Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Tuesday, May 9, in Room 401 of the Kansas Department of Agriculture, 109 S.W. 9th, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed changes in existing rules and regulations of the Weights and Measures Program.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Secretary of Agriculture, 109 S.W. 9th, 4th Floor, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Leslie Garner at (785) 296-4623 or fax (785) 368-6668. Handicapped park-

ing is located at the southwest corner of 9th and Jackson, and the north entrance to the building is accessible to individuals with disabilities.

These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of proposed regulations and their economic impact follows.

K.A.R. 99-26-1 is being amended to increase fees for conducting a NTEP test. Adoption of this regulation would impact the manufacturers of scales that are wanting their scales to receive NTEP approval; however, the ability to market their device as an approved NTEP device would offset the cost incurred. The proposed costs are not higher than other entities that provide this service. This fiscal impact would apply to manufacturers of devices. However, manufacturers must have an entity conduct a NTEP test prior to the release of a new device. Therefore, it is beneficial to the manufacturers to have KDA conduct the test on a timely basis. The fee KDA is proposing to charge is less than the fees charged by other entities.

The amendment to **K.A.R. 99-27-1** reflects a change in the history and would not have any fiscal impact.

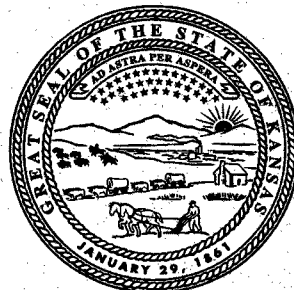

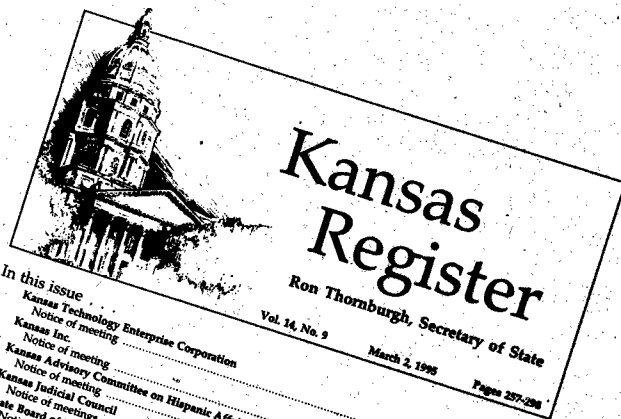
