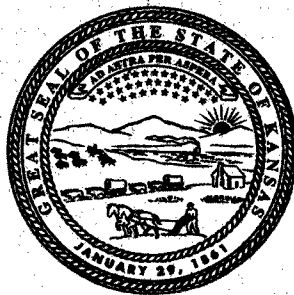

Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Friday, October 25, in the conference room at the offices of the Kansas Racing Commission, 3400 Van Buren, Topeka, to consider the adoption of a proposed permanent regulation of the Kansas Racing Commission. This 60-day notice constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulation.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting the secretary, Kansas Racing Commission, 3400 Van Buren, Topeka, 66611-2228, (913) 296-5800.

A copy of the full text of the regulation and the economic impact statement may be reviewed or obtained at the commission office. The following is a summary of the proposed regulation.

**K.A.R. 112-4-4b. Prohibited license activity.** This is a new regulation designed to prevent a licensee from engaging in any other license activity that is not provided for in that type of license. Licensees engaging in such activity may be cited by the racing judges or stewards with a violation. Subsection (b) applies specifically to the activities related to kennel owners.

**Economic Impact:** There is no economic impact as a result of this new regulation.

Sealed proposals will be received in the city manager's office, City Hall, 131 W. 5th Ave., Garnett, 66032, until 10 a.m. August 30, to furnish all labor, equipment and materials and to perform all work necessary for landscape and lighting for the Prairie Spirit Trail in Garnett. The project consists of pedestrian lighting and landscape improvements, which include the planting of trees, shrubs and prairie grass along the Prairie Spirit Rail-Trail through Garnett. The improvements also include plantings at the depot.

**30-63-23. Medications; restrictive interventions; behavioral management committee.** (a) A provider shall take proactive and remedial actions to ensure medications and other restrictive interventions to manage behavior are used only when:

- (1)(A) all other potentially effective, less restrictive alternatives have been tried and shown to be ineffective; or
- (B) it has been determined by best professional clinical practice that such less restrictive alternatives would not likely be effective; and

(2) safeguards are in effect to minimize risks related to their use.

(b) The proactive and remedial actions and procedural safeguards the provider shall take to minimize, reduce or avoid the use of medications or other restrictive interventions to manage behavior shall include:

- (1) providing positive behavior programming by:
  - (A) consulting with professionals and the person's support network to determine the least restrictive, most positive effective intervention to address the person's behavioral challenges; and
  - (B) providing reasonable environmental modifications and accommodations;

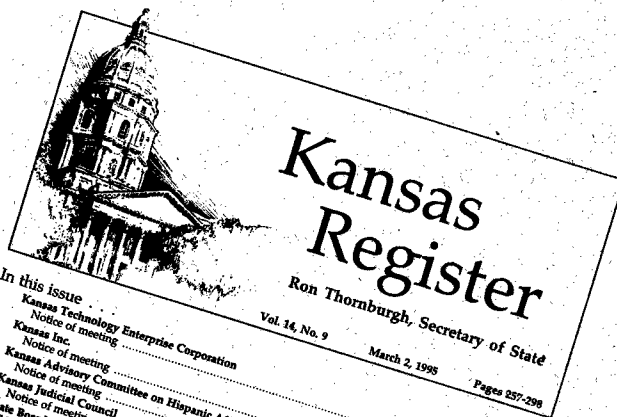
