**Board of Cosmetology****Notice of Hearing on Proposed  
Administrative Regulations**

The Kansas State Board of Cosmetology will conduct a public hearing at 9 a.m. Monday, October 12, at the board office, 2708 N.W. Topeka Blvd., Topeka, to consider proposed amendments to regulation K.A.R. 69-11-1. The following is a summary of the substance of the proposed regulation and its anticipated economic impact.

**K.A.R. 69-11-1.** This regulation increases the fees for salons/clinics/facilities and individual licensure for cosmetologists, cosmetology technicians, manicurists, estheticians, electrologists, apprentices and instructors. Fees for temporary permits, schools, reciprocal licensure, and delinquent fees also are increased.

The economic impact of the amendment to this regulation is to individual licensees, salons/clinics/facilities, and schools. The increased fees may be reflected in consumer costs.

There is no economic impact to other state agencies. The revenue increase will allow the agency to update office technology and provide for resources to ensure quality services to the professions that the Kansas Board of Cosmetology regulates. Enhanced services also will directly affect the health and safety of the consuming public.

This regulation is not mandated by federal law.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rule and regulation. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Mary Lou Davis, Administrative Officer, Kansas State Board of Cosmetology, 2708 N.W. Topeka Blvd., Topeka, 66617. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulation during the hearing.

Any persons requiring accommodations under the Americans With Disabilities Act should give notice to the Kansas Board of Cosmetology at least 10 days prior to the hearing date by contacting Mary Lou Davis at (785) 296-3155.

**Governmental Ethics Commission**

**Opinion No. 1998-15**

Written July 16, 1998, to Karen Beckerman, Social and Rehabilitation Services, Emporia.

This opinion is in response to your letter of July 7, 1998, in which you request an advisory opinion from the Kansas Governmental Ethics Commission concerning the application of the governmental ethics laws (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*). We note at the outset that the commission's jurisdiction is limited to the application of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule and regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

**Factual Statement**

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as a social worker with the Emporia Social and Rehabilitation Services Office (SRS). You advise us that in your current position you are responsible for providing services to families working with child care providers. Services include completion of paperwork, site visits, child care training and complaint investigations. Prior to your employment with SRS, you presented Model Approach to Partnership in Parenting (MAPP) training to prospective foster/adoptive parents. You and your spouse are currently foster/adoptive parents. The Kaw Valley Center, a local foster care agency that contracts

with SRS, would like you to once again provide MAPP training in your capacity as a private citizen.

#### Question

Is it a conflict of interest for you, as a private citizen, to enter into a contract with an entity that contracts with and is licensed by your state agency?

#### Opinion

The state governmental ethics laws prohibit state officers and employees from contracting, on behalf of the state, with persons or businesses in which they hold a "substantial interest" (see K.S.A. 46-233 and K.S.A. 46-229), or from licensing, inspecting or regulating organizations in which they hold a "position" (see K.S.A. 46-286).

In your situation, the contract is not on behalf of the state, but is between yourself, as a private citizen, and the Kaw Valley Center. Thus, the situation you describe would not violate the ethics laws.

In closing, for the reasons outlined above, we do note that in your capacity as a state employee you should not participate in the making of any contracts between SRS and the Kaw Valley Center, nor should you license, inspect or regulate the center. In addition, under K.S.A. 46-238, you may not charge a fee which is substantially in excess of that which other persons in the same business or profession would charge in the ordinary course of business.

#### Opinion No. 1998-16

Written July 16, 1998, to Becky Crowl, Human Resource Professional, Kansas Department of Transportation, Topeka.

This opinion is in response to your letter of June 23, 1998, in which you request an advisory opinion from the Kansas Governmental Ethics Commission concerning the application of the governmental ethics laws (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*). We note at the outset that the commission's jurisdiction is limited to the application of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule and regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

#### Factual Statement

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as a Human Resource Professional with the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT). You advise us that for several years KDOT has scheduled mobile blood drives with the Kansas Blood Bank, which is now known as Kansas Blood Services. There is no contract with Kansas Blood Services, but your agency has never used any other organization for the drives. You recently learned that Kansas Blood Services is no longer a nonprofit organization.

#### Question

Is the use of Kansas Blood Services for KDOT mobile blood drives a problem now that it is a for-profit company?

#### Opinion

We have reviewed the governmental ethics laws (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*) in its entirety and there is not a

section of law that speaks to the question you raise. Therefore, under the laws administered by this commission, the situation you describe is not prohibited.

#### Opinion No. 1998-17

Written July 16, 1998, to Michael Haynes, Executive Director, Real Estate Appraisal Board, Topeka.

This opinion is in response to your letter of June 17, 1998, in which you request an advisory opinion from the Kansas Governmental Ethics Commission concerning the application of the governmental ethics laws (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*). We note at the outset that the commission's jurisdiction is limited to the application of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule and regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

#### Factual Statement

We understand you request this opinion in your capacity as the executive director of the Real Estate Appraisal Board (board). You advise us that the board has the statutory authority to approve or disapprove pre-licensing and continuing education courses and course instructors. Members of the board have been asked to be instructors for courses that have been approved.

#### Question

Is it a conflict of interest for the board members to be compensated for instructing the courses that the board approves?

#### Opinion

K.S.A. 46-233(a) applies to your question. That subsection in pertinent part states:

No state officer or employee shall in the capacity as such officer or employee be substantially involved in the preparation of or participate in the making of a contract with any person or business by which such officer or employee is employed or in whose business such officer or employee . . . has a substantial interest . . .

K.S.A. 46-229 provides that anyone who receives \$2,000 or more in compensation in a calendar year, or receives \$2,000 or more in fees or commissions in a calendar year from any entity, has a "substantial interest" in that entity (see K.S.A. 46-229 for other ways that a "substantial interest" is held). Therefore, under K.S.A. 46-233, if an entity wants to hire one of your board members to instruct an approved course, the board member would either not be able to receive more than \$2,000 from that entity during the year or would have to completely abstain from voting on, or urging the passage of, approval of the course.

In closing, the commission does want to note that even in situations where the board member would be paid less than \$2,000, voting to approve the course would raise an appearance of impropriety.

K.A.R. 28-36-30. Food service establishment fees. The proposed regulation increases the food service establishment license fee from \$70 to \$100, and the food service establishment license application fee from \$90 to \$100.

Under K.S.A. 36-503(b), the license fee and the application fee should not exceed \$100 each and shall be sufficient to defray the cost of administering the food service establishment inspection and licensing activities of the secretary.

The time period between publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing serves as the required public comment period of at least 60 days for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulation. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Steve Paige, Department of Health and Environment, Bureau of BEHS, Food and Drug Section, Suite 604, Mills Building, 109 S.W. 9th, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulation during the hearing. 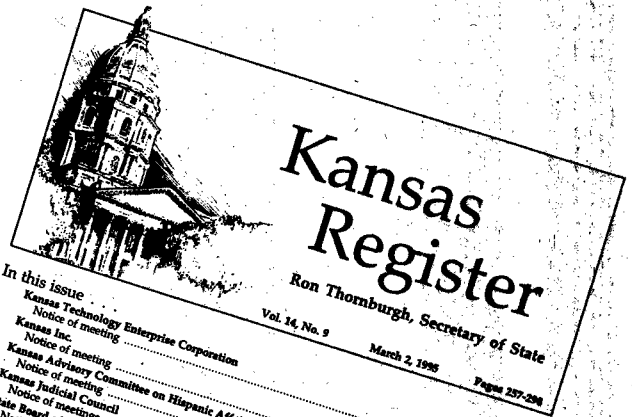
