The Dispute Resolution Fund (DRF) was created to fund grants to carry out the Dispute Resolution Act and to promote, encourage and facilitate dispute resolution services that are appropriate, affordable and accessible to all Kansas citizens. The mini-grant component of the DRF was created to allow Supreme Court-approved individual mediators or representatives of mediation programs to request funds to attend training sessions, contract with trainers or continuing mediation education presenters, allow approved mediators and programs to publish alternative dispute resolution materials, and help with one-time expenses.

For fiscal year July 1, 1999 through June 30, 2000, the judicial administrator and dispute resolution coordinator will award grants totaling not more than \$18,000. The due dates for grant proposals for fiscal year 2000 are July 15, 1999; October 15, 1999; and January 15, 2000. Recipients may not receive actual awards for up to three months.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has prepared a draft Kansas water pollution control permit and authorization to discharge under the national pollutant discharge elimination system (NPDES). The draft permit is designated by Kansas Permit No. I-AR06-PO06 and Federal Permit No. KS0094706. The draft water pollution control permit is for a proposed wastewater treatment system discharge for FB Operations LLC, which is proposing to construct a complex slaughterhouse and tannery operation located in or near the Goff Industrial Park near the center of Section 12, T34S, R3E in Cowley County. The facility mailing address is identified as Goff Industrial Park Road, Arkansas City, 67005. The proposed permit was placed on public notice in the Kansas Register (Public Notice No. KS-99-110) dated June 17, 1999 through July 17, 1999. Because of significant public interest in the draft permit, a public hearing has been scheduled.

A public hearing on KDHE's intention to issue the draft permit has been scheduled for 7 p.m. Wednesday, July 21, at the Agri-Business Building, 712 W. Washington Ave., Arkansas City. The public hearing is being conducted for the purpose of receiving public comments on the proposed permit and will continue until all comments are received and the hearing is closed by the hearing officer. Comments may be provided in oral or written form. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally at the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to limit oral presentations to five minutes. It is recommended that parties provide the hearing officer with copies of written comments to ensure that all parties are able to provide KDHE with all their issues, concerns and recommendations in the event the time for oral presentations is limited due to the number of individuals desiring to make a presentation.

The Secretary of Health and Environment will make a final permit decision after consideration of all comments received during the public notice period and at the public hearing and after considering all requirements of statutes and regulations.

Facility Description: The proposed action is to issue a new permit for the operation of a new beef complex slaughterhouse with associated by-product processing and leather tanning operation. The proposed process rate is about 1,650 head per day.

Wastewater is treated by a pretreatment system, steam for temperature control, a two-cell double lined and covered low rate anaerobic lagoon system, biogas collection and reuse system, a two-cell diffused air extended aeration activated sludge system, two final clarifiers, and a chlorination/dechlorination system. Article 29.—CERVIDAE

9-29-6. Tuberculosis. (a) Each cervidae, other than those captured from the wild, that is test-eligible for tuberculosis, that is entering Kansas or changing ownership within Kansas, and that is not intended for immediate slaughter shall meet one of the following requirements:

(1) The cervidae shall originate from and be a part of an accredited tuberculosis-free herd.

(2) The cervidae shall test negative for tuberculosis, using an official test, within 60 days before entry into Kansas or change of ownership.

(b) Any cervidae that meets all of the following conditions shall test negative for tuberculosis, using an official test administered twice and at least 90 days apart, but not more than 150 days before entry:

- (1) Is captured from the wild;
- (2) is test-eligible for tuberculosis;
- (3) is entering Kansas; and
- (4) is not intended for immediate slaughter.

(c) The owner of any herd infected with tuberculosis shall take one of the following steps:

- (1) Depopulate the herd; or
- (2) agree to and implement a plan approved by the livestock commissioner to eradicate the disease from the infected herd.

(d) Any imported cervidae may be quarantined for a re-test for tuberculosis by order of the livestock commissioner. The re-test shall be at the owner's expense. Article 2.—GENERAL

30-2-16. Permanency planning goals for title IV-E of the federal social security act. (a) The agency's permanency planning goal for the federal fiscal year commencing on October 1, 1999 shall be to have no more than 600 children who have been in foster care placements in excess of 24 consecutive months receive federal funding during the course of the year.

(b) Both of the following steps shall be taken by the agency to achieve the above-stated goal:

(1) A reasonable effort shall be made to make adoption assistance available on behalf of eligible children.

(2) A case review shall be initiated and a plan shall be developed for each child in the custody of the agency. Article 6.—MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM—
CLIENTS' ELIGIBILITY FOR PARTICIPATION

30-6-59. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 39-708c, as amended by L. 1996, Ch. 229, Sec. 104; effective May 1, 1981; amended, E-82-11, June 17, 1981; amended, E-82-19, Oct. 21, 1981; amended May 1, 1982; amended March 1, 1997; revoked July 2, 1999.)

30-6-86. Poverty level and low income medicare beneficiaries; determined eligibles. Each applicant or recipient shall meet the general eligibility requirements of K.A.R. 30-6-50 and the specific eligibility requirements set forth below. (a) Age, blindness, or disability. Each individual shall meet the age, blindness, or disability requirements of K.A.R. 30-6-85.

(b) Medicare part A beneficiary. Each individual shall be entitled to medicare part A benefits.

(c) Other coverage. An individual who meets the poverty income guidelines of K.A.R. 30-6-103 (a)(10) or (11) shall not be seeking coverage under any other type of medical assistance.

(d) Financial eligibility. A percentage of the official federal poverty income guidelines as established in K.A.R. 30-6-103 shall be used as the protected income level for the number of persons in the plan and any other persons whose income is considered. Total applicable income to be considered in the eligibility base period shall be compared against the poverty level for the base period. However, the amount of an annual social security cost-of-living adjustment shall be disregarded in determining eligibility during the first quarter of the year for which the adjustment is provided. To be eligible under this provision, the total applicable income shall not exceed the poverty level established for the base period. The individual also shall not own nonexempt real or personal property with a resource value in excess of two times the allowable amount specified in K.A.R. 30-6-107 for the number of persons whose nonexempt resources are considered available to the individual.

(e) Assistance provided. Assistance under this provision for individuals meeting the poverty income guidelines of K.A.R. 30-6-103(a)(7) shall be limited to the payment of allowable medicare premiums, deductibles, and coinsurance. Assistance for individuals meeting the poverty income guidelines of K.A.R. 30-6-103(a)(9) or (10) shall be limited to the payment of medicare part B premiums only. Assistance for individuals meeting the pov-

erty income guidelines of K.A.R. 30-6-103 (a)(11) shall be limited to the payment of the portion of the medicare part B premium attributable to the inclusion of home health costs. 30-6-103. Determined eligibles; protected income levels. (a) Independent living and home- and community-based services arrangements.

(1) The protected income level for any person in an independent living arrangement or in the home- and community-based services program shall be based on the total number of persons in the assistance plan and any other persons in the family group whose income is being considered.

(2) The protected income levels for independent living may also be used when an applicant or recipient meets either of these conditions:

(A) Enters a medicaid-approved facility, except that this provision shall not apply in situations in which only one spouse of a married couple enters an institutional living arrangement; or

(B) is absent from the home for medical care for a period not to exceed two months to allow for maintaining the applicant's or recipient's independent living arrangements;

(3) Except as provided in paragraphs (4), (5), (6), (7), and (8) below, the following table shall be used to determine the protected income level for persons in independent living.

The protected income level for additional persons shall be the sum of the basic standard for a like public assistance family plus the maximum state shelter standard.

(4) In determining eligibility for pregnant women and for infants under the provisions of K.A.R. 30-6-77(a) and (b), 150 percent of the official federal poverty income guidelines shall serve as the protected income level.

(5) In determining eligibility for other young children under the provisions of K.A.R. 30-6-77(c), 133 percent of the official federal poverty income guidelines shall serve as the protected income level.

(6) In determining eligibility for older children under the provisions of K.A.R. 30-6-77(d), 100 percent of the official federal poverty income guidelines shall serve as the protected income level.

(7) In determining eligibility for poverty-level medicare beneficiaries under the provisions of K.A.R. 30-6-86, 100 percent of the official federal poverty income guidelines shall serve as the protected income level.

(8) In determining eligibility for working disabled individuals under the provisions of K.A.R. 30-6-87, 200 percent of the official federal poverty income guidelines shall serve as the protected income level.

(9) In determining eligibility for low income medicare beneficiaries under the provisions of K.A.R. 30-6-86, 120

percent of the official federal poverty income guidelines shall serve as the protected income level.

(10) In determining eligibility for low income medicare beneficiaries under the provisions of K.A.R. 30-6-86, 120 to 135 percent of the official federal poverty income guidelines shall serve as the protected income level subject to available federal funding.

(11) In determining eligibility for low income medicare beneficiaries under the provisions of K.A.R. 30-6-86, 135 to 175 percent of the official poverty income guidelines shall serve as the protected income level subject to available federal funding.

(b) Institutional living arrangements. For persons residing in institutional settings, the protected income level shall be \$30.00, except as noted in paragraph (2) of subsection (a).

(c) Home- and community-based services arrangements. For persons in the home- and community-based services program, the protected income level shall be 100 percent of the official federal poverty income guidelines as of January 1 of each year. Article 14.—CHILDREN'S HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM

30-14-30. Applicable income. "Applicable income" means the amount of earned and unearned income that is compared with the poverty income guidelines referenced in K.A.R. 30-14-27 to establish financial eligibility. (a) Applicable earned income. All earned income shall be considered applicable income unless exempted in accordance with K.A.R. 30-6-112(a) through (bb) and K.A.R. 30-6-113(a) through (r). Applicable earned income shall be determined as follows.

(1) Applicable earned income for persons included in the living unit, and for all persons in the home whose earned income shall be considered and who are excluded

from the living unit, shall equal gross earned income, or the adjusted gross earned income from self-employment, less \$200.00 per month for each employed person.

(2) For self-employed persons, adjusted gross earned income shall equal gross earned income less cost of the production of the income. A standard deduction of 25% of gross earned income shall be allowed for these costs. If the person wishes to claim actual costs incurred, the following guidelines shall be used by the agency in calculating the cost of the production of the income.

(A) The healthwave program shall not treat income on the basis of internal revenue services (IRS) policies and shall not be used to either subsidize the payment of debts or set up an individual in a business or a nonprofit activity.

(B) If losses are suffered from self-employment, the losses shall not be deducted from other income, nor shall the net loss of a business be considered as an income-producing cost.

(C) If a business is being conducted from a location other than the applicant's or recipient's home, the expenses for business space and utilities shall be considered as income-producing costs.

(D) If a business is being conducted from a person's own home, shelter and utility costs shall not be considered as income-producing costs unless the person can verify that those costs are clearly distinguishable from operation of the home.

(E) If payments increase the equity in equipment, vehicles, or other property, the payments shall not be considered as an income-producing cost.

(F) If equipment, vehicles, or other property is being purchased on an installment plan, the actual interest paid may be considered as an income-producing cost.

(G) Depreciation on equipment, vehicles, or other property shall not be considered as an income-producing cost.

(H) Insurance payments on equipment, vehicles, or other property shall be allowed if the payments directly relate to the business.

(I) Expenses for inventories and supplies that are reasonable and required for the business shall be considered as income-producing costs.

(J) Wages and other mandated costs related to wages paid by the applicant or recipient may be considered as income-producing costs.

(b) Applicable unearned income.

(1) All net unearned income shall be considered to be applicable income, unless exempted in accordance with K.A.R. 30-6-112(a) through (bb) and K.A.R. 30-6-113(a) through (r).

(2) Net unearned income shall equal gross unearned income less the costs of the production of the income. Income-producing costs shall include only those expenses directly related to the actual production of income. The principles set forth in paragraph (a) (2) of this regulation regarding the calculation of income-producing costs shall apply. 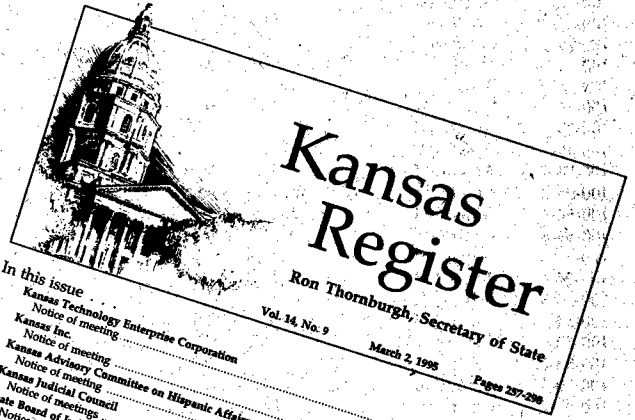
