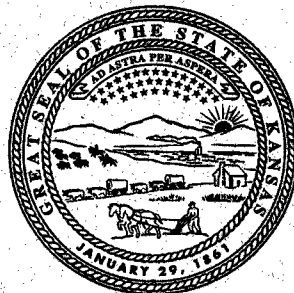

The Kansas Department of Transportation is seeking qualified consulting engineering firms for the projects listed below. Notice of Available Funding

The Kansas Department of Transportation, Office of Public Transportation, announces it is accepting funding requests for the next two years under 49 U.S.C. § 5310 and 49 U.S.C. § 5311, including funding for Intercity Bus transportation under the Federal Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21) for transportation services. In addition, KDOT is accepting requests for state funding made available under the Comprehensive Transportation Program (CTP) for rural transportation providers.

Under 49 U.S.C. § 5310, funding is made available for the purchase of vehicles and equipment for services to the elderly and to persons with disabilities. 49 U.S.C. § 5311 provides operating assistance and/or vehicles for transportation services to the elderly, persons with disabilities and the general public.

Eligible applicants for 49 U.S.C. § 5310 Federal Transit Administration grant funds must be private, nonprofit organizations that have been incorporated and registered with the Secretary of State to do business in Kansas. Applicants for a 49 U.S.C. § 5311 grant must be local units of government, Indian tribes, private nonprofit organizations or private operators contracting through any of these parties. Applicants also must be registered with the Secretary of State to do business in Kansas. All applicants must be an active member of their Coordinated Transit District (CTD) in order to receive federal and/or state transit funding.

A total of approximately \$850,500 in 49 U.S.C. § 5310 funds and \$3,300,000 in 49 U.S.C. § 5311 funds will be available for federal fiscal year 2001. Similar funding amounts also will be available in FFY 2002. The federal share of eligible capital cost will not exceed 80 percent of the net cost of each project, and the grant applicant share shall be 20 percent of the net cost. The federal share of operating cost will not exceed 50 percent of the net cost of each project. The grant applicant share will be not less than 50 percent of the net cost.

State funds in the amount of \$2,460,000 for rural transit providers are available for state fiscal years 2001 and 2002 for those who are currently in the 49 U.S.C. § 5310 or 49 U.S.C. § 5311 programs or who are eligible to be in either of those programs.

Application requests must be received by the KDOT Office of Public Transportation on or before August 11, 2000. Requests after that date will not be accepted. Jackson, Topeka, regarding the proposed issuance by the Authority of approximately \$12,500,000 of its Multifamily Housing Revenue Bonds for Brisben Chimney Hills Limited Partnership (the borrower). Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Wednesday, September 27, in the third floor conference room, Kansas Insurance Department, 420 S.W. 9th, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed changes in an existing rule and regulation.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rule and regulation. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Rebecca Sanders, Kansas Insurance Department, 420 S.W. 9th, Topeka, 66612-1678. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulation during the hearing.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Rebecca Sanders at (785) 296-7811.

Copies of the full text of the regulation and the economic impact statement may be obtained by contacting Rebecca Sanders. A summary of the proposed regulation and its economic impact follows.

K.A.R. 40-4-35. Medicare supplement policies; minimum standards; requirements. There were three primary amendments made to K.A.R. 40-4-35, which is the regulation governing the minimum standards and requirements for Medicare supplement policies.

The first change is to Section (7). This change is required by federal law. Section 4031(f) of the Balanced Budget Amendment specifies that copayment amounts provided for under Section 1833(t)(5) with respect to hospital outpatient department services shall be treated in Medicare supplement policies in the same manner as co-insurance with respect to such services. This amendment brings Kansas' regulation into compliance with federal law.

The second amendment requires the companies to combine all their forms in effect prior to 1992 for rating purposes. The economic impact for consumers and companies across the board will be neutral. By combining all pre-1992 forms, some consumers will not receive a rate increase because a block of business standing by itself could justify a rate increase on its own, but when combined with other blocks the rate increase is not justified. The reverse also could be true but less likely. There would be the same impact on the companies. There would be some increases when a combination of business blocks occurs and others where a rate increase would not be justified.

The third amendment bans, by January 1, 2001, the use of attained age Medicare supplement policies. Under attained age policies, as consumers age and reach a certain age, their premiums increase. It is the commissioner's concern, and the purpose of this change, that elderly con-

sumers would experience increases in their premiums at a time in their lives when their economic resources are less and they can least afford premium increases. Consumers will more than likely pay higher premiums at the start of their coverage. The impact on the companies is that rates are more stable over a period of time.

Opinion No. 2000-35
Amended

Written June 21, 2000, to Joyce Allegrucci, Assistant Secretary, Kansas Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services, Topeka.

This opinion is in response to your letter of April 25, 2000, in which you request an opinion from the Kansas Governmental Ethics Commission concerning the state level conflict of interest laws (K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*). We note at the outset that the Commission's jurisdiction is limited to the application of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*, and whether some other statutory system, common law theory or agency rule or regulation applies to your inquiry is not covered by this opinion.

Factual Statement

We understand that you are asking for this opinion in your capacity as the Assistant Secretary for the Kansas Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services. You have explained that in 1995 one of your employees was substantially involved in the making of a competitively bid contract between the Children and Family Services (CFS) division of Social and Rehabilitation Services (SRS) and the Kansas Children's Service League (KCSL). This was a four year contract which contained a provision for renewal on a yearly basis. The original contract specifically provided that the shared risk provision would be "renegotiated during contract renewal after the first contract year." The first renewal contract amended several "outcome goals and indicators" and changed the "risk share" provision of the contract. For instance, the first renewal amended the risk share provision in the following manner:

"(1) A fixed increase of \$1500

"The Contractor will receive the Year 2 Case Rate and \$1500 for each case rate referral made during year 2."

The second and third contract renewals contained similar language as well as other terms listed as "additional contractual requirements." We understand that this employee substantially participated in the making of the renewal contracts and that the renewal contracts were not let after a separate competitive bidding procedure. KCSL has now extended this employee an offer of employment.

Question

May this state employee accept employment with the Kansas Children's Service League?

Opinion

K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 46-233 is applicable to this scenario. It states in pertinent part:

(a)(2) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, whenever any individual has participated as a state officer or employee in making of any contract with any person or business, such individual shall not accept employment with such person or business as an employee, independent contractor or subcontractor until two years after performance of the contract is completed or until two years after the individual terminates employment as a state officer or employee, whichever is sooner. . . .

(d) Subsections (a) and (b) shall not apply to the following:

(1) Contracts let after competitive bidding has been advertised for by published notice. . . .

In Opinion 1999-33, this Commission stated:

It often occurs that an original contract let after a competitive bidding process contains a provision for renewal at a specific point in time. . . . The Commission determines that if . . . there are material changes which are made to the renewal contract, the renewal contract will be considered to be a negotiated contract and not a contract let after a competitive bidding process.

We have reviewed the modifications to the original contract, in the case at hand, and determine that the changes were material. Therefore, pursuant to Opinion 1999-33 and K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 46-233, the Year Two, Three, and Four renewal contracts were not contracts let after a competitive bidding procedure; thus, the restrictions in K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 46-233(a)(2) should apply. You have pointed out, however, that all of the parties involved with the making of these renewal contracts believed that the renewal contracts were let pursuant to a competitive bid procedure as determined by the Department of Purchasing. You also note that Opinion 1999-33 was issued after this employee's participation in the renewal contracts at issue and therefore she was unaware that she would be subject to the prohibitions contained in K.S.A. 46-233.

Because there were material changes to the original contract, and because this employee was substantially involved in the making of these renewal contracts, she would generally be prohibited from accepting employment with the Kansas Children's Service League at this time. However, the Commission has determined that because this employee was involved with the making of these contracts prior to the issuance of Opinion 1999-33, the present opinion shall be prospective only in application. Thus, the employee may accept the subject employment with the Kansas Children's Service League.

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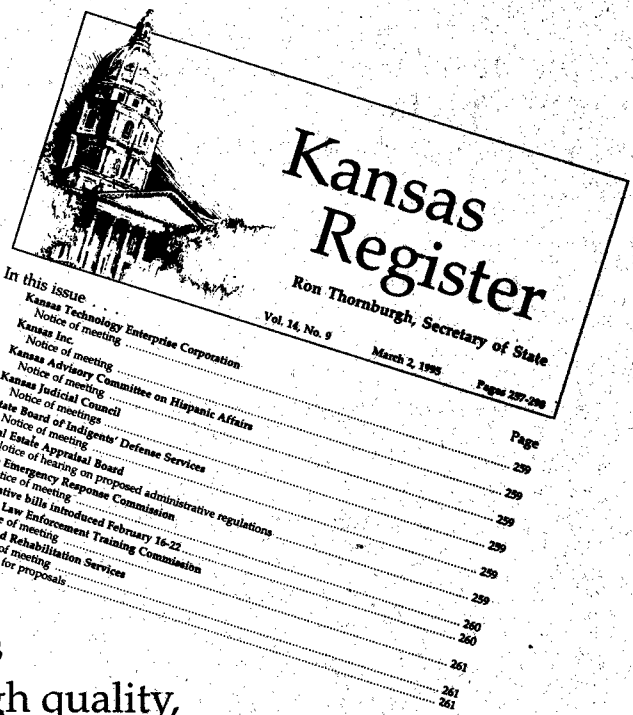
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
