Wildlife and Parks Commission**Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted by the Wildlife and Parks Commission at 7 p.m. Wednesday, August 13, at the Great Plains Nature Center, 6232 E. 29th, Wichita, to consider the approval and adoption of two proposed exempt regulations of the Department of Wildlife and Parks. The public notice for six additional department regulations to be considered at the same meeting was published in the Kansas Register June 12, 1997.

A workshop meeting on business of the Wildlife and Parks Commission will begin at 1:30 p.m. August 13, at the location listed above. The meeting will recess at 5 p.m., then resume at 7 p.m. at the same location for the regulatory hearing. There will be public comment periods at the beginning of the afternoon and evening meetings for any issues not on the agenda, and additional comment periods will be available during the meeting on agenda items. Old and new business also may be discussed at this time. If necessary to complete the hearing or other business matters, the commission will reconvene at 9 a.m. August 14 at the same location.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Cindy Baugh, commission secretary, at (316) 672-5911. Persons with a hearing impairment may call the TDD service at 1-800-766-3777 to request special accommodations.

This 30-day notice period prior to the hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed exempt regulations.

All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the chairman of the commission, Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks, Suite 502, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to express their views orally in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations. During the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the commission as a basis for approving, amending and approving, or rejecting the proposed regulations.

The regulations that will be heard during the regulatory hearing portion of the meeting, in addition to those whose notice has been previously published, are as follows:

K.A.R. 115-25-4. Squirrel; open season, bag limit, and possession limit. This exempt regulation establishes the season, the bag limit, and the possession limit for hunting squirrels. The proposed change to the regulation would extend the season from the current ending date of December 31 to an ending date of the last day of February.

Economic Impact Summary: A lengthened season may provide some economic benefit to businesses supplying goods and services to hunters. It would also provide some added flexibility for controlling squirrel populations, if problems were to occur. No other economic impact to the department or other state agencies are anticipated.

K.A.R. 115-25-20. Sandhill crane; management unit, hunting season, shooting hours, bag and possession limit, and permit validation. This exempt regulation establishes the sandhill crane management unit and hunting season. The proposal would expand the unit from its current size to include the area north of Cheyenne Bottoms to I-70, and east of the current unit to I-135 and I-35. No other changes to the regulation are proposed.

Economic Impact Summary: There were 837 validated sandhill crane permits in 1996. It is estimated that 900 permits will be validated in 1997 under the proposed regulation, which means the department would realize \$4500 in revenue. Businesses providing hunting-related services or supplies may receive some economic benefit. Expansion of the management unit is partially intended to help prevent crop damage caused by sandhill cranes; to the extent that any crop damage is prevented, those landowners would receive some economic benefit. The regulation would not have an economic impact on other state agencies.

This 60-day notice constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulation. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Bob McDanel, Administrator, Board of Emergency Medical Services, 109 S.W. 6th, Topeka, 66603-3826. Copies of the proposed regulation also may be obtained from the administrator.

All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulation. In order to give all parties an opportunity to express their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit oral presentations to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. This regulation is proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed regulation and its economic impact follows.

109-6-2. Renewal of attendant and instructor/coordinator certificate. Changes desired in this regulation establish that all applications for certification renewal shall be on the original forms provided by the administrator. Copies, facsimiles, electronic filings or other reproductions shall not be accepted.

Economic impact to the individual seeking certification renewal from the Board of Emergency Medical Services will be unchanged as the fees for certification renewal will remain the same.

Additionally, there will be no economic impact to training programs, ambulance services or the Board of Emergency Medical Services.

Other governmental units, private citizens and consumers will not be affected by these changes.

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Monday, September 15, in the conference room of the Attorney General's Office, second floor, Kansas Judicial Center, 301 S.W. 10th Ave., Topeka, to consider the adoption of rules and regulations of the State Child Death Review Board.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the State Child Death Review Board, Office of the Attorney General, 301 S.W. 10th Ave., Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. These rules and regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of proposed rules and regulations and their economic impact follows.

K.A.R. 124-1-1. This regulation offers guidelines to coroners for determining whether the death of a child is suspicious.

K.A.R. 124-1-2. This regulation sets forth a protocol, established by the State Child Death Review Board, to be used by the board in investigating child deaths by a records review.

K.A.R. 124-1-3. This regulation outlines the way in which the State Child Death Review Board will seek coordination and cooperation among agencies involved in child deaths. It specifically speaks to working agreements between the board and the Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services, law enforcement agencies, district and deputy coroners, schools, mental health providers, and public and private medical health providers.

K.A.R. 124-1-4. This regulation provides that the board will provide a checklist for use by law enforcement offices as an aid in child death case evaluations and filing decisions. It also provides that the board will communicate with district and deputy coroners regarding the requirements of K.S.A. 22a-242.

Summary of Economic Impact

The only economic impact of the proposed rules and regulations would be to counties if they had to reimburse

coroners/pathologists for the costs associated with additional autopsies. However, there is a fund within the Kansas Department of Health and Environment that can be used to obtain reimbursement for the autopsy and related expenses.

Article 3.—APPLICATION PROCEDURE

112-3-21. Race date fees, payment. Daily race date fees to be paid by an organization licensee pursuant to K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 74-8813(g) shall be paid in advance at least monthly by the licensee, remitting such daily license fees to the commission before the 25th day of the month preceding the month for which such fees are assessed. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 74-8804; implementing K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 74-8813 and 74-8813a; effective July 25, 1997.)

Article 4.—OCCUPATION LICENSES

112-4-1. Occupation licenses. (a) Before engaging in the following occupations at a racetrack facility, each person shall pay the required fee and secure the appropriate license or licenses from the commission:

- (1) administration-facility;
- (2) administration-organization;
- (3) administrative support-facility;
- (4) administrative support-organization;
- (5) amateur jockey;
- (6) apprentice jockey;
- (7) assistant trainer-horse/greyhound;
- (8) authorized agent;
- (9) backup greyhound racetrack official;
- (10) backup horse-racetrack official;
- (11) blacksmith/plater/farrier;
- (12) breed registry;
- (13) concession employee;
- (14) concession manager/operator;
- (15) driver;
- (16) exercise person;
- (17) greyhound racetrack official;
- (18) groom/hot walker;
- (19) horse racetrack official;
- (20) horseman/kennel representative;
- (21) jockey;
- (22) jockey agent;
- (23) jockey guild representative;
- (24) kennel helper;
- (25) kennel owner;
- (26) medical attendant;
- (27) owner-horse/greyhound;
- (28) owner/assistant trainer-horse/greyhound;
- (29) owner/trainer/driver-horse;
- (30) owner/trainer-horse/greyhound;
- (31) owner by open claim-horse;
- (32) photo finish operator;
- (33) pony person;
- (34) practicing veterinarian;
- (35) practicing veterinary assistant;
- (36) racing department staff;
- (37) racing judge;
- (38) selection sheet operator;
- (39) service provider;

- (40) steward;
- (41) totalisator employee;
- (42) trainee-racing official;
- (43) trainer-horse/greyhound;
- (44) video operator; and
- (45) any other personnel designated by the commission.

(b) Each applicant for an occupation license shall apply in writing on the application form approved and furnished by the commission.

(c) Each applicant for an occupation license acting as an employer shall submit proof of compliance with the workers compensation act of the state of Kansas, K.S.A. 44-501 *et seq.*

(d) Each person who is appointed by an owner to act as an authorized agent shall secure an occupation license. Each owner or authorized agent shall file each authorized agent agreement form with the commission. Each authorized agent shall perform for the owner only the duties that are the subject of the authorized agent agreement form. Each authorized agent shall notify the commission in writing when the authorized agent agreement is terminated.

(e) An applicant for an occupation license shall not knowingly provide false information on any occupation license application form.

(f) An applicant for an occupation license shall not fail to disclose any material fact on any occupation license application form.

(g) No person shall alter or attempt to alter any information contained on an occupation license badge.

(h) Each person who loses an occupation license shall immediately perform the following:

- (1) notify the commission office at the racetrack facility;
- (2) secure a duplicate license; and
- (3) pay the required fee.

(i) An applicant shall pay each required fee when the occupation license is issued. Occupational licenses issued by the commission shall be for one-year or three-year periods.

(1) Each one-year or annual license shall be valid for a period commencing on January 1 and terminating December 31 of the calendar year for which the license is issued.

(2) Each three-year or triennial license shall be valid for a period commencing on January 1 of the year in which such license is issued, and terminating December 31 of the final year. For the second and third years of a three-year license, the licensee shall complete a validation form approved by the commission and shall be issued current validation stickers. The licensee shall properly display the current validation stickers on the licensee's badge before being admitted to a racetrack facility.

(j) An ARCI computer check or substantially similar check of license records from other racing jurisdictions shall be run annually on all licensees by the commission. ARCI computer checks or substantially similar checks shall also be run at the time of validation of each three-year license.

(continued)

(k) Any applicant may be required to submit with the application or validation form at least two complete sets of fingerprint cards approved by the commission. If the fingerprints are not acceptable for processing, each applicant shall be required to resubmit fingerprint cards.

(l) Each applicant for an occupation license must be at least 16 years of age. This provision shall not preclude dependent children under the age of 16 from working for a parent or guardian when the parent or guardian is licensed as a kennel owner, trainer, or assistant trainer and the parent or guardian has obtained approval from the organization licensee. Each licensed trainer at a horse or greyhound racetrack facility or assistant trainer at a horse racetrack facility shall be at least 18 years of age. Each racing official, security employee and mutuel employee shall be at least 18 years of age.

(m) Each employer at a racetrack facility shall ensure that every employee is properly licensed and shall immediately notify the commission office at the racetrack facility and the organization licensee when a licensee's employment status changes or when an employee is terminated. Each employer shall make an effort to secure the employee's occupation license and, if the license is secured, shall deliver the license to the commission office at the racetrack facility. 112-4-26. Denial of an occupation license. (a) Except as provided in K.A.R. 112-6-1 *et seq.*, all proceedings relating to the denial, suspension, or revocation of an occupation license shall be conducted in accordance with the Kansas administrative procedure act, K.S.A. 77-501 *et seq.*

(b) As used in K.S.A. 74-8816(e)(3) the phrase "qualified to perform the duties associated with the license being applied for" shall in the case of all occupation license applicants include the requirement that such applicant shall have no present or prior activities, criminal record, or reputation, habits, or associations that meet either of these conditions:

(1) pose a threat to the public interest or to the effective regulation of parimutuel racing or wagering; or

(2) create or enhance the dangers of unsuitable, unfair, or illegal practices in the conduct of parimutuel racing or wagering. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 74-8804; implementing K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 74-8816; effective July 25, 1997.)

Article 18.—SIMULCASTING LICENSES

112-18-3. Application form for simulcasting applicant. (a) Each application for a simulcasting license shall contain the following:

(1) the name of the applicant or applicants, their business address or addresses, and their telephone number or numbers;

(2) the name, address, and telephone number of any individual who assisted the applicant or applicants in preparing their application;

(3) the written approval for the proposed simulcasting schedule from the recognized horsemen's group or the recognized greyhound owners' group, or both, as appropriate;

(4) for the calendar year, the proposed schedule of simulcast races or programs that the applicant or applicants plan to simulcast into the facility for as much of the calendar year as the respective horsemen's group and greyhound owners' group have approved. The application shall state the proposed simulcasting schedule as approved by the respective horsemen's group and greyhound owners' group for the entire calendar year when it is filed with the commission;

(5) for the calendar year, the proposed schedule of races or programs that the applicant or applicants plan to simulcast from the racetrack facility to any other racetrack facility, intertrack wagering facility, or off-track wagering facility, and a list of such facilities for as much of the calendar year as the respective horsemen's group and greyhound owners' group have approved. The application shall state the proposed simulcasting schedule as approved by the respective horsemen's group and greyhound owners' group for the entire calendar year when it is filed with the commission;

(6) certification that the applicant or applicants will comply with any provision of the interstate horse racing act of 1978 (15 U.S.C. 3001, *et seq.*) as in effect December 31, 1991, and submit documentation of the compliance;

(7) certification that the applicant or applicants will comply with the 80% threshold requirement of K.S.A. 74-8836 for a live racing program if the applicant conducts fewer than 10 live horse races during any day or 13 live greyhound races during any performance;

(8) one copy of each contract or agreement that the applicant has executed or proposes to execute and any modification or proposed modification of each contract or agreement with regard to the simulcasting license or races or wagering on the simulcast races. If the contract or agreement is an oral one, a written statement explaining the substance of the oral agreement shall be included;

(9) the names and addresses of the parties to each contract or agreement identified in paragraph (8) and any relationship of the parties to the applicant, the partners, associates, officers, directors, and principal owners either through family, business association, or other control;

(10) any plan to participate in a combined wagering pool, including the following information:

(A) the time and date of the races or programs for which combined pooling is planned;

(B) a description of the totalisator services to be used by the guest facility and host facility;

(C) a description of the backup communication device or procedure that would be used to communicate wagering information between the guest facility and host facility if the totalisator system or data line telephone system fails;

(D) a description of the data line or telephone line communication system to be used by the guest facility and the host facility;

(E) a description of the wagers that the applicant or applicants intend to offer on the races; and

(F) a description of the takeout rates requested for the combined wagering pool;

(11) a description of each special racing event that the applicant or applicants plan to simulcast;

(12) a statement describing how the granting of a simulcasting license to the applicant or applicants will enhance the breeding, owning, and training industries for horses or greyhounds; and

(13) a description of the impact that the proposed simulcasting will have on live racing and purses at the applicant's or applicants' racetrack facility.

(b) Each application shall describe the following factors, which may be considered by the commission in determining whether to grant or deny the application:

(1) the financial stability of the applicant or applicants and the effect that simulcasting will have on the economic viability of the applicant or applicants;

(2) the operating experience of the applicant or applicants;

(3) the regulatory compliance and conduct of the applicant or applicants; and

(4) the impact of the applicant's or applicants' proposed simulcasting on live racing and on purses at the racetrack facility.

(c) Upon receipt of a written request from an organization licensee, any facility owner, a recognized horsemen's group, or recognized greyhound group to submit a simulcasting dispute to the commission for determination pursuant to K.S.A. 74-8836(k), such proceedings shall be conducted by the commission in accordance with the Kansas administrative procedure act.
