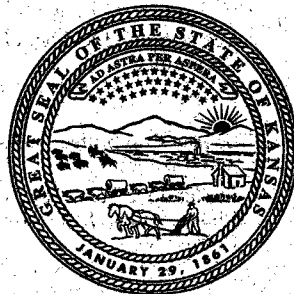

The Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services is accepting applications for grants under the Child Care and Development Fund for quality child care-related activities. Grant component areas include center-based establishment and expansion, rural family child care home networks, employer sponsored child care, public-private partnership/special projects, provider professional development, local child care advisory grant and quality enhancement grants. Eligible applicants must be public or nonprofit agencies or private employers seeking to establish child care for employees.

The Request for Proposal (RFP) addresses the areas of eligibility, application process, review, and general terms and conditions. Application due dates may vary depending on the component; the RFP specifies this information.

All applications will be initially screened for completeness and conformity to RFP guidelines. Review will be done by a panel of local and state reviewers. Final approval of all recommendations for funding will be made by the secretary of SRS. It is anticipated that funding would be available to grantees by May 2001.

The 1996 Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act created the Child Care and Development Fund. A percentage of these funds are to be set aside for quality activities. The components within the RFP are in response to federal regulation on the use of these funds.

Evaluation and Selection

Completed applications will be given a project number, analyzed by a review committee and evaluated based on the following content: narrative, methodology, budget, qualifications of the applicant, and adherence to specific criteria included in the application. Additionally, applicants should be aware that the KCDD and review committee will note whether the application addresses the needs of diverse populations and/or rural Kansans with developmental disabilities.

The grant project award will depend upon the availability of federal developmental disability funding. Final decision for the grant project award will be made by the KCDD.

Deadline

Completed applications will be accepted at the KCDD office until 5 p.m. October 23. No handwritten, faxed or single-spaced documents will be accepted. Applications received after the deadline will not be considered or returned.

Applicants will be notified of KCDD's decision by November 1.

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Thursday, October 19, in the offices of the Kansas Development Finance Authority, Suite 1000, Jayhawk Tower, 700 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, on the proposal for the Kansas Development Finance Authority to issue its Agricultural Development Revenue Bonds for the project numbered below in the respective maximum principal amount. The bond will be issued to assist the respective borrower named below (who will be the owner and operator of the respective project) to finance the cost in the amount of the bond of acquiring the project or for the purpose of refunding a bond previously issued to finance the project. The project shall be located as shown:

Description: Acquisition of 320 acres of agricultural land and related improvements and equipment to be used by the owner/operator for farming purposes. Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Bureau of Health Facilities, will conduct a public hearing from 10 a.m. to noon Friday, December 8, in Room 1003, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider revocations of and amendments to existing regulations and adoption of new regulations concerning ambulatory surgical centers and hospitals.

The time between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a 60-day public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulatory action. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Beth Voorhees, Bureau of Health Facilities, Suite 1001, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612.

All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to represent their views orally on the proposed regulatory action during the hearing. To give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to require each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Beth Voorhees.

Copies of the proposed regulations and the economic impact statement may be obtained by contacting Beth Voorhees. Questions pertaining to the proposed regulations also should be directed to Beth Voorhees. A summary of the proposed regulations and the economic impact follows.

Revocations

K.A.R. 28-34-52, 28-34-55, 28-34-56, and 28-34-58 to 28-34-61 are being revoked.

Ambulatory Surgical Center Regulations

K.A.R. 28-34-50. Definitions. This section updates the current definitions to include new references to the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Act, certain practitioners providing care in ASCs and not previously recognized, and other current terms. The governing authority definition has been changed to reflect the possibility of ownership by a single individual rather than a corporate or not-for-profit entity.

K.A.R. 28-34-51. Licensing procedure. This regulation requires ambulatory surgical centers to submit a state licensure application and construction documents. An annual application report also is required to be submitted each year. The regulation also requires the facility to verify professional liability coverage in accordance with K.S.A. 40-3401 and the development of a risk management plan in accordance with K.S.A. 65-4921 *et seq.* There are no comparable federal requirements.

(continued)

K.A.R. 28-34-52a. Patient rights. This regulation is new and defines each facility's governing body responsibilities in developing policies and procedures that support the rights of patients. The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has required the development of resident/patient rights in adult care homes and hospitals and proposes the extension of such requirements to ambulatory surgical centers. Although other accrediting bodies reference such standards, no similar federal regulations are currently available.

K.A.R. 28-34-52b. Assessment and care of patients. This section is new and reorganizes some previous requirements found in other sections of the current regulations. Requirements associated with the assessment and care of patients are the basis for standards established by accrediting bodies such as the Joint Commission on Healthcare Organizations and the Accreditation Association for Ambulatory Health Care.

K.A.R. 28-34-53. Governing authority. This regulation amendment references the governing authority's responsibility in the development of governing and medical staff bylaws and references implementation of a risk management program in accordance with K.S.A. 65-4921 *et seq.* and K.A.R. 28-52-1 through K.A.R. 28-52-4. There is no comparable federal risk management requirement.

K.A.R. 28-34-54. Medical staff. The description of medical staff involvement in the oversight of patient care is more developed than in federal regulations. Delineation of risk management activities not described in federal regulations also is included.

K.A.R. 28-34-55a. Human resources. Under this proposed new regulation, the requirements related to personnel issues are located at one reference rather than listed at several cites as with comparable federal regulations.

K.A.R. 28-34-56a. Anesthesia services. This new regulation is comparable to surgical services found at federal regulation 42 CFR 416.42. References to Kansas specific practice requirements for anesthesia providers are included in the regulation. Reference is made to the need for review and evaluation of anesthesia services. The proper labeling, inventory and maintenance of anesthetics and anesthetic equipment are referenced in the regulation and not included in federal regulation.

K.A.R. 28-34-57. Medical records. This regulation was amended to clarify current regulatory language. The regulation has always required maintenance of records for at least 10 years. There is no comparable federal requirement. The proposed regulation also clarifies the use of verbal orders and requires completion of the medical record within 30 days following patient discharge. These requirements describe standards that are not addressed by federal requirements.

K.A.R. 28-34-58a. Infection control. There is no comparable federal regulation related to this topic. Current Kansas Department of Health and Environment guidelines have been included in the new regulation and combine three sections into one topic area: infection control.

K.A.R. 28-34-59a. Ancillary services. This regulation is comparable to two Medicare certification regulatory cites, 42 CFR 416.48, Pharmaceutical Services, and 42 CFR 416.49, Laboratory and Radiologic Services.

K.A.R. 28-34-60a. Food services. There is no federal regulation comparable to this proposed regulation. The statutory definition of an ambulatory surgical center in Kansas allows patients to be admitted to the facility up to 24 hours. Medicare reimbursed ambulatory surgical services are generally limited to a total of 90 minutes operating time and four hours recovery or convalescent time. The proposed new regulation provides standards when the provision of food service is necessary.

K.A.R. 28-34-61a. Physical environment.

K.A.R. 28-34-62a. Construction standards. The federal requirements for Environmental Standards are found at 42 CFR 416.44. However, the proposed state regulations include specific reference to no smoking (K.S.A. 21-4017), and the 1996-97 Guidelines for Design and Construction of Hospital and Medical Facilities. The requirements for construction projects are updated from the previously referenced 1992-93 edition. The federal regulations do not provide guidance related to facility construction although the referenced guidelines are supported by the Health Care Financing Administration and the Health Resources Services Administration.

Hospital Regulations

K.A.R. 28-34-1a. Definitions. This section updates the current definitions to include certain practitioners providing care in hospitals not previously recognized and other current terms.

K.A.R. 28-34-6a. Medical staff. Proposed additions and changes to this section reflect current standards of practice without diminishing the hospital's quality assurance responsibilities.

K.A.R. 28-34-9a. Medical records services. Proposed additions and changes to this section reflect current standards of practice without diminishing the hospital's quality assurance responsibilities.

K.A.R. 28-34-32b. Construction standards. This regulation is amended to reference the current 1996-97 "Guidelines for Design and Construction of Hospital and Health Care Facilities."

In general, the promulgation of these new regulations will have little or no economic impact on the agency. These regulation amendments will allow the Kansas Department of Health and Environment to conduct licensure surveys in accordance with K.S.A. 65-433 utilizing updated standards. It is anticipated that the adoption of these regulations will not have a significant economic impact to private citizens and consumers. The regulations update standards that are or should be readily achievable by licensed facilities. There may be additional costs to new potential owners of ambulatory surgical centers related to adoption of the more current edition of the Guidelines for Design and Construction of Hospital and Health Care Facilities (1996-97). The update of construction standards may create additional costs for owners that cannot be calculated by the Kansas Department of Health and Environment. These costs would be associated with meeting referenced construction standards.

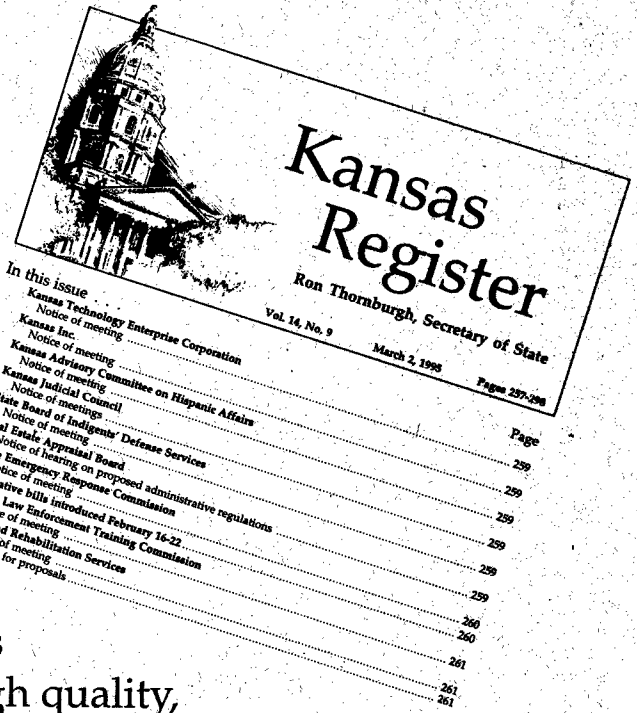
