Notice of Hearing on Proposed  
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Tuesday, April 29, at the office of the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts, 235 S. Topeka Blvd., Topeka, to consider the adoption of one proposed amended rule and regulation relating to the educational qualifications of applicants for licensure in medicine and surgery, osteopathic medicine and surgery, and chiropractic.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rule and regulation. All interested parties may submit comments prior to the hearing to the Board of Healing Arts at the address above. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views, orally or in writing, concerning the adoption of the proposed regulation during the hearing. In order to give all persons an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentations to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for ac-

commodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Pamela Dawes at (913) 291-3684. Handicapped parking is located at the west end of the Hutton Building, and the northwest entrance to the building is accessible.

A summary of the proposed rule and regulation to be amended and its economic impact follows.

**100-6-2. General qualifications.** This regulation specifies the minimum educational qualifications for applicants for licensure in medicine and surgery, osteopathic medicine and surgery, and chiropractic.

The above regulation is related to licensure qualifications of licensees regulated by the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts. There is no economic impact on state agencies or the general public. There may be an economic impact on applicants for licensure in chiropractic who enroll in a chiropractic college on or after July 1, 1999, as they shall now be required to receive a baccalaureate degree prior to entering chiropractic college.

## Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct

## Advisory Opinion No. 97-1

Written January 23, 1997, to John A. Potucek II, Sumner County Counselor, Wellington.

This opinion is in response to your letter of December 9, 1996, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct concerning the application of the local level conflict of interest laws (K.S.A. 75-4301a *et seq.*). We note at the outset that the commission's jurisdiction is limited to the application of K.S.A. 75-4301a *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule and regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

**Factual Statement**

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as county counselor of Sumner County, and on behalf of county commissioner-elect Robert Courtney. You advise us that the City of Wellington created the Wellington Airport Authority (Authority) to oversee operations of the local airport. County commissioner-elect Courtney contracts with the Authority as a fixed base operator and manager. You further advised us by telephone that the Authority is not governed by the county, but rather by a board of directors that is an arm of city government.

**Question**

Is it a violation of the local level conflict of interest laws for a county commissioner to contract as a private individual with a local airport authority?

**Opinion**

K.S.A. 75-4304(a) may apply to your situation. That subsection states:

No local governmental officer or employee shall, in the capacity of such an officer or employee, make or participate in the making of a contract with any person or business by which the officer or employee is employed or in whose business the officer or employee has a substantial interest.

In applying this language, if the contract was between the commissioner and the county, he would have to abstain from any action, as a commissioner, on the contract. However, since the contract exists between the commissioner, as a private individual, and the Authority, this section would not apply and there would not be a violation of the law.

In closing, the issue of incompatibility of offices is not within the jurisdiction of the commission. We suggest that you contact the Attorney General's Office for guidance.

## Advisory Opinion No. 97-2

Written January 23, 1997, to Todd W. Pesch, Public Lands

Manager, McPherson Valley Wetlands, Kanopolis Wildlife Area, McPherson.

This opinion is in response to your letter of December 1, 1996, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct concerning the state level conflict of interest laws (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*). We note at the outset that the commission's jurisdiction is limited to the application of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*; and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule and regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

**Factual Statement**

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as a wildlife area manager for the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks (KDWP). You have been asked by the state chair for Ducks Unlimited to serve on that organization's MARSH Committee. As a member of this committee, you would be giving your input and approval on all marsh projects submitted by the KDWP. Final approval of the projects would be given by the head of the committee. As part of your official state duties, you would be submitting projects to the committee for approval. You also have informed us by telephone that you will not receive any compensation for serving on the committee, and that you are currently chair for the local Ducks Unlimited chapter.

**Question**

Do the state level conflict of interest laws prohibit a state employee from submitting state projects to a private sector organization and then, on behalf of the organization, giving input and approval of the projects?

**Opinion**

We have reviewed the state level conflict of interest laws in their entirety, and nothing in those laws prohibits a state employee from submitting state projects to a private sector organization and then, on behalf of that organization, voting to approve the projects. However, K.S.A. 46-241 would prevent you from using confidential information acquired in the course of your state duties to further the economic interests of any person, including your state agency.

In closing, we note that this opinion deals solely with the issue of you approving state projects on behalf of Ducks Unlimited. If that organization were to contract with your agency, or you had other dealings with the organization in your capacity as a state employee, then a separate opinion would have to be issued concerning those situations.

## Advisory Opinion No. 97-3

Written January 23, 1997, to J. Michael Haskin, Treasurer, Hougland for Senate, Olathe.

This opinion is in response to your letter of January 13, 1997, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct concerning the Kansas Campaign Finance Act (K.S.A. 25-4142 *et seq.*).

**Factual Statement**

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as treasurer for the Steve Houglund for State Senate campaign. You advise us that the candidate was unsuccessful in his bid for the Kansas Senate. He would now like to run for the Olathe School Board, and has approximately \$1700 in his senate campaign account that he would like to transfer into the school board campaign. The Olathe School Board is a local elective office, as defined by K.S.A. 25-901, not under the jurisdiction of the Kansas Campaign Finance Act (K.S.A. 25-4142 *et seq.*).

**Question**

Based on these facts, you ask us the following questions:

1. Does the Kansas Campaign Finance Act prohibit a candidate, after losing an election, from transferring his or her excess campaign funds to a campaign account for a local elective office not under the purview of the Act?
2. If permissible, what procedure should be used to transfer the funds?

**Opinion**

Nothing in the Kansas Campaign Finance Act prohibits a candidate, after losing an election, from transferring his or her excess campaign funds to a campaign account for a local elective office not under the purview of the Act.

Turning to your second question, the candidate should file the appropriate forms to become a candidate for school board, then file a receipts and expenditures report with the Secretary of State's Office terminating the senate account and showing the money being transferred into the school board account. Please refer to K.S.A. 25-904 for guidance as to what reports must be filed by a candidate for the school board.

In closing, we note that under K.S.A. 25-4153(f) political funds collected and subject to the provisions of the Kansas Campaign Finance Act could not be transferred to a campaign account for a federal elective office.

**Advisory Opinion No. 97-4**

Written January 23, 1997, to Senator Jim Barone, Frontenac.

This opinion is in response to your letter of January 21, 1997, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct concerning the Kansas Campaign Finance Act (K.S.A. 25-4142 *et seq.*) We note at the outset that the commission's jurisdiction is limited to the applicability of K.S.A. 25-4142 *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule and regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

**Factual Statement**

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as a Kansas State Senator. You are interested in purchasing subscriptions to newspapers and other publications with your campaign funds.

**Question**

Based on this factual situation, you ask us the following questions:

1. May campaign funds be used to purchase all publications within your senate district?
2. May campaign funds be used to purchase major publications within the State of Kansas, such as the Topeka Capital-Journal, the Kansas City Star and the Wichita Eagle?
3. May campaign funds be used to purchase publications of national prominence such as the Wall Street Journal, Time, Newsweek and Barron's?

**Opinion**

K.S.A. 25-4157a(a) applies to your questions. That subsection states:

No moneys received by any candidate or candidate committee of any candidate as a contribution under this act shall be used or be made available for the personal use of the candidate and no such moneys shall be used by such candidate or the candidate committee of such candidate except for legitimate campaign purposes, for expenses of holding political office or for contributions to the party committees of the political party of which such candidate is a member.

For the purpose of this section, expenditures for "personal use" shall include expenditures to defray normal living expenses for the candidate or the candidate's family and expenditures for the personal benefit of the candidate having no direct connection with or effect upon the campaign of the candidate or the holding of public office.

Your first two questions can be answered by referring to KCGSC Opinion No. 96-20. In that opinion, this commission opined that purchasing subscriptions to newspapers and other publications in an individual's legislative district would be a legitimate expense of holding office if the newspapers and periodicals were read to keep track of activities and events in the district.

Similarly, major publications within the state such as the Topeka, Kansas City and Wichita newspapers would be a legitimate expense of holding office if these papers were read to keep track of activities, events and news items that would be of particular interest to a political officeholder.

Turning to your third question, subscriptions to publications whose major purpose is to provide news that deals with political and financial issues could be purchased with campaign funds. However, those publications whose major purpose is to provide articles of entertainment, sports, hobbies or recreation generally could not be purchased with campaign funds unless the primary purpose for subscribing would be to keep abreast of issues directly relating to holding political office.

Therefore, subscriptions to such publications as Barone's, Time, the Wall Street Journal and Newsweek would be permissible with campaign funds.

In closing, we note that this is not an exhaustive list, but rather a guide as to what publications would be permissible to purchase with campaign funds. We suggest that before any candidate or officeholder purchases a subscription, that he or she first check with the commission's staff.

Article 4.—PUBLIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

30-4-54. Citizenship, alienage, and residence. (a)
Definition. "Resident" means any person who is living in
the state voluntarily, with no intention of presently mov-
ing from the state, and who is not living in the state for
a temporary purpose.

(1) Any child living in the state shall be considered a
resident.

(2) For TAF, any person who has entered the state with
a job commitment or who is seeking employment in the
state shall be considered a resident.

(3) For GA, any individual who owns an automobile
or other motor vehicle that is not registered in this state,
but that is required by law to be registered in this state
shall not be considered a resident.

(b) Citizenship and alienage. Each applicant or recipi-
ent shall be a citizen of the United States or shall be an
alien who meets either of the following conditions:

(1) entered the United States before August 22, 1996;
and

- (A) is a refugee;
(B) is granted asylum;
(C) has deportation withheld;
(D) is a lawful permanent resident;

(E) is an honorably discharged veteran or currently on active duty in the armed forces or is the spouse or unmarried dependent child of such an alien;

(F) is paroled into the United States for at least one year; or

(G) is granted conditional entry.

(2) entered the United States on or after August 22, 1996; and

(A) is a refugee;

(B) is granted asylum;

(C) has deportation withheld;

(D) is an honorably discharged veteran or currently on active duty in the armed forces or is the spouse or unmarried dependent child of such an alien;

(E) is a lawful permanent resident who has resided in the United States at least five years;

(F) is paroled into the United States for at least one year and has resided in the United States at least five years; or

(G) is granted conditional entry and has resided in the United States for at least five years.

(c) Residence. Each applicant or recipient shall be a resident of the state of Kansas. Temporary absence from the state, with subsequent returns to the state, or intent to return when the purposes of the absence have been accomplished, shall not be considered to interrupt continuity of residence. Residence shall be considered to be maintained until abandoned or established in another state.

(d) This regulation shall take effect on and after March 1, 1997. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 39-708c; implementing K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 39-708c, 39-719b, 39-709; effective May 1, 1981; amended, T-88-10, May 1, 1987; amended May 1, 1988; amended Oct. 1, 1989; amended, T-30-2-20-97, March 1, 1997.)

#### Article 6.—MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM— CLIENTS' ELIGIBILITY FOR PARTICIPATION

**30-6-54. Citizenship, alienage, and residence.** (a) Definition. "Resident" means any person who is living in the state voluntarily, with no intention of presently moving from the state, and who is not living in the state for a temporary purpose.

(1) Any child who is living in the state shall be considered a resident.

(2) Any person who is otherwise eligible for medicaid and who has entered the state with a job commitment or who is seeking employment shall be considered a resident.

(3) For institutionalized individuals, the following criteria shall be used to determine residency.

(A) Any person placed by a state agency in an out-of-state institution shall be considered to retain residence in the state making the placement.

(B) Any person who is under age 21 or who became incapable of intent before age 21 shall be considered to have the same residence as the parent or legal guardian.

(C) Any person who became incapable of intent on or after age 21 shall remain a resident of the state in which the person is physically residing.

(D) Any other person shall be regarded as a resident of the state in which the person is living with the intention to remain there permanently or for an indefinite period.

(b) Citizenship and alienage. Each applicant or recipient shall be a citizen of the United States or shall be an alien who meets one of the following conditions:

(1) entered the United States before August 22, 1996; and

(A) is a refugee;

(B) is granted asylum;

(C) has deportation withheld;

(D) is a lawful, permanent resident;

(E) is an honorably discharged veteran or currently on active duty in the armed forces or is the spouse or unmarried dependent child of such an alien;

(F) is paroled into the United States for at least one year; or

(G) is granted conditional entry.

(2) entered the United States on or after August 22, 1996; and

(A) is a refugee;

(B) is granted asylum;

(C) has deportation withheld;

(D) is an honorably discharged veteran or currently on active duty in the armed forces or is the spouse or unmarried dependent child of such an alien;

(E) is a lawful, permanent resident who has resided in the United States for at least five years;

(F) is paroled into the United States for at least one year and has resided in the United States for at least five years; or

(G) is granted conditional entry and has resided in the United States for at least five years.

An otherwise eligible alien who does not qualify under the above provisions shall be eligible for emergency medical care.

(c) Residence. Each applicant or recipient shall be a resident of Kansas. The individual shall be living in the state and shall not be receiving assistance from another state. Temporary absence from the state with subsequent returns to the state, or intent to return when the purposes of the absence have been accomplished, shall not be considered to interrupt continuity of residence. Residence shall be considered to be retained until abandoned or established in another state.

(d) This regulation shall take effect on and after March 1, 1997. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 39-708c and K.S.A. 39-709; effective May 1, 1981; amended May 1, 1987; amended, T-88-10, May 1, 1987; amended May 1, 1988; amended, T-30-2-20-97, March 1, 1997.)

**Temporary Administrative Regulations**

**Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS**

**111-2-42. Outstanding sales achievement awards.**

(a) Beginning with the calendar year starting January 1, 1996, and ending December 31, 1996, any Kansas lottery retailer location with total lottery ticket sales of \$500,000 or more shall become a member of the "Director's Club." Following the end of each calendar year, qualifying members shall receive the following:

(1) A framed certificate or plaque recognizing the retailer as a member of the "Director's Club."

(2) Lottery promotional watches for employees at the retailer location, up to a maximum of 20 per location.

(3) The retailer will be featured in an issue of the lottery's retailer publication.

(b) All lottery retailer locations in Kansas are eligible for membership in the "Director's Club" on an annual basis which entitles the retailer location and employees to the above awards. **111-4-963. Definitions.** The following definitions shall apply to the "\$1000 Jackpot" instant lottery game:

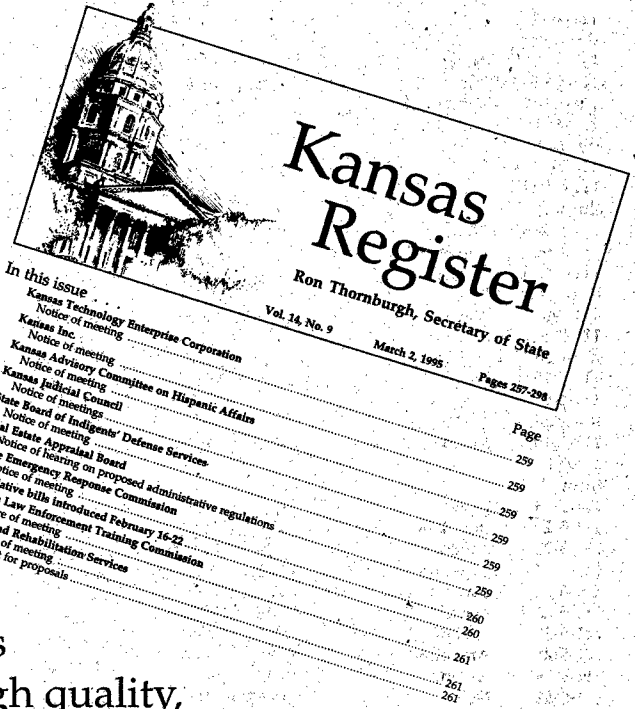
