Social and Rehabilitation Services**Public Notice**

Effective July 1, 1999, the following changes are being proposed for the Kansas Medicaid Disproportionate Share:

1. Removal of a limitation on public hospitals that is no longer applicable.
2. Removal of the multiplier of 10 and the corresponding limitation related to the prior Medicaid payments, which only applied to the low income method and which is no longer applicable.
3. Addition of a limitation that determines payment for all hospitals based upon their relative share of Kansas Medicaid days to the hospital's total Medicaid days. This adjustment will result in Kansas paying only for the appropriate share of disproportionate share where the hospital provides services to more than one state's Medicaid program.
4. Clarification on the availability of cost reports as of the start of the state fiscal year for which payments are to be made. This is the way the program has been previously operated.
5. Grammatical changes that do not affect the methodology.

The impact of these changes is an additional estimated payment to hospitals of \$1,500,000 per year.

Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board**Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Monday, September 13, in the office of the Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board, 712 S. Kansas Ave., Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed amendments in existing rules and regulations of the board.

The 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the board's executive director, 712 S. Kansas Ave., Topeka, 66603. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity during the hearing to present their views on the adoption of the proposed amendments. The board may limit any oral presentation to five minutes in order to give all parties an opportunity to be heard.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting the executive director at (785) 296-3240.

These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed regulations follows.

K.A.R. 102-4-10a. Continuing education for licensed master's level psychologists. Amendments to this regulation delay the effective date for increasing the number of required continuing education hours. Persons seeking renewal of their license to practice master's level psychology before December 31, 1999, would be required to show proof of completing 25 hours of continuing education. Persons who apply for renewal after January 1, 2000, would be required to show completion of 60 hours of continuing education.

Licenses who seek renewal prior to December 31, 1999, and their employers who provide continuing education as an employee benefit will potentially save money relating to the cost of accumulate continuing education hours. Other governmental units and other consumers will not be affected by the amendment.

K.A.R. 102-5-7a. Professional postgraduate supervised experience for licensed marriage and family therapists. Amendments to this regulation delay the effective date for increasing the required years of experience of persons who provide postgraduate supervision.

No fiscal impact upon licensees, the public or any governmental entity is anticipated.

Request for Comments

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality construction permit. Anadarko Gathering Company has applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300 to remove catalytic converters from four engines and take out of service two Ajax DPC 300 engines and one DPC 600 engine. Emissions of nitrogen oxides (NOx), carbon monoxide (CO), and volatile organic compounds (VOC) were evaluated during the permit review process.

Anadarko Gathering Company, Houston, Texas, owns and operates the stationary source located at Rolla Booster Station, S24-T33S-R40W, Morton County, at which four catalytic converters are to be removed, and three Ajax engines taken out of service.

Article 1.—DISEASES

28-1-6. Requirements for isolation and quarantine of specific infectious and contagious diseases. The following isolation precautions, as defined in K.A.R. 28-1-1, shall be observed: (a) Amebiasis: Infected food handlers shall be excluded from their occupation until three negative stools have been obtained. Both the second and the third specimens shall be collected at least 48 hours after the prior specimen.

(b) Anthrax: Infected persons shall be isolated until all lesions are healed.

(c) Chickenpox: Infected persons shall be isolated for six days after the first crop of vesicles appears or until lesions are crusted, whichever comes first.

(d) Cholera: Enteric precautions shall be followed for the duration of acute symptoms. Contacts shall be quarantined for five days from the date of last exposure.

(e) Diphtheria: Infected persons shall be isolated for 14 days or until two consecutive negative pairs of nose and throat cultures, and cultures of skin lesions in cutaneous diphtheria, are obtained at least 24 hours apart and not less than 24 hours after discontinuation of antibiotic therapy. Household and intimate contacts shall be quarantined for seven days from the time of last contact or until nose and throat cultures are negative. Healthy carriers shall be treated.

(f) E. Coli 0157:H7: Enteric precautions shall be followed for the duration of acute symptoms. Infected persons shall be excluded from food handling, patient care, or occupations involving the care of young children and the elderly, and infected children shall not attend a day care center until two negative stool cultures are obtained at least 24 hours apart and no sooner than 48 hours following discontinuation of antibiotics.

(g) Gonorrhoea ophthalmia neonatorum: Infected persons shall be isolated for 48 hours following initiation of treatment with antibiotics or until two negative cultures are obtained.

(h) Malaria: Blood precautions shall be followed for the duration of hospitalization.

(i) Meningitis, meningococcal: Respiratory isolation shall be instituted for 24 hours after initiation of antibiotic therapy.

(j) Meningitis, aseptic and other: Infected persons shall be isolated until the end of the febrile period.

(k) Mumps: Respiratory isolation shall be instituted for nine days from the onset of parotid gland swelling.

(l) Pediculosis: Students infested with lice shall be excluded from school or child care facilities until treatment with an antiparasitic drug is initiated, and until all nits have been removed.

(m) Pertussis (whooping cough): Respiratory isolation shall be instituted for three weeks if untreated, or for five days following initiation of antibiotic therapy.

(n) Plague (pneumonic): Airborne precautions shall be instituted until completion of 48 hours of antibiotic therapy and there has been a favorable clinical response. Close contacts who do not receive chemoprophylaxis shall be quarantined for seven days.

(o) Poliomyelitis: Infected persons shall be isolated for 10 days from onset; enteric precautions shall be followed for six weeks.

(p) Rubeola (measles): Respiratory isolation shall be instituted for four days after the onset of rash.

(q) Rubella (German measles): Respiratory isolation shall be followed for seven days after the onset of rash.

(r) Salmonellosis (nontyphoidal): Enteric precautions shall be followed for the duration of acute symptoms. Infected persons with diarrhea shall be excluded from food handling, patient care, or occupations involving the care of young children and the elderly until no longer symptomatic. Asymptomatic and convalescent infected persons without diarrhea may be excluded from, and return to, this work by the order of the local health officer or the department.

(s) Scabies: Children or students infected with scabies shall be excluded from school or child care facilities until treated with an antiparasitic drug.

(t) Shigellosis: Enteric precautions shall be followed for duration of acute symptoms. Infected persons shall be excluded from food handling, patient care, or occupations involving the care of young children and the elderly until two negative stool cultures are obtained at least 24 hours apart and no sooner than 48 hours following the discontinuation of antibiotics.

(u) Staphylococcal disease: Infected food handlers shall be excluded from their occupation until purulent lesions are healed.

(v) Streptococcal disease, hemolytic (including erysipelas, scarlet fever, streptococcal sore throat): Infected persons shall be isolated for 10 days if untreated or for 24 hours following initiation of antibiotic therapy.

(w) Taeniasis (beef or pork tapeworm): Enteric precautions shall be followed until treated.

(x) Tinea capitis and corporis (ringworm): Infected children or students shall be excluded from school until under treatment by a physician.

(y) Tuberculosis: Respiratory isolation shall be instituted until three sputa obtained on consecutive days are negative by microscopic examination.

(z) Typhoid fever: Enteric precautions shall be followed for the duration of acute symptoms. Infected persons shall be restricted from food handling, patient care, or occupations involving the care of young children and the elderly until three negative stool cultures, and urine cultures in patients with schistosomiasis, have been obtained. Both the second and the third specimens shall be collected at least 24 hours after the prior specimen. The first specimen shall be collected no sooner than 48 hours following the discontinuation of antibiotics, and not earlier than one month after onset. If any one of these tests is positive, cultures shall be repeated monthly until three consecutive negative cultures are obtained.

(aa) Sexually transmitted diseases (including syphilis, gonorrhea, chlamydia, and other diseases associated with sexual transmission): Isolation or quarantine measures

shall be established by the local health officer for persons who are confirmed or suspected of being infected with a sexually transmitted disease if these persons are recalcitrant to proper treatment.

(bb) Viral hepatitis type A (infectious): Blood and enteric precautions shall be followed for two weeks after the onset of symptoms. Infected persons shall be restricted from food handling, patient care, or occupations involving the care of young children and the elderly until two weeks after the onset of illness. Article 10.—ANIMAL HEALTH

112-10-6. Bleeder list. (a) For the purpose of this regulation, a bleeder is defined as any equine exhibiting exercise-induced pulmonary hemorrhage (EIPH) manifested by the presence of frank blood appearing from either nostril or the presence of frank blood in the trachea.

(b) Subject to the requirements of these racing regulations, furosemide may be administered to any horse that is entered in a race if its name is on the bleeder list. A horse's name shall be placed on the bleeder list if any one of the following conditions is met:

(1) The animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer observes the horse shed blood from one or both nostrils during or following exercise or a race.

(2) A practicing veterinarian who is employed by the owner of the horse, and the animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer determine that the horse should be certified as a bleeder after an endoscopic examination of the respiratory tract conducted by the practicing veterinarian under the observation of the animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer.

(3) A bleeder certificate for the horse is attached to the horse's papers on file in the racing secretary's office, and the certificate is from a jurisdiction that uses bleeder qualification criteria satisfactory to the animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer. Each certificate shall bear the signature of the racing commission official in the state of origin.

(c) For each horse that does not have a bleeder certificate and that is observed bleeding for the first time ever, both of these requirements shall be met:

(1) The horse's name shall be placed on the bleeder list for a minimum of 10 days or until the animal health officer or assistant animal health officer removes it.

(2) The horse's owner shall receive an official Kansas bleeder certificate signed by the animal health officer or

assistant animal health officer and attached to the registration certificate of this horse.

(d) Each horse that has a bleeder certificate and is racing after the administration of furosemide shall be subject to the following restrictions:

(1) The first time a horse is observed bleeding, its name shall be placed on the bleeder list, and the name shall remain there for a minimum of 20 days or until the animal health officer or assistant animal health officer removes it.

(2) The second time a horse is observed bleeding within a 12-month period, its name shall be placed on the bleeder list, and the name shall remain there for a minimum of 30 days or until the animal health officer or assistant animal health officer removes it.

(3) The third time a horse is observed bleeding within a 12-month period, the horse shall be barred from pari-mutuel racing in Kansas.

(e) Each owner shall receive a bleeder certificate signed by the animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer if the name of the owner's horse is placed on the bleeder list. Each horse's name shall be removed from the bleeder list only by the animal health officer or an assistant animal health officer, who shall notify the stewards in writing of the reason for removal.

(f) The bleeder list shall be current and shall be posted in the racing secretary's office. Article 6.—CONTINUING EDUCATION

117-6-1. Continuing education; renewal requirements. (a)(1) The continuing education requirement for renewal of a license or certificate for the provisional, licensed, residential, and general classifications shall be the equivalent of 14 classroom hours of instruction. A three-year total of 42 hours of continuing education hours may be averaged over each three-year period as defined in paragraph (a)(2) and as provided in paragraph (a)(3) and paragraph (a)(4) below. Each course for which credit is requested shall have received approval of the board for renewal of the applicable classification before the completion of the course.

(2) For persons certified or licensed before July 1, 1999, the three-year period shall begin on July 1, 1999 and shall continue triennially thereafter. For persons certified or licensed on and after July 1, 1999, the three-year period

shall begin with the first renewal after the initial licensure or certification and shall continue triennially thereafter.

(3) For persons certified or licensed before July 1, 1999, within three years after July 1, 1999 and within every subsequent three years, each certified and licensed appraiser shall attend a 15-classroom-hour uniform standards of professional appraisal practice course and shall successfully pass a written examination on the course.

(4) For persons certified or licensed on and after July 1, 1999, within three years after an appraiser's initial date of certification or licensure and within every subsequent three years, each certified and licensed appraiser shall attend a 15-classroom-hour uniform standards of professional appraisal practice course and shall successfully pass a written examination on the course.

(b) An appraiser shall not receive continuing education credit for a course for which the appraiser received credit toward the original classroom hour requirement pursuant to K.A.R. 117-2-1, 117-3-1, or 117-4-1. However, if a licensed or certified appraiser receives credit for a course to apply toward a higher classification, the appraiser may also receive continuing education credit for the course if it is approved by the board for continuing education credit.

(c) Continuing education credit may also be granted for participation, other than as a student, in appraisal educational processes and programs. Activities for which credit may be granted shall include teaching, program development, authorship of textbooks, or similar activities that are determined by the board to be equivalent to obtaining continuing education.

(d) At the completion of each continuing education course, each appraiser shall present to the board a certificate of completion for each course for which credit is requested, before the renewal date.

(e) If any appraiser requests credit pursuant to subsection (c) of this regulation, the appraiser shall submit a detailed description of the activities with the application for renewal on a form obtained from the board.

(f) A nonresident of Kansas may receive credit for courses approved by the state of residence by submitting certificates of completion and evidence that each course for which credit is requested was approved by the state of residence. Evidence of renewal of an equivalent license or certificate by a nonresident's state of residence may be recognized by the board as meeting the education requirement for renewal of the nonresident's Kansas license or certificate. Article 24.—MORTGAGE BUSINESS

17-24-1. Signed acknowledgment; contents. Before a registrant enters into any contact for the provision of services or receives any compensation or promise of compensation for a mortgage loan, the registrant shall acquire from the customer a signed acknowledgment containing only the following items:

- (a) The name and address of the mortgage business;
- (b) the name and position of the individual presenting the acknowledgment to the customer for a signature;
- (c) a statement in at least 10-point boldface letters that reads as follows: "(name of registrant) is a mortgage business registered with the Kansas Office of the State Bank Commissioner in accordance with the laws of the state of Kansas. This registration does not represent an endorsement or recommendation of the registrant's products or services by the Office of the State Bank Commissioner. As a consumer, you may submit a complaint or inquiry about this mortgage business by delivering a written statement to the Office of the State Bank Commissioner, 700 Jackson, Suite 300, Topeka, Kansas 66603"; and
- (d) the original signature of the customer or customers and the date on which the signature or signatures were attached. 17-24-2. Mortgage business fees. - (a) Application for registration \$600
- (b) Renewal application \$400

Article 3.—INSTANT GENERIC GAME RULES

111-3-1. Definitions. The following definitions apply to all instant ticket games: (a) "Bare arm technique" means a type of drawing in which the person drawing the winning ticket from the receptacle or drum wears a short-sleeved (sleeve not extending past the elbow) or a no-sleeve shirt which exposes the drawer's bare arm, or a long-sleeved shirt rolled up past the elbow.

(b) "Book" means a pack of fanfolded instant game tickets which are attached to each other by perforations, which perforations the retailer tears when selling a ticket from the book.

(c) "Book-ticket number" means the unique number appearing on each ticket which includes the number of the book from which it was removed and the serially assigned number of the ticket within that book. The book-ticket number is a number followed by a dash and then a 3-digit ticket number. The ticket numbers in each book start with 000. The book-ticket number is printed in black ink on the ticket below the bar code and above the space for the player's name and address.

(d) "Claimant" means a holder of a ticket who presents it for payment of a prize, whether or not the holder may have an obligation to share the prize.

(e) "Co-sponsor drawings" are the acts of drawing for prizes which may be held subsequent to the lottery drawings.

(f) "Co-sponsor(s)" means the person, retailer or organization designated by the executive director to assist in organizing and participating in the lottery drawings.

(g) "Drawings" are the acts of drawing prizes conducted by the Kansas lottery.

(h) "Drum" means a container which can be sealed and rotated for the purpose of mixing, and into which instant tickets are placed for the purpose of drawing preliminary and/or final drawing winners.

(i) "Executive director" means the executive director of the Kansas lottery, or the person designated by the executive director.

(j) "Instant game" means a lottery game in which a ticket is purchased by a player and the player can immediately determine whether he or she has won a prize by removing the removable covering on the ticket and comparing the exposed play numbers or symbols with those specified as winners in the published game rules for that instant game.

(k) "Lottery retailer" or "retailer" means a person or business authorized by the lottery to sell lottery tickets.

(l) "Lottery security" means the lottery security officer or a certified law enforcement officer(s) designated by the executive director or the person designated by the executive director.

(m) "Non-winning ticket" means any valid Kansas instant game lottery ticket not eligible to win a prize under

any specific instant game rules, but which may be eligible for a lottery drawing:

(n) "Participant" means any person, player, or contestant participating in a lottery game and anyone designated by a prize winner to appear on his or her behalf for any lottery game including any lottery drawing or televised draw show. In the event the prize winner or his or her designee fails to appear for a drawing or televised draw show, the executive director may designate an adult who may be a member of his staff to participate on behalf of the non-appearing prize winner. Any prize won by a participant appearing through a designee shall be payable to and delivered to the prize winner as provided by these rules and regulations.

(o) "Play area" is the portion of the front of each instant game ticket where the play or game symbols appear. It is covered by a removable layer of material which is intended to be removed ("scratched off") by the player to reveal the play or game symbols.

(p) "Play symbols" or "game symbols" are the numbers, letters, symbols, or pictures printed in the play area of each instant game ticket and which determine if the ticket holder is entitled to a prize.

(q) "Play symbol captions" or "game symbol captions" are the words or portions of words printed beneath each play or game symbol in the play area and are used to repeat or explain the play or game symbol. The play or game symbol caption associated with each play or game symbol is designated by the rules of the game.

(r) Prize tiers:

(1) "Low-tier prize" means a lottery instant game prize not exceeding \$599.00.

(2) "High-tier prize" means a lottery instant game prize in excess of \$599.00.

(s) "Receptacle" means a container in which non-winning Kansas instant game lottery tickets are placed and from which the drawings are made. Receptacles shall be sealable and capable of being mixed.

(t) "Retailer validation code" means the small letters found under removable covering in the play area of each instant game ticket. The retailer uses this code to verify and validate winners which are to be paid by the retailer.

(u) "Special event" means a drawing or other method of awarding an additional prize or prizes within a group of lottery instant game winners as defined by the rules for a particular instant game.

(v) "Ticket holder" or "holder" means the person who has possession of an unsigned ticket or the person whose signature appears in the area upon a ticket designated for signature.

(w) "Ticket validation number" means a unique number appearing on each ticket which is used to validate winning tickets. The ticket validation number appears under the removable covering on the front of each instant ticket.

(x) "Activated book" means book or pack of instant tickets activated on the lottery's computer system, which is available for sale to the public by a lottery retailer.

(y) "Consigned book" means a full book or pack of instant tickets sealed in shrink wrap and delivered to a certified Kansas lottery retailer, which is designated on the lottery's computer system as consigned and has not

been made available to the public. 111-3-14. Payment of prizes. The procedures for payment of instant monetary prizes to the winners of the instant games are as follows:

(a) The executive director or his designee shall award the designated prize to the appropriate person as soon as it is determined that all laws, regulations, and rules have been adhered to.

(b) Low-tier instant game prizes shall be paid as follows:

(1) Present the ticket to any retailer. Upon receipt and computer validation of the ticket, the retailer shall immediately make payment for the prize to the claimant. A retailer choosing not to make the payment shall not computer validate the ticket, and the claimant may claim the prize at another retailer location or may claim the prize in another manner prescribed in these rules. If the retailer cannot validate the claim, the claimant shall fill out a claim form provided by the retailer and personally present or mail the completed form together with the ticket to Kansas lottery headquarters. If the claim is received and validated at lottery headquarters, then payment shall be made to the claimant by mail.

(2) Bring the ticket to any regional office of the Kansas lottery during the hours that such office is open to the public for business. Upon receipt and verification of the claim, payment for such claim shall be made to the winner in the following manner:

(A) The prize for a validated free ticket winner redeemed in this manner shall be the purchase price of the ticket redeemed.

(B) The prize for other validated low-tier winners redeemed in this manner shall be paid by the lottery.

(3) Mail the ticket with a completed claim form in any envelope to Kansas lottery headquarters. Claim forms can be obtained from any lottery instant game retailer or any office of the Kansas lottery. Upon receipt and verification of the claim, the payment for such claim shall be made to the winner in the following manner:

(A) The prize for a validated free ticket winner redeemed in this manner shall be the purchase price of the ticket redeemed.

(B) The prizes for other validated low-tier winners redeemed in this manner shall be paid by the lottery.

(c) High-tier instant game prizes in excess of \$599.00 shall be paid by any one of the following methods:

(1) Bring the ticket to any office of the Kansas lottery during the hours that such office is open to the public for business. Upon receipt and validation of the ticket, the payment shall be made to the claimant by the executive director by any means deemed appropriate. On all high-

tier claims, the winning ticket should be validated by requesting any Kansas lottery retailer to validate the ticket through the lottery's on-line central computer system. Although the ticket is validated, no authorization numbers will be provided the retailer since retailer cannot pay a high-tier claim.

(2) Mail the ticket with a completed claim form in any envelope to Kansas lottery headquarters. Claim forms may be obtained from any lottery instant game retailer or any office of the Kansas lottery. Upon receipt and validation of the ticket, the payment shall be made to the claimant by the executive director by any means deemed appropriate.

(d) Tickets submitted for payment of a prize shall become property of the lottery and shall not be returned to claimant. 111-3-21. Certification of drawings. (a) All instant ticket drawings except as otherwise specified by individual game rules shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery division of security designated by the executive director and by an employee of the Kansas lottery designated by the executive director as drawing manager.

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the designated lottery security person shall issue a report certifying that the ticket selected is valid and that to the best of his or her knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in conducting the drawing. Tickets drawn and certified shall be secured by the designated lottery security person and retained until ready for disposal. 111-3-22. Selection of participants. The following process shall be used for the selection of participants in all drawings conducted pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* unless otherwise specified by individual game rules:

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all entries mailed to the lottery's post office box.

(b) Lottery personnel shall transport the tickets to a secure area where they will be held until the time designated by the executive director for the drawing for which they are entered. Lottery security personnel shall then be responsible for transporting the tickets and placing them in the receptacle(s) or drum(s) to be used for the drawing.

(c) The selection process shall be held at the date and time specified in individual game rules. All draws shall be held in a place accessible to the public and be open for

public attendance and with lottery security personnel present. All draws shall be video and audio taped.

(d) An individual designated by the executive director shall pick at random the number of tickets specified by the rules and regulations of the drawing from the receptacle(s) or drum(s) using the bare-arm technique. Should the designated individual draw tickets belonging to that designated individual, the tickets shall be disqualified.

(e) The contents of the receptacle(s) or drum(s) shall be mixed thoroughly with a shovel or other means, or rotated a minimum of 10 times to ensure random selection.

(f) If the tickets drawn are determined to be ineligible, they shall be discarded, the receptacle(s) or drum(s) resealed, and another drawn. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.

(g) All tickets remaining in the receptacle(s) or drum(s) after valid entries have been selected shall be destroyed.

(h) Valid entries shall be certified and secured in accordance with K.A.R. 111-3-21. Article 4.—INSTANT GAME RULES

111-4-1384. Determination of instant prize winners. "Wizard of Oz" is a maze game. To play this instant game, a player removes or "scratches off" the removable layer of material covering the square marked "ENTER." The arrow revealed will indicate which square is to be scratched next. A player shall continue to scratch, following the arrows, until exiting the maze at either one or two locations. If a player exits the maze directly on a prize amount, the player wins that prize. A player can win up to two times on a single ticket. 111-4-1457. Method of entry. (a) Entry into the "Last Summer of the Century Drawing" to be conducted on September 19, 1999, shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) Obtain a valid "Last Summer of the Century" Kansas instant lottery ticket;

(b) The executive director may terminate the sale of tickets prior to the complete sale of all tickets. In this event, the number and value of prizes will be approximately proportional to the number of tickets actually sold. The odds of winning a prize in this game are one in 4.91.

(c) All prizes are subject to deductions provided by law.

(d) Additional ticket orders shall have the same prize structure, the same number of prizes per prize pool of 240,000 tickets and the same odds as were contained in the initial ticket order. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 74-8710(b), (c) and (f); implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 74-8710(b), (c) and (f), and K.S.A. 74-8720; effective, T-111-6-11-99, May 21, 1999.)

Article 7.—ON-LINE GAMES

111-7-66. Game description; drawing. (a) Pick 3 is a daily game in which drawings shall be conducted every day but Sunday in accordance with lottery procedures until 6:00 a.m. on Sunday, July 18, 1999, following which time drawings shall be conducted seven days a week.

(b) To play Pick 3 a player shall select a set of three single digit numbers from three sets of single digit numbers beginning with zero and progressing by increments of one through the number nine by (1) communicating

the numbers to the retailer; (2) marking up to four boards on each play slip and submitting the play slip to the retailer; or (3) requesting a quick pick from the retailer.

(c) The cost of a single ticket shall be either \$.50 per play times the number of plays, or \$1.00 per play times the number of plays, depending on the type of wager to be made.

(d) A validated ticket shall be the only proof of a game play or plays, and the submission of a winning ticket to and receipt of the ticket by the lottery or its authorized retailer shall be the sole method of claiming a prize or prizes. A play slip has no pecuniary or prize value and shall not constitute evidence of ticket purchase, of numbers selected or prizes to be paid.

(e) A ticket may be cancelled as provided in K.A.R. 111-6-20.

(f) Ticket sales will end at approximately 6:45 p.m. central time on each drawing day and resume at approximately 7:00 p.m. Effective August 18, 1996, sales will end at approximately 8:59 p.m. central time on each drawing day and resume at approximately 9:05 p.m. for the next drawing.

(g) Drawings will be conducted daily after ticket sales end, under conditions and procedures promulgated by the executive director of the lottery. Winning number combinations shall be generated daily through the use of a computer-driven random number generator located at lottery headquarters. The generator shall be statistically analyzed, tested, and certified by an independent qualified statistician for integrity. Periodic checks shall be made to ensure the security and integrity of the system at least quarterly.

(h) It shall be the sole responsibility of the player to verify the accuracy of the game plays and other data printed on the ticket. The placing of plays is done at the player's own risk through the on-line retailer who is acting on behalf of the player in entering the plays. Article 9.—INDIVIDUAL PULL-TAB GAME RULES

RULES FOR PULL-TAB GAME NO. 916 "UP THE ANTE"

111-9-103. Name of game. The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant pull-tab game entitled "Up the Ante" starting on or around July 28, 1999. The specific rules for the "Up the Ante" game are contained in K.A.R. 111-9-103 through 111-9-108. Other applicable rules for the game may be found in K.A.R. 111-8-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-11-99, May 21, 1999.)

111-9-104. Definitions. The following definitions shall apply to the "Up the Ante" pull-tab lottery game.

(continued)

(a) "Ticket" or "card" means a Kansas lottery instant pull-tab game "Up the Ante" ticket.

(b) "Play symbols" are the numbers, letters, symbols or pictures printed on the front and under each tab on the back of each pull-tab ticket and which determine if the ticket bearer is entitled to a prize. In this pull-tab game, the play symbols consist of pictures of two \$500 poker chips, three stacks of poker chips, one \$25 poker chip, a slot machine, a purple number seven, a bell, an ace of spades, a pear and twin cherries. All but the pear and the twin cherries may be winning symbols. Various combinations of these play symbols appear under each of the five tabs on the back of each ticket.

(c) "Carton serial number" is the 9-digit number appearing on the front of the ticket.

(d) "Carton" means a box containing 672 pull-tab tickets. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-11-99, May 21, 1999.)

111-9-105. Determination of instant prize winners. Each tab on the back of the ticket is to be pulled open. If three symbols of two \$500 poker chips, three sticks of poker chips, \$25 poker chips, slot machines, purple sevens, bells or ace of spades printed horizontally under the tabs match any combinations of winning symbols shown on the front of the ticket, and the word WIN appears on that tab, the player wins the prize(s) which corresponds to the symbols matched. On winning combinations, the total amount won will appear on the front of the ticket to the right of the symbols matched. The prize amounts are as follows:

3 twin \$500 poker chips	\$125.00
3 triple stacks of poker chips	\$50.00
3 \$25 poker chips	\$20.00
3 slot machines	\$10.00
3 purple sevens	\$5.00
3 bells	\$2.00
3 ace of spades	\$1.00

111-9-106. Number and value of prizes per quarter carton of tickets. The prize structure for each carton of "Up the Ante" instant pull-tab tickets is as follows:

111-9-107. Validation requirements. The following validation requirements shall apply to all instant pull-tab tickets:

(a) The three winning symbols which must exactly match the winning symbols on the front of the ticket and appear in the same consecutive order horizontally.

(b) The three consecutive winning symbols must have the word "WIN" appear under the same winning tab.

(c) On any winning combination, the amount won will appear on the front of the ticket to the right of the symbols matched.

(d) The ticket must pass all validation requirements as specified in K.A.R. 111-8-6. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-11-99, May 21, 1999.)

111-9-108. Price. The retail price of the tickets is \$1.00 per ticket. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-11-99, May 21, 1999.)

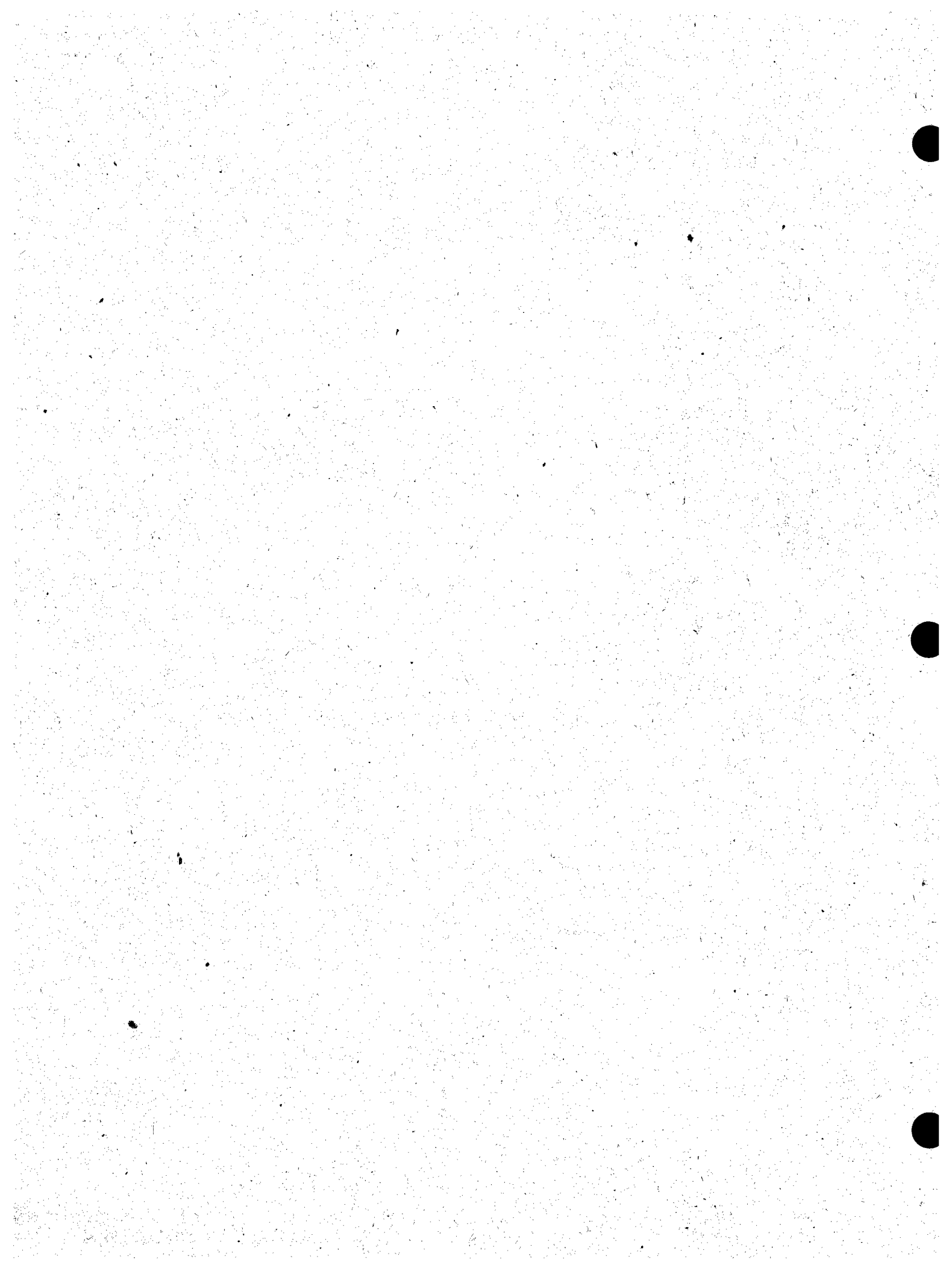

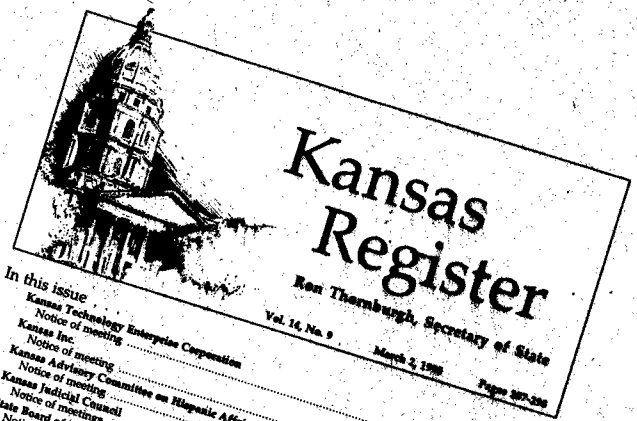
