Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Friday, January 24, by the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission in its conference room, 3400 S.W. Van Buren, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed amended permanent regulations. This 60-day notice constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting the secretary at the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission, 3400 S.W. Van Buren, Topeka, 66611-2228, (913) 296-5800.

A copy of the full text of the regulations and the economic impact statement may be reviewed or obtained at the commission office. The following is a summary of the proposed amendments:

K.A.R. 112-10-6. Bleeder list. The amendments to this regulation require that the animal health officer or assistant animal health officer place a horse on the bleeder list when certain conditions are met. The discretion to place or remove a horse from the bleeder list is left to the animal health officer or assistant animal health officer and not the veterinarian employed by the owner.

Economic Impact: There are no costs anticipated as a result of this regulation.

K.A.R. 112-16-14. Appeal, stewards' and racing judges' hearing. This regulation establishes the appeal procedure used by the commission stewards and racing judges for licensee hearings conducted at the racetrack on hearings that are not governed by KAPA. These amendments allow for a decision on appeal to be affirmed. An order entered by the stewards or racing judges shall be deemed an initial order and a notice of appeal form shall constitute the appealing party's written brief. The appeal time has been changed from 10 days to 72 hours after personal service of an order.

Economic Impact: There are no costs anticipated as a result of these changes. However, there may be some savings of expenses for licensees who will be able to appear before the stewards or racing judges during the race meet and not at a later date when most would have to travel long distances to attend a hearing.

The Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services is accepting applications for grants under the Child Care and Development Block Grant and the Child Care and Development Fund for child care related activities. Grant component areas include center-based and school-age establishment, expansion or quality enhancement; family resource center, provider recruitment and retention; Head Start wrap-around; employer child care campaign; provider training/technical assistance; and local child care advisory groups. Eligible applicants must be public or nonprofit agencies.

Instructions for completing the application are described in the RFP, which is available upon request from area SRS offices or from Jane Erwin, Child Care Unit, Room 651-West, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, 66612, (913) 296-3349. Applications must be postmarked not later than Friday, January 17.

Applications will be reviewed at the local, state and SRS central office levels. Final approval of all recommendations for funding will be made by the Deputy Secretary of SRS. It is anticipated that funding would be available to grantees by May 1997.

Two funding streams support this grant program: the Child Care and Development Block Grant (CCDBG) Act of 1990 and the Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF) of 1996 created through The Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act. There is no match requirement for the use of these federal funds.

The proposed amendments to this regulation reduce air emission fees and implement requirements which direct the Secretary of Health and Environment to "periodically increase or decrease such fees consistent with the need to cover the direct and indirect costs" of the air permits program. The current regulation is proposed to be amended to extend the fee reduction from \$18 per ton of air emissions to \$15 per ton, promulgated in December 1995, for four additional years. This revision postpones the increase to \$18 per ton from the current emissions fee level of \$15 per ton from emission year 1997 to emission year 2001. An additional total fee reduction of approximately \$600,000 per year will be realized from the years 1997, 1998, 1999 and 2000 by the 230 air emission sources statewide subject to this regulation.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Environment, Bureau of Air and Radiation, will conduct a public hearing at 10 a.m. Thursday, January 23, at the Johnson County northeast offices, Rooms A, B and C, 6000 Lamar, Mission, to consider the adoption of a proposed new air quality regulation, K.A.R. 28-19-79. K.A.R. 28-19-79 would reduce the level of motor vehicle fuel volatility for Johnson and Wyandotte counties in Kansas. A summary of the proposed regulation and its economic impact follows.

The State of Kansas is required under the federal Clean Air Act and its regulations to implement air pollution control measures which will achieve and maintain air quality in the state within the ambient air quality standards established by the EPA. Johnson and Wyandotte counties in the Kansas portion of the Kansas City metropolitan area (KCMA) air quality control region have experienced problems complying with the federal ambient air quality standard for ozone. In order to meet the requirement that the state maintain ozone levels within the national standards in the KCMA, KDHE is proposing a new regulation to reduce the level of fuel volatility during the ozone season (June 1 to September 15 of each year) from the current level of 7.8 pounds per square inch (psi) Reid vapor pressure (RVP) to 7.2 psi, beginning with the 1997 ozone season. This limit will reduce the emissions of volatile organic compounds from motor vehicle fuel. Volatile organic compounds are precursor pollutants which aid in the formation of ozone in the lower atmosphere. By limiting the fuel volatility, and thus the emissions of volatile organic compounds, the state anticipates that this control measure will improve compliance with the national ambient air quality standard for ozone in the Kansas City metropolitan area. Evaluation of the cost-effectiveness of this control measure indicated that it was the most cost-effective among those available for implementation prior to the 1997 ozone season that resulted in significant emission reductions. The consumers of motor vehicle fuel are expected to experience an increase in the price of gasoline during the ozone season not greater than 1.6 cents per gallon throughout the KCMA.

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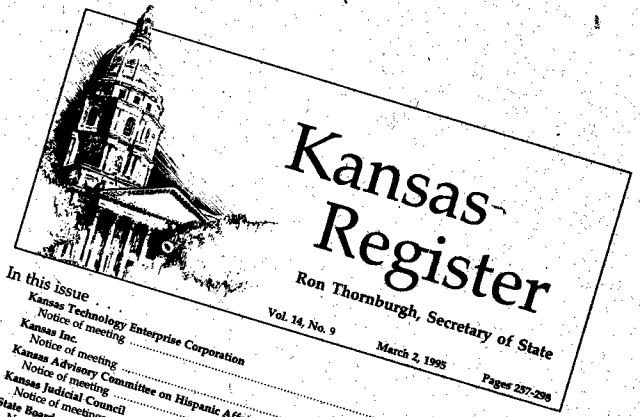
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
