## Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct

## Opinion No. 1998-1

Written January 8, 1998, to Carl Anderson, Assistant Attorney General, Kansas Lottery, Topeka.

This opinion is in response to your letter of December 9, 1997, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct concerning the state level conflict of interest laws (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*). We note at the outset that the commission's jurisdiction is limited to the application of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule and regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

## Factual Statement

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as the legal counsel for the Kansas Lottery. You advise us that an employee of your agency assisted in the preparation of a request for proposal (RFP), which ultimately resulted in the awarding of a contract to a major contractor. The employee did not participate in the making of the contract itself, although the RFP is incorporated into the contract by reference. The contract was negotiated by a Procurement Negotiation Committee, of which the employee was not a member. The contractor is not licensed, inspected or regulated by the Lottery.

## Question

Based on this factual scenario, you ask us the following questions:

1. May the employee accept employment with the contractor after terminating employment with the Kansas Lottery?
2. May the employee, as a representative of his own consulting firm, be listed by a major contractor of Kansas Lottery as a recommended supplier of goods or services?

## Opinion

K.S.A. 46-233, as amended by Chapter 155, Section 2 of the 1997 *Session Laws of Kansas*, applies to your first question. That section in pertinent part states:

(a) (2) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, whenever any individual has participated as a state officer or employee in the making of any contract with any person or business, such individual shall not accept employment with such person or business as an employee, independent contractor or subcontractor until two years after performance of the contract is completed or until two years after the individual terminates employment as a state officer or employee, whichever is sooner. . . .

(e) (2) "Substantially involved in the preparation or participate in the making of a contract" means having approved or disapproved a contract or having provided significant factual or specific information or advice or recommendations in relation to the negotiated terms of the contract.

K.S.A. 46-231 defines "contract" as the following:

"Contract" means any agreement including but not limited to sales and conveyances of real and personal property and agreements for the performance of services.

In applying this language to your first question, the commission believes that by assisting in the drafting of the RFP, the employee has "provided significant factual or specific information or advice or recommendations in relation to the negotiated terms of the contract." Therefore, the employee could not accept employment with the contractor for two years after termination of state employment or two years after completion of the contractual terms, whichever is sooner.

Turning to your second question, nothing in the state level conflict of interest laws would prohibit an employee of your agency from having his private consulting firm being listed by a Lottery contractor as a supplier of goods or services.

## Opinion No. 1998-2

Written January 8, 1998, to all interested persons:

Pursuant to K.S.A. 46-254, the Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct takes the opportunity to issue its opinion concerning the application of the state level conflict of interest laws (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*) to the question of a state agency providing gifts, including travel, to members of the legislature and other state officers and employees.

## Question

May a state agency provide gifts, including travel, to members of the legislature and other state officers and employees?

## Opinion

K.S.A. 46-237(a) and (b) in pertinent part state:

(a) No state officer or employee. . . shall accept, or agree to accept any economic opportunity, gift, loan, gratuity, special discount, favor, hospitality, or service having an aggregate value of \$40 or more in any calendar year from any one person known to have a special interest, under circumstances where such person knows or should know that a major purpose of the donor is to influence such person in the performance of their official duties or prospective official duties.

(b) No person with a special interest shall offer, pay, give or make any economic opportunity, gift, loan, gratuity, special discount, favor, hospitality or service having an aggregate value of \$40 or more in any calendar year to any state officer or employee. . . with a major purpose of influencing such officer or employee. . . in the performance of official duties or prospective official duties.

K.S.A. 46-228 defines "special interest" as the following:

"Special interest" means an interest of any person as herein defined (1) concerning action or non-action by the legislature on any legislative matter affecting such person as distinct from affect upon the people of the state as a whole, or (2) in the action or non-action of any state agency or state officer or employee upon any matter affecting such person as distinct from affect upon the people of the state as a whole.

(continued)

K.S.A. 46-223 defines "person" in pertinent part as:

"Person" means . . . a governmental agency . . ."

In applying these sections, each state agency has a "special interest" in members of the legislature. Therefore, an agency may only give gifts and travel up to \$40 in a calendar year to each member of the legislature. In situations where an agency holds a "special interest" in other state officers and employees, who are not otherwise prohibited from receiving gifts and travel, the agency could not give gifts or travel in excess of \$40 in a calendar year to such officers and employees. (Under the provisions of HB 2064 found in Chapter 155 of the 1997 *Session Laws of Kansas*, the Governor, all classified employees, those unclassified employees whose salaries are subject to the Governor's approval, and all members of boards, commissions and authorities of the executive branch may not accept gifts or travel from any source except as provided by that law.)

**Article 9.—PAROLE VIOLATIONS**

**45-9-2. Release revocation hearings.** (a) After an offender is returned to a correctional institution, the offender may request a hearing before the final decision on revocation by the board. The final hearing shall be held without unnecessary delay. The hearing to determine whether or not the release should be revoked shall be conducted by the board or any member of the board. After considering all pertinent evidence, an appropriate order shall be entered by the board. If the violation is established to the satisfaction of the board, the release may be reinstated or revoked by the board.

(b) Before the final hearing, the following information shall be provided to the offender by the board:

(1) written notice of the alleged violations of the conditions of release; and

(2) the evidence against the offender. If the board finds there are additional violations other than those contained in the written notice, the hearing shall be continued so that a written notice of the additional violations and a statement of the evidence against the offender can be prepared.

(c) The offender shall have the right to confront and cross-examine adverse witnesses, unless the board finds

(continued)

good cause for not allowing confrontation. If the board does not allow the offender to confront a witness, the reasons in the statement required by subsection (g) shall be specified by the board. If the offender had the opportunity to cross-examine a witness at the probable cause hearing provided for in K.A.R. 44-9-105, the record may be relied upon by the board, in lieu of calling that witness.

(d) The offender shall have an opportunity to be heard in person and to present documentary evidence and witnesses who can provide information relevant to the allegations of the violation of the conditions of release. Attendance of witnesses favorable to the offender is the responsibility of the offender and shall be at the offender's expense. The hearing may be continued from time to time to allow for the attendance of witnesses.

(e) All relevant evidence shall be received by the board, including letters and affidavits. If the violation of the conditions of release results from a conviction for a new felony or misdemeanor, the arrangement for the presence of witnesses shall not be the obligation of the board, and the only question considered by the board shall be whether or not the new conviction warrants revocation.

(f) Each offender shall be entitled to have legal counsel present at the hearing, at the offender's expense.

(1) Upon request and at the board's discretion, legal counsel may be appointed by the board, based upon either of the following claims, which shall be timely and colorable:

(A) the offender has not committed the alleged violation of the conditions upon which the offender is at liberty; or

(B) there are substantial reasons that justify or mitigate the violation and make revocation inappropriate.

The board's decision regarding the appointment of counsel shall take into account whether or not the offender appears to be capable of speaking effectively for that individual and whether or not the circumstances are complex or otherwise difficult to develop or present.

(2) In all cases in which a request for appointed counsel at a preliminary or final hearing is denied, the grounds for denial shall be made in writing.

(g) If the offender's release is revoked, a written statement as to the evidence relied on and reasons for revoking the release shall be given to the offender by the board. #### Article 19.—AMBIENT AIR QUALITY STANDARDS AND AIR POLLUTION CONTROL

**28-19-517. Class I operating permits; annual emission inventory.** (a) The owner or operator of each stationary source required by these regulations to apply for a class I operating permit shall, on or before June 1 of each year, submit to the department all operating or other relevant information deemed necessary by the department to estimate actual air emissions from the stationary source for the preceding year.

(b) The information required by subsection (a) of this regulation shall be submitted on forms approved by the department. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 65-3005; implementing K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 65-3007; effective Jan. 23, 1995; amended Feb. 20, 1998.)

**28-19-546. Class II operating permits; annual emission inventory.** (a) Except as may be otherwise specifically required, the owner or operator of each stationary source required by these regulations to apply for a class II operating permit shall, on or before June 1 of each year, submit to the department all operating or other relevant information deemed necessary by the department to estimate actual air emissions from the stationary source for the preceding year. This information shall be submitted on forms approved by the department.

(b) For sources that submit a report to the department by June 1 of each year pursuant to K.A.R. 28-19-561 through K.A.R. 28-19-563, that report shall be in lieu of the information required to be submitted under this regulation. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 65-3005; implementing K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 65-3007; effective Jan. 23, 1995; amended Feb. 20, 1998.)

**28-19-561. Class II operating permits; permit-by-rule; reciprocating engines.** (a) For purposes of this regulation, "reciprocating engine stationary source" means a source with one or more stationary reciprocating engines of any design or fuel type, which source does not contain other emission units that, alone or in combination with the reciprocating engines, would require that the source obtain a class I operating permit solely because of its potential-to-emit. For purposes of this regulation, a reciprocating engine stationary source shall be presumed to operate without emission controls, whether or not the source has emission controls.

(b) (1) Each reciprocating engine stationary source with a capacity of less than 730 horsepower, 550 kilowatts, or 5.1 million Btu per hour fuel input, shall be presumed to have a potential-to-emit of less than 100 tons of each regulated pollutant per year.

(2) The owner or operator of each such source may elect to operate the source pursuant to this regulation in lieu of obtaining a class I or class II operating permit, provided that the source complies with the requirements

of subsection (e) of this regulation if it exceeds the capacity listed in paragraph (1) of this subsection.

(c) Any owner or operator of a reciprocating engine stationary source with a capacity greater than 730 horsepower, 550 kilowatts, or 5.1 million Btu heat input per hour, may operate this source pursuant to this regulation and K.A.R. 28-19-542, if the owner or operator meets the following conditions:

(1) limits the operations of the source during each consecutive 12-month period to 5,800,000 horsepower hours, 4,300,000 kilowatt hours, or 40,000 million Btu fuel input;

(2) maintains on-site records demonstrating that the operating restrictions specified in this regulation have not been exceeded;

(3) updates the required records monthly, not later than the last day of the month following the month to which the records relate;

(4) retains the required records on-site for at least two years following the date of record; and

(5) submits to the department by June 1 of each year, on forms approved by the department, a report of the actual horsepower hours, kilowatt hours, or Btu fuel input for the preceding calendar year.

(d) At the end of any calendar quarter, if a source that has been operating under subsection (c) of this regulation for the past four calendar quarters, including the most recent calendar quarter, has operated at a level exceeding 85% of the restrictions specified in subsection (c)(1) of this regulation, the owner or operator of this source shall report in writing to the department the actual operations for the past four quarters.

(1) The actual operations shall be reported in the same units as the operating restrictions specified in this regulation.

(2) The report shall be submitted to the department within 45 days of the last day of the calendar quarter.

(e)(1) If at any time a reciprocating engine stationary source that the owner or operator has elected to operate pursuant to this regulation fails to meet the provisions of paragraph (c)(1) of this regulation, the owner or operator shall notify the department in writing, the notice to be mailed or delivered the first working day following discovery of the failure to meet such provisions.

(2) Within 60 days of discovery of any failure to meet the requirements of paragraph (c)(1) of this regulation, the owner or operator shall submit to the department a written compliance plan identifying those actions being taken by the owner or operator to assure future compliance with the applicable requirements or to otherwise bring the source into compliance with this regulation, any other applicable Kansas air quality regulations, and the Kansas air quality statutes.

(3) The owner or operator shall file an application for any required operating permit within 180 days of discovery of an exceedance of the provisions of paragraph (c)(1) of this regulation.

(4) Compliance with the requirements of this subsection shall not shield the owner or operator from enforcement action for exceeding any applicable restriction or for other violations of the Kansas air quality act or regulations.

(f) Each source that elects to operate in accordance with this regulation shall continue to be subject to all other applicable requirements of the Kansas air quality statutes and regulations. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 65-3005; implementing K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 65-3008; effective Jan. 23, 1995; amended Feb. 20, 1998.)

**28-19-562. Class II operating permits; permit-by-rule; organic solvent evaporative sources.** (a) For purposes of this regulation, "organic solvent evaporative source" means each stationary source that meets the following conditions:

(1) purchases or uses materials that contain volatile organic compounds, hazardous air pollutants, or both, used in cleaning solvents, printing operations, adhesives, or surface coatings; and

(2) does not contain emission units, other than organic solvent evaporative sources, that, alone or in combination with all organic solvent evaporative sources, would require that the source obtain a class I operating permit solely because of its potential-to-emit.

(b)(1) Each owner or operator of an organic solvent evaporative source that purchases all of the materials containing volatile organic compounds and hazardous air pollutants used at the source shall demonstrate compliance with this regulation by keeping records of the volatile organic compounds and hazardous air pollutants either purchased or used by the source.

(2) Each owner or operator of an organic solvent evaporative source that uses materials containing volatile organic compounds or hazardous air pollutants that were not purchased by the source shall demonstrate compliance with this regulation by keeping records of the volatile organic compounds and hazardous air pollutants used at the source, unless otherwise authorized by the department in writing.

(c)(1) An organic solvent evaporative source that in any consecutive 12-month period either purchases or uses materials that contain less than a total of nine tons of volatile organic compounds or hazardous air pollutants, or both, shall be presumed to have a potential-to-emit of less than 100 tons of volatile organic compounds per year, less than 25 tons of any combination of hazardous air pollutants per year, and less than 10 tons of a single hazardous air pollutant per year.

(2) The owner or operator of any source may elect to operate pursuant to this regulation in lieu of obtaining a class I or class II operating permit, provided that the source complies with the requirements of subsection (f) of this regulation if it either purchases or uses materials that contain nine tons or more of volatile organic compounds, hazardous air pollutants, or both, in any consecutive 12-month period.

(d) An organic solvent evaporative source that in any consecutive 12-month period either purchases or uses materials that contain less than a total of 90 tons of volatile organic solvents, less than a total of 22.5 tons of any combination of hazardous air pollutants, or less than a total of nine tons of each single hazardous air pollutant, may operate pursuant to this regulation and K.A.R. 28-19-542 if the owner or operator meets the following conditions:

(continued)

(1) maintains on-site records demonstrating that the restrictions specified in this regulation have not been exceeded;

(2) updates the required records monthly, not later than the last day of the month following the month to which the records relate;

(3) retains the required records on-site for a period of at least two years from the date of record; and

(4) annually submits to the department by June 1 of each year, on forms approved by the department, a report of the tons of volatile organic solvents, total hazardous air pollutants, and single hazardous air pollutants purchased or used by the source during the preceding calendar year.

(e)(1) At the end of any calendar quarter, if the purchase or use for the past four calendar quarters, including the most recent calendar quarter, has exceeded 85% of any of the restrictions on the purchase or use of volatile organic solvents and hazardous air pollutants specified in this regulation under which the owner or operator has elected to operate, the owner or operator shall report in writing to the department the amount purchased or used in the past four calendar quarters.

(2) The actual amount purchased or used shall be reported in the same units as the limitations specified in this regulation.

(3) The report shall be submitted to the department within 45 days of the last day of the calendar quarter.

(f)(1) If at any time an organic solvent evaporative source that the owner or operator has elected to operate pursuant to the terms of this regulation fails to meet the provisions of paragraph (d)(1) of this regulation, the owner or operator shall notify the department in writing, the notice to be mailed or delivered the first working day following discovery of the failure to meet that requirement.

(2) Within 60 days of discovery of any failure to meet the requirements of paragraph (d)(1) of this regulation, the owner or operator shall submit to the department a compliance plan identifying those actions being taken by the owner or operator to assure future compliance with the applicable restrictions or to otherwise bring the source into compliance with this regulation, any other applicable Kansas air quality regulations, and the Kansas air quality statutes.

(3) The owner or operator shall file an application for any required operating permit within 180 days of discovery of an exceedance of the provisions of paragraph (d)(1) of this regulation.

(4) Compliance with the requirements of this subsection shall not shield the owner or operator from enforcement action for exceeding any applicable restriction or for other violations of the Kansas air quality act or regulations.

(g) Each source that elects to operate in accordance with this regulation shall continue to be subject to all other applicable requirements of the Kansas air quality statutes and regulations. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 65-3005; implementing K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 65-3008; effective Jan. 23, 1995; amended Feb. 20, 1998.)

**28-19-563. Class II operating permits; permit by rule; hot mix asphalt facilities.** (a) For purposes of this

regulation, "hot mix asphalt facility" means a facility that is used to manufacture hot mix asphalt by heating and drying aggregate and mixing it with asphalt cement and that does not contain other emission sources that, alone or in combination with the hot mix asphalt facility, would require the source to obtain a class I operating permit solely because of its potential-to-emit.

(b) Any hot mix asphalt facility may operate pursuant to this regulation and K.A.R. 28-19-542 under the following conditions:

(1) the facility uses venturi scrubbers, a baghouse, or equivalent particulate emission controls to limit particulate emissions to not greater than 0.04 grains per dry standard cubic foot of exhaust gas; and

(2) the owner or operator of the facility meets the following conditions:

(A) limits production at the facility to not greater than 250,000 tons of hot mix asphalt during any consecutive 12-month period;

(B) maintains on-site records demonstrating that the production restrictions and particulate emission limits set forth in this regulation have not been exceeded;

(C) updates the records monthly not later than the last day of the month following the month to which the records relate;

(D) retains the records on-site for at least two years following the date of record; and

(E) annually submits to the department by June 1 of each year, on forms approved by the department, a report of the actual tons of hot mix asphalt produced at the source during the preceding calendar year.

(c) If at the end of any calendar quarter production for the past four calendar quarters, including the most recent calendar quarter, has exceeded 85% of any production restriction specified in this regulation, the owner or operator shall report in writing to the department the actual production for the past four calendar quarters.

(1) The actual production shall be reported in the same units as the restriction specified in this regulation.

(2) The report shall be submitted to the department within 45 days of the last day of the calendar quarter.

(d)(1) If at any time a hot mix asphalt facility that the owner or operator has elected to operate pursuant to the terms of this regulation fails to meet the provisions of paragraph (b)(2)(A) of this regulation, the owner or operator shall notify the department in writing, the notice to be mailed or delivered the first working day following discovery of the failure to meet that requirement.

(2) Within 60 days of discovery of this failure to meet the requirements of paragraph (b)(2)(A), the owner or operator shall submit to the department a compliance plan identifying those actions being taken by the owner or operator to assure future compliance with applicable restrictions or to otherwise bring the source into compliance with this regulation, any other applicable Kansas air quality regulations, and the Kansas air quality statutes.

(3) The owner or operator shall also file an application for any required operating permit within 180 days of discovery of an exceedance of the provisions of paragraph (b)(2)(A) of this regulation.

(4) Compliance with the requirements of this subsection shall not shield the owner or operator from enforce-

ment action for exceeding any applicable restriction or for other violations of the Kansas air quality act or regulations.

(e) Each source that elects to operate in accordance with this regulation shall continue to be subject to all other applicable requirements of the Kansas air quality statutes and regulations. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 65-3005; implementing K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 65-3008; effective Jan. 23, 1995; amended Feb. 20, 1998.)

Accident and sickness insurance; continuation and conversion policies; reasonable notice of required contributions and right to convert.** This regulation is changed to require insurers to make insureds aware of their additional option of coverage (higher risk pool). The notice requirement specified in K.A.R. 40-4-36 is the best means to communicate to insureds what their options are when they continue or convert coverage. There should be little or no economic impact on the department.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format.
