## Notice of Hearing on Permanent Quarantine

The Kansas Department of Agriculture will conduct a public hearing at 2 p.m. Friday, January 21, to determine whether a Permanent Quarantine Order should be established prohibiting the movement of all plants, plant products and nursery stock, as defined by K.S.A. 2-2113 (d) and (e), from property located at 21650 Mission Road, Bucyrus, Kansas, the actual legal description of which is: The North one-half (N½) of the South 106.66 acres of the Northeast Quarter (NE¼) of Section 21, Township 15, Range 25, Miami County, Kansas, containing 53½ acres, more or less.

Any person who moves plants, plant products or nursery stock from the property would be in violation of the Permanent Quarantine Order, if established.

A nursery business known as Ridgeview Turf and Tree Farm, also known as Mission Road Sod Farm, is operated on this property. The plants, plant products and nursery stock on this property have been found to be infested with field bindweed, quackgrass, musk thistle, and Johnson grass, all of which are weeds that injure plants and plant products. The hearing will determine whether the infestation warrants a Permanent Quarantine Order. If established, the Permanent Quarantine Order would be in effect until such time as the plant pests have been adequately treated.

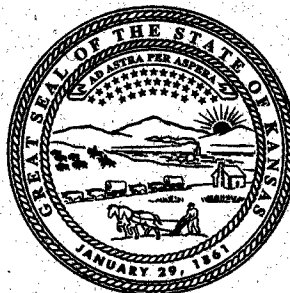

## Board of Hearing Aid Examiners

Notice of Hearing on Proposed  
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 3:30 p.m. Tuesday, March 21, at 216 E. 1st St., Wichita, to consider the adoption of proposed changes in existing rules and regulations of the Kansas Board of Hearing Aid Examiners.

This 60-day notice of public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Board of Hearing Aid Examiners, P.O. Box 252, Wichita, KS 67201. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of proposed regulations and their economic impact follows.

**K.A.R. 67-5-3. Renewal fee; responsibility of licensee.** Amendment to the regulation will increase annual renewal fees from \$50 to \$75.

The economic impact will be to increase agency operating funds to necessary levels and to increase licensure cost to licensees. There is no economic impact anticipated for other government entities, private businesses or other individuals.

**K.A.R. 67-5-4. Delinquent renewals; penalties.** Amendment to the regulation will increase penalty fees on late renewals from \$100 to \$150 and will increase penalty fees on extended late renewals from \$200 to \$250.

The economic impact will be a minimal increase to agency operating funds and a minimal increase to licensees renewing after deadline. There is no economic impact anticipated for other government entities, private businesses or other individuals.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Lee Payne at (316) 263-0774.

**Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted by the Wildlife and Parks Commission at 7 p.m. Thursday, March 16, at the Holiday Inn Express, 420 Parkview Drive, Pittsburg, to consider the approval and adoption of proposed regulations of the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks.

A workshop meeting on business of the Wildlife and Parks Commission will begin at 1:30 p.m. March 16 at the location listed above. The meeting will recess at 5 p.m., then resume at 7 p.m. at the same location for the regulatory hearing. There will be public comment periods at the beginning of the afternoon and evening meetings for any issues not on the agenda, and additional comment periods will be available during the meeting on agenda items. Old and new business also may be discussed at this time. If necessary to complete the hearing or other business matters, the commission will reconvene at 9 a.m. March 17 at the same location.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for ac-

commodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Cindy Baugh, commission secretary, at (316) 672-5911. Persons with a hearing impairment may call the TDD service at 1-800-766-3777 to request special accommodations.

This 60-day notice period prior to the hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations.

All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the chairman of the commission, Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks, Suite 502, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to express their views orally in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations. During the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the commission as a basis for approving, amending and approving, or rejecting the proposed regulations.

The administrative regulations that will be heard during the regulatory hearing portion of the meeting are as follows:

**K.A.R. 115-4-6.** This regulation establishes deer management units within the State of Kansas. The proposed amendments would rename the boundaries of two units, due to recent highway redesignations, and would eliminate sub-unit 12A, as it is no longer used as a sub-unit.

**Economic Impact Summary:** The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any economic impact on the department, other agencies, or the public.

**K.A.R. 115-18-16.** This proposed new administrative regulation would provide authority to harvest light geese (defined as snow geese and Ross' geese) outside of regular hunting seasons, so long as the individual has all licenses and permits that would be required during a regular hunting season. The regulation allows the state to implement the Conservation Order of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, intended to reduce the populations of light geese.

**Economic Impact Summary:** The proposed regulation, because it requires licenses and permits, may create some additional revenue for the department, although the sales of additional licenses and permits is expected to be minimal. The regulation may have some indirect, long-term positive economic impact on agricultural producers who experience crop depredation by light geese.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Genetic Metabolic Newborn Screening, will conduct a public hearing at 1:30 p.m. Monday, March 13, in Room 1052, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider amendments to K.A.R. 28-4-501, K.A.R. 28-4-503, K.A.R. 28-4-504, K.A.R. 28-4-505 and K.A.R. 28-4-513, and the revocation of K.A.R. 28-4-530 and K.A.R. 28-4-531. A summary of the proposed amendments and the economic impact follows.

The intent of the regulations is to implement genetic metabolic newborn screening tests for all newborns in the State of Kansas, to identify infants at risk, to locate and refer these infants to medical consultants for definitive testing, and, if medically necessary, to place the infants on treatment with continual monitoring.

Proposed changes to K.A.R. 28-4-501 include the definitions of borderline hypothyroid, hemoglobin disease, hemoglobin trait and "other genetic disease."

Proposed changes to K.A.R. 28-4-503 and K.A.R. 28-4-513 are grammatical.

The proposed change to K.A.R. 28-4-504 adds another method of delivering specimens to the lab, by carrier.

Proposed changes to K.A.R. 28-4-505 describe how the department treats unsatisfactory specimens.

Revocations of K.A.R. 28-4-530 and K.A.R. 28-4-531 are due to the repeal of K.S.A. 65-1,149, 65-1,150, 65-1,152 through 65-1,157 and K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 65-1,151, and passage into law of H.B. 2362 of the 1999 legislative session, the Newborn Infant Hearing Screening Act.

**Economic Impact:** There is no economic impact foreseen as a result of the amendments of these regulations.

The time between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a 60-day public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulatory action. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to DeAnna McClenahan, RN, Children's Developmental Services, Suite 1053, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612-1220.

All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the proposed regulatory action during the hearings. **117-7-1. Fees.** The following fees shall be submitted to the board. (a) For application for certification or licensure, the fee shall be \$50.

(b) For original certification or licensure, the fee shall be \$250.

(c) For renewal of a certificate or license, the fee shall be \$240.

(d) For late renewal of a certificate or license, the fee shall be an additional \$50.

(e) Except as provided in subsection (h) of this regulation, for approval of a course of instruction to meet any portion of the education requirements of K.A.R. 117-2-1, 117-3-1, or 117-4-1, the fee shall be \$100.

(f) Except as provided in subsection (h) of this regulation, for approval of a course of instruction to meet the continuing education requirements of K.A.R. 117-6-1, the fee shall be \$50.

(g) Except as provided in subsection (h) of this regulation, for renewal of any course of instruction, the fee shall be \$25.

(h) For approval or renewal of any course of instruction that is endorsed by the appraisal qualifications board, the fee shall be \$10. **Article 9.—TEMPORARY PRACTICE**

**117-9-1. Temporary practice.** (a) An appraiser from another state who is licensed or certified by the appraiser licensing or certifying agency in that state may register to receive temporary licensing or certification privileges in this state by paying a \$50 fee and filing with the board a registration form approved by and obtained from the board.

(b) Within five days of receipt of the fee and a properly completed registration form, written notification of acceptance of the registration shall be mailed to the appraiser by the board. Regulations****Article 23.—PROPRIETARY SCHOOLS**

**88-23-1. Definitions.** (a) "Board" means the board of regents.

(b) "Closure of a school" means no longer allowing students access to the school to receive instruction. Closure occurs on the calendar day immediately following the last day on which students are allowed access to the school to receive instruction.

(c) "To enter school" means the commencement of school class attendance by the student, with respect to a noncorrespondence school, and with the first submission of a lesson by the student for evaluation with respect to a correspondence school. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 72-4921; effective Jan. 28, 2000.)

**88-23-2. Minimum standards.** (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), in order to qualify for a certificate of approval, each school shall submit evidence indicating that the school meets the criteria listed in K.S.A. 72-4926 and amendments thereto.

(b) National accreditation shall be accepted by the board as evidence of the school's competence. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 72-4921; implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 72-4925, 72-4926; effective Jan. 28, 2000.)

**88-23-3. Certificate of approval.** (a) Application for certificate of approval. An application for a certificate of approval shall be made on a form provided by the board. Upon receiving a request for an application form, the applicant shall be sent by the board the form, a copy of K.S.A. 72-4916 et seq., and a copy of this article of the Kansas administrative regulations.

(1) Each school that has been in operation for at least one year shall submit the following information with its application:

(A) A balance sheet and profit and loss statement showing income and expenditures for the most recent, complete fiscal year. These documents shall be prepared and acknowledged by a certified public accountant;

(B) a description of the school's facilities, equipment, and instructional materials;

(C) a certification by an officer or owner of the school that the school complies with all local, state, and federal regulations;

(D) one copy of each of the school's most recent catalogues, bulletins, and brochures, with supplements, including the following information:

(i) Fee schedules and charges for tuition, books, supplies, and any other items required to be paid by students;

(ii) policies of the school covering the refund of unused portions of tuition and other charges when courses are not completed by students for any reason; and

(iii) policies of the school governing student conduct and attendance;

(E) the school's enrollment agreement;

(continued)



- (F) an outline or syllabus for each course;
- (G) any certificate of accreditation issued to the school by a regional or national accrediting agency recognized by the United States department of education;
- (H) a copy of the certificate given to students upon completion of a program;

(I) copies of any advertising used; and

(J) a resume of each instructor and administrator that includes the individual's educational and previous work experience.

(2) Each school that has not been in operation for at least one year shall submit the following information with its application:

(A) If incorporated, a current financial statement of the corporation, and, if unincorporated, an individual financial statement of each owner. All financial statements shall be prepared and acknowledged by a certified public accountant;

(B) a copy of the existing or proposed school catalogue, including the following information:

(i) A fee schedule and charges for tuition, books, supplies, and any other items required to be paid for by students;

(ii) policies of the school covering the refund of unused portions of any tuition or other charges when courses are not completed by a student for any reason; and

(iii) policies of the school governing student conduct and attendance;

(C) a copy of the certificate to be given to a student upon completion of a program;

(D) an outline or syllabus of each course;

(E) a certification by an officer or owner of the school that the building which is to house the school complies with all local, state, and federal regulations;

(F) a description of the school's facilities, equipment, and instructional materials;

(G) a resume of each administrator and instructor that includes the individual's education and previous work experience; and

(H) the school's enrollment agreement.

(b) Review of application; inspection and evaluation of school. If an application submitted in accordance with these regulations is found to be complete and the applicant meets the requirements in K.S.A. 72-4926 and amendments thereto, the instructional facilities of the applicant may be inspected and evaluated by the board of professional consultants appointed by the board.

(c) Conditional approval of application; filing of surety bond. If a school is found to be eligible for a certificate of approval, it shall be notified of its conditional approval and instructed to furnish a surety bond or other equivalent security acceptable to the board in the amount of \$20,000, as provided by K.S.A. 72-4932 and amendments thereto. A certificate of approval shall not be issued until the surety bond or other security is filed with the board.

(d) Subsequent investigation.

(1) On the board's own motion or upon complaint filed by any person doing business with the school, an investigation of the school may be conducted by the board.

(2) Based upon the results of the investigation, the school may be ordered by the board to take corrective action, or proceedings may be initiated by the board to

revoke the school's certificate of approval under the provisions of K.S.A. 72-4929 and amendments thereto. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 72-4921; implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 72-4925, 72-4926; effective Jan. 28, 2000.)

**88-23-4. Registration of representative.** (a) Application for registration of representative. Any person who is to serve as a representative of any proprietary school shall complete a representative's application form provided by the board. Upon receipt of a request for an application form, the applicant shall be sent the form by the board, together with a copy of K.S.A. 72-4916 et seq. and a copy of this article of the Kansas administrative regulations.

Each application shall be signed by the applicant and by the owner or an officer of the school that the applicant seeks to represent and shall attest that if registration is issued, the applicant will be employed by the school.

(b) Denial of application for registration. If the board, upon review and consideration of an application, determines that the application is denied, the applicant shall be notified by the board of the denial and the reason or reasons for the denial. The notice shall also advise the applicant of the right to request a hearing under K.S.A. 72-4931 and amendments thereto.

(c) Evidence of registration of representative. Upon approval of the application, a certificate of registration of the representative shall be issued by the board, which shall state the name of the registrant, the name of the school or schools that the registrant may represent, the date of issuance, and the date of expiration. The certificate of registration shall be displayed to each prospective student or enrollee before any personal solicitation by the representative.

(d) Revocation, complaint, and hearing. The certificate of registration of a representative may be revoked by the board upon a finding that the registrant has violated the laws or regulations governing proprietary schools.

(1) Complaint. Any complaint against the registrant for the violation of any law or regulation shall be submitted in writing, signed by the party making the complaint, and verified under oath or affirmation. The complaint shall state clearly and concisely the alleged violation and shall be filed with the board.

(2) Hearing. A certificate of registration of a representative may be revoked in accordance with K.S.A. 72-4931 and amendments thereto. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 72-4921; implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 72-4931; effective Jan. 28, 2000.)

**88-23-5. Exempt schools; avocational or recreational programs.** (a) Any person who alleges that the school or training program the person operates is offered only for avocational or recreational purposes and is exempt from the Kansas proprietary school act shall submit to the board an application for exemption, upon a form provided by the board.

(b) The person submitting the application shall submit the following information with the application:

(1) If the school is incorporated, a copy of the articles of incorporation;



- (2) any flyers, catalogues, brochures, or similar items concerning the school;
  - (3) any advertisements, including telephone and newspaper advertisements, concerning the school;
  - (4) any information given by the school to prospective students;
  - (5) a copy of the enrollment or admission form used by the school;
  - (6) a copy of any certificate or diploma issued to students who complete the program; and
  - (7) any other information regarding the school that is requested by the board.
- (c) If the board, upon review and consideration of the application, determines that the application is denied, the applicant shall be notified by the board of the denial and the reason or reasons for the denial. The notice shall also advise the applicant of that individual's right to request a hearing under the Kansas administrative procedures act. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 72-4921; imple-

menting K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 72-4920; effective Jan. 28, 2000.)

**88-23-6. Student records upon school closure.** (a) Upon closure of a school, the school shall deliver or make available to the board all records of students who have been in attendance at the school. These records shall be delivered, or made available, no more than 15 calendar days following closure of the school.

(b) If the records are not delivered or made available to the board as required by subsection (a) of this regulation, any action deemed necessary may be commenced by the board to obtain possession of the records. Any costs incurred by the board may be recovered against the bond filed by the school under K.S.A. 72-4932 and amendments thereto. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 72-4921; implementing K.S.A. 1998 Supp. 72-4932; effective Jan. 28, 2000.)

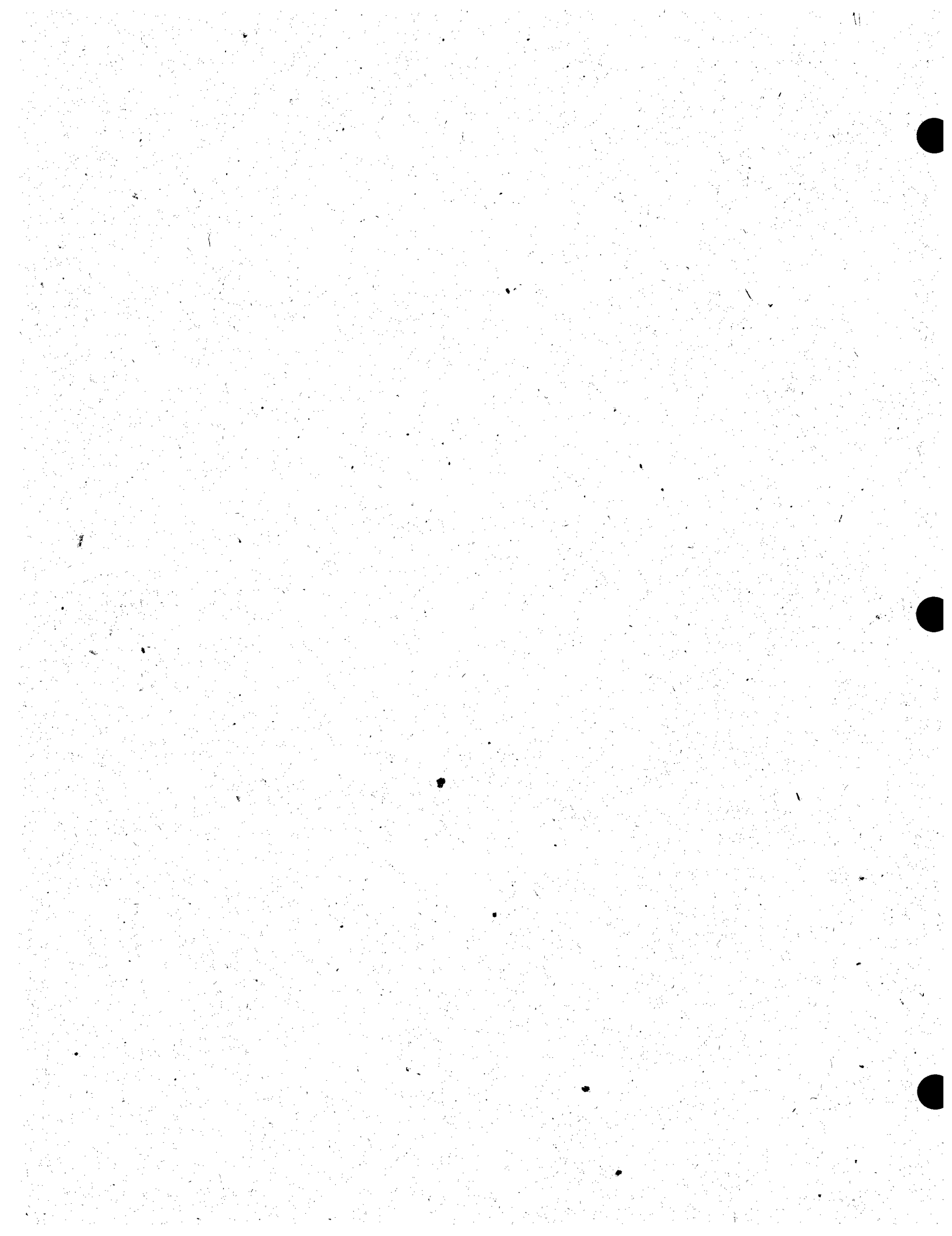

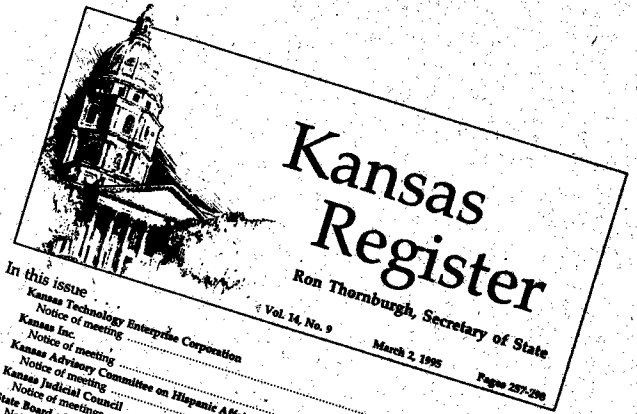
