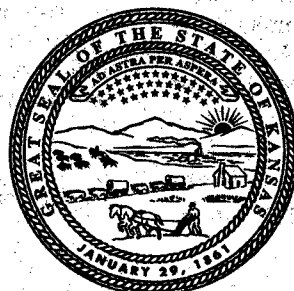

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has received and reviewed a request for an expansion of the Morton County municipal solid waste landfill, located in Section 27 in Township 34S, Range 41W, approximately 6 miles northeast of Elkhart. The landfill's current area is 120 acres, and the proposed expansion would add 320 acres to the east of the existing landfill. KDHE is providing public notice of its intent to issue an amended municipal solid waste landfill permit to Morton County that increases the permitted area. As a condition of the amended permit, the county will be required to modify environmental monitoring procedures. Once this information is submitted and approved, the requirements of new state and federal regulations for small arid landfills, which became effective October 9, 1997, will be fulfilled.

86-1-5. Fees. This regulation is amended to increase the two-year renewal fee for a broker's license from \$125 to \$150; to increase the two-year renewal fee for a salesperson's license from \$80 to \$100; to increase the six-month fee for a temporary salesperson's license from \$20 to \$25; to increase the prorated fee, based on a two-year amount, for a broker's license from \$125 to \$150; and to increase the prorated fee, based on a two-year amount, for a salesperson's license from \$80 to \$100.

The economic impact on applicants for licenses will be \$5 for a temporary salesperson's license; an average of \$10 for a standard salesperson's license; and an average of \$12.50 for a broker's license. The economic impact on licensees to renew their licenses for a two-year renewal period will be \$20 for salespersons and \$25 for brokers. Anticipated revenue for the fee increases through FY-1999 will be \$99,712 to the agency and \$24,928 to the general fund. There is no anticipated economic impact on other governmental agencies or other private businesses.

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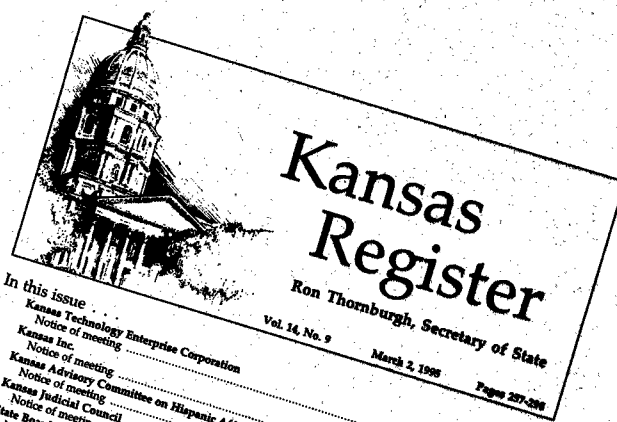
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
