The Office of the Kansas Attorney General, acting pursuant to 1998 Senate Substitute for House Bill 2895, § 50 (1998 Kan. Sess. Laws 202 § 50), is soliciting offers from attorneys to act as counsel in the Kansas Tobacco Cases (*State of Kansas v. R.J. Reynolds Tobacco Company, et al.*, Shawnee County Case No. 96-CV-919; and *State of Kansas v. Brooke Group, Ltd., et al.*, Kansas Supreme Court Case No. 97-80451-AS). This litigation is complex and may require a large expenditure of time and money. Expenses will need to be advanced by counsel and recoupment of the same will be contingent on securing money from either a judgment from the defendants, settlement of the cases or the approval of the Kansas Legislature's Joint Committee on Special Claims Against the State with a subsequent appropriation.

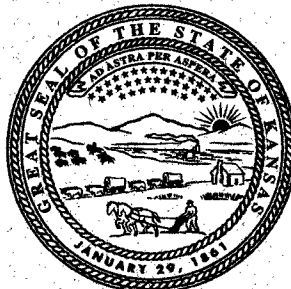

Notice to Consulting Engineers

The Kansas Department of Transportation is seeking qualified consulting engineering firms for the projects listed below. Responses must be received by 5 p.m. November 24 for the consulting engineering firm to be considered. Seven signed copies of the response should be mailed to Neil Rusch, P.E., Assistant to the Director, Division of Engineering and Design, KDOT, Room 1084-West, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, 66612-1568. Responses shall be limited to four pages.

From the firms expressing interest, the Consultant Selection Committee will select a list of the most highly qualified (not less than three, not more than five) and invite them to attend an individual interview conference. At this time, the consulting firms can more thoroughly discuss their experience related to the type of project at hand and will be expected to discuss, in some detail, their approach to this project and the personnel to be assigned to the project. Firms not selected to be short listed will be notified by letter.

The Consultant Negotiating Committee, appointed by the Secretary of Transportation, will conduct the discussions with the firms invited to the individual interview conferences. The committee will select the firm to perform the professional services required for completing the advertised project. After the selection of this firm, the remaining firms will be notified by letter of the outcome.

Project No. 160-13 K-7334-01

Clark County

The scope of services is to provide for the replacement of Johnson Creek bridge (002), 1.6 km east of the Meade-Clark county line. The project is scheduled for plan completion in September 2001, and the estimated construction cost is \$873,000.

Project No. 14-27 K-7343-01

Ellsworth County

The scope of services is to provide for the replacement of Oxide Creek bridge (036), 20.7 km north of the Rice-Ellsworth county line. The project is scheduled for plan completion in November 2002, and the estimated construction cost is \$778,000.

Project No. 281-84 K-7337-01

Russell County

The scope of services is to provide for the replacement of Landon Creek bridge (036) and Smoky Hill River bridge (037), 8.4 km and 9.0 km north of the Barton-Russell county line. The project is scheduled for plan completion in September 2001, and the estimated construction cost is \$2,275,000.

Project No. 106 K-7354-02

Statewide

The scope of services is to provide a report that evaluates and recommends changes to the inventory data for highway/railroad crossings and the existing Design Hazard Rating Formula used by the Kansas Department of Transportation. The second phase of the project is an on-site re-inventory of the data required to implement the recommendations from the report. There are approximately 7,200 public at-grade crossings in Kansas. The study is scheduled to be completed by December 31, 1999, and the inventory is scheduled to be completed by June 30, 2001.

Project No. 106 K-7356-01

Statewide

The scope of services is to provide for the underwater bridge inspection, reports and sketches of the structural integrity of 21 bridges on the Missouri River and the Kansas River, using nondestructive or minimally-destructive test methods in conformance with the Federal Highway Administration Report No. FHWA-DP-80-1 entitled "Underwater Inspection of Bridges," dated November 1989. The underwater inspections shall not be performed until the fall of 2000 and the final reports shall be completed by July 2001.

It is KDOT's policy to use the following criteria as the basis for selection of the consulting engineering firms:

1. Size and professional qualifications;
2. Experience of staff;
3. Location of firm with respect to proposed project;
4. Work load of firm; and
5. Firm's performance record.

The written request must be submitted to Connie Carreno, Bureau of Air and Radiation, not later than the close of business December 7 in order for the Secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The United States Environmental Protection Agency has 45 days after receipt of the proposed Class I operating permit within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA within 60 days after the expiration of the 45-day review period to review the permit. Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period.

Regulations****Article 39.—OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE
HEARINGS**

1-39-1. Definitions. (a) As used in this article, the words and phrases defined by K.S.A. 77-502 and amendments thereto shall have the meanings ascribed to them in that statute.

(b) The following terms shall be defined as follows.

(1) "Office" means the office of administrative hearings within the department of administration.

(2) "Director" means the director of the office of administrative hearings.

(3) "KAPA" means the Kansas administrative procedure act, K.S.A. 77-501 et seq. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 75-37,121; effective Nov. 20, 1998.)

1-39-2. Administrative law judges. The provisions of articles 1 through 14 of the regulations of the secretary of administration shall apply in their entirety to each administrative law judge of the office and shall control the following:

(a) The qualifications for administrative law judges;

(b) the procedures by which candidates for an administrative law judge position will be considered for employment;

(c) the manner in which public notice of vacancies will be given; and

(d) the standards and procedures for the evaluation, training, promotion, and discipline of administrative law judges. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 75-37,121; effective Nov. 20, 1998.)

1-39-3. Assignment of administrative law judges.

(a) Any state agency head or a designee may request that

the director assign an administrative law judge to act as the presiding officer in an administrative hearing that is neither subject to KAPA nor listed in K.S.A. 77-551 and for which the agency head is responsible. The request may be made in writing, by telephone, or by electronic transmission.

(b) Upon receiving a request for assignment of an administrative law judge, an administrative law judge of the office shall be assigned by the director, unless the director determines that the existing caseloads of the administrative law judges would prevent the office from providing a timely hearing or unless there is a conflict that would subject the administrative law judges to disqualification. In making an assignment, the relative experience, caseloads, and expertise of the office's administrative law judges, as well as potential conflicts, time frames, and other relevant resources and factors, may be considered by the director.

(c) After the assignment of an administrative law judge, the requesting state agency shall forward to the director written documentation of the basis for the administrative hearing, which may include any of the following materials:

(1) A request for an administrative hearing;

(2) a petition for a hearing from a party to the state agency proceedings;

(3) the order that is the subject of the request for a hearing; or

(4) other documentation of the event or action that forms the basis for the administrative hearing under applicable law. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 75-37,121; effective Nov. 20, 1998.)

1-39-4. Conduct of proceedings. (a)(1) Each administrative hearing to which an administrative law judge is assigned under K.S.A. 75-37,121(b) shall be conducted in accordance with KAPA, except to the extent that other applicable statutes or regulations provide otherwise.

(2) Each hearing to which an administrative law judge is assigned under K.S.A. 75-37,121(d) shall be conducted in accordance with any applicable statutes, regulations, ordinances, or other law.

(b) All parties to the state agency proceedings may be required by the administrative law judge or the director to submit motions, objections, briefs, and other pleadings in a format established by the director and with the number of copies prescribed by the director.

(c)(1) When an administrative law judge is assigned to a hearing under K.S.A. 75-37,121(b), the order issued by the administrative law judge shall contain the elements required under KAPA or other applicable statute or regulation.

(2) When an administrative law judge is assigned to a hearing under K.S.A. 75-37,121(d), the order issued by the administrative law judge shall contain the elements required under any applicable statutes, regulations, ordinances, or other law.

(3) Each order issued by an administrative law judge of the office shall be in a format approved by the director. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 75-37,121; effective Nov. 20, 1998.)
