State Corporation Commission**Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Thursday, January 27, in the first floor hearing room of the State Corporation Commission offices, 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed revisions to a Kansas motor carrier regulation, K.A.R. 82-4-3.

The proposed revisions to K.A.R. 82-4-3 require compliance with the applicable federal authority's rule if it imposes a higher standard of care than other laws, ordinances or regulations of the jurisdiction in which a commercial vehicle is being operated. The proposed revisions allow for a waiver of some physical defects in applicant drivers; relax certain restrictions for drivers engaged in transportation for agricultural operations; allow any law officer in the state who has received the appropriate certification to declare drivers out of service and to perform inspections in accordance with the applicable federal regulations; and provide updated references to many of the federal regulations adopted by reference and make technical changes. A primarily positive economic impact upon the commission, other agencies, private entities and individuals is expected.

The 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulation. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Paula Lentz, Assistant General Counsel, State Corporation Commission, 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, 66604. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to orally present their views regarding adoption of the proposed revisions to the regulation during the hearing.

Any person requiring accommodations under the Americans With Disabilities Act should give notice to the commission at least 10 days prior to the hearing date.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has received and reviewed an application for modification to an existing waste tire monofill from Champlin Tire Recycling, Inc. The existing tire monofill has been receiving tires since 1991 and is located in the SW of Section 34, Township 5 South, Range 2 West, in Cloud County, approximately 5 miles east of Concordia. The permit modification would consist of the addition of a waste tire disposal cell northwest of the existing tire monofill area. KDHE is providing public notice of its intent to amend Champlin Tire Recycling Inc.'s tire monofill permit to include the new disposal cell. The size of the new cell would be 7 acres and would be expected to last approximately six years.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has prepared two proposed Kansas Water Pollution Control Permits, A-UAKE-H002, for Todd Graham Commercial Finisher Site #1 located near Deerfield, and A-UAWH-H002, for Maple Creek Farms, LLC - Roberts 2 Site located near Leoti.

Todd Graham Commercial Finisher Site #1 proposes a new facility for the confined feeding of 43,200 head (17,280 animal units) of swine weighing more than 55 pounds. The proposed facility location is in the S2 of Section 20, Township 23S, Range 36W of Kearny County. Maple Creek Farms, LLC - Roberts 2 Site proposes a new facility for the confined feeding of 21,600 head (8,640 animal units) of swine weighing more than 55 pounds. The proposed facility location is in the SE/4 of Section 21, Township 20S, Range 38W of Wichita County. The proposed permits for Todd Graham Commercial Finisher Site #1 and Maple Creek Farms, LLC - Roberts 2 Site were placed on Public Notice No. KS-AG-99-180 and KS-AG-99-177, dated November 25, 1999. A public hearing has been scheduled in conformance with Kansas Administrative Regulation 28-16-61.

Public hearings on KDHE's intention to issue these proposed permits have been scheduled at 7 p.m. Tuesday, January 4, for Todd Graham Commercial Finishers Site #1, with the Maple Creek Farms, LLC - Roberts 2 Site hearing immediately following. The hearings will be conducted in the Lakin City Library conference room, 101 E. Prairie, Lakin.

Copies of the applicant's application, draft permit and other pertinent documents may be requested by contacting Dena Endsley, Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Bureau of Water, Livestock Waste Management Section, Forbes Field, Building 283, Topeka, 66620, (785) 296-6432 or fax (785) 296-5509. Appropriate copying charges will be assessed for each request.

Persons wishing to comment on the proposed permit may do so at the public hearing or may submit written statements to the above address by December 25. It is recommended that persons wishing to present oral testimony at the public hearing supply the hearing officer with a written copy of the testimony.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Environment, Bureau of Air and Radiation, will conduct a public hearing at 11 a.m. Thursday, January 27, in the main conference room, Building 283, Forbes Field, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed new air quality regulations K.A.R. 28-19-729 through 28-19-729h, and the adoption of a Hospital/Medical/Infectious Waste Incinerator Emissions Control Implementation Plan. These proposed new regulations implement federal requirements for the state to establish air emissions standards for existing hospital/medical/infectious waste incinerators. A summary of the proposed new regulations follows.

The department is proposing to adopt new Kansas Administrative Regulations 28-19-729 through 28-19-729h to implement the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's emissions guidelines for existing sources for hospital/medical/infectious waste incinerators (HMIWI). The purpose of the proposed regulations is to reduce emissions of air pollutants resulting from the incineration of wastes generated primarily by hospitals, clinics, nursing homes, veterinarians, laboratories and others in the health care industry. Section 129 of the federal Clean Air Act (CAA), as amended in 1990, directs the EPA to establish new source performance standards (NSPS) and emission guidelines for new and existing HMIWI, respectively. Section 111 of the CAA requires states that want to have the primary authority to regulate these sources adopt the EPA NSPS, and submit a plan to implement and enforce the emission guidelines to the EPA for review and approval. To be approved, state emission guideline plans must be at least as protective of the public health and the environment as are the EPA federal emission guidelines. The federal regulations for HMIWI were finalized on September 15, 1997. The state adopted the HMIWI NSPS effective June 11, 1999, when it updated the NSPS state regulation, 28-19-720.

K.A.R. 28-19-729 identifies the HMIWI facilities that will be subject to the standards proposed in the new regulations. The regulations provide for several exemptions from the regulations, which are consistent with the federal regulations.

K.A.R. 28-19-729a adopts by reference definitions from the federal NSPS and specifies the meaning of terms as they are to apply to the new proposed regulations.

K.A.R. 28-19-729b specifies the opacity limits, and the pollutant emission limits for PM, SO₂, HCl, NO_x, CO, Pb, Cd, Hg, CDD and CDF for HMIWI subject to the proposed regulations.

K.A.R. 28-19-729c outlines the schedule by which all existing HMIWI must be in compliance with the proposed new regulations.

K.A.R. 28-19-729d outlines the HMIWI operator training and qualification requirements, including the minimum acceptable elements of a HMIWI operator training

program, initial operator training and experience requirements, ongoing training updates and maintenance of qualified HMIWI operator status.

K.A.R. 28-19-729e summarizes the elements of an acceptable waste management plan, including strategies for reducing toxic emissions.

K.A.R. 28-19-729f establishes inspection requirements and lists the items to be inspected at a HMIWI facility, the frequency of required inspections, and corrective actions to be taken when components are found in need of replacement or repair during HMIWI inspections.

K.A.R. 28-19-729g contains the compliance, performance testing and monitoring requirements and adopts by reference 40 C.F.R. 60.56c and 40 C.F.R. 60.57c.

K.A.R. 28-19-729h contains the reporting and record keeping requirements for HMIWI subject to the proposed regulations.

The proposed implementation plan describes how the department will implement the proposed new air quality regulations, K.A.R. 28-19-729 through 28-19-729h. Section 111(d) of the federal Clean Air Act, as amended, requires states to submit to the EPA state plans to implement and enforce emission guidelines promulgated by the EPA. Regulations controlling the emissions of air pollutants from hospital/medical/infectious waste incinerators were published as final rules on September 15, 1997.

The time period between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulatory action. All interested parties may submit written comments by the close of business on the day of the hearing to Ralph J. Kieffer, Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Bureau of Air and Radiation, Building 283, Forbes Field, Topeka, 66620. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the proposed regulatory action during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to require each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Request for Comments

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is announcing its intent to issue an air quality construction permit to the Monarch Cement Company (Monarch) for modifications proposed at Monarch's facility, located in Humboldt. The proposed construction permit authorizes Monarch to modify the existing plant by installing precalciner furnaces on kilns numbered 4 and 5. A new finish mill also is to be installed. The long dry cement kiln at the facility is to remain in service. Coal, natural gas, petroleum coke and tires are to be burned in the kilns and precalciners to supply the thermal energy necessary for the cement manufacturing processes. Installation of the precalciner furnaces will allow the cement clinker production of the facility to be increased.

The proposed permit is to be issued in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-17, prevention of significant deterioration (PSD), which adopt the federal standards, procedures and requirements of 40 CFR 52.21 by reference. These air quality regulations apply to major stationary emission sources located in areas designated as "attainment" under the federal Clean Air Act (CAA). Attainment areas are areas where the air quality meets or is better than the national ambient air quality standards (NAAQS).

The PSD regulations require evaluation of emission reduction techniques to identify the best available control technology (BACT) for each pollutant for which there will be a significant net emissions increase. The purpose of BACT is to effect the maximum degree of reduction achievable, taking into account energy, environmental and economic impacts for each pollutant under review. Evaluation of the estimated emissions for the proposed modifications indicates that there will be a significant net emissions increase for oxides of sulfur (SO₂), nitrogen ox-

ides (NO_x) and carbon monoxide (CO). Monarch conducted the required BACT analyses and has determined that the most efficient and cost effective control technology for SO₂ would be inherent dry scrubbing. BACT for control for NO_x and CO was determined to consist of installation, operation and maintenance of a computerized network of process control and emissions monitoring equipment, combined with a comprehensive employee training program. Operation of the cement plant by trained personnel using computer aided process control and monitoring equipment is commonly referred to as implementation of "good combustion practices" or GCP.

The Monarch project will trigger the PSD baseline date for all PSD increment pollutants. Monarch completed the required modeling, using methods approved by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. Consumption of the available increments for SO₂ was found to be 162.6 micrograms per cubic meter (ug/m³), 75 ug/m³ and 14.2 ug/m³ for the 3-hour, 24-hour and annual averaging periods, respectively. The allowable PSD increments for SO₂ are 512, 91 and 20 ug/m³, respectively. For NO_x, only an annual increment has been established. The modeling found that the proposed project would consume 23.5 ug/m³ of the available NO_x increment. The allowable annual increment available for NO_x is 25 ug/m³.

The PSD regulations also require an evaluation of the impacts, if any, that emissions from the proposed modifications may have on the ambient air quality, visibility, vegetation and soils. Monarch has conducted the required analyses. The results of the analyses conclude that there should be no significant impacts on the ambient air quality, visibility, local vegetation or soils.

A public comment period has been established from November 25 to January 3 to allow citizens the opportunity to express any concerns or comments they may have about this permitting action. A public hearing is scheduled from 7 to 10 p.m. December 29 at the First Commercial Bank, 725 Bridge, Humboldt. All comments should be submitted in writing to Harish Agarwal, Air Permit Section Chief, KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, Forbes Field, Building 283, Topeka, 66620.

The bids shall be considered and thereafter acted upon by the Board of Education of the school district at its regular meeting time of 7 p.m. to be held in the Senior High School Library on Monday, December 13, 1999. No oral or auction bids for the bonds shall be considered, and no bids for less than the entire amount of the bonds shall be considered.

Bids shall be accepted only on the official bid form that has been prepared for these bonds, which may be ob-

tained from the clerk of the school district or from the school district's financial advisor. Bids may be submitted by mail or delivered in person, and must be received at the place and not later than the date and time hereinbefore specified. (Provisions for telephoning or telefaxing a bid are set forth in the official notice of bond sale.) Each bid shall be accompanied by a good faith deposit in the form of a certified or cashier's check drawn on a bank located within the United States and made payable to the order of the school district, or in the form of a financial surety bond payable to the order of the school district and meeting requirements therefor as set forth in the official notice of bond sale, and shall be in an amount equal to 2 percent of the principal amount of the bonds.

Details of the Bonds

The bonds to be sold are in the aggregate principal amount of \$1,055,000. The bonds shall be issued as fully registered bonds in the denomination of \$5,000, or any integral multiple thereof not exceeding the principal amount of the bonds maturing in any year. The bonds shall bear a dated date of December 15, 1999. The bonds shall bear interest, payable as hereinafter set forth, at the rates specified by the successful bidder for the bonds. The bonds shall be subject to redemption prior to their respective maturities as set forth in the official notice of bond sale.

Interest on the bonds shall be payable semiannually on April 1 and October 1 of each year, commencing April 1, 2001, and the bonds shall mature serially on October 1 in each of the years and principal amounts as follows:

Payment of Principal and Interest

The Kansas State Treasurer shall serve as the bond registrar and paying agent for the bonds, and the principal of the bonds shall be paid upon surrender at the paying agent's principal offices in the City of Topeka, Kansas. Interest shall be paid by the mailing of a check or draft of the paying agent to the registered owners of the bonds.

Security for the Bonds

The bonds and the interest thereon constitute general obligations of the school district, and the full faith, credit and resources of the school district will be pledged to the payment thereof. The school district will be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes without limitation as to rate or amount upon all of the taxable tangible property within the territorial limits of the school district for the purpose of paying the bonds and the interest thereon.

Delivery of the Bonds

The bonds, duly printed, executed and registered, shall be furnished and delivered at the expense of the school district to the successful bidder, or at its direction, on or before Thursday, December 23, 1999, at such location in the State of Kansas or Kansas City, Missouri, as may be

specified by the successful bidder. Delivery elsewhere shall be made at the expense of the successful bidder.

Legal Opinion

The bonds will be sold subject to the legal opinion of Hinkle Elkouri Law Firm L.L.C., Wichita, Kansas, bond counsel, whose fees will be paid by the school district. Bond counsel's approving legal opinion as to the validity of the bonds will be printed on the bonds and delivered to the successful bidder upon delivery of the bonds. (Reference is made to the official notice of bond sale for a discussion of tax exemption and other legal matters.)

Financial Matters

The school district's equalized assessed tangible valuation for computation of bonded debt limitations is \$56,107,340. Including the bonds described herein, on December 15, 1999, the school district's outstanding bonded indebtedness will be \$13,830,000.

Official Statement

The school district has prepared a preliminary official statement relating to the bonds, copies of which may be obtained from the school district or the school district's financial advisor. The preliminary official statement is in a form "deemed final" by the school district for the purpose of Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12(b)(1), but is subject to revision, amendment and completion in the final official statement. Upon the sale of the bonds, the school district shall furnish the successful bidder with a reasonable number of copies of the final official statement, without additional cost, upon request. Copies of the final official statement in excess of a reasonable number may be ordered by the successful bidder at its expense.

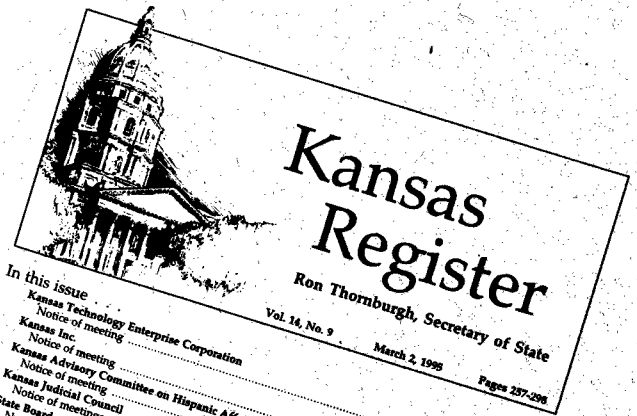
