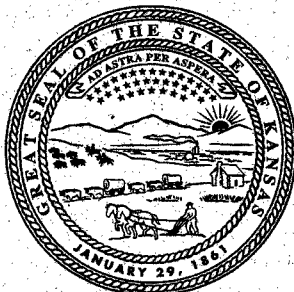

As directed by Executive Order 00-03, the Board of Tax Appeals is conducting a comprehensive review of all of the agency's regulations. The purpose of the review is to identify all regulations that are outdated, redundant, over-broad, ineffective, unnecessary, cumbersome, irrelevant or otherwise undesirable, and to revoke or modify those regulations so identified.

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Friday, August 25, in the Board of Tax Appeals' office, Room 481, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, to receive comments concerning board regulations that may need modification or elimination. The regulations to be reviewed are Kansas Administrative Regulations (K.A.R.) 94-2-1 through 94-3-2. Failure to submit the sworn statement as part of the bid approval package will make the bid nonresponsive and not eligible for award consideration.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted by the Kansas Department of Human Resources at 10 a.m. Wednesday, October 18, in the first floor conference room of the Kansas Department of Human Resources, 401 S. Topeka Blvd., Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed changes in existing regulations of the Employment Security Law, K.S.A. 44-703 *et seq.*

This 60-day notice of the public hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Merrill J. Hicklin Befort, Staff Attorney, Kansas Department of Human Resources, 401 S. Topeka Blvd., Topeka, 66603.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and the economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least 10 working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Merrill J. Hicklin Befort at (785) 296-4902 or mjbefort@hr.state.ks.us.

A copy of the full text of the regulations and economic impact statement may be reviewed or obtained by contacting Merrill J. Hicklin Befort. The following is a summary of the proposed regulations. The economic impact follows.

K.A.R. 50-1-2: The Kansas Department of Human Resources, Division of Employment Security, proposes changes to Section 50-1-2, "Meaning of Terms Relating to Both Unemployment Compensation Contributions and Benefits. This section defines the terms "division" and "state" with regards to their usage for unemployment insurance purposes.

K.A.R. 50-1-3: This regulation amends the definitions relating primarily to unemployment compensation contributions.

K.A.R. 50-1-4: This regulation defines types of unemployment, types of unemployment insurance claims and other definitions pertinent to the filing of unemployment insurance claims.

K.A.R. 50-2-1: This amended regulation amends the rules pertaining to the cash value of remuneration in kind and determines the rate for board or lodging furnished in addition to or in lieu of cash wages.

K.A.R. 50-2-3: This regulation amends when the payment of contributions and benefit cost payments are paid. The amendments revoke section (b) and amend sections (f) and (h).

K.A.R. 50-2-9: This regulation is revoked, as it is covered adequately by K.S.A. 44-710.

K.A.R. 50-2-12: This regulation is amended to remove the due date of 25th from the regulation concerning reports by reimbursing employers. This is now defined in K.S.A. 44-710(e)(2) and 44-717(a).

K.A.R. 50-2-17: The changes to this regulation update and amend the "Standard Industrial Classification Man-

ual" from the 1972 edition to 1987 edition, and add the "North American Industry Classification System" 1997 edition to the regulation.

K.A.R. 50-2-18: This regulation, concerning surety bond or surety deposit requirements for reimbursing employers, is amended to change the surety amount from 3.6 percent to 5.4 percent to conform with K.S.A. 44-710(e).

K.A.R. 50-2-19: This regulation, concerning the contribution appeal process for employers, was amended for clarification purposes. Section (a)(5) was added to provide employers an appeal process for "wilful failure" determination made by the department. Section (b)(3) added a provision for experience rate hearings to be held in the employer's home county as provided by K.S.A. 44-710(a). Section (c) was amended to provide that the department hearing officer must render a decision within 90 days to conform with K.S.A. 44-710(a).

K.A.R. 50-2-21: This regulation is being amended to update the statutory provisions from K.S.A. 1995 Supplement 44-710a(a)(3) to K.S.A. 44-710a(a)(3).

K.A.R. 50-2-26: This is a new regulation that provides for the payment of interest on erroneously collected payments as set forth in K.S.A. 44-717(h).

K.A.R. 50-3-1: This regulation defines an employer's obligation concerning unemployment insurance claims and pertinent records.

K.A.R. 50-3-2: This regulation defines initial claim filing procedures for intrastate claimants.

K.A.R. 50-3-3: This regulation defines continued claim filing procedures for intrastate claimants.

K.A.R. 50-3-4: This regulation defines those circumstances that may be construed as being good cause for the claimant's failure to file an initial claim as provided in K.A.R. 50-3-2(c).

K.A.R. 50-3-5: This section defines procedures by which interstate claimants can file initial and continued claims.

K.A.R. 50-4-2: This regulation updates the procedures for obtaining Employment Security information.

Economic Impact: The Kansas Department of Human Resources, unemployment insurance claimants and their employers will be affected by the amendments. No other government agencies will be impacted.

No significant impact on agency operations is anticipated nor added costs are expected to administer the regulations subsequent to the changes, while an actual savings in operation cost could be realized through the utilization of electronic media. Cost analysis studies have shown this to be a more cost-effective process than in-person reporting, for both the claimant and the agency. Greater flexibility will be afforded employers and the agency with regards to the means by which unemployment insurance claim notices are sent to employers and by which employers respond to said notices.

Good Faith Deposit

Each bid shall be accompanied by a cashier's or certified check drawn on a bank located in the United States or a financial surety bond in a form that complies with the requirements set forth in the notice of sale in the amount of \$12,600 (2 percent of the principal amount of the bonds).

Delivery

The issuer will pay for printing the bonds and will deliver the same properly prepared, executed and registered without cost to the successful bidder within 30 days of the sale of the bonds at such bank or trust company in the contiguous United States as may be specified by the successful bidder.

Assessed Valuation and Indebtedness

The equalized assessed tangible valuation for computation of bonded debt limitations is \$6,718,146. The total general obligation indebtedness of the issuer as of the date of the bonds, including the bonds being sold, is \$1,115,000.

Official Statement

The city has prepared a preliminary official statement relating to the bonds, copies of which may be obtained from the city. The preliminary official statement is in a form "deemed final" by the city for the purpose of Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c-12(b)(1), but is subject to revision, amendment and competition in the final official statement. Upon the sale of the bonds, the city shall furnish the successful bidder with a reasonable number of copies of the final official statement without additional cost, upon request. Copies of the final official statement in excess of a reasonable number may be ordered by the successful bidder at its expense.

Continuing Disclosure

Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12, as amended effective July 3, 1995, provides that brokers, dealers and municipal securities dealers must comply with certain requirements before acting as an underwriter in a primary offering of municipal securities with an aggregate principal amount of \$1,000,000 or more.

The bonds described herein will be offered in a primary offering with an aggregate principal amount of less than \$1,000,000. Accordingly, in the opinion of bond counsel, the offering and sale of the bonds described herein does not constitute an offering as defined by the rule, and the requirements of the rule do not apply to brokers, dealers and municipal securities dealers acting as underwriters in connection with the bonds described herein.

Approval of Bonds

The bonds will be sold subject to the legal opinion of Cosgrove, Webb & Oman, Topeka, Kansas, bond counsel, whose approving legal opinion as to the validity of the bonds will be furnished and paid for by the issuer, printed on the bonds and delivered to the successful bidder when the bonds are delivered.

112-4-1. Occupation licenses. (a) Before engaging in the following occupations at a racetrack facility, each person shall pay the required fee and secure the appropriate license or licenses from the commission:

- (1) Administration-facility;
- (2) administration-organization;
- (3) administrative support-facility;
- (4) administrative support-organization;
- (5) amateur jockey;
- (6) apprentice jockey;
- (7) assistant trainer-horse/greyhound;
- (8) authorized agent;
- (9) backup greyhound racetrack official;
- (10) backup horse racetrack official;
- (11) blacksmith/plater/farrier;
- (12) breed registry;
- (13) concession employee;
- (14) concession manager/operator;
- (15) driver;
- (16) exercise person;
- (17) greyhound racetrack official;
- (18) groom/hot walker;
- (19) horse racetrack official;
- (20) horseman/kennel representative;
- (21) jockey;
- (22) jockey agent;
- (23) jockey guild representative;
- (24) kennel helper;
- (25) kennel owner;
- (26) kennel owner/trainer;
- (27) medical attendant;

(b) Each applicant for an occupation license shall apply in writing on the application form approved and furnished by the commission.

(c) Each applicant for an occupation license acting as an employer required to carry workers compensation insurance pursuant to the workers compensation act of the state of Kansas, K.S.A. 44-501 et seq., shall submit proof of this insurance to the commission within 10 working days of the applicant's filing an application for an occupation license.

(d) Each person who is appointed by an owner or trainer to act as an authorized agent shall secure an occupation license. Each owner, trainer, or authorized agent shall file each authorized agent agreement form with the commission. Each authorized agent shall perform for the owner or trainer only the duties that are the subject of the authorized agent agreement form. Each authorized agent shall notify the commission in writing when the authorized agent agreement is terminated.

(e) An applicant for an occupation license shall not knowingly provide false information on any occupation license application form.

(f) An applicant for an occupation license shall not fail to disclose any material fact on any occupation license application form.

(g) No person shall alter or attempt to alter any information contained on an occupation license badge.

(h) Each person who loses an occupation license shall immediately perform the following:

- (1) Notify the commission office at the racetrack facility;
- (2) secure a duplicate license; and
- (3) pay the required fee.

(i) An applicant shall pay each required fee when the occupation license is issued. Occupational licenses issued by the commission shall be for one-year or three-year periods.

(1) Each one-year or annual license shall be valid for a period commencing on January 1 and terminating on December 31 of the calendar year for which the license is issued.

(2) Each three-year or triennial license shall be valid for a period commencing on January 1 of the year in which the license is issued, and terminating on December 31 of the final year. For the second and third years of a three-year license, the licensee shall complete a validation form approved by the commission and shall be issued current validation stickers. The licensee shall properly display the current validation stickers on the licensee's badge before being admitted to a racetrack facility.

(j) A computer check of license records from other racing jurisdictions shall be run annually on all licensees by

the commission. A computer check shall also be run at the time of validation of each three-year license.

(k) Any applicant may be required to submit with the application or validation form at least two complete sets of fingerprint cards approved by the commission. If the fingerprints are not acceptable for processing, each applicant shall be required to resubmit fingerprint cards.

(l) Each applicant for an occupation license shall be at least 16 years of age. This provision shall not preclude dependent children under the age of 16 from working for a parent or guardian when the parent or guardian is licensed as a kennel owner, trainer, or assistant trainer and the parent or guardian has obtained approval from the organization licensee. Each licensed trainer at a horse or greyhound racetrack facility or assistant trainer at a horse racetrack facility shall be at least 18 years of age. Each racing official, security employee, and mutuel employee shall be at least 18 years of age.

(m) Each employer at a racetrack facility shall ensure that each employee is properly licensed and shall immediately notify the commission office at the racetrack facility and the organization licensee when a licensee's employment status changes or when an employee is terminated. Each employer shall make an effort to secure the employee's occupation license and, if the license is secured, shall deliver the license to the commission office at the racetrack facility. Article 18.—SIMULCASTING LICENSES

112-18-21. Election and recognition of recognized greyhound owners' group. (a) Each recognized greyhound owners' group for each racetrack facility licensed by the Kansas racing and gaming commission shall be elected pursuant to K.S.A. 74-8802(ff), and amendments thereto.

(b) Each recognized greyhound owners' group shall be duly recognized by the commission before assuming any duties concerning the approval of any simulcast schedule proposed by an organization licensee.

(c) Only one group for greyhound owners as appropriate for each race meeting shall be recognized by the commission for the purpose of serving at each racetrack facility.

(d) Each recognized greyhound owners' group shall be responsible for performing the following:

- (1) Negotiating agreements pertaining to simulcast license applications;
- (2) signing simulcast license applications pursuant to K.S.A. 74-8836(d)(2), and amendments thereto; and
- (3) determining how the purse money will be distributed for horse and greyhound purses pursuant to K.S.A. 74-8836(g)(3) and (4), and amendments thereto.

(e) Each recognized greyhound owners' group shall consist of five individuals elected in accordance with this regulation.

(f) Elections for recognized greyhound owners' groups shall commence on August 1 of each odd-numbered year unless held sooner according to the provisions of subsection (k) of this regulation.

(g) Except as otherwise provided in this regulation or by commission order, each member of a greyhound owners' group shall serve a term of two years, commencing on October 1 of the year in which the recognized greyhound owners' group is elected, and ending on September 30 of the next odd-numbered year or until the member's successor has been duly elected and recognized by the commission after the commission is presented with a petition in accordance with subsection (k) of this regulation.

(h) To be eligible to vote in the election process at the racetrack facility where the recognized greyhound owners' group is to serve, a voter shall have been a licensed greyhound owner or kennel owner participating as an owner on and after December 1 of the year before the election and through July 31 of the election year, and shall have raced at that racetrack facility on and after January 1 and through July 31 of the election year.

(i) The procedure for conducting an election of a recognized greyhound owners' group shall be as follows:

(1) On August 1 of each odd-numbered year, a notice of elections to be held for a recognized greyhound owners' group for the racetrack facility in question shall be posted conspicuously by the commission or its designee, if any, pursuant to K.S.A. 74-8802(ff), and amendments thereto. The notice shall be posted throughout each racetrack facility, including the following:

(A) The racing office;

(B) the commission offices; and

(C) any other places greyhound owners are known to congregate. Notice of elections to be held may also be published in one or more greyhound parimutuel industry publications at the commission's direction.

(2) On August 1 of each odd-numbered year, the notice of elections to be held shall be mailed by the commission or its designee, if any, pursuant to K.S.A. 74-8802(ff), and amendments thereto, by depositing the notice in the United States mail, first-class postage prepaid, to each eligible voter at the eligible voter's last known address appearing in the records of the Kansas racing and gaming commission.

(3) Nominating petitions shall be made available by the commission or its designee, if any, pursuant to K.S.A. 74-8802(ff), and amendments thereto, for distribution to any eligible voter upon request in the Kansas racing and gaming commission office. The nominating petitions shall be in a form approved by the commission for the purpose of nominating individuals to stand for election to a recognized greyhound owners' group. The nominating petitions shall contain a statement signed by the nominee that the nominee agrees to perform the following:

(A) Serve as a member of the recognized group for which the nominee is standing for election;

(B) be reasonably available to attend meetings of the recognized group for which the nominee is standing for election;

(C) bargain in good faith as a member of the recognized group for which the nominee is standing for election; and

(D) obtain the signatures of three other eligible voters on the nominating petition.

(4) Nominating petitions for election to a recognized greyhound owners' group shall be returned to the Kansas racing and gaming commission office in Topeka by 12 o'clock noon of the third Friday following the first Monday in August following the posting of the notice of election required by paragraph (i)(1) of this regulation.

(5) After the close of the nominating period prescribed in paragraph (i)(4) of this regulation, the nominating petitions shall be reviewed by commission staff or its designee, if any, pursuant to K.S.A. 74-8802(ff) and amendments thereto, in accordance with procedures approved by the commission to confirm the following:

(A) That the signatures on the nominating petitions appear on the list of eligible voters in the records of the Kansas racing and gaming commission; and

(B) that the required number of signatures of eligible voters has been received by each nominee.

(6) Once the nominating petitions have been processed by the commission staff or its designee, if any, pursuant to K.S.A. 74-8802(ff), and amendments thereto, a ballot shall be prepared by the commission that shall include the following:

(A) A list of names of the duly nominated persons standing for election to the recognized group;

(B) a serial number;

(C) a statement that the voter shall vote for no more than five nominees;

(D) a statement that the five nominees receiving the highest number of votes from those voting in the election shall be elected to serve as the recognized greyhound owners' group for the racetrack facility at which the election is being conducted for the term provided in subsection (g) of this regulation;

(E) a statement that if one or more of the members elected to the recognized greyhound owners' group resigns or for any other reason fails to complete the term of service as provided in subsection (g) of this regulation, then the member or members shall be replaced by the nominee or nominees having received the next highest number of votes from those voting in the election. The nominee or nominees shall serve out the remainder of the term for any member or members who failed to complete the member's or members' term; and

(F) a statement that proxy voting shall not be permitted.

(7) On or before September 1 of each odd-numbered year following the preparation of the ballots as prescribed by paragraph (i)(6) of this regulation the following actions shall be performed by the commission or its designee, if any, pursuant to K.S.A. 74-8802(ff) and amendments thereto:

(A) Conspicuously post copies of the ballot clearly and indelibly marked "SAMPLE" throughout each racetrack facility, including the following:

(i) The racing office;

(ii) the commission offices; and

(iii) any other places greyhound owners are known to congregate; and

(B) mail official ballots to each voter who is eligible to vote, by depositing the ballot in the United States mail, first-class postage prepaid, to each voter's last known address as shown in the records of the Kansas racing and gaming commission.

(8) Ballots shall be returned to the Kansas racing and gaming commission office in Topeka by 12 o'clock noon of the third Friday following the first Monday in September following the posting of the sample ballot as required by paragraph (i)(7)(A) of this regulation.

(9) On the Wednesday following the deadline set out in paragraph (i)(8) above, an open meeting shall be convened by the commission chairperson, executive director, and general counsel at the commission offices, and the ballots shall be counted by these individuals.

(10) In the event of a tie in the number of votes received by one or more nominees, lots shall be cast to settle the election results.

(11) Ten days following the counting of the ballots or as soon thereafter as the commission meeting schedule will permit, a certificate of election shall be executed by the commission to each of the five nominees receiving the highest number of votes designating those nominees as duly elected members of a recognized greyhound owners' group having been elected in accordance with this regulation.

(j) Within 10 days following the counting of the ballots in any election held pursuant to this regulation, any commission staff member, nominee, or eligible voter may file a sworn complaint with the commission concerning the conduct in any election held pursuant to this regulation. A hearing shall be commenced by the commission upon the receipt of a complaint in accordance with the Kansas administrative procedure act, K.S.A. 77-501 et seq. The filing of a complaint with the commission concerning the conduct in an election held pursuant to this regulation shall not impair or inhibit the duly elected recognized group from functioning, pending resolution of the complaint.

(k) No election for a recognized greyhound owners' group that is conducted within 24 months of a prior election shall be recognized by the commission, except upon the filing of a petition with the commission to conduct a new election signed by at least 30 percent of the number of eligible voters that actually voted in the preceding election.

(l) Upon receipt of a petition for a new election signed by the required number of voters set out in subsection (k) above, an election for a new recognized greyhound owners' group shall be conducted by the commission as soon as practicable in accordance with this regulation. Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS

111-2-30. Retailer bonus. (a) On all Powerball, Cash 4 Life, and Kansas Cash drawings in which the prize claimed and awarded is the "jackpot prize" offered in the game it represents, the Kansas lottery retailer(s) selling the ticket(s) shall receive \$10,000 for Powerball, \$2,500 for Cash 4 Life and \$1,000 for Kansas Cash, or share equally in a bonus if there are multiple winners and the prize is paid on a parimutuel basis. The bonus shall be in addition to compensation specified in K.A.R. 111-2-4.

(b) A "jackpot prize" is the highest prize awarded in the prize structure of the Powerball, Cash 4 Life, or Kansas Cash game it represents.

(c) On all Powerball and Cash 4 Life drawings where the prize claimed and awarded is less than the jackpot prize and is not less than \$100,000, the Kansas lottery retailer selling the ticket shall receive \$1,000.

(d) On all Keno drawings where the prize claimed and awarded is not less than \$100,000, the Kansas lottery retailer selling the ticket shall receive \$1,000.

(e) In addition to other commissions and bonuses received, each retailer shall receive a sales bonus of one percent (1%) of each instant and online tickets sold by the retailer where the prize claimed and awarded is over \$599, with a minimum bonus of \$10 and a maximum bonus of \$100. A retailer receiving a bonus pursuant to subsections (a), (b), (c) or (d) above shall not be entitled to this bonus.

(f) A bonus as provided in subsections (a), (b), (c), (d), or (e) above shall only be paid to a Kansas lottery retailer that, at the time the qualifying prize is claimed and awarded, is not delinquent in any payments due the lottery, is a certified lottery retailer, is not suspended or on "hold" status, and is otherwise in compliance with retailer's contract with the lottery. In the event a bonus is earned but the retailer is not at that time eligible to receive the bonus, the lottery will withhold payment or credit for up to 90 days to allow the retailer to cure any such delinquency or other deficiency. If after 90 days the retailer fails to cure said delinquency or deficiency, the retailer shall forfeit said bonus. Under extenuating circumstances, as determined by the executive director, the time for curing said delinquency or deficiency may be extended. conduct a "Starburst" promotion to enhance winner awareness at all Kansas T&E Oil Pump & Pantry locations.

(b) The winner awareness sales promotion will commence at 5:00 a.m. on Sunday, October 1, 2000, and end at the end of the business day as defined at K.A.R. 111-6-1 on Tuesday, October 31, 2000.

(c) Beginning October 1, 2000, and concluding October 31, 2000, the lottery will conduct a "Starburst" promotion at all the T&E Oil Pump & Pantry corporate stores located in Kansas. The stores must place a starburst decal on a visible wall or counter for every winning instant or on-line ticket that is redeemed at that retailer which wins \$10 or more. Each starburst placed should contain, where possible, the name of the winner, the amount won, and the ticket itself.

(d) For every 10 winning starbursts placed in a visible location at the retail establishment, the retailer will receive the lottery's choice of a promotional item, with a maximum of 10 items per store. For every 25 winning starbursts placed in a visible location at the retail establishment, that retailer will be entered into a drawing for a prize from the lottery. (c) Beginning November 1, 2000, and concluding November 30, 2000, the lottery will conduct a "Starburst" promotion at all the R & C Petroleum corporate stores located in Kansas. The stores must place a starburst decal on a visible wall or counter for every winning instant or on-line ticket that is redeemed at that retailer which wins \$10 or more. The stores must place a starburst decal on a visible wall or counter for every winning instant or on-line ticket that is redeemed at that retailer which wins \$10 or more. Each starburst placed should contain, where possible, the name of the winner, the amount won, and the ticket itself.

(b) The promotion will run from 5:00 a.m. beginning August 16, 2000, through and including September 5,

2000, at the close of the business day as defined by subsection (p) of K.A.R. 111-6-1 at all Dillons grocery store lottery retail locations in Kansas.

(c) Each time a person makes a single purchase of at least one 24-count carton of Pepsi Cola canned soda plus at least one large bag of a Frito Lay brand snack food, and as part of said purchase has his or her Dillons Plus Card scanned by the retailer, the Dillons Plus Card system will produce a Catalina coupon entitling the purchaser to \$1.00 off the purchase price of a Kansas lottery "A Big 2 Do!" instant scratch game ticket. On each coupon shall be printed a message that the coupon may be redeemed only at the store where the coupon was produced for \$1.00 off the purchase price of a Kansas lottery "A Big 2 Do!" instant ticket scratch game, and that all coupons must be redeemed no later than September 9, 2000. Only the original coupon shall be eligible for redemption and the retailer shall retain each original coupon until turned over to the lottery.

(d) For each such original coupon actually redeemed and turned over to the lottery by the retailer, the retailer shall receive \$1 credit on its account with the lottery.

(e) All coupons must be redeemed no later than September 9, 2000, at the close of the business day as defined by subsection (p) of K.A.R. 111-6-1. No credit will be allowed for any coupons redeemed after said time.

(f) Each person who redeems a coupon must be 18 years of age or older. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8708; effective, T-111-7-31-00, July 21, 2000.)

Article 3.—INSTANT GENERIC GAME RULES

111-3-1. Definitions. The following definitions apply to all instant ticket games unless otherwise specified by individual game rules: (a) "Bare arm technique" means a type of drawing in which the person drawing the winning ticket from the receptacle or drum wears a short-sleeved (sleeve not extending past the elbow) or a no-sleeve shirt which exposes the drawer's bare arm, or a long-sleeved shirt rolled up past the elbow and looks away from the drawing drum or receptacle while drawing.

(b) "Book" means a pack of fanfolded instant game tickets which are attached to each other by perforations, which perforations the retailer tears when selling a ticket from the book.

(c) "Book-ticket number" means the unique number appearing on each ticket which includes the number of the book from which it was removed and the serially assigned number of the ticket within that book. The book-ticket number is a number followed by a dash and then a 3-digit ticket number. The ticket numbers in each book start with 000. The book-ticket number is printed in two places on the back of each ticket.

(d) "Claimant" means a holder of a ticket who presents it for payment of a prize, whether or not the holder may have an obligation to share the prize.

(e) "Co-sponsor drawings" are the acts of drawing for prizes which may be held subsequent to the lottery drawings.

(continued)

(f) "Co-sponsor(s)" means the person, retailer or organization designated by the executive director to assist in organizing and participating in the lottery drawings.

(g) "Drawings" are the acts of drawing prizes conducted by the Kansas lottery.

(h) "Drum" means a container which can be sealed and rotated for the purpose of mixing, and into which instant tickets are placed for the purpose of drawing preliminary and/or final drawing winners.

(i) "Executive director" means the executive director of the Kansas lottery, or the person designated by the executive director.

(j) "Instant game" means a lottery game in which a ticket is purchased by a player and the player can immediately determine whether he or she has won a prize by removing the removable covering on the ticket and comparing the exposed play numbers or symbols with those specified as winners in the published game rules for that instant game.

(k) "Lottery retailer" or "retailer" means a person or business authorized by the lottery to sell lottery tickets.

(l) "Lottery security" means the lottery security officer or a certified law enforcement officer(s) designated by the executive director or the person designated by the executive director.

(m) "Non-winning ticket" means any valid Kansas instant game lottery ticket not eligible to win a prize under any specific instant game rules, but which may be eligible for a lottery drawing.

(n) "Participant" means any person, player, or contestant participating in a lottery game and anyone designated by a prize winner to appear on his or her behalf for any lottery game including any lottery drawing or televised draw show. In the event the prize winner or his or her designee fails to appear for a drawing or televised draw show, the executive director may designate an adult who may be a member of his staff to participate on behalf of the non-appearing prize winner. Any prize won by a participant appearing through a designee shall be payable to and delivered to the prize winner as provided by these rules and regulations.

(o) "Play area" is the portion of the front of each instant game ticket where the play or game symbols appear. It is covered by a removable layer of material which is intended to be removed ("scratched off") by the player to reveal the play or game symbols.

(p) "Play symbols" or "game symbols" are the numbers, letters, symbols, or pictures printed in the play area of each instant game ticket and which determine if the ticket holder is entitled to a prize.

(q) "Play symbol captions" or "game symbol captions" are the words or portions of words printed beneath each play or game symbol in the play area and are used to repeat or explain the play or game symbol. The play or game symbol caption associated with each play or game symbol is designated by the rules of the game.

(r) Prize tiers:

(1) "Low-tier prize" means a lottery instant game prize not exceeding \$599.00.

(2) "High-tier prize" means a lottery instant game prize in excess of \$599.00.

(s) "Receptacle" means a container in which non-winning Kansas instant game lottery tickets are placed and from which the drawings are made. Receptacles may be sealable and capable of being mixed.

(t) "Retailer validation code" means the small letters found under removable covering in the play area of each instant game ticket. The retailer may use this code to confirm winners which are validated through the terminal and to be paid by the retailer.

(u) "Special event" means a drawing or other method of awarding an additional prize or prizes within a group of lottery instant game winners as defined by the rules for a particular instant game.

(v) "Ticket holder" or "holder" means the person who has possession of an unsigned ticket or the person whose signature appears in the area upon a ticket designated for signature.

(w) "Ticket validation number" means a unique number appearing on each ticket which is used to validate winning tickets. The ticket validation number appears under the removable covering on the front of each instant ticket.

(x) "Activated book" means book or pack of instant tickets activated on the lottery's computer system, which is available for sale to the public by a lottery retailer.

(y) "Consigned book" or "consigned pack" means a full book or pack of instant tickets sealed in shrink wrap and delivered to a certified Kansas lottery retailer, which is designated on the lottery's computer system as consigned and has not been made available to the public.

(z) "Partial pack" means a book or pack of instant tickets which has been activated, whether or not any of the tickets from the pack have been sold and whether or not the pack has been settled, or a pack not yet activated but upon which the shrink wrap or other seal has been broken or damaged.

(aa) "End-of-game date" means the date announced by the executive director as the last date for consignment of tickets, which date shall be 180 days prior to the expiration date of the game unless otherwise specified by the executive director.

(bb) "Expiration date" means the last date an instant ticket may be validated and eligible to win a prize, which date shall be 180 days following the end-of-game date as announced by the executive director, unless otherwise specified by the executive director. 111-3-18. Termination of the game. The executive director may announce a termination date for a game at any time. If a game is terminated prior to the sale of all tickets, the number and value of prizes will be approxi-

111-4-1767. Determination of instant prize winners. This game is played similarly to the traditional "BINGO" game and includes bonus numbers. "Joker's Wild Bingo" is a two-part game.

The first part consists of the "CALLER'S CARD" and the "BONUS NUMBERS." The "CALLER'S CARD" contains 24 draw letter/number combinations covered by opaque latex. The "BONUS NUMBERS" consist of six draw letter/number combinations covered by opaque latex.

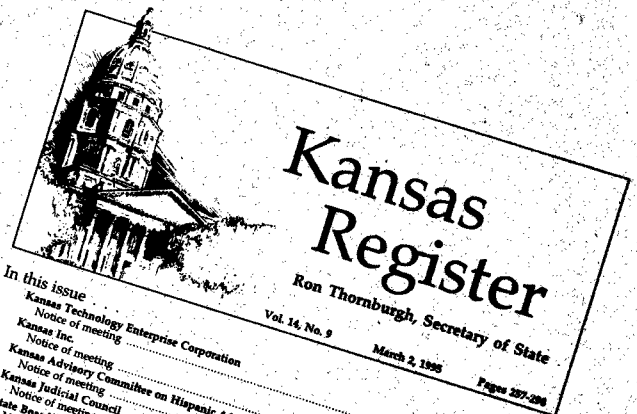
