Notice of Hearing on Proposed  
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Tuesday, March 24, in the conference room of the Department of Corrections, fourth floor, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed changes in an existing rule and regulation of the Department of Corrections.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rule and regulation. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Timothy G. Madden, Chief Legal Counsel, Kansas Department of Corrections, 4th Floor, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulation during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Timothy G. Madden at (785) 296-4508, fax (785) 296-0014. Handicapped parking is located at the south end of Landon State Office Building, and the north entrance to the building is accessible to individuals with disabilities.

The regulation is proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed regulation and its economic impact follows.

**K.A.R. 44-12-601. Mail.** This regulation is being amended to regulate mail sent by or to persons in the custody of the Department of Corrections. Mail between persons in custody or under supervision is restricted. Items sent by bulk mail and publications will not be delivered to inmates unless ordered through the facility. The amount of postage paid for by the state on behalf of indigent inmates is reduced to four, one-ounce first-class letters per month. Only indigent inmates will be provided free writing paper and envelopes. Inmates shall be responsible for paying the postage for all legal and official mail; however, indigent inmates shall receive the necessary postage for official and legal mail, but such postage shall be deducted from the inmate's funds when available. Publications that are censored shall, at the option of the inmate, be either sent out of the facility in their entirety at the inmate's expense or discarded in their entirety.

Pursuant to the amendments of this regulation, the Department of Corrections will experience a reduction in the expense of processing mail and the provision of postage, writing supplies and envelopes. The resources expended in the reading of mail between inmates also will be reduced. Inmates will be required to bear a greater portion of the cost of writing and posting correspondence.

Other governmental units, private citizens and consumers will not be affected by this amendment.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed  
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted by the Wildlife and Parks Commission at 7 p.m. Wednesday, March 25, at the Red Coach Inn, 2529 W. Central, El Dorado, to consider the approval and adoption of four proposed administrative regulations of the Department of Wildlife and Parks.

A workshop meeting on business of the Wildlife and Parks Commission will begin at 1:30 p.m. March 25 at the same location. The meeting will recess at 5 p.m., then resume at 7 p.m. at the same location for the regulatory hearing. There will be public comment periods at the beginning of the afternoon and evening meetings for any issues not on the agenda, and additional comment periods will be available during the meeting on agenda items. Old and new business also may be discussed at this time. If necessary to complete the hearing or other business matters, the commission will reconvene at 9 a.m. March 26 at the location listed above.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Cindy Baugh, commission secretary, at (316) 672-5911. Persons with a hearing impairment may call the TDD service at 1-800-766-3777 to request special accommodations.

This 60-day notice period prior to the hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed administrative regulations.

All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the chairman of the commission, Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks, Suite 502, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to express their views orally in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations. During the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the commission as a basis for approving, amending and approving, or rejecting the proposed regulations.

The regulations that will be heard during the regulatory hearing portion of the meeting are as follows:

**K.A.R. 115-2-3.** This regulation establishes fees for state parks and other designated areas for which camping and utility fees are required. The proposed amendments would strike fees for certain leases or permits, including private boat docks and private cabin, club or organization sites. A new regulation is proposed, K.A.R. 115-2-6, which would incorporate these fees in order to more appropriately group fees by subject matter.

**Economic Impact Summary:** No economic impact is anticipated from striking these fees and inserting them in the new regulation.

**K.A.R. 115-2-6.** This proposed new regulation would establish certain fees, including fees for private boat docks and private cabin, club or organization sites, which currently are established by K.A.R. 115-2-3. It would initially establish the annual fee for private cabin, club and organization sites at \$200, effective January 1, 1999, with future adjustments to be made based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI). This fee would become applicable when the lease for a private cabin, club or organization site is newly assigned, transferred or renewed, unless the terms of the existing lease specify otherwise. The transfer fee for a private cabin, club or organization site would be \$25, and the annual fee for a private boat dock would be \$25.

**Economic Impact Summary:** The private cabin, club and organization site fee would represent an increase of \$100, which would be a cost to the lessees at the three state parks at which such sites exist. The increase is intended to better reflect the fair market value of the leased property. However, individuals with long-term leases, and with leases with specified renewal rates, would not be affected. The increased boat dock and assignment fees would better reflect administrative and operational costs, and therefore would be an economic benefit to the agency. No other economic impacts on other state agencies or the public is anticipated.

**K.A.R. 115-4-1. Turkey; legal equipment, taking methods, reports, tags, and general provisions.**

**K.A.R. 115-4-7. Elk; legal equipment, taking methods, general provisions.**

The proposed amendments to these two regulations are substantially the same. The proposed amendments would add crossbows, as authorized under K.A.R. 115-18-7 for persons with a permanent physical disability, to the list of legal equipment for the taking of turkey and elk, in order to make these two regulations consistent with previously amended K.S.A. 32-932 and K.A.R. 115-18-7.

**Economic Impact Summary:** As the amendments would simply ensure that these regulations are not in conflict with other laws or regulations, no economic impact is anticipated.

### Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Office of Epidemiologic Services, will conduct a public hearing at 10 a.m. Thursday, March 26, in Room 1051-South, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of a proposed amendment to K.A.R. 28-1-13. A summary of the proposed regulation and its economic impact follows.

Changes to K.A.R. 28-1-13 (rabies control; isolation of mammals causing exposure to rabies for observation and examination; quarantine of mammals exposed to rabies) are intended to correspond to current scientific and public health practices as follows:

Rabies control regulations, observation, examination and quarantine of ferrets would be changed so that they would be treated similarly to dogs and cats. This conforms to the November 1, 1997, findings and recommendations of the national Animal Rabies Control Committee. The recommendations were based on studies that determined the shedding period of rabies in ferrets from a variety of animal rabies strains. The amended regulation eliminates the special conditions of ferrets that bite humans so that an affidavit would no longer be part of the requirements to avoid sacrificing a ferret in the case of a ferret bite to a human.

Economic impact: In general, there will be no added costs to KDHE, other governmental agencies, private businesses or individuals. The proposed elimination of the affidavit is less restrictive than the existing regulation in the case of a bite from a ferret.

The time between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a 60-day public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulatory action. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Gail Hansen, Office of Epidemiologic Services, Room 1051-S, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612-1290. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the proposed regulatory action during the hearing. ## Request for Comments

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality Class II operating permit. Rich-Mix Products, Inc. has applied for a Class II operating permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-540. Rich-Mix Products, Inc. blends and bags dry cement, mortar, soil and decorative rock for retail sale. Emissions resulting from the processing of sand, cement, soil rock, etc. were evaluated to determine the potential-to-emit. The purpose of the Class II operating permit is to limit the potential-to-emit of particulate matter with a diameter of 10 micrometers or less (PM10) to below 100 tons per year.

Rich-Mix Products, Inc., Wichita, owns and operates the stationary source located at 2424 S. 88th St., Kansas City, Kansas.

**66-6-1. Seal.** (a) Each licensee shall obtain a seal of the design approved by the board in compliance with K.S.A. 74-7023, and amendments thereto. The seal may be a rubber stamp, an embossed seal, or a computer-generated seal.

(b) Each original drawing, document, technical report, legal description, record, and paper prepared by or under the direct supervision of the licensee in the licensee's professional capacity shall be stamped with the licensee's seal, unless the project is exempt from the requirements for licensure pursuant to K.S.A. 74-7031, K.S.A. 74-7032, K.S.A. 74-7033, or K.S.A. 74-7034, and amendments thereto.

After the licensee's seal has been applied to the original or record copy, the licensee shall place the licensee's handwritten signature and date across the seal. Computer-generated or other facsimile signatures and dates shall not be acceptable.

(c) Each licensee shall endeavor to take all practical measures to ensure that drawings and specifications are not utilized for projects not contemplated at the time of the completion of the drawings and specifications.

(d) Each licensee shall endeavor to ensure that the drawings and specifications as instruments of service remain the property of the licensee, whether the project for which they are made is executed or not.

(e) The owner may retain copies, including reproducible copies, of drawings and specifications for informa-

tion and reference in connection with the owner's use and occupancy of the project.

(f) The licensee shall endeavor to ensure that the drawings and specifications are not used by the owner on any other projects, for additions to the contemplated project, or for completion of this project, unless the licensee is in default or agrees, in writing, and receives appropriate compensation. 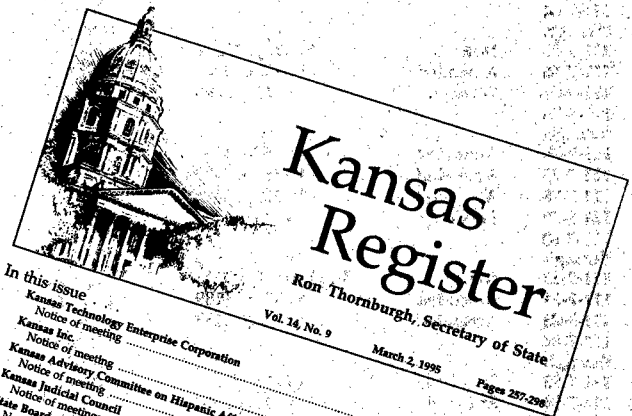
