WHEREAS, on June 8, 1998, a fire at the Kansas City, Kansas, Department of Corrections' Parole Office caused damage estimated at \$125,000 - \$130,000; and

WHEREAS, the investigation by the Kansas Fire Marshal's Office revealed arson was the likely cause of the fire; and

WHEREAS, a second fire, also believed to be intentionally set, occurred on June 18, 1998, in the temporary office space of the Kansas City, Kansas, Department of Corrections' Parole Office causing in excess of \$40,000 in damages to the building and contents; and

WHEREAS, the offer of a reward will enhance the efforts of the agencies and officers involved in the investigation in this heinous crime;

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the authority vested in me by K.S.A. 75-113, I, Bill Graves, Governor of the State of Kansas, do hereby offer a reward of five thousand dollars (5,000.00) for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible for these fires.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 98-3, and shall become effective immediately.

Jackson, Topeka, on the proposal for the Kansas Development Finance Authority to issue approximately \$1,800,000 principal amount of Housing Development Revenue Bonds for Pioneer Olde Town Apartments, L.P. (the developer). ## Notice of 1998 Access to Justice Grant

The Access to Justice Fund was created as a source of grants for the operating expenses of programs, including dispute resolution programs, providing access to the Kansas civil justice system for persons who would otherwise be unable to gain access to civil justice. Programs awarded grants must provide such services as legal assistance to pro se litigants, legal counsel for civil and domestic matters, or other legal or dispute resolutions services. The services provided should help reduce the burden pro se litigation imposes on the district courts. Applicants must be income tax exempt organizations who will use the grant funds to provide services to individuals and families at or below 150 percent of the federally established poverty level.

For the fiscal year July 1, 1998 through June 30, 1999, the Kansas Supreme Court will award grants totaling not more than \$1 million. Grant proposals are due July 15.

## Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct

## Opinion No. 1998-11

Written June 18, 1998, to Fred W. Johnson, Labette County Counselor, Oswego.

This opinion is in response to your letter of June 17, 1998, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct concerning the local level conflict of interest laws (K.S.A. 75-4301a *et seq.*). We note at the outset that the commission's jurisdiction is limited to the application of K.S.A. 75-4301a *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule and regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

**Factual Statement**

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as the Labette County Counselor. You advise us that Labette County received a strategic planning grant from the Kansas Department of Commerce and Housing. The grant application was a joint venture with the City of Parsons. Larry Eller, a city employee, was involved in the grant application process. Upon receipt of the grant, Mr. Eller developed, with county approval, a Request for Qualifications for the consultant who would help with the implementation of the grant. He then caused these requests to be solicited by the appropriate advertising and mailings. Ultimately, the only person who responded to the solicitation was Mr. Eller.

**Question**

Is it a conflict of interest for a local governmental official to draft a bid request for a position, respond to the bid request and ultimately receive the position?

**Opinion**

K.S.A. 75-4304 applies to your question. That section in pertinent part states:

(a) No local governmental officer or employee shall, in the capacity of such an officer or employee, make or participate in the making of a contract with any person or business by which the officer or employee is employed or in whose business the officer or employee has a substantial interest.

(d) This section shall not apply to the following: (1) Contracts let after competitive bidding has been advertised for by published notice. . . .

In applying this language to your question, under subsection (d), so long as the Request for Qualifications was let after a competitive bid which was properly advertised, this situation would not be an actual violation of the local level conflict of interest laws; however, we would bring to your attention that members of the public might consider this situation to have the appearance of a conflict of interest. The commission does note that this opinion does not address the issue of what constitutes a "competitive bid" since that would require a review of statutes not under our jurisdiction. We suggest you contact the Attorney General's office for guidance on that particular issue.

## Opinion No. 1998-12

Written June 18, 1998, to Cynthia Lane, Kansas Department on Aging, Emporia.

This opinion is in response to your letter of June 16, 1998, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct concerning the state level conflict of interest laws (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*). We note at the outset that the commission's jurisdiction is limited to the application of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule and regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

**Factual Statement**

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as a staff member of the Kansas Department on Aging (KDOA). You advise us that your agency awards grants through contracts to Area Agencies on Aging (AAA) that apply for the grants. The AAA then provides in-home services to the elderly as dictated by state statute. According to the statutes that you provided with your opinion request (Kansas Senior Care Act, K.S.A. 75-5926 *et seq.*), only an AAA may receive such a grant, and the amount of the grant is established by law. In addition, the procedure for awarding of grants is also governed by that particular Act. You are concerned that since you participate in the making of these contracts you would be prohibited from terminating state employment and then accepting a job with an AAA until two years had passed.

**Question**

Is a member of the KDOA, who has participated in the making of a contract governed by state statute with an AAA, prohibited from terminating state employment and then accepting a position with the AAA?

**Opinion**

K.S.A. 46-233, as amended by the 1997 *Session Laws of Kansas*, Chapter 155, Sec. 2, in pertinent part states:

(a)(2) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, whenever any individual has participated as a state officer or employee in the making of any contract with any person or business, such individual shall not accept employment with such person or business as an employee, independent contractor or subcontractor until two years after performance of the contract is completed or until two years after the individual terminates employment as a state officer or employee, whichever is sooner.

(d) Subsections (a) and (b) shall not apply to the following: . . . (2) Contracts for property or services for which the price or rate is fixed by law.

Under subsection (a), state officers and employees are prohibited from participating in the making of a contract with a person or business and then terminating state employment and accepting a position with that person or business. However, subsection (d)(2) clearly states an exception for situations in which the price or rate of the contract is fixed by law.

Based on the information that you provided in your opinion request, it appears that the price or rate of the KDOA and AAA contracts are fixed by law. Therefore, the exception in subsection (d)(2) would apply. Thus, the

prohibition in subsection (a) would not apply, and you would not be prohibited from accepting employment with an AAA immediately upon termination of state employment.

#### Opinion No. 1998-13

Written June 18, 1998, to Evelyn McCormick, Coordinator, KS Case Mix Project, Kansas Department on Aging, Topeka.

This opinion is in response to your letter of June 12, 1998, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct concerning the state level conflict of interest laws (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*). We note at the outset that the commission's jurisdiction is limited to the application of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule and regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

#### Factual Statement

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as the coordinator for the KS Case Mix Project for the Department on Aging. You advise us that as part of your state duties you provide information to nursing homes to facilitate a transition from the current Medicare payment system to the new Medicare Prospective Payment System (PPS). The Case Mix Project will end on November 15, 1998. You also do some work with Medicaid programs that do not receive Medicare funding. You do not have any responsibilities for Medicare certification, state licensure, policies, procedures or reimbursements as the Medicare program is completely regulated by the federal government.

You further advise us that you have established a private business that would offer consulting services to nursing home facilities. Your consulting would only be on the Medicare program and not the Medicaid program. In addition, you will not market or consult with any Kansas nursing facilities until after the ending of the KS Case Mix Project on November 15, 1998. You will seek an additional opinion from this commission if a Kansas nursing home desires to hire you after that date.

#### Question

Is it a conflict of interest for you to provide consulting services to out-of-state nursing home facilities?

#### Opinion

We have reviewed the state level conflict of interest laws, and two sections may apply to your question. K.S.A. 46-235 in pertinent part states:

No state officer or employee shall accept compensation for performance of official duties, other than that to which such person is entitled for such performance. No person shall pay or offer to pay any state officer or employee any compensation for performance of official duties, except a state officer or employee performing official duties in making payments to state officers and employees. . . .

K.S.A. 46-233(a) in pertinent part states:

No state officer or employee shall in the capacity as such officer or employee be substantially involved in the preparation of or participate in the making of a contract with any person or business by which such officer or employee

is employed or in whose business such officer or employee or any member of such officer's or employee's immediate family has a substantial interest. . . .

In applying this language to your question, so long as it is not part of your official state duties to provide PPS information to out-of-state facilities, then K.S.A. 46-235 would not prohibit you from accepting compensation to provide consulting services to such out-of-state facilities. In addition, so long as you do not, in your capacity as a state employee, participate in the making of any contracts between the state and your private consulting business, or between the state and any of the out-of-state facilities, then K.S.A. 46-233 would not apply.

In closing, the commission notes that this opinion is limited to the question of your ability to provide consulting services to out-of-state nursing home facilities. As you mentioned in your request letter, if you desire to contract with in-state facilities in the future, you will need to seek a further opinion from the commission.

#### Opinion No. 1998-14

Written June 18, 1998, to the Honorable Janis Lee, Kansas State Senator, 36th District, Kensington.

This opinion is in response to your letter of June 1, 1998, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Commission on Governmental Standards and Conduct concerning the state level conflict of interest laws (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*). We note at the outset that the commission's jurisdiction is limited to the application of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory, or agency rule and regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

#### Factual Statement

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as a Kansas State Senator. You have been asked to deliver the keynote address at the annual meeting of Rural Telephone Service Co., Inc. regarding the history of the industry and what you foresaw in the future for the industry. You advise us that you spent more than twenty-five hours researching the history and future trends of the industry and then translating that information into a speech.

The company has offered you a \$500 honorarium as a token of appreciation for your participation at the meeting. Since you were aware that legislators are limited to accepting no more than \$200 without the approval of the commission, you are seeking this opinion before accepting the honorarium.

#### Question

Is it permissible for you to accept the \$500 honorarium for delivering the keynote presentation at the Rural Telephone Service Co., Inc. annual meeting?

#### Opinion

K.S.A. 46-237(f) applies to your question. That subsection states:

No state officer or employee shall accept any payment of honoraria for any speaking engagement except that a member of the state legislature or a part-time officer or employee of the executive branch of government shall be allowed to receive reimbursement in the preparation for



and the making of a presentation at a speaking engagement in an amount fixed by the Kansas commission on governmental standards and conduct prior to the acceptance of the speaking engagement. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the reimbursement of state officers and employees for reasonable expenses incurred in attending seminars, conferences and other speaking engagements.

In KCGSC Opinion No. 1997-51, the commission opined that the amount of honorarium that could be paid to a legislator for the preparation and presentation of materials at a speaking engagement would depend on the following factors: amount of preparation, complexity of issues, qualifications of the presenter and the extent of the presenter's participation in the event. The commission stated that it would "... presume a maximum of \$100

for preparation and a maximum of \$100 for presentation. . . ." Anyone seeking an additional amount "... shall request a waiver from the Commission."

Applying the factors outlined in KCGSC Opinion No. 1997-51 to the brief information you provided in your opinion request, the commission believes the monetary limits set out in that opinion should not be waived. Thus you could accept up to \$200 for delivering the keynote presentation.

In closing, the commission notes that since you are providing a bona fide speaking service at the meeting, the company could pay for all of your reasonable expenses.
