for State Crime Victims' Assistance

Grant funds are available from the State Crime Victims' Assistance Fund for fiscal year 1998. The purpose of the grant program is to provide services and assistance to victims of crime in order to speed their recovery from the financial loss, physical suffering and emotional trauma of victimization; and to assure proper and sensitive treatment of crime victims in the criminal justice process.

It is the intention of this grant program to provide as wide a range of coverage to the citizens of the state as possible. In distributing funds among urban and rural areas of the state, priority shall be given to those areas with the greatest need. Activities or services which can be funded include, but are not limited to, 24-hour crisis intervention, support or emergency services; counseling; assistance with compensation claims; community referrals; prosecutor/court-related services; shelter support; criminal justice advocacy, etc.

Available funds may be awarded to units of state or local government or private not-for-profit organizations for defined program activities. Each applicant may receive up to \$25,000 in grant funds, but not more than 50 percent of the total applicant agency's budget prior to grant award.

Public Notice 97-01

This notice is issued to clarify the application of sales and use taxes to sales of modular homes and to their installation and incorporation into real property. The following words and terms, when used in this notice, shall have the following meanings:

Modular home—A structure fabricated in one or more modules at a location other than the home site, or fabricated utilizing one or more modular components, and designed to be used as a permanent residence when the components are transported to the home site and installed on a permanent foundation. The term includes the plumbing, heating, air conditioning, and electrical systems built into the modules. Modular homes are certified by the manufacturer to be constructed in accordance with a nationally recognized building code. Modular homes do not include: (A) structures constructed of sectional or panelized systems not utilizing modular components; (B) structures built on a permanent chassis; or (C) manufactured or mobile homes, as defined at K.S.A. 58-4202.

Manufacturer—A business that constructs modular home modules or modular components at a fixed location other than the homesite.

Dealer—A person who acts as an agent or broker for a modular home manufacturer. A dealer may also act as a retailer of modular homes.

Incorporated into realty or installed—A condition whereby a modular home is served by a water or gas utility, is connected to a sanitary sewer facility, or is permanently attached to a foundation or incorporated into another structure by means other than its own weight. It is a condition whereby the home is no longer tangible personal property and cannot be moved without a substantial change to the home or to the real estate.

When a manufacturer or dealer enters into a lump sum contract with a customer which calls for the sale and installation of a modular home on the premises of the customer, the manufacturer is considered to be a construction contractor if the modular home is incorporated into realty of the customer before the title first passes from the manufacturer. Under such a contract, the manufacturer is considered to be the final user or consumer of the materials and supplies that are incorporated into the real estate pursuant to K.S.A. 79-3603(1). Such a manufacturer shall accrue sales tax on the cost of the materials and supplies that make up the modular home, unless tax was paid at the time such materials and supplies were purchased.

A manufacturer or dealer who merely sells a modular home to a customer but does not at the same time agree to install the home or incorporate it into the realty of the customer is considered to be a retailer of the modular home and is required to collect and remit sales tax on the entire selling price of the modular home. A manufacturer who transfers title of a modular home to a dealer to hold in inventory or for display is making an exempt sale for resale.

Manufacturers may act as a retailer on some contracts and as a contractor on others. Manufacturers that do both should purchase construction materials tax exempt since they must collect sales tax when they sell a modular home as tangible personalty and accrue sales tax when they affix a home to real estate. Other manufacturers enter into construction exclusively and never engage in reselling modular homes as tangible personal property. These manufacturers should pay tax on materials at the time of purchase and avoid additional reporting responsibilities.

Sales of modular homes that qualify as sales in interstate commerce are exempt from Kansas retailers' sales tax. Sales in interstate commerce include those sales where a Kansas manufacturer or dealer transports the modular home out-of-state but does not affix the home to the real estate. When a Kansas manufacturer or dealer affixes such a modular home to real estate located in another state before the title first passes from the manufacturer, Kansas sales tax is due since the manufacturer is acting as a contractor/consumer on such contracts.

Nonresident manufacturers and dealers who deliver or deliver and install modular homes in Kansas must register for Kansas compensating use tax and remit use tax on the transaction as either a retailer or as a contractor/consumer. If taxes were properly paid to another state on materials removed from inventory located within that state, the manufacturer may take credit under K.S.A. 79-3705 for all or part of the sales taxes that were paid.

Sedgwick County, Kansas, in cooperation with the Kansas Department of Commerce and Housing and other political subdivisions of the State of Kansas, announces the 1997 Kansas Mortgage Savers Program, a qualified Mortgage Credit Certificate Program. Section 25 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, authorizes issuers of qualified mortgage bonds, such as Sedgwick County, to elect to issue mortgage credit certificates (MCCs) in lieu of qualified mortgage bonds. MCCs entitle qualifying individuals to a credit against the individual's federal income tax. The amount of the credit is determined by multiplying the certificate credit rate by the amount of interest paid or accrued during each taxpayer's taxable year on the mortgage loan for the taxpayer's "principal residence." In order for an individual to claim the credit provided by Section 25(a), the MCC must be a "qualified mortgage credit certificate" issued pursuant to a "qualified mortgage credit certificate." The following criteria/requirements must be met:

Principal Residence Requirement

The homebuyer(s) must use the residence as his or her principal residence within a reasonable time (60 days) after the MCC is issued. The MCC holder must notify the issuer of the MCC if the residence ceases to be his or her principal residence.

New Mortgage Requirements

An MCC cannot be issued in conjunction with the acquisition, replacement or refinancing of an existing mortgage. However, a certificate can be used in conjunction with the replacement of construction period loans, bridge loans, or other temporary initial financing with a term of 24 months or less.

Three-Year No Prior Homeownership Requirement

The homebuyer(s) cannot have had any present ownership interest in a principal residence at any time during the preceding three years ending on the date the MCC is issued. This three-year, first-time homebuyer requirement does not have to be met if the residence for which a mortgage loan application is being made is located in a federally designated targeted area. A targeted area is a particular area in the state determined or approved by the federal government that will receive special consideration to provide an added stimulus to housing in that area.

Purchase Price Requirements

There are maximum allowable purchase prices for residences assisted by MCCs which vary based upon location, whether the residence being purchased is new or existing and whether the home is in a targeted area. The maximum purchase prices at this time are as follows:

Article 54.—OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

100-54-7. Continuing education; registration renewal. (a) Each registrant shall submit evidence of completing a minimum of 40 contact hours of continuing education during the preceding two calendar years. Evidence of this attainment shall be submitted prior to or with the application for renewal in each odd-numbered year.

(b) Any registrant who suffered an illness or injury during the 12-month period prior to the renewal registration which made it impossible or extremely difficult to reasonably obtain the required contact hours may be granted an extension of not more than six months.

(c) Each occupational therapist and occupational therapy assistant initially registered within two years of a renewal registration date in an odd-numbered year shall complete a minimum of 10 contact hours for every six-month period from the date of registration to the end of the next even-numbered calendar year. When an occupational therapist or occupational therapy assistant initially registers after July 1 of an even-numbered year, the occupational therapist or occupational therapy assistant shall not be required to obtain continuing education for the first renewal in an odd-numbered year.

(d) A contact hour shall be 50 minutes of instruction or its equivalent.

(e) The content of the continuing education classes or literature shall be related to the field of occupational therapy or similar areas.

(f) Each registrant shall acquire continuing education from the classes of education experiences defined in subsection (g). The registrant shall acquire a minimum of 30 contact hours from Class I, Class IV or Class V. A maximum of eight contact hours may be acquired from Class II. A maximum of two contact hours may be acquired from Class III. A maximum of 30 contact hours may be acquired from Class V. A maximum of 10 contact hours may be acquired from Class VI.

(g) Continuing education experiences shall be classified as follows.

(1) Class I—Attendance at an education presentation. Class I continuing education experiences shall include the following types of education offerings.

(A) Lectures. A "lecture" means a discourse given for instruction before an audience or through a teleconference.

(B) Panels. A "panel" means the presentation of a number of views by several professional individuals on a given subject with none of the views considered a final solution.

(C) Workshops. A "workshop" means a series of meetings designed for intensive study, work or discussion in a specific field of interest.

(D) Seminars. A "seminar" means directed advanced study or discussion in a specific field of interest.

(E) Symposiums. A "symposium" means a conference of more than a single session organized for the purpose of discussing a specific subject from various viewpoints and presented by various speakers.

(F) College or university courses. Ten contact hours shall be given for each college credit with a grade of at least "C" or a "pass" in a pass/fail course.

(2) Class II—In-service training. A maximum of four contact hours may be given for attending in-service training. A maximum of four contact hours may be given for instructing the in-service training, but no additional hours shall be acquired for attending that particular in-service training.

(3) Class III—Professional reading. A maximum of two contact hours may be given for reading professional literature, whether printed or provided by audio or videotapes.

(4) Class IV—Professional publication. The maximum contact hours that may be given for professional publication shall be as follows:

(A) 30 hours for publication of a book or original paper; and

(B) 15 hours for a review paper, case report, abstract or book review.

(5) Class V—Instructor preparation of Class I programs. Any registrant who presents a Class I continuing education program or its equivalent shall receive three Class V contact hours for each hour of presentation. No credit shall be granted for any subsequent presentations on the same subject matter.

(6) Class VI—Fieldwork supervision of level II students. Five contact hours may be given for supervising a level II student's full-time fieldwork for at least a six-week period or its equivalent. Ten contact hours may be given for supervising fieldwork for at least a 12-week period or its equivalent.

(h) Each registrant shall submit documented evidence of attendance at or presentation to Class I and Class II continuing education activities. Each registrant shall submit personal verification for Class III activities. Copies of publications shall be submitted for verification of Class IV activities. Verification of Class VI fieldwork supervision shall be submitted by the registrant's employer.

(i) Instructional staff shall be competent in the subject matter and in the methodology of instruction and learning processes as evidenced by experience, education or publication. Notice Concerning Municipal Solid Waste Landfill Permit

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has received and reviewed a request to vertically expand the Coffey County municipal solid waste landfill (Permit #297) and construct a tire monofill. The landfill is owned and operated by Coffey County and is located approximately 1 1/4 miles east of U.S. Highway 75 and 1/4 mile north of 12th Lane near Burlington. The landfill site comprises approximately 37.3 acres lying in the NE 1/4 of Section 24, Township 21 South, Range 15 East. The vertical expansion area will include 8 acres of the 14 acres currently being used for solid waste disposal. The requested vertical expansion would allow the landfill to continue to operate and allow an increase in height without the construction of a lined cell and a leachate collection system. The tire monofill will be located to the west of the landfill in the SW 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Section 24, Township 21 South, Range 15 East. KDHE is providing public notice of its intent to modify the existing municipal solid waste landfill permit for the Coffey County landfill to allow for a vertical expansion over a portion of the existing landfill. The expiration date for the permit will be October 9, 2001.

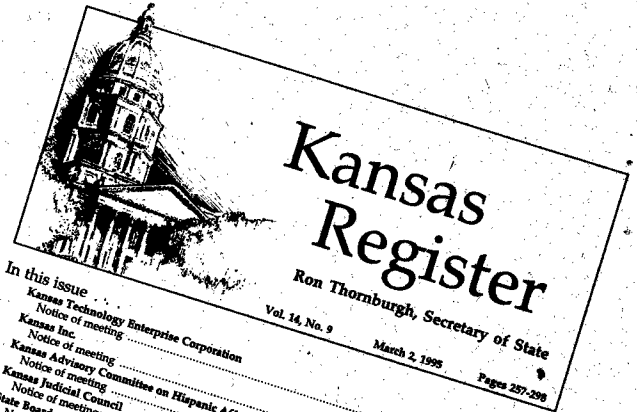
