Notice of Available Funding for Assistance to Crime Victims

Grant funds are available from the Federal Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) for federal year of October 1, 1996 through September 30, 1997. The purpose of this grant program is to fund public and private nonprofit agencies who provide direct assistance to crime victims.

For the purposes of this grant program, a crime victim is a person who has suffered physical, sexual or emotional harm as a result of the commission of a crime. Direct services are defined as efforts that (1) respond to the emotional and physical needs of crime victims; (2) assist primary and secondary victims of crime to stabilize their lives after a victimization; (3) assist victims to understand and participate in the criminal justice system; and (4) provide victims of crime with a measure of safety, such as boarding-up windows, replacing or repairing locks, etc.

Priority shall be given to victims of sexual assault, spousal abuse and child abuse. A minimum of 10 percent of each federal fiscal year grant (30 percent total) will be allocated to each of these categories of crime victims. An additional 10 percent of each VOCA grant will be allocated to victims of violent crime (other than "priority" category victims) who were previously underserved.

VOCA crime victim assistance grant funds can be used to enhance or expand services and cannot be used to supplant state and local funds that would otherwise be available for crime victim services.

There is a match requirement of a minimum of 20 percent cash or in-kind of the total VOCA project (VOCA grant award plus match). The exception is that subrecipients that are Native American tribes/organizations located on reservations, whether new or existing, are a 5 percent cash or in-kind match of the total VOCA project (VOCA grant award plus match).

The Kansas Department of Commerce and Housing and the American Institute of Architects of Kansas are seeking architects (both licensed professionals and students) interested in entering the Kansas Housing Design Competition. Both teams and individuals will design two single-family structures—one ranch and one split-level. Teams must have at least one architect licensed with the State of Kansas. Cash prizes will be awarded to the top designs.

The competition was created this year by KDC&H and AIA/Kansas as a way of gathering reliable data on home construction costs and increasing the state's stock of affordable housing. From the winning designs, KDC&H plans to coordinate the construction of 24 homes annually throughout the state. Local government will provide the lots, building permit costs and utilities for the sites. The Department of Commerce and Housing will provide half of the construction financing, with a local lending institution financing the other half. Upon completion, homes will be available for purchase by families at or below 80 percent of the median income level.

Board of Education**Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations**

The State Board of Education will conduct a public hearing at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday, November 12, in the board room of the State Education Building, 120 S.E. 10th Ave., Topeka, to consider proposed amendments to State Board Regulation 91-1-68c and K.A.R. 91-5-3.

S.B.R. 91-1-68c outlines the procedures for initial approval of teacher education programs. The purpose of the regulation is to provide colleges and universities with a standard process for initial approval of teacher education programs. The proposed amendment will allow institutions greater flexibility for submission of new program applications.

This regulation will have no economic impact upon the State Board of Education, other governmental agencies, private business or individuals, or school districts.

K.A.R. 91-5-3 prescribes the qualifications for instructors in approved driver education programs. Its purpose is to establish minimum qualifications of instructors to help assure that appropriate instruction in driver education is provided. The proposed amendment would clarify if, and under what conditions, substitute teachers can be used to teach driver education.

This regulation will have no economic impact upon the State Board of Education or other governmental agencies, or upon private business or individuals. This amendment should have no fiscal impact upon school districts, although it will provide more potential persons to serve as driver education instructors.

A complete economic impact statement for these regulations may be obtained by contacting the secretary of the State Board of Education, 120 S.E. 10th Ave., Topeka, 66612.

All interested persons will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to present their views or arguments, either orally or in writing, in regard to the proposed amended regulations. In addition, the period of public notice hereby provided constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. Such written comments may be submitted to the secretary of the State Board of Education at the above address. The hearing shall be conducted in compliance with the public hearing procedures of the State Board of Education.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Lanny Gaston at (913) 296-3906 or (913) 296-8172 (TDD).

The regulations proposed for amendment are as follows:

91-1-68c. Procedures for initial approval of teacher education programs. (a) Process initiation.

(1) Each teacher education institution that desires to have any new program approved by the state board shall

submit an intent to seek program approval to the commissioner. The intent to seek program approval shall be submitted by May 1 of the year preceding the academic year in which the institution plans to begin offering the program at least 12 months prior to the date of implementation.

(2) Each institution shall submit with its intent to seek program approval, a detailed written description of the proposed program and a plan for implementation and operation of the program, which shall be in the form and contain the information prescribed by the commissioner. The institution shall submit the number of copies of the written program description and plan requested by the commissioner.

(b) *Program report.* Upon receipt of a program folio, the commissioner shall appoint a review team to analyze the program folio. The chairperson of the review team shall be designated by the commissioner. The number of review team members shall be determined by the commissioner based upon the scope of the program to be reviewed. An institution may challenge the appointment of a team member only on the basis of a conflict of interest.

(c) *Program review.*

(1) In accordance with procedures adopted by the state board, each review team shall examine and analyze the proposed program description and plan and prepare a report expressing the findings and conclusions of the review team. The review team report shall be submitted to the commissioner who shall forward the report to the evaluation review committee and to an appropriate representative of the teacher education institution.

(2) Any such institution may prepare a response to the review team report. This response shall be prepared and submitted to the commissioner within 30 days of receipt of the review team report. Any such response shall be forwarded to the evaluation review committee by the commissioner.

(d) *Initial recommendation.* The evaluation review committee, in accordance with procedures adopted by the state board, shall prepare a written initial recommendation regarding the appropriate status to be assigned to the proposed program, which shall include a statement of the findings and conclusions of the evaluation review committee. The recommendation shall be submitted to an appropriate representative of the teacher education institution and to the commissioner.

(e) *Request for hearing.*

(1) Within 30 days of the receipt of an initial recommendation of the evaluation review committee, the teacher education institution may submit a written request to the evaluation review committee for a hearing before the committee to appeal the initial recommendation. This request shall specify, in detail, the basis for the appeal, including an identification of each item disputed by the institution.

(2) If a request for a hearing is submitted, the evaluation review committee shall conduct a hearing. The committee shall then prepare a written final recommendation regarding the appropriate status to be assigned to the proposed program, which shall include a statement of the findings and conclusions of the evaluation review committee. The recommendation shall be submitted to an appropriate representative of the teacher education institu-

tion and to the commissioner who shall submit the final recommendation to the state board for its consideration and determination of program approval according to subsection (e)(1) of this regulation.

(3) If a request for a hearing is not submitted within the time allowed under paragraph (1) of this subsection, the initial recommendation of the evaluation review committee shall become the final recommendation of the review committee. In any such situation, the recommendation of the evaluation review committee shall be submitted by the commissioner to the state board for its consideration and determination of program approval according to subsection (e)(1) of this regulation.

(f) *Approval status.*

(1) Each new program shall be approved with stipulation or not approved.

(2) If a new program is approved with stipulation, that status shall be effective until the institution's next on-site visit.

(g) *Annual report.*

(1) If approved with stipulation status is assigned to a new program, the institution shall submit an annual report to the commissioner within 60 days after completion of the second semester of operation of the program, and on or before October 1 of each year thereafter until the institution's next on-site visit.

(2) The report shall be submitted by the commissioner to the evaluation review committee for its examination and analysis.

(h) *Approval status.*

(1) The state board, at any time, may change the approved status of a teacher education program if, after providing an opportunity for a hearing, it is found that the institution has failed to meet substantially program standards or has materially changed the program. The state board, for just cause, may extend the approved status of a program, and the status of a program shall be extended automatically if, at the end of the current approval period, the program is in the process of being reevaluated by the state board. Any such extension shall be counted as part of any subsequent approval period of a program.

(2) At the time of the institution's next on-site visit, the new program shall be reviewed pursuant to S.B.R. 91-1-68d.

(3) For licensure purposes, each teacher education program that is approved with stipulation shall be considered to be approved. (Authorized by and implementing Article 6, Section 2(a) of the Kansas Constitution; effective Sept. 2, 1991; amended June 26, 1995; amended P-____.)

91-5-3. Qualifications of instructors. Effective September 1, 1979: An (a) Each instructor of an approved driver education program shall meet the requirements of the state board for teaching driver education in Kansas as well as hold a valid motor vehicle operator's license have the following:

(1)(A) a valid teacher certificate with an endorsement in driver education; or

(B) subject to the provisions of subsection (b), a valid substitute teacher certificate; and

(2) a valid motor vehicle operator's license.

(b) Each instructor who provides driver education under a substitute teacher certificate shall have had, within

the five years preceding the date of the issuance of each substitute teacher certificate, teaching experience in an approved driver education program. Notice Concerning Hazardous Waste Storage and Post-Closure Permit

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Region VII have received a Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) hazardous waste Part B permit application from Chemical Waste Management of Kansas, Incorporated (the operator) and Chemical Waste Management, Incorporated (the owner) for the facility located at 8808 N. 127th St. East, Valley Center. The KDHE and the EPA are providing notice of their intent to issue a joint hazardous waste storage and post-closure permit to the owner and operator of the facility.

The facility operated from 1977 until January 1982 under Industrial Landfill Permit No. 193 as Kansas Industrial Environmental Services, Incorporated, EPA I.D. Number KSD070902952. In August 1978, the name was changed to National Industrial Environmental Services, Incorporated. The facility qualified for interim status under the new Resource Conservation and Recovery Act in November 1980 and was acquired by Chemical Waste Management, Incorporated in December 1980.

In October 1985, the State of Kansas received final authorization from the EPA to implement its own hazardous waste management program in lieu of the federal program, except for the portions covered by the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments of 1984 (HSWA). The KDHE portion of the permit (Part I) will be issued under the authority of K.S.A. 65-3431(i) and 65-3431(s), and the EPA portion of the permit (Part II) will be issued under the authority of Sections 3002(b), 3004(u) and (v), and 3005 of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA).

Part I of the permit will allow the owner/operator to store hazardous waste in containers from on-site and off-site sources and in tanks from on-site sources. The facility will store 53,680 gallons of hazardous waste in one container storage area and 13,400 gallons of hazardous waste in two tanks. The materials managed at the facility will include ignitable, corrosive, reactive, toxic and listed hazardous waste. The container storage area and tanks have secondary containment and comply with 40 CFR Part 264 Subparts I and J. In addition, Part I of the permit requires the owner/operator to provide post-closure care of the

closed treatment and disposal units, monitor groundwater, and maintain A-level and B-level groundwater extraction programs. The EPA portion (Part II) of the joint permit will address the requirements of HSWA.

Anyone wishing to comment on the draft permit should submit written comments postmarked not later than October 15 to John W. Mitchell (KDHE) or Robert Stewart (EPA) at the above addresses. A public hearing will be conducted in conjunction with the public comment period at 7 p.m. October 8 in the basement of the Sedgwick County Fire Station, 4343 N. Woodlawn, Wichita.

After consideration of all comments received, the KDHE secretary and the EPA regional administrator will make a final permit decision. Notice will be given to the applicant, all persons who submitted written comments, those who commented at the public hearing and those who requested notice of the final permit decision. If none of the comments received during the public comment period result in revisions to the draft permit, the permit will become effective immediately upon its issuance. If comments received during the public comment period result in revisions, the permit will become effective 30 days after service of notice of the final decision or at a later date, if a review is requested under 40 CFR 124.19.

Administrative Regulations**

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment will conduct a public hearing at 1 p.m. Monday, November 4, in the MTAA conference room at the Forbes Field Air Terminal, 6700 S. Topeka, Blvd., Topeka, to consider new regulations for the Kansas Drycleaner Environmental Response Act, K.A.R. 28-68-1 through 28-68-9. The most significant changes provided by the new regulations are the introduction of performance standards for drycleaning facilities and use of the trust fund for corrective action at contaminated drycleaning facilities. The regulations are to conform to K.S.A. 65-34,141 et seq. (1995 House Bill 2256).

Summary of Proposed Regulations

K.A.R. 28-68-1 provides the definitions used throughout the remaining regulations.

K.A.R. 28-68-2 describes the annual registration for drycleaning facilities.

K.A.R. 28-68-3 describes the performance standards and time schedules for drycleaning facilities. The performance standards are meant to reduce or prevent spills and releases from drycleaning wastes.

K.A.R. 28-68-4 describes the process for removal of drycleaning solvents at closed facilities.

K.A.R. 28-68-5 describes the application and data one must submit so the department can rank and prioritize the contaminated site for corrective action.

K.A.R. 28-68-6 describes the required \$2,500 deductible payment prior to the department performing corrective action.

K.A.R. 28-68-7 describes the reimbursement process for payment of corrective action costs.

K.A.R. 28-68-8 describes how the department will prioritize each site for expenditures from the trust fund.

K.A.R. 28-68-9 describes the process for determining completion of corrective action.

As a result of these regulations, a regulatory impact has been written.

Environmental Benefit

One benefit of these regulations is the proposed performance standards will reduce or prevent future spills and releases of drycleaning solvents and drycleaning wastes. An additional benefit is the trust fund will pay for corrective action at sites. Corrective action for a contaminated site is typically very costly and unaffordable for an operator of the drycleaning facility or the current property owner.

General Public

The new regulations will not impose any new costs on the general public. However, the statute created a trust fund which is funded, in part, by a 2 percent environmental surcharge on gross receipts for drycleaning and laundering services. The surcharge is typically paid by the public when they use drycleaning services. This funding is typically 85-90 percent of the trust fund receipts.

Industrial and Agricultural

The new regulations will impose new costs on the drycleaning facilities to meet the new performance standards required by the statute. Examples of these costs are dikes around drycleaning machines to capture spills and leaks, and new requirements for handling and disposing of drycleaning wastes for those facilities which use chlorinated solvents.

The statute created a trust fund which is funded in part by an environmental surcharge when drycleaning solvent is purchased. The surcharge is paid by the drycleaning operator. This surcharge is typically 10-15 percent of the trust fund receipts.

The new regulations may impose a cost to suppliers of drycleaning solvent. The performance standards require a special coupling to deliver solvent to drycleaning machines. The purpose of this coupling is to reduce spills during deliveries.

The new regulations will not impose any new costs on other industry or on agriculture.

State Agencies

The adoption of the proposed regulations will create KDHE administrative and oversight costs for receiving and handling registrations, applications, reimbursements, field inspections and oversight of corrective action of a state contractor.

Counties and Municipalities

The new regulations will not impose any new costs on counties and municipalities. In some cases, a municipality may choose to become the applicant to the trust fund for one or more contaminated drycleaning sites within the city. In this case, the municipality would pay the \$2,500 deductible for each contaminated drycleaning facility.

The time period between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written comments prior to the hearing. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Attn: Lloyd E. Dunlap, Bureau of Environmental Remediation, Forbes Field, Building 740, Topeka, 66620. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to limit oral presentations to five minutes.

Copies of the proposed regulations may be obtained from Lloyd E. Dunlap, (913) 291-3250. A copy will be available for inspection at the Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Bureau of Environmental Remediation, Topeka.

Executive Order No. 96-8

Establishing the Governor's Council on Work Force Training and Investment

WHEREAS, Article 1, § 3 of the Constitution of the State of Kansas vests the supreme executive power of the state in the Governor; and

WHEREAS, Article 1, § 4 of the Constitution of the State of Kansas vests in the Governor, the power to require information from the officers of the executive department, upon any subject related to their respective duties; and

WHEREAS, the Governor has signed into law 1996 Senate Bill 459 creating the job training and investment program known as the Kansas Investments in Major Projects and Comprehensive Training Act or the IMPACT Act; and

WHEREAS, the approval of the Governor's Council on Work Force Training and Investment is required for each project under the IMPACT Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, there is hereby

established the Governor's Council on Work Force Training and Investment.

1. The Council shall be composed of eight (8) members, which will consist of the Secretaries of Departments of Commerce and Housing, Administration, Human Resources, Revenue, and Social and Rehabilitation Services, the President of the Kansas Development Finance Authority, the Director of the Budget, and the Commissioner of Education or their designees. The Secretary of Administration shall chair all meetings of the Council.

2. The Council will meet as frequently as necessary for the purpose of reviewing and considering for approval all proposed IMPACT program agreements. Specifically, the Council will study agreements among an employer, an educational institution and the Department of Commerce and Housing to determine eligibility and compliance with statutory requirements and the environmental and economic impact of the proposed agreements. Such review shall include, but not be limited to, the following criteria:

- A. Does the employer qualify as a Kansas basic enterprise?
- B. Are the "new jobs" involved documented?
- C. Are all "program costs" allowable?
- D. Are all "program services" allowable and service providers and payment amounts identified?
- E. Do the total program costs in the agreement exceed 90% of the expected ten year withholding on the new jobs?
- F. Is program funding identified as to amounts to be paid from bond proceeds, the IMPACT program services fund, tuition and other educational institutions charges, and grants and donations?

3. The Council shall act in an advisory role as to all other aspects concerning the proper functioning of the IMPACT Act including, but not limited to, the following:

- A. Recommendations as to any changes to the IMPACT Act.
- B. Recommendations for changes to proposed or enacted regulations adopted pursuant to the IMPACT Act.
- C. Recommendations as to limitations on bonds to be issued and the timing on the issuance of bonds to assure the availability of revenues for cash flow purposes of the State General Fund and the IMPACT program.
- D. Recommendations as to the rates at which money is credited to the IMPACT program repayment fund and IMPACT program services fund.
- E. Recommendations for the time period within which bonds issued under the IMPACT Act are to be retired.

This order shall supersede Executive Orders No. 91-135 and 91-138, which are hereby rescinded. This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 96-8 and shall be effective immediately.

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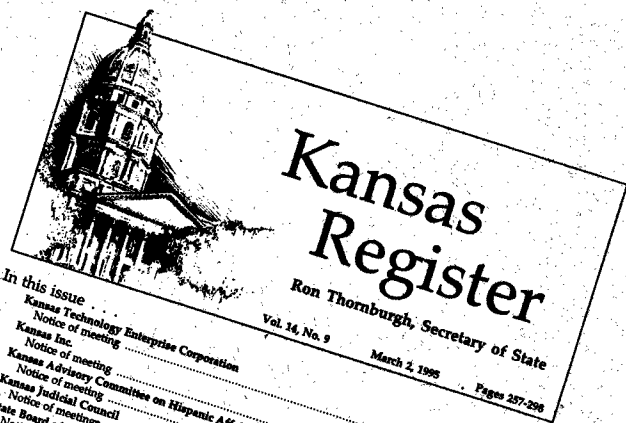
