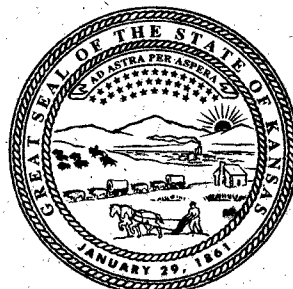

Notice of Nomination Deadline for Governor's Arts Awards

The Kansas Arts Commission is accepting nominations for the 1999 Governor's Arts Awards until 5 p.m. Monday, May 3. Mailed nominations should bear a U.S. Postal Service postmark that is no later than the deadline date. Metered mail is not acceptable as a postmark. Hand-delivered nominations, or nominations that are delivered by express mail or overnight delivery, will not be accepted after 5 p.m. May 3.

Any Kansas citizen or organization may submit a documented nomination in one of six categories: Individual Artist, Arts Organization, Art Educator, Arts Advocate, Individual Patron, or Patron Organization. Individual artists may be in the visual, performing, literary, folk or media arts.

Nominees must be Kansas citizens or Kansas-based organizations with records of outstanding contributions to the excellence, growth and support or availability of the arts in Kansas. Prior honorees, current members of the commission or its staff, and art projects or programs are not eligible.

Award recipients will be selected from the eligible nominees by a panel including members of the Kansas Arts Commission, a representative of the Governor, and representatives from various arts disciplines and organizations. The honorees chosen will be recognized during a public ceremony in October.

All original nominations must be submitted on the official form. Handwritten nominations will not be considered. If more than one nomination is received for the same person or organization, only the first one received will be accepted.

All support materials—including but not limited to photographs, slides, video tapes, audio tapes, letters, clippings, manuscripts or publications—become the property of the commission and will not be returned.

The Kansas Department of Transportation is seeking qualified consulting engineering firms for the projects listed below. Responses must be received by 5 p.m. February 17 for the consulting engineering firm to be considered. From the firms expressing interest, the Consultant Selection Committee will select a list of the most highly qualified (not less than three, not more than five) and invite them to attend an individual interview conference. At this time, the consulting firms can more thoroughly discuss their experience related to the type of project at hand and will be expected to discuss, in some detail, their approach to this project and the personnel to be assigned to the project. Firms not selected to be short listed will be notified by letter.

The Consultant Negotiating Committee, appointed by the Secretary of Transportation, will conduct the discussions with the firms invited to the individual interview conferences. The committee will select the firm to perform the professional services required for completing the advertised project. The scope of improvement is to provide for the replacement of Johnson Creek Bridge (023), Black Vermillion River Bridge (026), Little Timber Creek Bridge (027), and Oikierman Creek Bridge (028) on K-9, and the replacement of Clear Creek Bridge (034) on K-99. Project No. 9-58 K-7427-01 is scheduled for plan completion in fiscal year 2005, and the construction estimate is \$2,702,000. Project No. 99-58 K-7390-01 is scheduled for plan completion in fiscal year 2004, and the estimated construction cost is \$984,000.

Franklin County

The scope of improvement is to provide for the reconstruction of I-35 from 0.3 mile north of K-68, northeast 7.3 miles. The project was field-checked by KDOT in August 1997. All bridge plans will be completed by KDOT. KDOT Traffic Engineering will do the signing, traffic control, pavement marking and lighting plans. The road plans are 75 percent complete. The consultant will be required to review the existing plans and complete any remaining

work. The plans *must* be completed by January 2000. The estimated construction cost is \$23,477,000.

1. Size and professional qualifications;
2. Experience of staff;
3. Location of firm with respect to proposed project;

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Environment, Bureau of Air and Radiation, will conduct a public hearing at 10:30 a.m. Friday, April 16, in the KDHE main conference room, Building 283, Forbes Field, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed amendments to existing emergency planning and right-to-know regulations K.A.R. 28-65-1, K.A.R. 28-65-2 and K.A.R. 28-65-3. K.A.R. 28-65-1 establishes the general provisions for the state to implement the federal emergency planning and community right-to-know program in Kansas. K.A.R. 28-65-2 establishes the definitions used for implementing the federal Tier II reporting requirements in Kansas. K.A.R. 28-65-3 establishes the notification and reporting requirements for facilities subject to the federal act. A summary of the proposed amendments follows.

K.A.R. 28-65-1 and K.A.R. 28-65-2 adopt the federal emergency planning and community right-to-know act (EPCRA) requirements contained in 40 C.F.R. Parts 350, 355, 370 and 372. These regulations were last amended in November 22, 1993, and November 28, 1994, respectively. The federal U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has amended these sections since these regulations were last updated. The proposed amendments change the date of adoption by reference for the federal regulations to July 1, 1998.

K.A.R. 28-65-2 and K.A.R. 28-65-3 are being amended to allow facilities to file their Kansas Tier II reports by electronic submission or by submittal of the written form. The current regulation only provides for submittal of a written Tier II report. These amendments will simplify and streamline the reporting process. Facilities located in Kansas are already subject to these provisions, when applicable. The state adoption does not change the substantive requirements to which these sources are subject. No additional economic impact is expected upon the the regulated community, the public or the agency from these amendments.

The time period between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulatory action. All interested parties may submit comments prior to the hearing to Scott Bangert, Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Bureau of Air and Radiation, Building 283, Forbes Field, Topeka, 66620. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the proposed regulatory action during the hearings. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to require each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Article 20.—PET SHOPS

9-20-4. Prohibiting the sale or gift of certain animals. (a) A pet shop shall not sell any reptiles, offer any reptiles for sale, or offer any reptiles as a gift or promotional consideration unless a notice regarding safe reptile-handling practices and meeting the requirements of subsection (b) is prominently posted or displayed at each location in the pet shop where the reptiles are displayed, housed, or held.

(b) Each notice regarding safe reptile-handling practices shall be one of the following: a notice provided at no charge by the animal health department upon the request of any pet shop, any notice created by the centers for disease control and prevention, or a notice that meets the following standards:

(1) The dimensions of each notice shall be a minimum of 8.5 inches by 11 inches and shall use one or more typefaces or fonts that are clearly visible and readily draw attention to the notice.

(2) At a minimum, the notice shall contain the following statements:

(A) "As with many other animals, reptiles carry salmonella bacteria, which can make people sick. To reduce the chance of infection, follow these safe reptile-handling steps."

(B) "Always wash your hands thoroughly after you handle your pet reptile, its food, and anything it has touched."

(C) "Keep your pet reptile and its equipment out of the kitchen or any area where food is prepared."

(D) "Don't nuzzle or kiss your pet reptile."

(E) "Keep reptiles out of homes where there are children under one year of age or people with weakened immune systems. Children under five should handle reptiles only with adult or parental guidance. And they should always remember to wash their hands afterwards."

(c) A pet shop shall not possess, sell, offer for sale, or offer as a gift or promotional consideration any skunk, raccoon, fox, or coyote. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 47-1712; implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 47-1713; effective Feb. 11, 1999.)

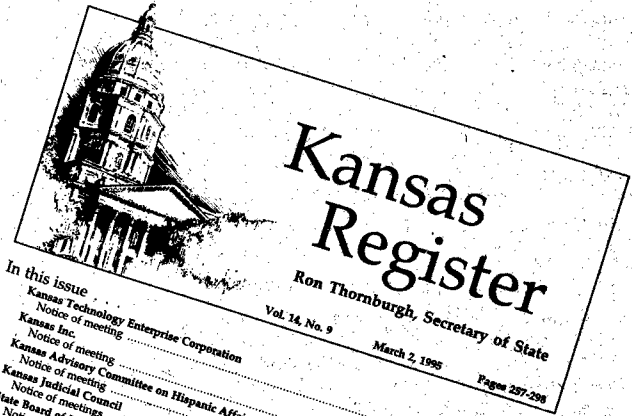
