## Executive Order No. 98-10

Establishing the Dwight David  
Eisenhower Commission

WHEREAS, Dwight David Eisenhower, raised in Kansas, was the Supreme Commander who led the Allied Expeditionary Forces to Victory in World War II; and

WHEREAS, General Eisenhower, whose home was Abilene, Kansas, served as President of the United States of America from 1953 to 1961; and

WHEREAS, during his distinguished career as General during World War II and later as President, Eisenhower significantly and positively influenced the course of history; and

WHEREAS, the recognition of Eisenhower's achievements can serve as inspiration to many, particularly to Kansans; and

WHEREAS, the State of Kansas desires to preserve and honor the achievements of Eisenhower and to keep his inspiration alive;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby estab-

lish the Dwight D. Eisenhower Commission. Members and a chairperson will be appointed by the Governor. The Commission will meet upon the call of the chairperson.

The Commission will review the life and career of Dwight D. Eisenhower and make recommendations to the Governor no later than March 1, 1999, on ways the State can honor and establish continuing tribute to Eisenhower. Annual recognition, public awareness campaigns, inclusion of recognition in education curricula, and enhancement of the Eisenhower Presidential Library and Museum in Abilene for education and tourism are among the topics to be considered by the Commission.

The provisions of Executive Order 98-10 shall expire on July 1, 1999.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 98-10 and shall become effective immediately.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed  
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Thursday, January 7, at the Clubhouse Inn, 924 S.W. Henderson Road, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed rules and regulations of the Kansas State Board of Pharmacy.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Larry Froelich, Executive Secretary, Room 513, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their view, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Karen Hollon at (785) 296-4056.

The regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A brief summary of the proposed regulations and economic impact follows.

**K.A.R. 68-2-22. Electronic prescription transmission.** The regulation outlines the requirements that are to be followed for a practitioner to transmit a prescription order to a pharmacy.

There is no anticipated economic impact on the Board of Pharmacy, other governmental agencies, registrants or the public.

**K.A.R. 68-11-1. Fees for examination and licensure as a pharmacist.** The regulation changes the amount of renewal fees charged for licensure as a pharmacist. The renewal fee is decreased from \$200 to \$150.

The agency will expect a decrease of \$80,000 in fees collected in FY 99 and yearly thereafter. A total of 3,162 active and inactive pharmacists licenses will be affected. Although the agency will experience a decrease in revenues, the expenses of the agency do not exceed amended revenues.

**K.A.R. 68-20-15a. Electronic prescription transmission of controlled substances.** The regulation is being revised only to update the existing language.

There is no anticipated economic impact on the Board of Pharmacy, other governmental agencies, registrants or the public.

**K.A.R. 68-20-17. Order forms.** The regulation is being revised only to update the existing language.

There is no anticipated economic impact on the Board of Pharmacy, other governmental agencies, registrants or the public.

**K.A.R. 68-20-19. Controlled substances listed in schedule II.** The regulation allows the prescriber seven days to deliver a schedule II controlled substance prescription, as opposed to what was 72 hours.

There is no anticipated economic impact on the Board of Pharmacy, other governmental agencies, registrants or the public.

## Executive Order No. 98-9

Establishing the Governor's  
Substance Abuse Prevention Council

WHEREAS, alcohol and drug abuse have a substantial impact on the state resulting from the loss of human resource potential and in increased health care costs, family violence, crime, truancy, and accidents in the work place and on Kansas roads; and

WHEREAS, a system of coordinated and comprehensive programs could be effective in reducing or preventing the losses and costs resulting from substance abuse;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby establish the Substance Abuse Prevention Council to be co-chaired by the Secretary of Social and Rehabilitation Services and the Commissioner of Juvenile Justice.

The mission of the council shall be to promote the development, implementation, maintenance, and evaluation of a coordinated interagency system in order to maximize resources and encourage partnerships, both public and private, for the purpose of eliminating the abuse of alcohol and drugs.

The council shall consist of agency heads of the departments of social and rehabilitation services, juvenile justice, corrections, health and environment, transportation, and other agencies as requested by the co-chairs. The Commissioner of Education and the Attorney General are also requested to serve on the committee.

State officers or agency heads may appoint an individual to represent them on the Council.

Executive Order 92-150 is hereby superseded by this Order and its force and effect are hereby rescinded.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 98-9 and shall become effective immediately.

Wastewater Control Facilities: Wastewater will be impounded for subsequent application to agricultural land for beneficial use. Wastewater storage capacity is provided which meets or exceeds KDHE minimum requirements.

Compliance Schedule: A livestock waste management plan for the facility shall be developed. The plan shall cover, but not be limited to, the following items: handling and disposal equipment for both solid and liquid wastes, land application practices used to protect against runoff and leaching, waste application rates based on crop nutrient utilization, and identification of adequate land areas for application of all wastes. Detailed guidance and requirements will be provided by the department. A plan shall be submitted to the department within six months following receipt of detailed requirements. The approved plan will become part of this permit.

This permit requires compliance with the applicable provisions of H.B. 2950, effective May 7, 1998. The permit further requires compliance with the applicable regulations adopted thereafter.

The existing lagoons will be required to achieve a permeability rate of 0.25 inches or less per day. A water permeability test must be conducted. This can be done by conducting in-place, saturated infiltration tests. Tests shall be performed at each end of the retention channel for the gestation lots and one test shall be performed in the lagoon for the enclosed facilities. The results of this testing must be sent to KDHE. Should the lagoons not meet the maximum allowable seepage rate, additional sealing will be required.

Wastewater Control Facilities: Wastewater will be impounded for subsequent application to agricultural land for beneficial use. Wastewater storage capacity is provided which meets or exceeds KDHE minimum requirements.

Compliance Schedule: 1) The livestock waste management plan developed by Central Plains Engineering and approved by this department shall be adhered to as a condition of this permit. The plan covers, but is not limited to, the following items: handling and disposal equipment for solid manure waste and land application practices used to protect against runoff and leaching, waste application rates based on crop nutrient utilization, and identification of adequate land areas for application of all wastes. The plan calls for nutrient analysis of waste and soils with applications to meet crop nutrient needs. Wastes shall be applied at not greater than 250 pounds of available nitrogen or 20 tons of dry solids per acre per year. If wastes are not analyzed for nutrient content, solids shall be applied at not greater than 8 tons per acre.

2) If the submitted nutrient utilization plan does not meet all subsequently adopted requirements of the Kansas Department of Agriculture administrative rules and regulations, amendment to the nutrient utilization plan will be required within 180 days after KDA adoption.

3) This permit requires compliance with the applicable provisions of H.B. 2950, effective May 7, 1998. The permit further requires compliance with the applicable regulations adopted thereafter.

4) The designer is responsible for providing KDHE with a final post construction inspection of the system to assure construction was

Article 1.—PRIVATE DETECTIVES AND AGENCIES

16-1-7. Fees. The following fees shall be charged:

- (a) Application forms and materials ..... \$15.00
- (b)(1) For an initial or renewal license, permit, or certificate that will be effective on and after January 1, 1999:
  - (A) Application for initial private detective agency license ..... \$10.00 per month for each month for which the license is issued
  - (B) Application for initial private detective license by an employee of a private detective agency or by an independent private detective ..... \$10.00 per month for each month for which the license is issued
  - (C) Application for initial private detective license by an officer, director, partner, or associate of private detective agency ..... \$4.00 per month for each month for which the license is issued
  - (D) Renewal of a private detective agency license ..... 175.00
  - (E) Renewal of private detective license by an employee of a private detective agency or by an independent private detective ..... 175.00
  - (F) Renewal of private detective license by an officer, director, partner, or associate of a private detective agency ..... 100.00
  - (G) Application for initial firearm permit ..... 50.00
  - (H) Renewal of firearm permit ..... 50.00
  - (I) Application for initial firearm trainer certificate ..... 100.00
  - (J) Renewal of firearm trainer certificate ..... 100.00

(2) To determine the applicable amount of a prorated fee for a license that is described in paragraph (b)(1)(A), (B) or (C) above, an applicant shall presume that a license will be issued three months from the date the application is submitted and will expire on December 31 of the year following the year in which the license is issued.

(c) Duplicate license ..... 5.00

(d) All fees shall be submitted by a personal check, money order, cashier's check, or certified check. (Authorized by and implementing L. 1998, ch. 183, sec. 14, K.S.A. 75-7b04, as amended by L. 1998, ch. 183, sec. 3, K.S.A. 75-7b05, as amended by L. 1998, ch. 183, sec. 4, K.S.A. 75-7b07, as amended by L. 1998, ch. 183, sec. 6, K.S.A. 75-7b17, as amended by L. 1998, ch. 183, sec. 12, and K.S.A. 75-7b21, as amended by L. 1998, ch. 183, sec. 13; effective Nov. 6, 1998.)

Article 2.—DEFINITIONS

16-2-1. (Authorized by K.S.A. 75-7b18; implementing K.S.A. 75-7b01; effective May 1, 1982; amended April 12, 1996; revoked Nov. 6, 1998.)

16-2-1a. Definitions. (a) "Associates" means persons who share ownership of a private detective agency that is not incorporated or established as a legal partnership.

(b) "Capper" or "runner" means a person acting on behalf of an attorney who coordinates a staged automobile accident or acts as a decoy or lure for the purpose of swindling or any other fraudulent purpose.

(c) "Firearms trainer" means a person certified by the the attorney general to train private detective applicants for a firearm permit in the handling of firearms and the lawful use of force.

(d) "Independent private detective" means a person who engages in detective business but who is not employed by a licensed private detective agency and who does not regularly employ any other person to engage in detective business.

(e) "License" means a certificate and card, issued by the attorney general upon proper application, testing, and approval, authorizing a person to engage in Kansas in detective business as a private detective or private detective agency.

(f)(1) "Special commission" means any type of identification issued by a law enforcement agency or law enforcement officer that grants any temporary or permanent law enforcement authority, including any of the following:

- (A) Deputy;
- (B) special deputy;
- (C) special assistant;
- (D) reserve officer; or
- (E) special officer.

(2) A special commission shall not include a commission issued by a law enforcement agency that identifies the holder as a private detective or private security officer, or as a retired or honorary law enforcement officer, but that does not grant any law enforcement authority. (Authorized by K.S.A. 75-7b18; implementing K.S.A. 75-7b01, as amended by L. 1998, ch. 183, sec. 1; effective Nov. 6, 1998.)

Article 3.—APPLICATIONS FOR PRIVATE DETECTIVE LICENSE

16-3-1. Procedure. (a) An applicant for a private detective license or a private detective agency license shall be required to appear at a time and location designated by the attorney general for a written examination and oral interview.

(b) An applicant who fails to pass the written examination may retake the examination two times at a scheduled examination date.

(1) The first reexamination shall occur within 30 days after notice of the results of the original exam is provided to the applicant.

(2) A second reexamination shall occur within 30 days after notice of the results of the first reexamination is provided to the applicant.

(3) An applicant who does not successfully pass the examination after three attempts shall be denied a license to engage in detective business.

(c) An applicant denied a license as a private detective or detective agency for failure to pass the written examination within three attempts shall not make application under the provisions of the Kansas private detective licensing act within 12 months following the denial of the license.

(d) The certificates of reference submitted by an applicant for a private detective license or a private detective agency license shall be dated within four months of the date the application is received by the attorney general.

(e) An applicant for a private detective license or a private detective agency license shall provide information concerning discharge from the United States military service in relation to the applicant and any officer, director, partner, or associate of the applicant.

(f) An applicant for a private detective license or a private detective agency license shall submit two classifiable sets of the applicant's right- and left-hand fingerprints on forms provided by the attorney general. The applicant shall have fingerprints taken by an officer or employee of a law enforcement agency. The name of the law enforcement agency and the name of the person taking the fingerprints shall be clearly identified on the form. (Authorized by K.S.A. 75-7b18; implementing K.S.A. 75-7b04, as amended by L. 1998, ch. 183, sec. 3, and K.S.A. 75-7b20; effective May 1, 1982; amended Feb. 13, 1995; amended Nov. 6, 1998.)

#### Article 5.—FIREARM TRAINERS

**16-5-1. Individuals deemed personally qualified and knowledgeable.** (a) An applicant for a firearm trainer certificate shall be considered personally qualified to train private detectives in the handling of firearms upon successful completion of approved firearms training meeting either of these criteria:

(1) Within two years before application for a firearm trainer certificate; or

(2) within five years before application for a firearm trainer certificate if the applicant has also had subsequent experience training persons in the handling of firearms within two years before application.

(b) Training shall be approved if the applicant for a firearm trainer certificate successfully completed a minimum of 40 clock hours of education and training through any combination of law enforcement, military, or private firearm courses that included education and training in the following:

- (1) Firearms fundamentals and safety;
- (2) marksmanship fundamentals and safety procedures;
- (3) instruction in daylight, dim light, and darkness shooting;
- (4) care, cleaning and maintenance of firearms;
- (5) instruction in basic firearms retention and disarming techniques;
- (6) shooting proficiency demonstrated with a firearm; and
- (7) teaching or instructing abilities.

(c) An applicant for a firearm trainer certificate shall provide verification of the successful completion of approved firearm training by providing the following:

- (1) A copy of the original certificate of completion of the course or courses; and
- (2) a copy of the training course agenda, a statement from the course instructor or instructors, or an affidavit from the applicant that verifies the education and training requirements.

(d) An applicant for a firearm trainer certificate shall be considered personally qualified to train private detectives in the lawful use of force upon verification of successful completion of 10 clock hours of formal classroom or course instruction on the lawful use of force.

(e) In order to establish that an applicant for a firearm trainer certificate is a person of good character and reputation, an applicant shall meet either of these requirements:

(1) Be licensed as a private detective; or

(2) (A) Provide affidavits from five or more reputable citizens who have known the applicant for a period of at least five years and who are not related to the applicant by blood or marriage, attesting that the applicant is a person of good moral character and reputation; and

(B) provide two classifiable sets of the applicant's right- and left-hand fingerprints on forms provided by the attorney general, one of which shall be submitted to the Kansas bureau of investigation and one of which shall be submitted to the federal bureau of investigation for a fingerprint check to determine any criminal history of the applicant. The applicant shall have fingerprints taken by an officer or employee of a law enforcement agency. The name of the law enforcement agency and the name of the person taking the fingerprints shall be clearly identified on the form. #### Article 6.—FIREARM PERMITS

**16-6-1. Training in the handling of firearms.** (a) A firearm permit shall not be granted unless, within six months before submission of the application for the permit, the applicant has satisfactorily completed training in the handling of firearms and the lawful use of force from a certified firearms trainer who is other than the applicant.

(b) A firearm permit shall not be renewed unless, within each of the two calendar years before submission of the application for renewal of the permit, the applicant has satisfactorily completed training in the handling of firearms and the lawful use of force from a certified firearms trainer who is other than the applicant.

(c) Firearm permits shall be granted only for the firearm or firearms for which the applicant has satisfactorily completed a course of fire from a firearms trainer as specified in K.A.R. 16-5-4(a)(5)(C).

(d) The holder of a firearm permit shall notify the attorney general through the Kansas bureau of investigation within 72 hours of any change of or additional firearm that the permit holder intends to carry. The permit holder shall qualify with this firearm by successfully completing a course of fire as specified in K.A.R. 16-5-4(a)(5)(C) within 30 days of changing or adding a firearm. **16-6-3. Firearm permit badge.** A private detective who holds a firearm permit may obtain a firearm permit badge and a badge holder upon written request to the attorney general through the Kansas bureau of investigation and upon payment to the attorney general through the Kansas bureau of investigation for reimbursement of

United States Constitution—Article IV, States' Relations—Section 2, Citizenship; Privileges and Immunities; Residency Requirement for Pawnbrokers and Precious Metal Dealers. Representative Doug Mays, 54th District, Topeka, September 15, 1998.

The pursuit of a "common calling," the right to practice one's chosen profession, is a fundamental privilege protected by Article IV, Section 2 of the United States Constitution, commonly referred to as the Privileges and Immunities Clause. The ability to engage in business as a pawnbroker or precious metal dealer is as much a "common calling" as any other occupation or profession and is thus a protected privilege under the clause. In the absence of any known substantial rationale to justify Kansas residency for persons who wish to engage in business as a pawnbroker or precious metal dealer, the Kansas statutory provisions that establish such a requirement are found to violate Article IV, Section 2 of the United States Constitution. **Residents of Kansas. Representative David Adkins, 28th District, Leawood, September 15, 1998.**

A district court may decline jurisdiction in an agency adoption only if three conditions exist: (1) the basis for venue is location of the agency, (2) the petitioner does not reside in Kansas; and (3) the child did not reside in Kansas prior to receipt of custody by the agency. If all of these conditions exist, the court may decline to exercise its jurisdiction after weighing the factors listed in K.S.A. 59-2127. Discretion to decline jurisdiction under K.S.A. 59-2127 is not available if venue is based on location of the agency and either the petitioner resides in Kansas or the child resided in Kansas prior to receipt of custody by the agency. A series of meetings or communications between members of a public body, each of which may involve less than a majority of a quorum of a public body, but collectively totaling a majority of a quorum, the purpose of which is to discuss a common topic of the business or affairs of that body so that the views of the members are exchanged in an interactive dialogue, constitutes a meeting for purposes of the Kansas Open Meetings Act. The communications need not be direct for the act to apply, but must be at the direction or behest of the members of the body. Whether a series of communications is a violation of the act is very fact specific, and each situation must be decided on its facts. Cited herein: K.S.A. 75-4317; 75-4317a; 75-4318. SP

**Public Health—Regulation of Dentists and Dental Hygienists—Act Inapplicable to Certain Practices, Acts and Operations; Definitions; Authorized Practice of Unlicensed Dental Assistants. Representative Kent Glascock, 62nd District, Manhattan, Senator Lana Oleen, 22nd District, Manhattan, September 17, 1998.**

1998 House Bill No. 2724 (L. 1998, Ch. 141, § 1,) amends K.S.A. 1997 Supp. 65-1423(h)(5), dealing with the requirements that must be met before coronal scaling and coronal polishing may be performed by an unlicensed individual. The anatomical and procedural terms used in the

statute, such as coronal polish and coronal scale, may be defined by the Kansas Dental Board; through rules and regulations. The statute provides two exceptions to the prohibition against an unlicensed person performing any part of a prophylaxis: under the direct supervision of a dentist, an unlicensed person may coronal polish teeth, as defined by the Kansas Dental Board; and under the direct supervision of a dentist, an unlicensed person may coronal scale teeth above the gum line if the person meets the requisite training and experience approved by the Kansas Dental Board, the procedure is performed before July 1, 2001, and the patient is not under general or local anesthesia. The statute does not require dental assistants (or any other unlicensed individual) to obtain licensure; however, dental assistants are subject to the prohibitions and requirements of K.S.A. 1997 Supp. 65-1423, as amended, and in that sense are regulated by the Kansas Dental Board, the agency charged with the statute's enforcement. **Public Records, Documents and Information—Records Open to Public—Lists of Names and Addresses Derived From Public Records; Prohibited Uses. Robert J. Watson, Overland Park City Attorney, Overland Park, October 5, 1998.**

Pursuant to K.S.A. 21-3914, not all commercial use of public records is prohibited. The statute is violated only if the requestor intends to use the names and addresses in the records to contact those persons and solicit a sale. The term "person," for purposes of K.S.A. 21-3914, includes businesses. The Kansas Open Records Act does not require provision of records based upon a standing request or prospective request for documents not yet in existence. A request that is unreasonably burdensome need not be honored, but the public agency must cooperate with the requestor to provide access and copies, if possible. A real estate broker is prohibited from offering or giving anything of value, other than the broker's services as a broker, that is contingent upon an agency agreement with a client or the sale, purchase or lease of real estate. In the errors and omissions insurance program described, a real estate broker would be offering a seller-client some-

thing of value, other than services as a broker, that is contingent upon an agency agreement. Thus, a real estate broker who participated in the AHS program as described would be in violation of K.S.A. 1997 Supp. 58-3062(a)(11). 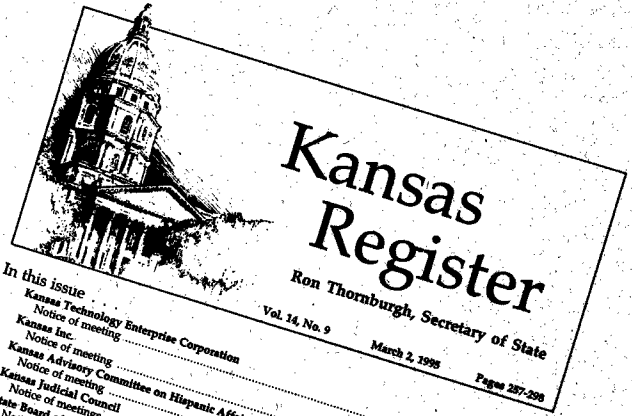
