Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Thursday, February 27, at the office of the Board of Veterinary Examiners, 1003 Lincoln, Wamego, to consider the adoption on a permanent basis of proposed amended regulations K.A.R. 70-4-8 through 70-4-10 and new regulation 70-1-6.

The period of 60 days notice constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. Written comments may be sent to the board at P.O. Box 242, Wamego, 66547-0242. The following is a summary of the proposed regulations:

K.A.R. 70-4-8 through 70-4-10 address the process a veterinarian must follow in applying for a license in the state. K.A.R. 70-1-6 defines the term "anesthetized." None of these regulations is mandated by federal law. There will be no cost to the board, other governmental agencies or units, private citizens, or consumers of veterinary products or services. The change is being requested by the Board of Veterinary Examiners and there is no economic impact on any business, individual or the state economy.

Any Kansas citizen or organization may submit a documented nomination in one of six categories: Individual Artist, Arts Organization, Art Educator, Arts Advocate, Individual Patron, or Patron Organization. Individual artists may be in the visual, performing, literary, folk, or media arts.

Nominees must be Kansas citizens or Kansas-based organizations with records of outstanding contributions to the excellence, growth and support or availability of the arts in Kansas. Prior honorees, current members of the commission or its staff, and art projects or programs are not eligible.

Award recipients will be selected in March from the eligible nominees by a panel including members of the Kansas Arts Commission, a representative of the Governor, and representatives from various arts disciplines and organizations. The honorees chosen will be recognized during a public ceremony.

All original nominations must be submitted on the official form. Nominations that are handwritten or received after the deadline will not be considered. If more than one nomination is received for the same person or organization, only the first one received will be accepted.

Applicant Assistance Video Conferences

The Kansas Arts Commission is distributing guideline and application form booklets for grant programs available to Kansas nonprofit organizations, communities, and schools and to other governmental entities for support of arts programs and projects that will occur during fiscal year 1998 (July 1, 1997—June 30, 1998).

The two primary grant programs are Project Support, with an application deadline of 5 p.m. February 3, and Operational Support, including any Arts In Education and Kansas Touring Program components, with an application deadline of 5 p.m. February 18.

Other deadlines are 5 p.m. February 3 for Arts and K-12 Curriculum (QPA) grants and May 1 for Rural Cultural Opportunity grants.

The guidelines also include the application procedures for Technical Assistance (Leadership Exchange and Design Arts Consultants), Grassroots, and Kansas Touring Program grants. Applications must be submitted prior to the beginning of a planned project and will be accepted until the allocated funds have been exhausted.

To assist prospective applicants in understanding extensive revisions to the grant programs and the application process itself, two live, interactive video conferences have been scheduled on Tuesday, January 7. The telecasts will originate from the Kansas State Board of Education Building, 120 S.E. 10th, Topeka.

The first telecast—from 2 to 5 p.m.—will be received at these locations:

- Northwest Kansas Area Health Education Center, 217 E. 32nd, Hays
- Northwest Kansas Educational Service Center, 703 W. 2nd, Oakley
- Wichita State University, Media Resources Center

The second telecast—from 6 to 9 p.m.—will be received at these locations:

- Kansas State University at Salina, Technology Center, 2409 Scanlan Ave.
- Southeast Kansas Education Service Center, Route 4, Greenbush

The meeting sites have been distributed geographically so no one has to drive more than 90 miles to attend. Persons living in Northeast Kansas may attend either of the telecasts at the originating site in Topeka.

K.A.R. 40-2-24. Life and health reinsurance agreements. This regulation replaces K.A.R. 40-2-21 and adopts the NAIC "life and health reinsurance agreements" model regulation sections 3, 4, 5 and 6 by reference, subject to some additions and exceptions. The purpose of the proposed regulation is to set forth regulatory requirements pertaining to financial and surplus relief reinsurance arrangements between insurance companies. In addition, the regulation addresses accounting requirements pertaining to reinsurance agreements and includes requirements pertaining to the terms of reinsurance agreements. The regulation should have a minimal financial impact on most insurance agencies and on the department.

There will be no discrimination against anyone because of race, age, religion, color, sex, handicap or national origin in the award of contracts.

Each bidder shall file a sworn statement executed by or on behalf of the person, firm, association or corporation submitting the bid, certifying that such person, firm, association or corporation has not, either directly or indirectly, entered into any agreement, participated in any collusion, or otherwise taken any action in restraint of free competitive bidding in connection with the submitted bid. This sworn statement shall be in the form of an affidavit executed and sworn to by the bidder before a person who is authorized by the laws of the state to administer oaths. The required form of the affidavit will be provided by the state to each prospective bidder. Failure to submit the sworn statement as part of the bid approval package will make the bid nonresponsive and not eligible for award consideration.

Article 23.—SHORT-TERM TREATMENT
OF OBESITY

100-23-1. Short-term treatment of obesity. Amphetamines and sympathomimetic amines listed on schedule III and IV under the Uniform Controlled Substances Act shall not be dispensed or prescribed for the short-term treatment of obesity, except in conformity with the following minimal requirements. (a) The treating

physician shall take a complete history of the patient and shall give a complete physical examination. The physical examination shall include checking the blood pressure and pulse, examining the heart and lungs, recording weight and height, and administering any other appropriate diagnostic tests. The history and examination shall be sufficient to determine if the patient has previously been drug dependent, to determine if the cause of the obesity is one that indicates the drugs are inappropriate and to determine if other contraindications to use of the drugs exist. The treating physician shall enter each of those findings in the patient's record.

(b) The treating physician shall prescribe a diet for weight loss and record the diet on the patient record.

(c) The treating physician shall prescribe a daily dosage that does not exceed the dosage recommended in the manufacturer's prescribing information for the drug prescribed or dispensed.

(d) The treating physician shall not dispense or prescribe more than a 30-day supply for a patient on the first visit. Thereafter, not more than a 30-day supply shall be dispensed or prescribed at the time of each visit. The patient shall be weighed at each visit prior to dispensing or prescribing an additional supply of the drug and the weight shall be entered in the patient's record. If the patient is found not to have achieved a significant weight loss since the last patient visit, the treating physician shall not prescribe or dispense any additional drug for that patient.

(e) At the time of each return patient visit, the treating physician shall monitor progress of the patient. The patient's weight, blood pressure, pulse, heart, and lungs shall be checked. The findings shall be entered in the patient's record.

(f) Except as otherwise provided by this regulation, schedule III or IV amphetamines or sympathomimetic amines shall not be dispensed or prescribed for a patient for obesity for a period longer than 90 days. However, the treating physician may extend therapy beyond 90 days under the following conditions:

(1) when amphetamines or sympathomimetic amines are indicated for treatment of diseases other than obesity; and

(2) when in the physician's professional judgement, the treating physician is observing and recording significant progress or benefit from the drugs and no adverse effects occur that are related to the treatment. These observations shall be documented in the patient's record.

(g) The treating physician may prescribe or dispense dexfenfluramine hydrochloride for a patient for treatment of obesity for a period of 360 days in a two-year period. Any such dispensing or prescription order shall comply with the indications and usage instructions and the dosage and administration instructions as stated in the manufacturer's package insert, as approved by the federal drug administration and as in effect October 24, 1996, which is hereby adopted by reference. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 65-2837a; effective, T-86-25, July 24, 1985; effective May 1, 1986; amended, T-100-12-16-96, Dec. 16, 1996.)

Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS

111-2-4. Compensation. (a) Each lottery retailer shall be compensated for selling lottery tickets and/or shares in accordance with the terms of the contract or contracts currently in effect between the Kansas Lottery and the lottery retailer.

(b) Effective with the implementation of a new on-line gaming system and gaming terminals on or around July 1, 1997, as consideration for problem on-line game tickets that cannot be sold and are not cancelled, a retailer shall receive an additional .05 percent selling commission for its net on-line sales. Any on-line game ticket that was neither sold nor cancelled shall not be returned to the lottery for credit. At the discretion of the executive director, credit may be applied to a retailer's account in the event of a major terminal or system malfunction that results in unsellable and uncancellable tickets being charged to the retailer. If the employee fails to ask adult customers for the purchase of a lottery ticket and the customer brings it to the clerk's attention before leaving the premises, the retailer shall give the adult customer one \$1.00 instant lottery ticket at no charge.

(c) All retailer employees at each location shall wear promotional buttons and display special point-of-sale materials provided by the lottery each Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. during the promotion announcing the promotion to its customers. These promotional materials consist of:

(1) A tent card to be displayed at the point where tickets are sold.

(2) A window/monitor banner to be displayed at the front entrance of the business and/or below the lottery information display system monitor.

These materials must be on display during all hours of the promotion at the times and dates established in subsections (b) and (c) for a store to be eligible for a prize.

(d) The Kansas lottery will provide each location with credit of \$25. This will be credited to each store's account at the beginning of the promotion.

(e) Any tickets given away above the \$25 allowance representing 25 tickets per location will be the responsibility of Riverstop.

(f) Each retail location shall maintain a ticket log form to be completed every time a lottery ticket is given away. The log will be picked up by the Kansas lottery district manager servicing the retailer location at the end of the promotion.

(g) At the end of the promotion, if the store has a 20 percent increase in lottery product, a lottery scratch party will be provided. Promotional items and credit for an additional \$25 in lottery tickets will be awarded by the lottery. The base sales period for Riverstop will be the 31 day average sales based upon total lottery sales from January 1, 1997, to January 31, 1997, compared to total sales from January 1, 1996, to January 31, 1996. 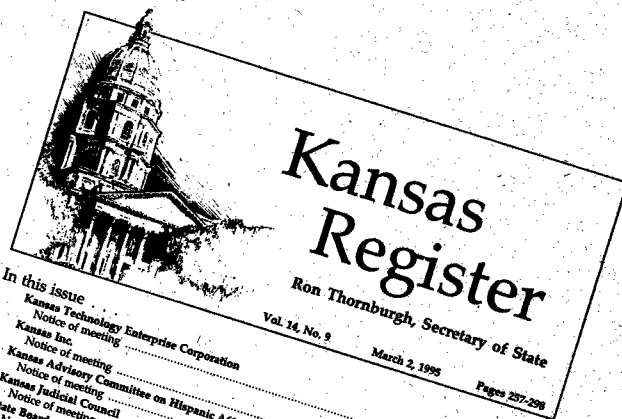
