Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Friday, January 2, in the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission's conference room, 3400 Van Buren, Topeka, to consider the adoption of a proposed permanent regulation of the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission. This 60-day notice constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulation.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. A copy of the full text of the regulation and the economic impact statement may be reviewed or obtained at the commission office. The following is a summary of the proposed amendment:

K.A.R. 112-18-21. Election and recognition of recognized greyhound owners' group. The 1994 legislative changes required the drafting of a new regulation regarding the election procedures to be used for recognized greyhound owners' groups. This regulation sets out the duties of and the number of persons who will serve as members of each recognized group. The procedure to be used by the agency for electing each group also is described in detail, together with the eligibility requirements for those participating in the election. The regulation states that the agency will hold the election pursuant

to K.S.A. 74-8802(dd). Provisions are made for the filing of a complaint concerning the conduct of an election, in which case the agency shall commence a hearing in accordance with the Kansas administrative procedure act, K.S.A. 77-501 *et seq.*

Economic Impact: The agency will bear the expenses incurred during the election process.

Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct

Advisory Opinion No. 97-46

Written October 9, 1997, to Michael B. Rees, Chief Counsel, Kansas Department of Transportation, Topeka.

This opinion is in response to your letter of October 1, 1997, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct concerning the state level conflict of interest laws (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*). We note at the outset that the commission's jurisdiction is limited to the application of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule and regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

Factual Statement

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as the chief counsel of the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT). You advise us that the Kansas Contractors Association (KCA) is an organization whose membership is comprised of contractors engaged in heavy construction. The board of the KCA is derived from persons associated with the various construction firms. KCA officials are in frequent contact with KDOT personnel concerning road and bridge construction.

You further advise us that the KCA hosts an annual meeting attended by approximately 15 members of the KCA board and a like number of KDOT staff. The meeting lasts for one-half day and is a forum for discussing matters of mutual interest to the KCA and KDOT. At the conclusion of the meeting, the KCA hosts and pays for a dinner attended by the persons at the meeting.

You state that HB 2064 subsection (c)(1) permits the acceptance of free meals at "widely attended" events. In your opinion, this dinner constitutes a "widely attended" event because the KCA members have access to KDOT

staff throughout the year, especially at the annual meeting.

Question

Is it permissible for the KDOT staff who attend the KCA annual meeting to accept a free dinner from the KCA upon conclusion of the meeting?

Opinion

The provisions of HB 2064 found in the 1997 Session Laws of Kansas, Chapter 155, Section 4, apply to all classified employees and those unclassified employees whose salaries are subject to approval by the Governor. The receipt of free meals by all other unclassified employees is subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 46-237.

Subsection (c) of HB 2064 prohibits the acceptance of free or discount meals with certain exceptions. Subsection (c)(1) provides an exception to the general rule. That subsection states:

Meals, the provision of which is motivated by a personal or family relationship or provided at events that are widely attended. An occasion is "widely attended" when it is obvious to the person accepting the meal that the reason for providing the meal is not a pretext for exclusive or nearly exclusive access to the person.

In applying this language to your question, it is our opinion that the meal is not "widely attended" since the very reason the meal is being given is for members of the KCA to have access to KDOT staff. The fact that the KCA has access to KDOT staff at times other than the meal is irrelevant under the language of the law. Thus, for those employees of KDOT subject to HB 2064, they could not receive this free meal from the KCA.

For those employees of KDOT who are in the unclassified service and whose salaries are not subject to approval by the Governor, K.S.A. 46-237 applies to their receipt of free meals. That statute in pertinent part states:

(a) No state officer or employee . . . shall accept, or agree to accept any . . . hospitality . . . having an aggregate value of \$40 or more in any calendar year from any one person known to have a special interest. . . .

(d) Hospitality in the form of recreation, food and beverages are presumed not to be given to influence a state officer or employee . . . in the performance of such officer's or employee's official duties or prospective official duties. . . .

K.A.R. 19-40-3a(c) provides:

Hospitality. "Hospitality in the form of recreation, food and beverage" means the provision of recreation and consumption of food and beverage in the company of the donor or the donor's authorized agent. The provision of recreation, food and beverage in any other manner constitutes a gift.

Thus, for those KDOT employees subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 46-237 rather than HB 2064, they may accept the free dinner from the KCA so long as the dinner is given and consumed in the presence of members of the KCA.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has prepared a proposed Kansas water pollution control permit, A-UAHG-H001, for Murphy Family Farms-Wildcat Farm located near Jetmore. Murphy Family Farms proposes a new facility for the confined feeding of 14,300 head (5,720 animal units) of swine. The proposed facility location is in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 14, T22S, R24W, in Hodgeman County. The proposed permit for Murphy Family Farms was placed on Public Notice No. KS-AG-97-147/151 dated June 26, 1997. Significant public response to this notice was expressed concerning the potential impact of the proposed facility. While many of the comments addressed issues for which the department is not the controlling legal authority, a public hearing has not been scheduled in conformance with Kansas Administrative Regulation 28-16-61 to provide citizens with the opportunity to address environmental issues regulated by KDHE.

A public hearing on KDHE's intention to issue the proposed permit has been scheduled for 7 p.m. Monday, November 24, at the King Center, 1312 Main, Jetmore.

Article 1.—GENERAL RULES

71-1-3. Examinations required by the board. In addition to the examination required pursuant to section 71-1-9, each applicant for licensure as a dentist or dental hygienist shall have successfully completed the written examination of dental theory conducted by the national board of dental examiners and clinical examinations approved by the board. (Authorized by K.S.A. 65-1426; implementing K.S.A. 65-1427, 65-1428, 74-1405; effective Jan. 1, 1966; amended May 1, 1983; amended Nov. 7, 1997.)

71-1-16. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-1406(l); implementing K.S.A. 65-1423(g); effective May 10, 1993; amended Sept. 6, 1994; revoked Nov. 7, 1997.)

71-1-17. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-1406(l); implementing K.S.A. 65-1423(g); effective May 10, 1993; amended Sept. 6, 1994; revoked Nov. 7, 1997.)

71-1-19. Proration of fees. (a) Beginning June 1, 1997, each dentist applying for licensure on or after the first day of January shall pay $\frac{1}{24}$ th of the biennial renewal fee for each full month remaining in the renewal period, in addition to the application fee.

(b) Beginning June 1, 1997, each dental hygienist applying for licensure on or after the first day of January shall pay $\frac{1}{24}$ th of the renewal fee for each full month remaining in the renewal period, in addition to the application fee. Article 3.—DENTAL HYGIENISTS

Article 5.—SEDATIVE AND GENERAL ANAESTHESIA

71-5-3. Level I permit requirements. (a) A Level I permit for administration of conscious sedation in a dental office shall be issued to each licensed dentist who fulfills these requirements:

(1) meets the education or experience requirements in subsection (b);

(2) meets the requirements regarding facilities set out in subsection (c); and

(3) has current certification in basic life support or its equivalent.

(b) Each licensed dentist applying for a Level I permit shall provide evidence of the following:

(1) satisfactorily completing one of the following:

(A) a minimum of 60 hours of instruction in intravenous conscious sedation, including didactic and supportive courses, provided by a training program approved by the board; or

(B) an internship or residency program that includes supervised experience in intravenous conscious sedation equal to the 60 hours of instruction required in paragraph (A); or

(2) having regularly engaged in the administration of conscious sedation in a competent manner for a period of three years immediately before the effective date of this regulation.

(c) Each licensed dentist applying for a Level I permit shall provide evidence satisfactory to the board that the dentist maintains a properly equipped facility that shall include the following:

(1) a blood pressure monitor and stethoscope;

(2) an oxygen delivery system with full face masks, including connectors capable of delivering oxygen under positive pressure; and

(3) emergency drugs and equipment.

(d) Each Level I permit shall be renewed biennially on July 1 of odd-numbered years, on a form prescribed by the board. The biennial renewal fee shall be \$100.

(e) Each licensed dentist applying for a renewal of a Level I permit shall demonstrate that the dentist has maintained competence in administration of conscious sedation, by providing evidence of having performed a minimum of 20 Level I procedures during the two years preceding renewal. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-1406 and implementing K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 65-1444; effective Nov. 27, 1995; amended Nov. 7, 1997.)

71-5-4. Level II permit requirements. (a) A Level II permit for administration of deep sedation and general anaesthesia shall be issued to each licensed dentist who fulfills these requirements:

(1) meets the education or experience requirements in subsection (b);

(2) meets the requirements regarding facilities set out in subsection (c); and

(3) has current certification in basic life support or its equivalent.

(b) Each licensed dentist applying for a Level II permit shall provide evidence of the following:

(1) meeting the requirements for a Level I permit established under 71-5-3; and

(2)(A) satisfactorily completing one of the following:

(i) a course of study and residency program in anaesthesia approved by the board of healing arts;

(ii) an advanced oral and maxillofacial surgery program approved by the board; or

(iii) a minimum of one year of advanced training in anaesthesiology with standards not less than those established in the "guidelines for teaching the comprehensive control of pain and anxiety in dentistry," as published in 1992 and implemented in July, 1993 by the American dental association; or

(B) having regularly engaged in the administration of deep sedation or general anaesthesia in a competent manner for a period of three years immediately before the effective date of this regulation.

(c) Each licensed dentist applying for a Level II permit shall provide evidence satisfactory to the board that the dentist maintains a properly equipped facility that shall include the following:

(1) facilities specified in K.A.R. 71-5-3(c); and

(2) appropriate equipment for intubation and IV infusions.

(d) Each Level II permit shall be renewed biennially on July 1 of odd-numbered years, on a form prescribed by the board. The biennial renewal fee shall be \$100.

(e) Each licensed dentist applying for renewal of a Level II permit shall demonstrate that the dentist has maintained competence in the administration of deep sedation and general anaesthesia, by providing evidence of having performed a minimum of 48 Level II procedures during the two years preceding renewal. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-1406 and implementing K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 65-1444; effective Nov. 27, 1995; amended Nov. 7, 1997.)

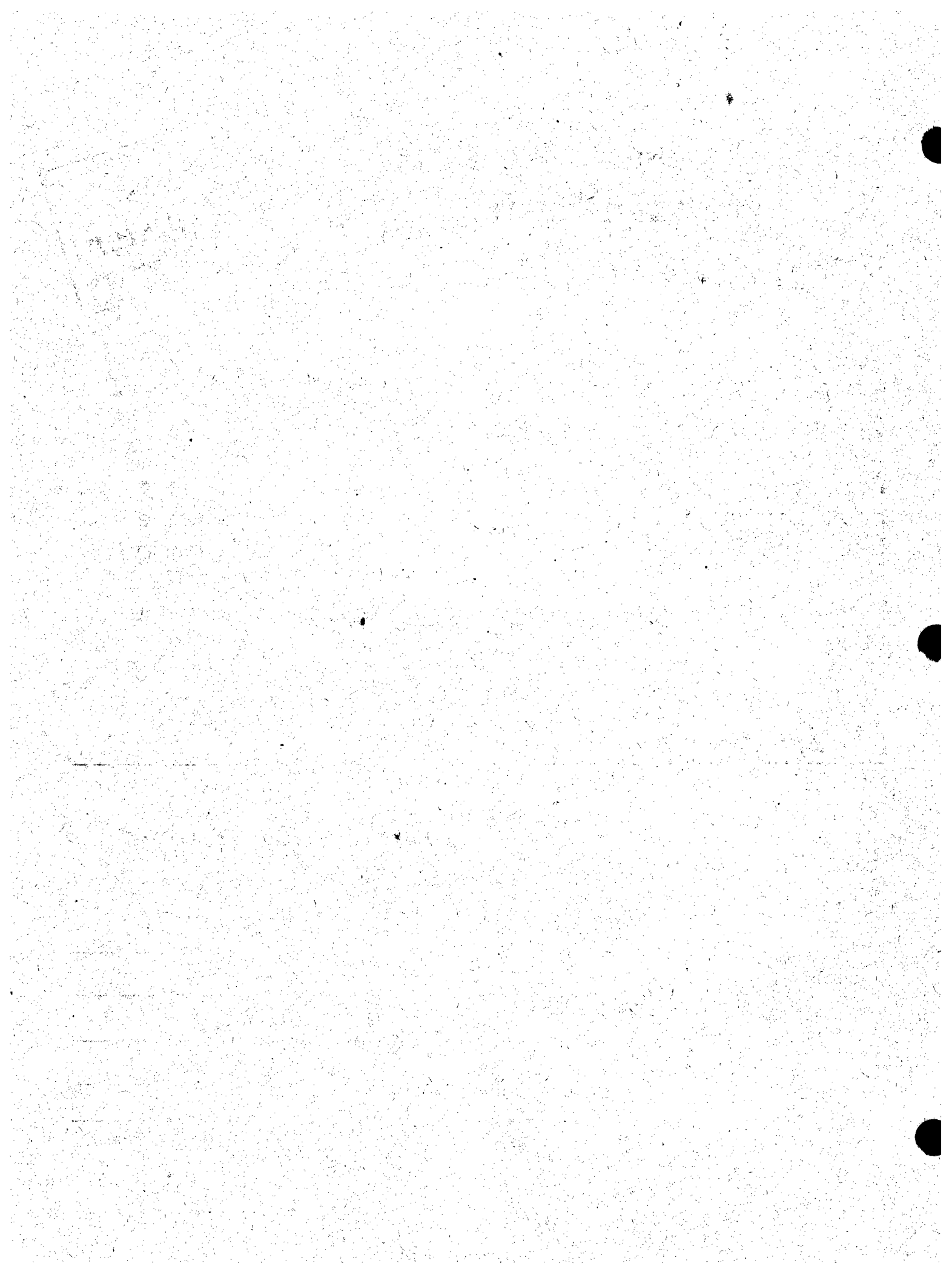

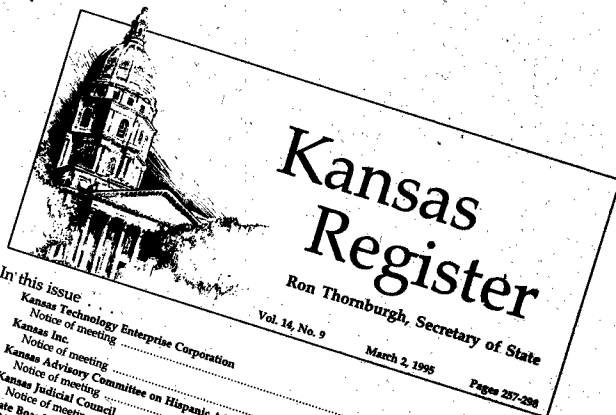
