Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Tuesday, February 22, in the SRS board room, sixth floor, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, to consider the adoption of amendments to an existing rule and regulation on a permanent basis effective April 1, 2000. Telephone conference will not be available.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the proposed regulation. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to or during the public hearing to Hope Burns, Office of the Secretary for SRS, Room 603-N, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views; however, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Copies of the regulation and the economic impact statement may be obtained by contacting Hope Burns at (785) 296-3969.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Hope Burns or by calling the Kansas Relay Center at 1-800-766-3777.

The adoption of the regulation will take place at 11 a.m. Monday, February 28, in the SRS executive conference room, 603-N, Docking State Office Building. Telephone conference will not be available.

A summary of the proposed regulation and the economic impact follows.

Article 5.—PROVIDER PARTICIPATION, SCOPE OF SERVICES, AND REQUIREMENTS FOR THE MEDICAID (MEDICAL ASSISTANCE) PROGRAM

30-5-64. Prior authorization. Lists by class those pharmaceuticals that require prior authorization for any of the following reasons:

- To assure that provision of the service is medically necessary.
- To assure that services that may be subject to overuse are monitored for appropriateness in each case; and
- To assure that services are delivered in a cost-effective manner.

The proposed changes remove several drug classes from the prior authorization list and add monoclonal antibody for respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) and drugs for the treatment of obesity to the list. These changes are not required by federal law.

Anticipated Economic Impact: The proposed changes are considered cost neutral for SRS except for adding the class of pharmaceuticals for the treatment of obesity. Adding these drugs may result in an initial increase in the costs in the pharmacy budget, but it can be anticipated that there will be an overall decrease in the costs in the Medicaid budget. The dollar impact is difficult to determine. SRS does not anticipate an economic impact on other governmental agencies, private businesses or individuals.

Less Costly or Intrusive Methods: No other method was appropriate for the desired outcome.

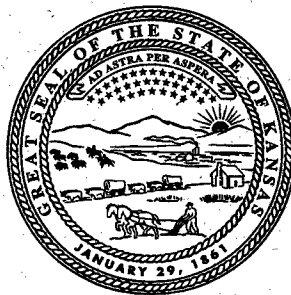

Jackson, Topeka, regarding the proposed issuance by the Authority of approximately \$6,090,000 of its Health Facilities Revenue Bonds for Deaconess Long Term Care, Inc. (the borrower). A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Friday, February 18, in the lower level conference room at 1100 S.W. Wanamaker, Topeka, to consider the adoption of regulations 117-6-3 and 117-8-1.

This 60-day notice of public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Kansas Real Estate Appraisal Board, 1100 S.W. Wanamaker, Suite 104, Topeka, 66604. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

The proposed regulation amendments are for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed amendments to the regulations and the economic impact follows.

117-6-3. Education; obtaining course approval. This regulation is being amended to clarify the specific course that all course providers must use when offering the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice course to students. This amendment also will eliminate tentative approval of courses and require providers of courses to submit the course application fee with the original application. Since the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal course is already required for new applicants and licensed/certified appraisers, it will have no economic impact to appraisers. The course provider is currently required to use the most current information (including current USPAP manual and course information) when offering this course. Therefore, it should have little or no economic impact to the course provider and no economic impact to the other agencies or the general public.

117-8-1. Uniform standards of professional appraisal practice. This regulation is being amended so that the board can adopt the current edition of Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice (USPAP) by reference. USPAP is updated on an annual basis. There will be no economic impact to appraisers, state agencies or the public.

Notice to Consulting Engineers

The State Corporation Commission is inviting all consulting firms interested in providing engineering services for a jointly-conducted project with the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation to prequalify themselves with the Conservation Division. The project covered under this notice will focus on determining and refining treatment options and costs associated with beneficial use of chloride contaminated groundwater.

In order to prequalify, the firm must:

1. Have an engineer who is licensed and registered with the State Board of Technical Professions.
2. Be able to demonstrate past experience in working on brine contamination projects with an emphasis on reviewing and analyzing treatment options.
3. Be able to demonstrate past experience in working on groundwater projects in the area of the Equus Beds Aquifer.

**Permanent Administrative
Regulations**

Article 44.—SUPPORT ENFORCEMENT

30-44-2. Standardized cost recovery fee. (a) As used in this regulation, the following definitions shall apply:

(1) "Applicant or recipient" means a person who has applied for or is receiving support enforcement services from the department of social and rehabilitation services pursuant to Part D of Title IV of the federal social security act, 42 U.S.C. §651 *et seq.*, as amended.

(2) "IV-D case" means a case in which the department of social and rehabilitation services is providing support enforcement services pursuant to Part D of Title IV of the federal social security act, 42 U.S.C. §651 *et seq.*, as amended.

(3) As used in this rule and regulation, the following definitions shall apply:

(A) "Non-PA case" means a case in which the applicant or recipient or the child, as appropriate, has not received and is not currently receiving public assistance from the state of Kansas, including the following:

(1) Aid to families with dependent children (AFDC) or temporary assistance to needy families (TANF), regardless of how designated;

(2) medical services;

(3) care due to placement under chapter 38 of the Kansas statutes annotated and amendments thereto; or

(4) care in a state institution as defined in K.S.A. 59-2006b and amendments thereto.

(B) "Non-PA case" shall also mean, in any IV-D case in which the applicant or recipient or the child previously received but is not currently receiving public assistance from the state of Kansas, that portion of the case not subject to any assignment of support rights for reimbursement of public assistance.

(C) In an interstate IV-D case referred to Kansas by another state, unless the other state clearly designates otherwise, "Non-PA case" shall mean a case, or that portion of a case, designated as IV-D non-AFDC or IV-D non-TANF.

(D) "Non-PA" case shall not include any IV-D case referred to Kansas from a foreign country.

(b) A cost recovery fee shall be collected in all Non-PA cases. The fee shall be retained from support collections made on behalf of the applicant or recipient. If any fee remains unpaid and the applicant or recipient will receive no further support collections in the Non-PA case, the fee shall be remitted by the applicant or recipient upon demand.

(c) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (d), the fee shall be in an amount equal to the basic rate times the amount of support collections distributed to the applicant or recipient. The date of collection shall determine the applicable basic rate. The basic rate shall be two percent through December 31, 1999. Beginning January 1, 2000, the basic rate shall be four percent.

(continued)

(d)(1) As needed, but no more frequently than annually, Kansas counties shall be identified in which the average fee income per case will exceed the average actual cost of required activities. The counties shall be identified in consultation with the judicial administrator. The average fee income per case shall be estimated by first multiplying the fee rate established in subsection (c) of this regulation times the estimated average of current monthly support obligations for the county and then multiplying the result by 12. The average cost per case of required activities shall be based upon the estimated actual cost of providing services during the next twelve months using state employees. Costs for activities required less frequently than annually shall be prorated.

(2) A special fee rate shall be established for each county identified under paragraph (d)(1) of this regulation. The special fee rate shall be in an amount likely to produce average fee income per case less than, but as close as possible to, the average cost per case of required activities. If there is a district court trustee for the county, the special fee rate shall be the same as the rate charged by the district court trustee in non-IV-D cases pursuant to K.S.A. 23-497 and amendments thereto, if the trustee's fee rate does not exceed the fee rate established in subsection (c) of this regulation.

(3) Any county that has had a special fee rate in effect may be reevaluated to determine whether the special fee rate is still needed and, if so, the appropriate fee rate. The reevaluation shall not occur more frequently than annually.

(4) A list shall be maintained of the special fee rates currently in effect and the counties to which the special fee rates apply. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 39-756; effective Feb. 6, 1995; amended Jan. 3, 2000.)

Permanent Administrative Regulations

Article 1.—GENERAL RULES

71-1-13. Sterilization and infection control. (a) As used in this regulation, the following definitions shall apply:

(1) "Dental health care worker" means dentist, dental hygienist, dental assistant, or other employee of the dentist, or any other person who performs or participates in an invasive or exposure-prone procedure or functions ancillary to invasive procedures.

(2) "Exposure-prone procedure" means a procedure in which there is an increased risk of percutaneous injury to the dental health care worker by virtue of digital palpation of a needle tip or other sharp instrument in a body cavity or simultaneous presence of the dental health care worker's fingers and a needle or other sharp instruments in a poorly visualized or highly confined anatomic site,

or any other circumstance in which there is a significant risk of contact between the blood or body fluids of the dental health care worker and the blood or body fluids of the patient.

(3) "HBeAg seropositive" means that the presence of the hepatitis B antigen has been confirmed by a test meeting the criteria of federal centers for disease control.

(4) "HBV" means the hepatitis B virus.

(5) "HIV" means the human immunodeficiency virus.

(6) "HIV seropositive" means that the presence of HIV antibodies has been confirmed by a test meeting the criteria of the federal centers for disease control.

(7) "Invasive procedure" means any surgical or other diagnostic or therapeutic procedure involving manual or instrumental contact with or entry into any blood, body fluids, cavity, internal organ, subcutaneous tissue, mucous membrane, or percutaneous wound of the human body.

(b) Each dental health care worker who performs or participates in an invasive or exposure-prone procedure shall observe and adhere to infection control practices and universal blood and body fluid precautions. For the purpose of infection control, all dental staff members and all patients shall be considered potential carriers of communicable diseases. Infection control procedures shall be required to prevent disease transmission from patient to doctor and staff, doctor and staff to patient, and patient to patient. Each dentist shall be required to comply with the applicable standard of care in effect at the time of treatment. Precautions shall include the following minimum standards.

(1) Each dental health care worker shall routinely use protective barriers and surface decontamination.

(A) Gloves shall be used by the dentist and direct care staff during any treatment involving procedures or contact with items potentially contaminated with the patient's bodily fluids or other dental debris. Fresh gloves shall be used for each patient. Gloves that have been used for dental treatment shall not be reused for any other purpose.

(B) Surgical masks and protective eyewear or chin-length plastic face shields shall be worn to protect the face, the oral mucosa, and the nasal mucosa when splashing or splattering of blood or other body fluids is likely.

(C) Reusable or disposable gowns, laboratory coats, or uniforms shall be worn when clothing is likely to be soiled with blood or other body fluids. If reusable gowns are worn, they may be washed, using a normal laundry cycle. Gowns shall be changed at least daily or when visibly soiled with blood.

(D) Surface decontamination and disinfection or protective barriers shall be used in areas of the dental operatory that may be contaminated by blood or saliva during treatment and are not removable to be sterilized. Contaminated surface coverings shall be removed, discarded, and then replaced with clean material between patients. Surfaces to be covered or decontaminated and disinfected shall include the following:

- (i) The delivery unit;
- (ii) chair controls;
- (iii) light handles;
- (iv) the high-volume evacuator handle;

- (v) x-ray heads and controls;
- (vi) headrests; and
- (vii) instrument trays.

(E) Dental health care workers shall wash their hands after glove removal if the hands have been contaminated by bodily fluids or other dental debris.

(F) Dental health care workers who have exudative lesions or weeping dermatitis shall refrain from all direct patient care and from handling patient care devices used in exposure-prone invasive procedures, unless covered by an effective barrier.

(2) Dental health care workers shall take appropriate precautions to prevent injuries caused by needles, scalpels, and other sharp instruments during and after procedures. If during a single visit a patient needs multiple injections over time from a single syringe, the needle shall be recapped or placed in a sterile field between each use to avoid the possibility of needlestick injury or needle contamination. Used sharp items shall be placed in puncture-resistant containers for disposal.

(3) Any heat-stable instrument or device that enters tissue or contacts the mucous membranes shall be sterilized. Dental health care workers shall comply with the following sterilization requirements.

(A) Before sterilization, all instruments shall be decontaminated to remove all visible surface contamination, including blood, saliva, tooth and dental restorative material cuttings and debris, soft tissue debris, and bacterial plaque. Decontamination of instruments may be accomplished by a thorough scrubbing with soap and water or detergent, or by using a mechanical device, including an ultrasonic cleaner. Persons involved in cleaning instruments shall take reasonable precautions to prevent injuries.

(B) Heat-stable dental instruments shall be routinely sterilized between patient use by one of the following methods:

- (i) Steam under pressure autoclaves;
- (ii) heat plus pressurized chemical (unsaturated formaldehyde or alcohol);
- (iii) vapor chemoclave;
- (iv) prolonged dry heat exposure;
- (v) dry heat convection sterilizers;
- (vi) ethylene oxide sterilizers; or
- (vii) other equivalent methods.

(C) Biological spore testing devices shall be used on each sterilization unit after each six days of use, but not less often than each month, to verify that all pathogens have been killed. A log of spore testing shall be kept for three years for each sterilization unit.

(D) Items to be sterilized shall include the following:

- (i) Low-speed handpiece contra-angles and prophyl-angles;
- (ii) high-speed handpieces;
- (iii) hand instruments;
- (iv) burs;
- (v) endodontic instruments;
- (vi) air-water syringe tips;
- (vii) high-volume evacuator tips;
- (viii) surgical instruments; and
- (ix) sonic or ultrasonic periodontal scalers.

(E) When sterilizing the heat-stable instruments or devices listed in paragraphs (b)(3)(D)(i) through (ix), each instrument or device shall be placed in a closed bag or container for sterilization and thereafter maintained in that bag or container until immediately before use.

(F) Following the sterilization of heat-stable instruments or devices not listed in paragraphs (b)(3)(D)(i) through (ix), each instrument or device shall be maintained in covered storage until immediately before use.

(G) Nondisposable items used in noninvasive procedures that cannot be heat sterilized shall be decontaminated and disinfected with a chemical sterilant that has been registered by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and is tuberculocidal.

(H) Materials, impressions, and intra-oral appliances shall be decontaminated and disinfected before being sent to and upon return from a commercial dental laboratory.

(I) A dental health care worker who is HBeAg seropositive or HIV seropositive, or who otherwise knows or should know that the worker carries and is capable of transmitting HBV or HIV, shall not thereafter perform or participate directly in an exposure-prone procedure unless the worker has sought counsel from an expert review panel. The expert review panel shall be composed of these individuals:

- (i) The dental health care worker's personal physician;
- (ii) an infectious disease specialist with expertise in HIV and HBV transmission;
- (iii) a dentist licensed in the state of Kansas with expertise in procedures performed by the health care worker; and
- (iv) a state of Kansas or local public health official.

(c) Reports and information furnished to the Kansas dental board relative to the HBeAg or HIV status of a dental health care worker shall not be deemed to constitute a public record but shall be deemed and maintained by the board as confidential and privileged as a medical record. These reports and this information shall not be subject to disclosure by means of subpoena in any judicial, administrative, or investigative proceeding, if the dental health care worker adheres to the regulations of the board and is willing to participate in counseling and be reviewed and monitored by the board or its designated agent.

(d) When the board learns that a dental health care worker is HBeAg or HIV seropositive, contact shall be made with that dental health care worker to review the regulations of the board and develop a process of monitoring that individual's practice.

(e) The monitoring of a dental health care worker's HIV or HBV status and discipline of the dental health care worker shall be reported to the Kansas department of health and environment, but shall remain confidential.

(f) During business hours, the office of a licensed dentist may be inspected by the Kansas dental board or its duly authorized agents and employees in order to evaluate compliance with this regulation. A written evaluation shall be given to the licensed person or office representative, and a copy shall be filed with the Kansas dental board. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-1406; implementing

111-2-97. Corporate Pick 3 sales promotion. In addition to compensation specified in K.A.R. 111-2-4 and 111-2-6, the Kansas lottery shall also offer the following as a bonus incentive to enhance the sale of Pick 3 tickets to the following corporate chains:

(a) The Pick 3 sales promotion will commence at 6:00 a.m. on Wednesday, December 1, 1999, and end at the end of the business day as defined at K.A.R. 111-6-1 on Friday, December 31, 1999.

(b) The base period used for the contest shall be December 1, 1998, through December 31, 1998. A minimum base of \$20 will be established for participating retailers.

(c) At the end of the Pick 3 sales promotion, all retailers will be awarded a \$1 free instant Kansas lottery ticket for each one dollar increase of Pick 3 sales over the base period. A maximum of one hundred \$1 instant Kansas lottery tickets will be awarded per retailer. (b) Every day in December 1999, all listed retailers selling Kansas lottery tickets will ask every adult customer making a purchase if the customer would like to purchase a lottery ticket. If the employee fails to ask adult customers for the purchase of a lottery ticket and the customer brings it to the clerk's attention before leaving the premises, the retailer shall give the adult customer one \$1.00 instant lottery ticket at no charge.

(c) All retailer employees at each location shall wear promotional buttons and display special point-of-sale materials provided by the lottery each day from 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. during the promotion announcing the promotion to its customers. These promotional materials consist of:

(1) A tent card to be displayed at the point where tickets are sold.

(2) A window/monitor banner to be displayed at the front entrance of the business and/or below the lottery information display system monitor.

These materials must be on display during all hours of the promotion at the times and dates established in subsections (b) and (c) for a store to be eligible for a prize.

(d) The Kansas lottery will provide each location with a credit of \$25. This will be credited to each store's account at the beginning of the promotion.

(e) Any tickets given away above the \$25 allowance representing 25 tickets per location will be the responsibility of the retailers identified in subsection (a). Any credit from subsection (d) remaining following the promotion may be retained by the retailers identified in subsection (a).

(f) Each retail location shall maintain a ticket log form to be completed every time a lottery ticket is given away. The log will be picked up by the Kansas lottery district manager servicing the retailer location at the end of the promotion.

(g) At the end of the promotion, each store will receive promotional items selected by the lottery. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8708; effective, T-111-11-30-99, Nov. 19, 1999.)

111-2-99. "Ask for the sale" promotion. (a) During the period beginning January 1, 2000, and ending January 31, 2000, in addition to compensation provided for in K.A.R. 111-2-4, the Kansas lottery also offers the R & C stores in Kansas an opportunity to participate in a bonus retailer "ask for the sale" incentive promotion of lottery tickets.

(b) On each Wednesday in January 2000, including January 5, 12, 19 and 26, all R & C personnel selling Kansas lottery tickets will ask every adult customer making a purchase if the customer would like to purchase a lottery ticket. If the employee fails to ask adult customers for the purchase of a lottery ticket and the customer

brings it to the clerk's attention before leaving the premises, the retailer shall give the adult customer one \$1.00 instant lottery ticket at no charge.

(c) All retailer employees at each location shall wear promotional buttons and display special point-of-sale materials provided by the lottery each Wednesday from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. during the promotion announcing the promotion to its customers. These promotional materials consist of:

(1) A tent card to be displayed at the point where tickets are sold.

(2) A window/monitor banner to be displayed at the front entrance of the business and/or below the lottery information display system monitor.

(3) Promotion specific buttons. These materials must be on display during all hours of the promotion at the times and dates established in subsections (b) and (c) for a store to be eligible for a prize.

(d) The Kansas lottery will provide each location with a credit of \$25. This will be credited to each store's account at the beginning of the promotion.

(e) Any tickets given away above the \$25 allowance representing 25 tickets per location will be the responsibility of the regional R & C stores.

(f) Each retail location shall maintain a ticket log form to be completed every time a lottery ticket is given away. The log will be picked up by the Kansas lottery district manager servicing the retailer location at the end of the promotion.

(g) At the end of the promotion, the R & C store with the greatest percentage increase in total sales for the period from January 1, 2000, to January 31, 2000, over the base period from January 1, 1999, to January 31, 1999, will win a pack of instant tickets and promotional items. The second and third place stores will receive promotional items provided by the lottery. Article 4.—INSTANT GAME RULES

111-4-1591. Name of game. The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Harley Davidson" commencing on or after November 29, 1999. The specific rules for the "Harley Davidson" game are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-1591 through 111-4-1595. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-11-30-99, Nov. 19, 1999.)

111-4-1592. Definitions. The following definitions shall apply to the "Harley Davidson" instant lottery game:

(a) "Play symbols" are the numbers, letters, symbols, or pictures printed in each of the four play areas of each instant game ticket and which determine if the ticket bearer is entitled to a prize. In this instant game, the play symbols are printed in black ink with matching captions. A play symbol appears in the 31 play spots within the four play areas. Each play symbol for this instant game

(b) "Play symbol captions" are the words or portions of words, letters or numbers printed beneath each game symbol in the play area and are used to repeat or explain the play symbol. The play symbol caption associated with each play symbol is as follows:

ber appearing on each ticket which is used to validate winning tickets. For this instant game, the ticket validation number is an 11-digit number which appears below the game symbols under the latex covering in the play area on the front of each instant ticket.

(d) "Book-ticket number" means the unique number appearing on each ticket which includes the number of the book from which it was removed and the serially assigned number of the ticket within that book. For this instant game, the book-ticket number is an 8-digit book number followed by a dash and then a 3-digit ticket number. The ticket numbers in each book start with 000 and end with 059. The book-ticket number is printed in black ink on the back of each instant game ticket both above the information form and below the bar code.

(e) "Retailer validation code" means the small letters found under removable covering in the play area of each instant game ticket. The retailer uses this code to verify and validate winners which are to be paid by the retailer. In this instant game, the retailer validation code is a three-letter code printed and appearing in three of eight varying locations among the play symbols in each of the four play areas. The codes and their meanings are as follows: FRE = FREE TICKET; FIV = \$5.00; TEN = \$10.00; FTN = \$15.00; SXN = \$16.00; TWY = \$20.00; TRY = \$30.00; FRY = \$40.00; FTY = \$50.00; HUN = \$100.00; THY = \$250.00.

(f) "Bar code" means the 16-digit bar-coded number appearing on the back of each ticket. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-11-30-99, Nov. 19, 1999.)

111-4-1593. Cost of ticket. The price of "Harley Davidson" instant tickets sold by a retailer shall be \$5.00 each. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-11-30-99, Nov. 19, 1999.)

111-4-1594. Determination of instant prize winners. An instant prize winner is determined for this instant game when the player removes or "scratches off" the removable layer of material covering the four separate play areas entitled "GAME 1," "GAME 2," "GAME 3" and "GAME 4" to reveal the game symbols and captions in each play area.

"GAME 1" is a key number match game. The player removes the scratch-off material to reveal two "LUCKY NUMBERS" and 10 "YOUR NUMBERS" with a prize amount below each of the "YOUR NUMBERS." If any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" match either of the "LUCKY NUMBERS," the player wins the prize shown below that matched number. If the prize won is a "HARLEY-DAVIDSON MOTORCYCLE," a player wins \$15,000, which may be exchanged for a Harley-Davidson Sportster® 1220 Custom™. A player can win 10 times in this game play area.

(f) "Bar code" means the 16-digit bar-coded number appearing on the back of each ticket. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-11-30-99, Nov. 19, 1999.)

111-4-1612. Cost of ticket. The price of "Wheel of Fortune" instant tickets sold by a retailer shall be \$3.00 each. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-11-30-99, Nov. 19, 1999.)

111-4-1613. Determination of instant prize winners. "Wheel of Fortune" is a ticket with three different games featuring three distinct play areas.

Game 1 is a letter match game. An instant prize winner is determined for this game when the player removes or "scratches off" the removable layer of material covering the play area to reveal two "WHEEL LETTERS" and eight "YOUR LETTERS" with a prize amount below each of the "YOUR LETTERS." If any of the "YOUR LETTERS" match either of the "WHEEL LETTERS," a player wins the prize shown below that matched letter. A player can win eight times in this play area.

Game 2 is an instant bonus game. A player removes the scratch-off material covering the play area. If a wheel symbol is revealed, a player wins \$100 instantly. A player can win one time in this play area.

Game 3 is an instant win game. A player removes the scratch-off material covering the play area. If a prize

amount is revealed, the player wins that prize instantly. A player can win one time in this play area.

A player can win up to 10 times on a single ticket.

There is a second-chance drawing to win one of six trips to a "Wheel of Fortune" game show audition. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 74-8710(b), (c) and (i); implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 74-8710(b), (c) and (i), and K.S.A. 74-8720(b) and (d); effective, T-111-11-30-99, Nov. 19, 1999.)

111-4-1614. Number and value of instant prizes.

111-4-1615. Name of drawing. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a drawing entitled "Wheel of Fortune Drawing," and will accept entries starting the date "Wheel of Fortune" instant tickets become available for the drawing to be conducted at 10:00 a.m. on May 5, 2000. Rules applicable to the "Wheel of Fortune Drawing" are contained in K.A.R. 111-4-1615 through 111-4-1620 and

K.A.R. 111-6-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-11-30-99, Nov. 19, 1999.)

111-4-1616. Prize. The six prize winners selected in the "Wheel of Fortune Drawing" on the date specified in K.A.R. 111-4-1615 shall receive a vacation in Hollywood, California, for two people, including hotel room and room taxes for four days and three nights, round-trip air transportation from Kansas City, Missouri, to Los Angeles, California, round-trip ground transfers between the Los Angeles airport and the hotel, cash, and an audition on the Wheel of Fortune television game show. The prize of each trip, including the trip and cash, will have a total value of \$5,000. The following restrictions shall apply to the Los Angeles Wheel of Fortune audition prize packages:

(a) Vacation packages are non-transferable and cannot be redeemed for cash.

(b) The trips and auditions are subject to availability and all scheduling shall be handled by Media Drop-In, Inc. Any meals, drinks, gratuities, and taxes that are not specifically mentioned, are not included.

(c) All prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs and deductions authorized by law.

(d) The winner of a prize as the result of the "Wheel of Fortune Drawing" shall claim the prize within 45 days in which his or her ticket was drawn or the person named on the ticket drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn pursuant to subsection (d) of K.A.R. 111-4-1619 shall be declared the winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-11-30-99, Nov. 19, 1999.)

111-4-1617. Method of entry. (a) Entry into the "Wheel of Fortune Drawing" to be conducted on May 5, 2000, shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) Obtain a valid "Wheel of Fortune" Kansas instant lottery ticket;

(2) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with "Wheel of Fortune" instant game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the "Wheel of Fortune Drawing" and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules;

(3) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for the drawing and the holder of the ticket may enter the "Wheel of Fortune Drawing."

(4) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on a non-winning ticket entered.

(5) Place one non-winning "Wheel of Fortune" ticket into an envelope no larger than 4 3/4 inches x 11 inches and mail it to: "Wheel of Fortune Drawing," c/o Kansas lottery, P. O. Box 7777, Lawrence, Kansas 66044-7777. Entries in envelopes of a larger size and envelopes containing more than one non-winning "Wheel of Fortune" ticket shall be ineligible for the drawings and shall be destroyed by lottery security. Mailed entries must be received by morning mail pickup on May 2, 2000.

(6) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the "Wheel of Fortune Drawing" or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner;

(7) The drawing will be conducted at the approximate times listed in K.A.R. 111-4-1615.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make.

(c) All eligible non-winning tickets which are mailed and received by the morning mail pickup in Lawrence, Kansas, on Tuesday, May 2, 2000, shall be entered into the "Wheel of Fortune Drawing."

(d) Eligible entrants in any "Wheel of Fortune Drawing" must be 18 years of age or older.

(e) Completing the information form on the non-winning ticket and entering the ticket into the drawing constitutes authorization to publicly identify the person whose entry is drawn. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-11-30-99, Nov. 19, 1999.)

111-4-1618. Certification of drawing. (a) The "Wheel of Fortune Drawing" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department.

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 74-8710(b); effective, T-111-11-30-99, Nov. 19, 1999.)

111-4-1619. Selection of winners. The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "Wheel of Fortune Drawing":

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing "Wheel of Fortune Drawing" entries at the United States Post Office in Lawrence, Kansas, with final pick up on Tuesday, May 2, 2000.

(b) Lottery personnel shall transport the mail to the mail room where the envelopes will be retained in mail trays.

(c) The drawing shall be held at the lottery headquarters in a place accessible to the public and open for public attendance with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(d) At the start of the Friday, May 5, 2000 drawing, lottery security personnel shall present the mail trays, each containing approximately the same number of entries, to the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. The designated individual shall insert a plastic divider into each mail tray between the entry envelopes and pull the envelope which is either behind or to the right side of the divider and place it in the drum. This procedure shall be repeated until 10 entry envelopes have been pulled from each mail tray and placed in the drum.

(e) Immediately following the placement of entry envelopes into the drum and prior to each drawing, the drum shall be sealed and the contents mixed by rotating the drum 10 times. The designated individual shall then unseal the receptacle or drum, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove six tickets, one at a time, from the receptacle or drum. The person whose

name appears on each of the entries shall be the winner of the prize identified in K.A.R. 111-4-1616, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(f) After the ticket has been drawn and the entry has been verified as valid by lottery security, six more entries will be drawn, one at a time, to serve as alternate entries. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, 5A, and 6A and marked with the draw date. The alternate ticket entries will be used only if the original winners cannot be located or are declared ineligible. The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn.

(g) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each ticket drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the "Wheel of Fortune Drawing" in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner and the winner shall be promptly notified.

(h) If the entry is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.

(i) Non-winning "Wheel of Fortune" entry tickets are eligible for all drawings.

(j) All "Wheel of Fortune" tickets remaining in the drum or receptacle on May 5, 2000, after the winners have been selected and certified, shall be destroyed. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 74-8710(b); effective, T-111-11-30-99, Nov. 19, 1999.)

111-4-1620. Rights of participants. Any Kansas "Wheel of Fortune" ticket entered into the "Wheel of Fortune Drawing" is disqualified from any other Kansas lottery prize or eligibility for which that ticket may have been redeemable. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 74-8710(d); effective, T-111-11-30-99, Nov. 19, 1999.)

(b) The maximum prize awarded per game per ticket shall be \$100,000 regardless of the amount wagered per game, except as provided by the bull's-eye option as specified in K.A.R. 111-7-80a.

(c) A player is eligible to receive only the highest prize per game played on a ticket, except as increased by the progressive jackpot bonus and the bull's-eye option.

(d) The progressive jackpot bonus applies only to a player choosing either the 6 spot or 7 spot game with starting 6 spot prizes for matching six of six numbers selected being \$50 higher than the Keno prize of \$1,000, and starting 7 spot prizes for matching seven of seven numbers selected being \$100 higher than the Keno prize of \$2,000. The progressive jackpot bonus shall be funded as follows:

(1) A total of .70 percent of Keno sales from the previous Keno game shall be applied to the bonus jackpot for the 6 spot game for each drawing after the starting progressive jackpot until the jackpot is won. Fractional cents

will not be applied. The first drawing after a jackpot is won starts with a minimum progressive jackpot bonus minimum of \$50.

(2) A total of .35 percent of Keno sales from the previous Keno games shall be applied to the bonus jackpot for the 7 spot game for each drawing after the starting progressive jackpot until the jackpot is won. Fractional cents will not be applied. The first drawing after a jackpot is won starts with a minimum progressive jackpot bonus minimum of \$100.

(3) If the progressive jackpot bonus is not won, it will continue to grow as stated in subsection (d)(1) and (d)(2) above.

(4) The prize money allocated to the progressive jackpot prize bonus shall be distributed on a parimutuel basis by dividing the bonus prize equally by the number of dollars wagered for each winning combination of numbers for the same game.

(5) All progressive jackpot bonus prizes shall be paid in whole dollar amounts which will be rounded down for payment, except that no progressive jackpot bonus prize paid shall be less than \$1. (Authorized by and implementing 1998 Supp. K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-9-1-92, Aug. 28, 1992; amended, T-7-19-99, June 17, 1999; amended, T-111-9-14-99, Aug. 20, 1999; amended, T-111-11-30-99, Nov. 19, 1999.)
