kansas lottery guarantees the jackpot prize for Kansas Cash shall be a minimum of \$100,000. If the minimum jackpot amount of \$100,000 is not won on the first drawing on which that amount appeared, the minimum jackpot for the next drawing shall increase to \$125,000. Further rolls of the jackpot shall result in jackpot increases based on sales. Moneys left over after the five of six and four of six prizes have been rounded down pursuant to subsection (f) of K.A.R. 111-7-123 shall be applied to prizes in categories 2 and 3 in the next Kansas Cash drawing. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710, effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-7-123. Prizes, probability of winning.** (a) Prizes shall be awarded for matching three, four, five or six numbers on a board. Prize categories, probability of winning rounded to the nearest whole number and prize allocation are as follows:

(b) The jackpot prize for matching all six winning numbers shall be calculated on a parimutuel basis and be not less than \$100,000 for the first drawing and not less than \$125,000 for the second drawing if no one matches six numbers in the first drawing. On any draw, if the jackpot is hit and the jackpot pool is insufficient to match the guarantee, the lottery will utilize the lottery prize payment fund, including unclaimed prize money to fund the guaranteed jackpot amounts.

(c) All prizes shall be paid in a lump sum.

(d) The prize money allocated to the jackpot prize category for matching six of six shall be divided equally by the number of game boards winning a jackpot prize.

(e) The prize money allocated to prize category numbers two and three shall be paid on a parimutuel basis, but not be less than the minimum amount stated in subsection (a). In situations wherein the number of winners in a category or categories results in a prize liability in excess of the percent of the prize pool allocated for that

category, the amount in the prize pool to cover the minimum \$2.00 prize, money in the lottery prize payment fund shall be used to pay the minimum amounts stated in the prize categories.

(f) The prize paid for matching five of six winning numbers shall not be less than the prize paid for matching four of six winning numbers.

(g) The prize paid for category numbers two and three shall be paid in the amount stated in subsection (a).

(h) The calculation of a prize shall be rounded down so that prizes can be paid in multiples of whole dollars. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-7-124. Prize payment.** (a) All prize categories including the jackpot prizes shall be paid in one lump sum.

(b) If the jackpot prize is not won in any drawing, the prize money allocated for the jackpot prize shall be added to the jackpot prize pool for the following drawing, however, the first rollover after the jackpot prize is won shall be not less than \$125,000.

(c) The holder of a winning ticket may win in only one prize category per board in connection with the winning numbers drawn, and shall be entitled only to the highest prize won by those numbers.

(d) Prizes shall be claimed within 365 days from the date of the drawing for which the ticket was purchased.

At the conclusion of the prize claim period, all unclaimed prizes shall remain in the lottery's prize payment fund to be used for the payment of other prizes. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-7-125. Ticket validation.** To be a valid ticket and eligible to receive a prize, a Kansas Cash ticket shall satisfy all the requirements established by the Kansas lottery for validation of winning tickets. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-7-126. Claiming prizes; procedure and time period.** (a) Following the drawing for which a Kansas Cash ticket was purchased, and prior to the payment of that prize, each ticket shall be validated by any on-line retailer or any Kansas lottery office pursuant to K.A.R. 111-6-7 and this article.

(b) The procedure for payment of a prize on any single game ticket of \$599 or less, except for a jackpot prize, is as follows:

(1) The holder of a ticket purchased in Kansas may present the ticket to any on-line retailer. Upon validation of the ticket, the retailer shall immediately make payment of the prize to the holder. If the retailer cannot validate the claim, the claimant shall fill out a claim form provided by the retailer and personally present or mail the completed form, together with the ticket, to any office of the Kansas lottery. If the claim is validated at lottery headquarters, then payment shall be made either directly to the claimant if personally present or by mail.

(2) The claimant may bring the signed ticket to any regional office of the Kansas lottery during the hours that the office is open to the public for business. Upon validation of the claim, and completion of a claim form, payment shall be processed for the claimant.

(3) The claimant may mail the ticket with a completed claim form in any envelope, to any office of the Kansas lottery. Claim forms may be obtained from any lottery retailer or any office of the Kansas lottery. Upon validation of the claim, payment shall be processed for the claimant.

If the evidence of alteration, mutilation, tear, or other ambiguity appears on the ticket, the retailer shall not make the direct payment of a prize. The claimant shall submit a claim form with the ticket to the lottery.

(c) The procedure for the payment of a Kansas Cash prize on any single game ticket which totals \$600 or more, except for a jackpot prize, shall be as follows:

The claimant may bring the signed ticket to any office of the Kansas lottery during the hours that the office is open to the public for business. Upon validation of the claim and completion of a claim form, payment shall be processed for the claimant.

(d) The procedure for the payment of a jackpot prize or for prizes won on the same ticket as a jackpot prize are as follows:

The claimant shall personally submit the signed ticket and a completed claim form to Kansas lottery headquarters or to a regional Kansas lottery office in Great Bend and Wichita. Jackpot prizes and prizes won on the same ticket as jackpot prizes shall not be claimed by mail.

(e) All prizes shall be claimed within 365 days of the drawing in which the prize was won. Any prize or prizes not claimed within the time specified shall be forfeited. If a prize is claimed by mail, the ticket and claim form must actually be received by the lottery within the claim period. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8720; effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

**111-7-127. Multi-draw.** (a) In addition to a single play involving two boards for each \$1.00, a player may also have his or her selections in multiple drawings. Multi-draw tickets must be purchased for consecutive drawings beginning with the next drawing. This is done by marking one of the multi-draw boxes designated by 2, 3, 6, 9, 12, or 15 draws on the play slip. The additional draw period(s) for which the ticket is valid will then appear on the computer generated ticket given to the player by the retailer.

(b) A player must pay an additional \$1.00 per two (2) boards for each additional drawing in which he or she wishes to play.

(c) Unless one of the multi-draw boxes is marked and the additional amount paid, the play will only be eligible for the current drawing up to approximately 8:59 p.m. the day of the drawing.

(d) When purchasing a multiple drawing ticket, a player must purchase the same numbers on the same boards for the duration of the multiple drawings. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-22-96, July 19, 1996.)

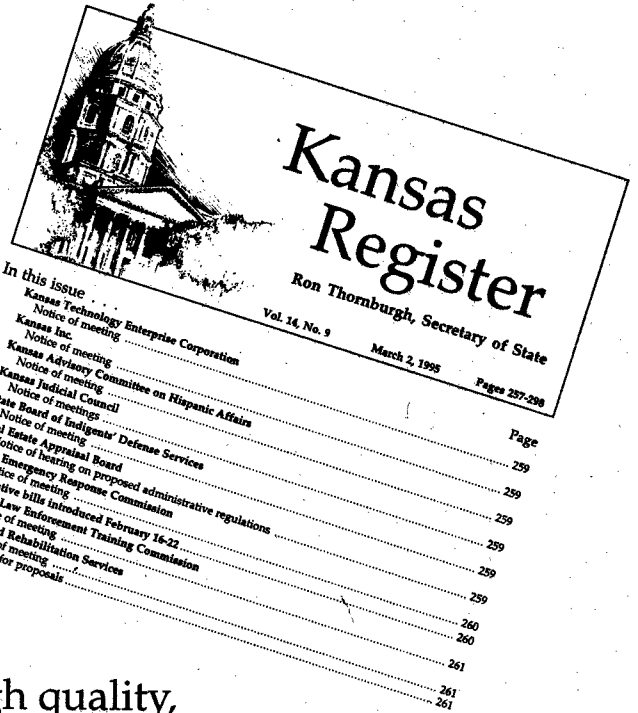
