**Attorney General****Opinion 2000-54**

**State Departments; Public Officers and Employees—Kansas Performance Review Board; Powers and Duties; Authority to Charge State Agencies for Cost of Review.** Robert L. Stockwell, Executive Director, Kansas Performance Review Board, Topeka, November 2, 2000.

The Kansas Performance Review Board has been authorized since May 20, 1998, to charge state agencies amounts necessary to recover all or part of the costs of analyses of governmental functions conducted at the request of such state agencies in accordance with K.S.A. 75-7104. Subsequent to April 26, 1999, the board has been authorized to charge state agencies amounts necessary to recover all or part of the costs of analyses of governmental functions conducted at the discretion of the executive director in accordance with K.S.A. 75-7104, in addition to charging for those conducted at the request of the agency. There apparently is no authority to require payment for analyses conducted prior to these dates or outside the limitations established by the provisos, and likewise there appears to be no authority for agencies to pay for the costs of an analysis from any funds other than "one or more appropriate special revenue funds." An agency's ability to pay such costs may thus depend on availability of funds and other budget law constraints. **Opinion 2000-55**

**Constitution of the State of Kansas—Corporations—Cities' Powers of Home Rule; Ordinance Prohibiting Ticket Scalping.**

**Counties and County Officers—General Provisions—Home Rule Powers; Resolution Prohibiting Ticket Scalping.** Senator John Vratil, 11th District, Leawood, November 2, 2000.

A city or county can enact local legislation to prohibit "ticket scalping" if the governing body concludes that such activity is detrimental to the peace, health, safety and welfare of its citizens. Moreover, a city or county may enforce such legislation on private property, state-owned property, and on federal highways. **Opinion 2000-56**

**State Departments; Public Officers and Employees—State Historical Society; Historic Preservation Powers and Duties.** Representative Ralph M. Tanner, 10th District, Baldwin City, November 2, 2000.

In a state, such as Kansas, with an approved Historic Preservation Program, only the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) may formally submit a nomination for listing of a property on the National Register of Historic Places to the National Park Service. Only the State Historic Sites Review Board, in conjunction with the SHPO, can list a property on the State Register of Historic Places. Any person may submit a nomination form for any property to the SHPO. While private property may not be placed on the National Register without the owner's consent, no statutory provisions limit the placement of public property on either the National or State Registers. **Opinion 2000-57**

**Schools—Transportation of Students—Transportation of Nonpublic School Pupils; Contracts for Transportation of Certain Students; Reimbursement for Mileage.** William W. Jeter, Counsel, Unified School District No. 489, Hays, November 2, 2000.

A unified school district that provides school bus transportation for its pupils is required to provide school bus transportation for pupils attending private or parochial schools who reside along a regular school route or gather at a place along a regular school route. Further, the school district may provide or furnish transportation for pupils attending private or parochial schools to such extent and upon such conditions as the school district deems appropriate. There is no mandatory obligation placed upon a school district to provide or furnish transportation for pupils attending private or parochial schools who do not reside along a regular school route or gather at a place along a regular school route. ## Notice of Review of Administrative Regulations

As directed by Executive Order 00-03, the Kansas Parole Board has conducted a comprehensive review of all rules and regulations of the board for the purpose of identifying and eliminating or modifying, as appropriate, any rules and regulations that are outdated, redundant, overly broad, ineffective, unnecessary, cumbersome, irrelevant or otherwise undesirable or inconsistent with the criteria set forth in Executive Order 00-03.

In order to conclude this review, the Kansas Parole Board is giving notice of a 30-day public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the rules and regulations of the board. The board is seeking written comments evaluating individual regulations in light of the criteria for regulatory review established by the Executive Order 00-03. Those criteria include the following:

1. **Need:** Is the regulation necessary to comply with the statutes that authorize it? Is the regulation obsolete, duplicative or ambiguous to a degree that warrants repeal or revision? Is the regulation broader than necessary to accomplish its purpose or objective?

2. **Clarity:** Is the regulation written and organized in a clear and concise manner so it can be readily understood by those to whom it applies?

3. **Cost:** Have the benefits of the regulation been considered in relation to its cost? Do the benefits of the regulation exceed the costs of the regulation?

4. **Fairness:** Does the regulation result in equitable treatment of those required to comply with it and those affected by the regulation in other ways?

5. **Effectiveness:** Has the regulation been effective in achieving the purpose for which it was established?

The majority of the Kansas Parole Board's regulations can be found in Volume 3 of the *Kansas Administrative Regulations* and the *1999 Supplement to the Kansas Administrative Regulations*, both published by the Secretary of State. Four regulations that have been adopted recently are printed in the Kansas Register, which is published weekly. An index at the back of each issue identifies the regulations published in the Kansas Register, as well as the volume and page number where each regulation can be found. Public libraries should maintain a set of the *Kansas Administrative Regulations* and the Kansas Register.

Written comments should specifically identify, by K.A.R. number, each regulation that is the subject of the comments. Any interested party may submit written comments regarding the rules and regulations of the Kansas Parole Board on or before December 26 to Ben Burgess, Kansas Parole Board, Room 452-S, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612.

The single change in this regulation would allow an individual who had obtained an unlimited turkey permit in the prior year to apply in the current year on an equal basis for all applicants in the limited unit.

**Economic Impact Summary:** The proposed amendment would not affect the number of turkey permits available, and therefore is not anticipated to have an economic impact on the department, other state agencies or members of the public.

**115-2-2. Motor vehicle permit fees.** (a) The following motor vehicle permit fees shall be in effect for state parks and for other areas requiring a motor vehicle permit:

One-day temporary motor vehicle permit .....	\$ 4.50
October 1 through March 31:	
Annual motor vehicle permit .....	29.50
Additional motor vehicle permit .....	14.50
April 1 through September 30:	
Annual motor vehicle permit .....	34.50
Additional motor vehicle permit .....	17.00

(b) Each one-day temporary motor vehicle permit shall expire at noon on the day following its effective date. However, a one-day temporary motor vehicle permit shall expire at 2:00 p.m. on Sundays and on Memorial Day, Independence Day and Labor Day when the Sunday or the listed holiday is the day following the effective date of the one-day temporary motor vehicle permit.

(c) This regulation shall be effective on and after January 1, 2001. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 32-807 and K.S.A. 32-901; effective Jan. 22, 1990; amended Oct. 12, 1992; amended Aug. 21, 1995; amended Jan. 1, 2001.)

**115-2-3. Camping, utility, and other fees.** (a) Each overnight camping permit shall be valid only for the state park for which it is purchased and shall expire at noon on the day following its effective date.

(b) Each annual camping permit may be used in any state park for unlimited overnight camping, subject to other laws and regulations of the secretary, and shall expire on December 31 of the year for which it is issued.

(c) Each 14-night camping permit may be used in any state park and shall expire when the permit has been used a total of 14 nights, or on December 31 of the year for which it is issued, whichever is first.

(d) Camping permits shall not be transferable.

(e) The fee for a designated prime camping area permit shall be in addition to the overnight, annual, 14-night, or other camping permit fee, and shall apply on a nightly basis.

(f) Fees shall be due at the time of campsite occupancy and by noon of any subsequent days of campsite occupancy.

(g) Fees set by this regulation shall be in addition to any required motor vehicle permit fee specified in K.A.R. 115-2-2.

**Article 7.—FISH AND FROGS**

**115-7-1. Fishing; legal equipment, methods of take, and other provisions.** (a) Legal equipment and methods for taking sport fish shall be the following:

- (1) Fishing lines with not more than two baited hooks or artificial lures per line;
- (2) trotlines;
- (3) setlines;
- (4) tip-ups; and
- (5) snagging for paddlefish in waters posted by the department as open to snagging of paddlefish, subject to the following requirements:

(A) Each paddlefish caught and landed shall be included in the creel and possession limit, unless a minimum length limit has been established and posted for that area, in which case each paddlefish not meeting the minimum length limit shall be released immediately into the waters from which it came.

(B) Each individual fishing for paddlefish shall place all paddlefish legally caught on a stringer, cord, cable, or chain, or in a basket, sack, cage, or other holding device that shall be marked with the individual's name and address.

(C) Each individual with a filled creel limit shall cease all snagging activity in the paddlefish snagging area until the next calendar day.

(D) Each individual taking paddlefish during the snagging season shall transport each paddlefish taken to a check station established by the department, and each paddlefish shall be taken to the check station immediately upon the filling of the daily creel limit or upon cessation of the day's fishing activity.

(E) Each paddlefish checked shall have a numbered tag attached to its lower jaw at the check station.

(F) Each individual shall provide that person's name, address, and fishing license number to the check station attendant.

(b) Legal equipment and methods for taking non-sport fish shall be the following:

- (1) Fishing lines with not more than two baited hooks or artificial lures per line;
- (2) trotlines;
- (3) setlines;
- (4) tip-ups;
- (5) bow and arrow with a barbed head and a line attached from bow to arrow;
- (6) crossbow and arrow with a barbed head and a line attached from arrow to crossbow;
- (7) spear gun, without explosive charge, while skin or scuba diving. The spear, without explosive charge, shall be attached to the speargun or person by a line; and
- (8) snagging and gigging in waters posted by the department as open to snagging or gigging.

(c) Dip nets and gaffs may be used to land any legally caught or hooked fish.

(d) Fish may be taken by any method designated by the secretary when a fish salvage order has been issued by the secretary through public notice or posting the area open to fish salvage.

(e) Fish may be taken with the aid of boats, depth finders, artificial lights, sound attracters, and scents.

(f) Fish may be taken by legal means from vehicles. (Authorized by K.S.A. 32-807; implementing K.S.A. 32-807 and K.S.A. 32-1002; effective Dec. 26, 1989; amended Feb. 10, 1992; amended Oct. 1, 1999; amended Dec. 8, 2000.)
