## Notice of Special Local Need Registration

Notice is hereby given that the Kansas Corn Growers Association and Crop Quest Inc. have requested, on behalf of Kansas corn farmers, a special local need (SLN) registration, Section 24(c) FIFRA exemption, to allow the use of Tilt® (EPA Registration Number 100-617) for the control of gray leaf spot (*Cercospora zeaе maydis*) and other foliar diseases on corn through 100 percent blister stage (when the kernels of corn are white outside and resemble a blister). The current federal label allows the use of Tilt® on corn up to 50 percent silk. The Kansas Department of Agriculture approved the SLN registration effective on July 16, 1999, after surveys conducted the previous week by Kansas State University (KSU) and corn producers indicated that the outbreak of gray leaf spot in 1999 was the most severe for this time of season than in previous seasons. Yield losses of 40 percent or more have been reported in fields where the disease went untreated. While KSU Extension encourages the use of resistant hybrids, none of the current hybrids available to growers has adequate resistance when disease conditions are as severe as they are currently. The outbreak and rapid development of the disease was attributed, in part, to an unusual cool and wet spring throughout most of Kansas.

The SLN registration is based on two main criteria:

(1) Better timing of the application for improved performance. Because Tilt® could not be applied after silking, its effectiveness against gray leaf spot and other dis-

eases was impeded. Many corn producers had to apply the fungicide earlier than the optimum timing because of label restriction. This practice does not fit well into integrated pest management (IPM) practices, which dictate that a fungicide not be applied until the disease reaches an action threshold.

(2) Avoiding worker exposure of Tilt® to detassellers. During the tassel and silking stages of seed corn, workers must be in the field for mechanical and then hand detasseling. The timing of these operations conflicts with the scheduling of Tilt® applications on the current federal label. The result is either risk of increased worker exposure or a failure to apply Tilt®, resulting in yield loss. If applications can be made after silking, for which the SLN provides, detasseling operations could be completed before Tilt® application and worker exposure.

This SLN registration is economically and environmentally beneficial because it provides greater efficacy and more flexibility to growers and commercial applicators. Pursuant to 7 U.S.C. 136v, Novartis Crop Protection, Inc. has filed with the Kansas Department of Agriculture (KDA) as application for the SLN registration action.

All required residue data and risk assessment information already exist as part of the U.S. EPA registration of Tilt® fungicide through 50 percent silk. Additional residue studies conducted by the registrant indicate that extending the application window from 50 percent silk to 100 percent blister do not exceed the current tolerances of 0.10 part per million for grain. Almost all the analyzed samples of stover (material that becomes fodder or forage) by Novartis had residue levels below the 0.10 ppm established tolerance. As an additional safeguard, Novartis Crop Protection, Inc. has added the following statement on the SLN label to prevent potential exceedance of the tolerance: "Do not feed forage or fodder." Novartis intends to submit for federal registration the same use as granted by the SLN registration. Approval of this SLN request is necessary to address needs of growers until a federal label amendment can be approved. Efficacy information has been provided to the KDA in support of the SLN registration.

Copies of the SLN label and material safety data sheet (MSDS) were made available to the Kansas Department of Health and Environment and to the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks. The KDA emphasizes that the federal label under the heading "Environmental Hazards" specifically states, "This pesticide is toxic to fish. For terrestrial uses, do not apply directly to water, or to areas where surface water is present. . . . Do not contaminate water when disposing of equipment wash waters. Refer to product labeling for use restrictions to protect endangered species."

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period. A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Tuesday, September 28, in the Landon State Office Building, sixth floor conference room, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed new regulations concerning secure residential treatment facilities.

The time period between publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing serves as the required public comment period of at least 60 days for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Gene Lueger, Department of Health and Environment, Suite 203, Capitol Tower, 400 S.W. 8th, Topeka, 66603.

All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Copies of the complete text of the regulations and the economic impact statement may be obtained by contacting Gene Lueger. A summary of the proposed regulations and their economic impact follows.

**K.A.R. 28-4-330 through 28-4-343.** These proposed new regulations provide a basis for the licensing of secure residential treatment facilities for youth ages 10 to 21. At the present time no such regulations exist, limiting applicants to the regulations for nonclinical programs such as secure care centers and detention centers for youth. The Juvenile Justice Authority has identified the need for secure clinical treatment programs for a population of its youth which would be eligible for Medicaid funding. These offenders are currently being cared for in existing juvenile detention facilities that are unable to provide the neces-

sary clinical treatment for these youth. These regulations will have a positive impact on the Juvenile Justice Authority's ability to serve these youth in a secure setting and will enable providers in the state to design appropriate secure treatment programs.

There will be no added cost to the agency. It appears that funds needed for these programs already exist through Medicaid and JJA and that the regulations will not affect the cost to those affected. Youth will be able to receive appropriate treatment, community residents will be protected and the facilities will receive Medicaid funding. No other governmental agencies will incur additional costs as a result of these regulations.

AND AIR POLLUTION CONTROL

**28-19-752a.** Hazardous air pollutants; limitations applicable to construction of new major sources or reconstruction of existing major sources. (a) Applicability.

(1) For the purpose of this regulation, 40 C.F.R. §63.40, as in effect as of July 1, 1997 is adopted by reference.

(2) Except as otherwise provided by 40 C.F.R. §63.40(c), (e), and (f), this regulation shall apply to the owner or operator of each proposed new major source of hazardous air pollutants (HAPs) and the owner or operator of each existing major source of hazardous air pollutants for which reconstruction is proposed.

(b) Definitions.

(1) For the purposes of this regulation, 40 C.F.R. §63.41, as in effect as of July 1, 1997, is adopted by reference.

(2) "Case-by-case MACT determination" means a determination pursuant to the provisions of subsection (d) of this regulation so that emissions of HAPs from the constructed or reconstructed source will be controlled to a level no less stringent than the maximum achievable control technology, or "MACT", emission limitation for new sources.

(c) Prohibition. After the effective date of this regulation, the owner or operator shall not begin actual construction or reconstruction of a major source of HAP unless the conditions of both paragraphs (1) and (2) of this subsection are met:

(1) The owner or operator has fully complied with all requirements of the construction permit program, K.A.R. 28-19-300, et seq. for preconstruction review, including applicable requirements of section (d) of this regulation, and of subpart A of 40 C.F.R. part 63 as adopted by K.A.R. 28-19-750.

(2) (A) The major source category has been specifically regulated or exempted from regulation under a standard issued in 40 C.F.R. part 63 pursuant to 42 U.S.C. §7412(d), 42 U.S.C. §7412(h), or 42 U.S.C. §7412(j); or

(B) The owner or operator of the source has applied to the department through the preconstruction review process of K.A.R. 28-19-300, et seq., as required by paragraph (1) of this subsection for, and received from the department a final and effective case-by-case MACT determination pursuant to the provisions of subsection (d) of this regulation so that emissions of HAPs from the constructed or reconstructed source will be controlled to a

level no less stringent than the maximum achievable control technology emission limitation for new sources.

(d) Requirements. The owner or operator of a source subject to this regulation shall apply for the construction permit under 28-19-300, et seq. and comply with the provisions of 40 C.F.R. §63.43, as in effect as of July 1, 1997, which are adopted by reference, exempt for the following subsections of 40 C.F.R. §63.43:

(1) 40 C.F.R. §63.43(h)(1); and

(2) 40 C.F.R. §63.43(i).

(e) Requirements for constructed or reconstructed major sources subject to subsequently adopted MACT standard or MACT requirement. The owner or operator of each major source subject to this regulation shall comply with the applicable provisions of 40 C.F.R. §63.44, in effect as of July 1, 1997, which is adopted by reference. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 65-3005; implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 65-3008; effective Aug. 13, 1999.)

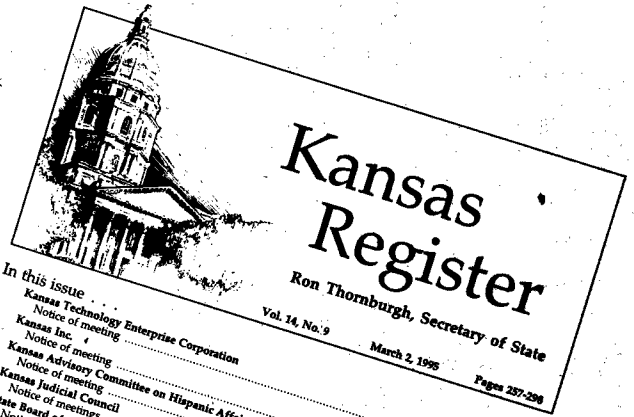
