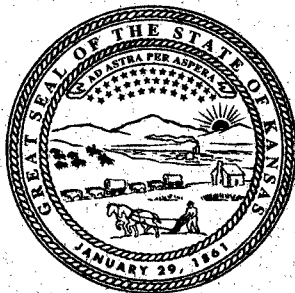

HB 2533, An act making and concerning appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2000, for the department of health and environment; relating to an infant and toddler day care loan program; authorizing certain transfers and imposing certain restrictions and limitations, and directing or authorizing certain receipts and disbursements and acts incidental to the foregoing, by Committee on Appropriations.

HB 2540, An act concerning firearms, ammunition and firearms dealers; relating to the limitation on certain civil actions relating thereto, by Committee on Federal and State Affairs.

HB 2541, An act concerning certain crimes; relating to criminal use of weapons; amending K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 21-4201 and repealing the existing section, by Committee on Federal and State Affairs.

HB 2542, An act concerning underground storage of natural gas; amending K.S.A. 55-1201, 55-1204, 55-1205 and 55-1210 and repealing the existing sections, by Committee on Federal and State Affairs.

Notice of Hearings on Proposed Administrative Regulations

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Environment, Bureau of Water, will conduct a series of three public hearings to consider the proposed revisions to the Kansas surface water quality standards K.A.R. 28-16-28b through K.A.R. 28-16-28f, including revisions to the Kansas surface water register. The first hearing will be at 6:30 p.m. May 11 at Fort Hays State University, Memorial Union Black and Gold Room, Hays. A second hearing will be at 7 p.m. May 12 at the Wichita City Council Chambers, 455 N. Main, Wichita. The final hearing will be at 7 p.m. May 13 at the Kansas Technology Enterprise Corporation offices, 214 S.W. 6th Ave., Suite 100, Topeka.

K.A.R. 28-16-28b is the definition section for the surface water quality standards. Six new definitions have been added, several definitions have been modified for clarification, and the section has been reorganized to maintain alphabetization.

K.A.R. 28-16-28c is the general provisions section of the surface water quality standards. The scheme of classification for surface waters has been changed. Waters can now be classified as outstanding national resource waters, exceptional state waters or general purpose waters. Provisions have been added for alternate mixing zones and alternate low flows. The exclusion of the fecal coliform bacteria criteria during high flow conditions has been changed.

K.A.R. 28-16-28d is the designated uses and classification section of the water quality standards. Some of the definitions in the section have been modified for clarification. The designated uses for recreation have been renamed from "contact" and "non-contact" recreation to "primary" and "secondary" contact recreation to alleviate confusion.

K.A.R. 28-16-28e is the surface water quality criteria section of the water quality standards. The criteria for the following pollutants have been changed: arsenic, atrazine, ammonia, chloride and fecal coliform bacteria. Ten criteria have been changed to adopt federal criteria developed under the National Toxics Rule. Several other criteria in Table 1a reflect where EPA has promulgated criteria for Kansas. Provisions also have been added to recognize that naturally occurring concentrations of some elements may exceed water quality criteria.

K.A.R. 28-16-28f is the administration of surface water quality standards section. Two provisions concerning solid waste have been removed because they are not appropriate for water quality standards and are addressed in the Kansas hazardous and solid waste regulations.

The financial costs associated with the proposed regulations will primarily impact municipalities and industries in the state. The two areas where the greatest economic impact will be experienced are related to revisions made to the ammonia and atrazine criteria. The proposed revisions to the ammonia criteria may result in upgrade and enhanced treatment costs to municipalities and industries. However, these costs are not significantly different than the costs estimated for those same facilities to meet with existing ammonia criteria. Additionally, proposed changes to the implementation of ammonia criteria should mitigate some of those costs. The proposed criteria for atrazine may result in an economic benefit to Kansas agriculture. Some entities believe the existing criteria would restrict the use of atrazine on Kansas crops. The proposed criteria should allow the use of atrazine on Kansas crops, thus reducing the expenditures associated with alternate, more costly weed control methods. The proposed revisions to the regulations have no financial effect on other government agencies. Environmental benefit will be provided to those surface waters classified as outstanding national resource waters. Surface waters in this classification will be afforded the highest level of protection given to waters of the state.

The time period between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a 60-day public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulatory action. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Steve M. Swaffar, Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Bureau of Water, Building 283, Forbes Field, Topeka, 66620. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the proposed regulatory action during the hearings, as well as to submit their written comments at that time. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to require each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

**Article 2.—QUALIFICATIONS CRITERIA—
RESIDENTIAL REAL ESTATE APPRAISER
CLASSIFICATION**

117-2-1. Licensed classification; education requirements. (a) In order to sit for the licensed classification examination, each applicant shall meet these requirements:

(1) Have received credit for 90 classroom hours in subjects related to real estate appraisal, which shall include the successful completion of a board-approved uniform standards of professional appraisal practice course within the two-year period immediately preceding the application date;

(2) have successfully completed an examination pertinent to each course for which credit is received;

(3) provide evidence, satisfactory to the board, of completion of courses approved by the board or provide evidence, satisfactory to the board, that the education covered all of the following topics with a particular emphasis on the appraisal of one- to four-unit residential properties:

- (A) Influences on real estate values;
- (B) legal considerations in appraisal;
- (C) types of value;
- (D) economic principles;
- (E) real estate markets and analysis;
- (F) valuation process;
- (G) property description;
- (H) highest and best use analysis;
- (I) appraisal statistical concepts;
- (J) site value;
- (K) sales comparison approach;
- (L) cost approach;
- (M) income approach, including gross rent multiplier analysis, estimation of income and expenses, and operating expense ratios;

(N) valuation of partial interests; and

(O) appraisal standards and ethics; and

(4) provide evidence satisfactory to the board that all courses taken after July 1, 1997 were taught by a licensed or certified appraiser or an instructor holding a degree in education employed by the college or university. At the

time the course was taken, it shall have been approved by the board.

(b) For courses other than the uniform standards of professional appraisal practice, the education may have been obtained at any time before submission of an application for license to the board.

(c) The length of each course shall have been at least 15 classroom hours.

(d) Correspondence courses may be approved to meet the classroom hour requirement if the course has received approval for college credit from the American council on education's program on non-collegiate sponsored instruction or if these conditions are met:

(1) The course is presented by an accredited college or university offering correspondence programs in other disciplines.

(2) The applicant successfully completes a written examination administered by an official approved by the college or university.

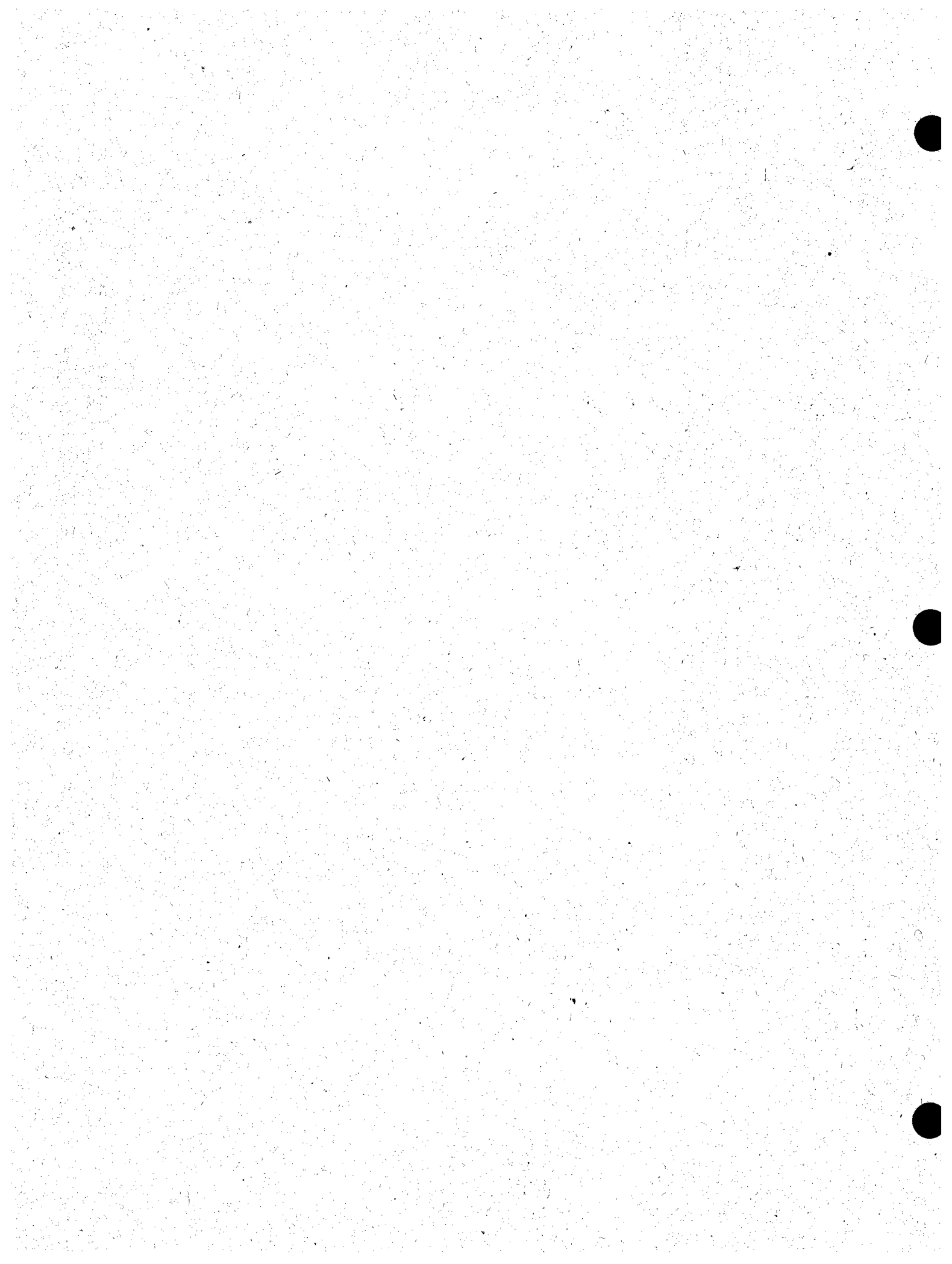

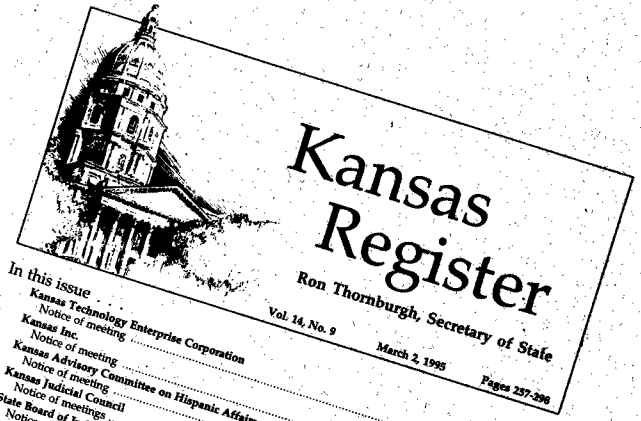
