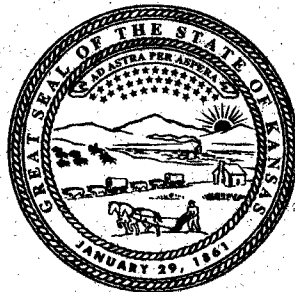

## Opinion No. 96-68

**Public Records, Documents and Information—Records Open to Public—Lists of Names and Addresses Derived from Public Records; Exception to Disclosure.** Dwight D. Radke, Rice County Attorney, Lyons, August 21, 1996.

K.S.A. 45-216(a) requires public records to be open for inspection unless the record falls within one of the exceptions listed in K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 45-221. An agency shall not be required to disclose records of a utility unless the request concerns billings for a specific individual customer named by the requester. A request for records which does not fall under an exclusion listed in K.S.A. 45-221(a) cannot be denied for the reason that the requester plans to contact those listed for the purpose of purchasing property or services. ## Opinion No. 96-69

**Counties and County Officers—General Provisions—Home Rule Powers; Creation of a Position within the County Department of Corrections.**

**Counties and County Officers—Sheriff—Charge and Custody of Jail.** William T. North, Chase County Attorney, Cottonwood Falls, August 21, 1996.

A sheriff is required to transport prisoners that are housed within the county jail to medical appointments. However, a county resolution that transfers the operation of a jail from the sheriff to a county department of corrections may remove that responsibility from the sheriff. Furthermore, pursuant to its home rule powers, a county may create the position of transport officer in a county department of corrections. Such transport officer may carry a concealed weapon while acting within the scope of his or her authority. If the officer's sole function is to transport prisoners, then the officer may not be subject to the certification requirement of the Kansas Law Enforcement Training Act. **Cities and Municipalities—Public Recreation and Playgrounds—Establishment of System of Public Recreation; Establishment by Petition or by Action of City or School District; Annual Budget; Tax Levy; Revocation of Authority to Operate.** Don Knappenberger, Stafford County Attorney, St. John, August 23, 1996.

A recreation system established pursuant to K.S.A. 12-1925 may be dissolved following submission of a petition signed by at least 5 percent of the qualified voters of the recreation district seeking to bring to an election a proposition authorizing dissolution, and approval of the proposition by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon. Such election may be conducted in any year following the third year of operation of the recreation sys-

**Counties and County Officers—County Appraiser—Appointment; Term and Qualifications; Proper Respondent in Complaint Filed with Real Estate Appraisal Board.**

**Personal and Real Property—Real Estate Appraisers—Revocation or Suspension of Certificate or License; or Other Disciplinary Action; Proper Respondent in Complaint Filed with Real Estate Appraisal Board.** Mike Haynes, Executive Director, Kansas Real Estate Appraisal Board, Topeka, August 26, 1996.

A licensed or certified county or district appraiser would be the appropriate respondent in a complaint filed with the board which alleges errors, omissions, carelessness, negligence or lack of reasonable diligence in the development or report of a mass appraisal property, even when such was performed, in whole or in part, by an unlicensed or uncertified person working under the supervision of the licensed or certified county or district appraiser. In addition, any other licensed or certified appraiser who participated in the appraisal development or report complained about should be named as a respondent as well.

Mere dissatisfaction by a taxpayer with the value assessed by a county or district appraiser's office does not provide a legally sufficient basis for board investigation or initiation of a disciplinary proceeding against a licensed county or district appraiser. For the board to assume jurisdiction, a complaint filed with the board must factually allege on its face that the assessed value resulted from errors, omissions, carelessness, negligence or lack of reasonable diligence in the development and/or report of a mass appraisal property. ## Opinion No. 96-72

**Cities and Municipalities—Compacts Between Missouri and Kansas—Kansas and Missouri Metropolitan Culture District Compact.** Representative Gary A. Merritt, 20th District, Overland Park, August 28, 1996.

The use of public funds to finance the Kansas and Missouri Metropolitan Culture District is for a valid public purpose, and payment of those funds to a private entity will not defeat that purpose. Furthermore, because the district is a political subdivision of both the states of Kansas and Missouri, public funds appropriated by Kansas counties that are part of the district may be used to fund cultural activities and organizations within the district even if the activity occurs in a Missouri county that is part of the district.

The proposed ballot language substantially conforms to the requirements of the compact, and the fact that all of the federal and private contributions to the district may not be forthcoming in the amounts represented in the ballot will not vitiate the election unless the representations on the ballot are misleading. The act requires that a

county that adopts a resolution make certain findings and that the resolution that contains those findings be printed on the election notice and on the ballot. The Kansas and Missouri Metropolitan Culture District Compact Act is identical to the compact enacted by the Missouri Legislature.

The county-wide retailers' sales tax shall expire upon the date of withdrawal of a county from the district, if and when the compact becomes null and void, or upon the collection of \$118,000,000, whichever event occurs first. Finally, any contractual obligations incurred by the commission prior to the effective date of a repealing statute must be paid before the compact becomes null and void. **Payment of Principal and Interest**

The Kansas State Treasurer will serve as the bond registrar and paying agent for the bonds, and the principal of the bonds will be payable upon surrender at the paying agent's principal offices in the City of Topeka, Kansas. Interest will be paid by the mailing of a check or draft of the paying agent to the registered owners of the bonds.

**Security for the Bonds**

The bonds and the interest thereon will constitute general obligations of the city, and the full faith, credit and resources of the city will be pledged to the payment thereof. The city is obligated to levy ad valorem taxes without limitation as to rate or amount upon all of the taxable tangible property within the territorial limits of the city for the purpose of paying the bonds and the interest thereon.

**Delivery of the Bonds**

The bonds, duly printed, executed and registered, will be furnished and delivered at the expense of the city to the successful bidder, or at its direction, on or before September 30, 1996, at such bank or trust company or other qualified depository in the State of Kansas or Kansas City, Missouri, as may be specified by the successful bidder. Delivery elsewhere will be made at the expense of the successful bidder.

**Legal Opinion**

The bonds will be sold subject to the legal opinion of Jonathan P. Small, Chartered, Topeka, Kansas, bond counsel, whose fees will be paid by the city. Bond counsel's approving legal opinion as to the validity of the bonds will be printed on the bonds and will be delivered to the successful bidder upon delivery of the bonds. (Reference is made to the official notice of bond sale for a discussion of tax exemption and other legal matters.)

**Financial Matters**

The city's 1996 equalized assessed tangible valuation for computation of bonded debt limitations is \$11,625,449. The city's outstanding general obligation bonded indebtedness as of July 31, 1996, totals the principal amount of \$1,956,000, including the bonds described herein.

Voting.** This regulation is amended to provide for Voice Response Voting using touch tone telephones and an alternate system of voting for those without access to touch tone telephones, or other problems. The date for KPERS' distribution of candidate listings is changed from April to March of the calendar year in which the term of an elected trustee expires. The wording is changed to allow only active or retired members to vote. The deadline for voting is changed to April 30.

**K.A.R. 80-8-4. Election committee.** This regulation is amended to provide for the supervision and monitoring of the Voice Response Voting using touch tone telephones and the alternate system of voting for those without access to touch tone telephones.

**Article 6.—UNIFORM CONSUMER CREDIT CODE**

**75-6-9. Additional charges.** (a) The charges enumerated in K.S.A. 16a-2-501 (1)(d) shall be considered "additional charges in connection with a consumer credit transaction" if such charges:

(1) are made under conditions which permit their exclusion from the definition of "finance charge" under the provision of K.S.A. 16a-1-301 (18)(b)(iii); and

(2) are payable to a third party who is not related to the creditor, except as allowed by K.S.A. 16a-1-301 (7)(b).

(b) Additional charges shall be considered "in connection with a consumer credit transaction," as used in K.S.A. 16a-2-501 and subsection (a) of this regulation if:

(1) in relation to insurance premiums, the creditor or a person related to the creditor receives a commission on any insurance sold on the same day on which the consumer credit transaction was consummated; or

(2) in relation to all other additional charges, such charges are made for goods, services, or both rendered within one month before or after the consummation of the consumer credit transaction. **Article 4.—OCCUPATION AND CONCESSIONAIRE LICENSES**

**112-4-14b. Trainer responsibility.** (a) Each trainer of record shall be responsible for greyhounds in the trainer's care as to:

- (1) Eligibility;
- (2) weight;
- (3) physical fitness;
- (4) absence of prohibited substances;
- (5) proper equipment; and
- (6) timely arrival in the paddock.

(b) Each trainer shall be held responsible for each positive test revealing any substance foreign to a greyhound in the trainer's care unless the trainer can show by a preponderance of the evidence that neither the trainer nor any employee or agent of the trainer was responsible for or had knowledge of the administration of the substance causing the positive test.

(c) Each trainer shall be held responsible for each puncture mark on a greyhound in the trainer's care unless the trainer can show by a preponderance of the evidence that neither the trainer nor any employee or agent of the trainer was responsible for or had knowledge of any injection. ## Article 11.—INVESTMENT SECURITIES

**17-11-14. Directors' meetings.** (a) Minutes shall be made of each directors' meeting of a bank or trust company. The minutes shall show any action taken by the directors.

(b) In addition to any other actions the board may take, the following specific actions shall be taken by the board of directors and noted in the minutes:

(1) election of all officers showing their titles, salaries, and bonuses, if any;

(7) approval of bank income and expenses and securities transactions;

(8) review and ratification of any committee reports; and
