An informational meeting will be held at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday, January 16, to provide consultants with the opportunity to discuss these projects with staff from Overland Park, Lenexa and KDOT. The meeting will be held in Conference Room 1 of the Overland Park City Hall.

From the firms expressing interest, the Consultant Selection Committee will select a list of the most highly

qualified (not less than three or more than five) and invite them to attend an individual interview conference. At this time, the consulting firms can more thoroughly discuss their experience related to the type of project at hand and will be expected to discuss, in some detail, their approach to this project and the personnel to be assigned to the project. Firms not selected to be short listed will be notified by letter.

The Consultant Selection Committee, composed of representatives of the City of Overland Park, City of Lenexa and Kansas Department of Transportation, will conduct the discussions with the firms invited to the individual interview conferences. The committee will select the firm to perform the professional services required for completing the advertised project. After the selection of this firm, the remaining firms will be notified by letter of the outcome.

Each bond will be payable solely from amounts received from the respective borrower, the obligation of which will be sufficient to pay the principal of, interest and redemption premium, if any, on each bond when it becomes due.

Notice to Private Activity Bond Applicants

Applications for allocation of 2001 Private Activity Bond (PAB) authority are now being accepted for qualified uses, as defined by the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, and amendments thereto.

The State of Kansas is projected to receive \$187,500,000 of federal authority for the issuance of PABs in calendar year 2001. Historically, the primary uses of this federal authority have included "qualified small issue bonds" used for construction and equipping of manufacturing facilities and beginning farmer programs; "exempt facility bonds" used by for-profit entities providing a public benefit, i.e., certain waste treatment facilities, qualified residential rental facilities, etc.; and "qualified mortgage bonds" issued to benefit first-time homebuyers. Allocations awarded by the Secretary of Commerce and Housing are subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 74-5060 *et seq.* and the limitations of the state volume cap.

Fees associated with PAB application and issuance are as follows:

- (1) Application fee—A nonrefundable fee must accompany the application before the request can be processed. The application fee is determined as follows:
 - \$250 for allocation requests up to \$5,000,000
 - \$500 for allocation requests from \$5,000,001 to \$10,000,000
 - \$1,000 for allocation requests \$10,000,001 and above
- (2) Issuance fee—An issuance fee for allocation amounts utilized, other than "Qualified Mortgage Bonds" issued, shall be due and payable to the Kansas Department of Commerce and Housing at bond closing. Issuance fees shall be determined as follows:

Allocation Used	Fee
• To \$2,000,000	5 basis points (.05%)
• \$2,000,001 and above	10 basis points (.10%)

"Qualified Mortgage Bond" programs will be assessed a fee equal to .5% of equal mortgage loan amount upon issuance of each mortgage loan assisted through the program.

Issuance fees shall be remitted within 30 days of bond closing. Checks for both the application and issuance fees should be payable to the Kansas Department of Commerce and Housing Bond Fee Fund.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. Dodge City Cooperative Exchange has applied for a Class II operating permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-540. Emissions of particulate matter equal to or less than 10 microns in diameter (PM₁₀) were evaluated during the permit review process. The purpose of a Class II permit is to limit the potential-to-emit for these pollutants to below major source thresholds.

Dodge City Cooperative Exchange, Dodge City, owns and operates a terminal grain elevator located at 706 Bent, Ensign, Gray County.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the permit application review process is available for public review during normal business hours at the KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, Building 283, Forbes Field, Topeka, and at the KDHE Southwest District Office, 302 W. McArtor Road, Dodge City.  Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 1 p.m. Monday, March 19, in the office of the Director of Property Valuation, fourth floor, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, to consider proposed changes to existing rules and regulations of the Division of Property Valuation of the Kansas Department of Revenue.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Laura Johnson, Deputy Director of Property Valuation, 4th Floor, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, 66612-1585. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Laura Johnson at (785) 296-4218. Handicapped parking is located in State Parking Lot No. 2, south of the Docking Building facing Harrison Street, and the north, south and east entrances to the Docking Building are accessible.

The amended regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the regulations and their economic impact follows.

93-1-1 to 93-1-4, inclusive. Hearings by Director of Property Valuation. It is proposed that these regulations be revoked. Hearings before the Director of Property Valuation are now conducted in accordance with the Kansas administrative procedure act, K.S.A. 77-501 *et seq.*; therefore, these regulations are obsolete. The proposed change has no economic impact.

93-4-6. Standards on ratio studies. This regulation adopts the "standard on ratio studies," adopted by the executive board of the International Association of Assessing Officers in July 1990. That standard was superseded by the "standard on ratio studies," adopted by the executive board of the International Association of Assessing Officers in July 1999. It is proposed to update the regulation to adopt the current standard. The proposed change has no economic impact.

93-6-1 to 93-6-4, inclusive. Registered mass appraiser. These regulations prescribe the education and experience requirements for a registered mass appraiser. It is proposed to reduce the number of mandatory hours from 150 to 140, and increase the number of elective hours from 30 to 40. It also is proposed to make the four-year continuing education cycle the same as the four-year continuing ed-

ucation cycle for a county appraiser. It also is proposed to limit the qualifying mass appraisal experience that may come from appraising personal property to 600 hours, except where the candidate can demonstrate that the personal property appraised was comparable in complexity to the appraisal of real property and that personal property constitutes a predominate portion of the tax base of the county in which the values were determined. The proposed change has no economic impact.

Annual Program Report for the Voluntary Cleanup and Property Redevelopment Program

Activities from December 31, 1999 to
December 31, 2000:

Background

The Voluntary Cleanup and Property Redevelopment Act was enacted by the Kansas Legislature on July 1, 1997 (Kansas Statutes Annotated 65-34,161 through 65-34,174). The purpose of the act is to allow voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties with oversight by the Kansas Department of Health and Environment to promote the transfer, redevelopment and reuse of contaminated properties and protect public health and the environment. Article 71 of the Kansas Administrative Regulations, specifically K.A.R. 28-71-1 through 28-71-12, were promulgated June 26, 1998, officially establishing the Voluntary Cleanup and Property Redevelopment Program (VCPRP). The law and program are administered by the Kansas Department of Health and Environment.

Under the Voluntary Cleanup and Property Redevelopment Program, stakeholders performing cleanup of contaminated properties that meet the criteria in the law (low to medium priority sites with minimal risk) can receive a "no further action" determination from the department to provide some protection from potential liabilities. Adjacent property owners who did not contribute to the contamination also may receive protection from the department through such determinations. A streamlined process is utilized to address these sites in an expeditious manner to encourage the redevelopment or enhancement of such properties. Clearly defined cleanup standards that identify the extent of cleanup have been developed and are provided to the voluntary party early in the program so the time and costs involved in cleanup can be determined. The Voluntary Cleanup and Property Redevelopment Program is truly voluntary and is designed for industry and businesses to properly address contamination on their property through a private/state partnership. There are no additional burdens or requirements

placed on voluntary parties that participate in the program.

Report Summary

In accordance with K.S.A. 65-34,173, the Department of Health and Environment shall publish annually in the Kansas Register a summary of the number of applicants, the general categories of those applicants and the number of cleanups completed pursuant to this act. This annual report describes the activities accomplished by the department in the Voluntary Cleanup and Property Redevelopment Program for the period of December 31, 1999 to December 31, 2000.

The previous annual reports to the Legislature contained descriptions of VCPRP activities that reflected significant program building and implementation. VCPRP activities conducted during this reporting period involved increased attention to the operation of the program to successfully achieve intended program objectives in light of increasing numbers of applications to the program. VCPRP refinement also has continued through this reporting period developing policies and procedures; the need for these new policies are typically identified from the actual processing of properties through the VCPRP process. VCPRP refinement is expected to continue as the program matures; however, ongoing program refinement also would be expected in response to other state or federal regulatory influences as they occur and affect existing program procedures and guidance.

The 2000 Kansas Legislature passed the Agriculture and Specialty Chemical Remediation Act (SB 501), which was signed into law by Governor Graves. This act establishes an industry-supported remediation fund to provide financial aid to eligible parties faced with costs associated with addressing soil or groundwater contamination caused by agricultural and specialty chemicals such as fertilizers and pesticides. The VCPRP has been identified as one of the preferred programs to address agriculture-related properties with contamination problems. The VCPRP currently has a rather significant percentage of agriculture-related projects; the numbers of agriculture-related applications to the VCPRP is expected to increase with the new funding mechanism for property owners with these types of problems.

As of December 20, 2000, the department has received a total of 175 completed application packages, of which 173 properties have been determined eligible to participate in the program. A total of 162 voluntary agreements have been signed. Voluntary cleanup investigations have been initiated or completed at 114 properties. Currently, 27 properties have entered the voluntary cleanup phase, meaning in either the preliminary cleanup proposal process, cleanup planning stage or active cleanup phase; cleanups have now been completed at six properties. To date, the department has issued 16 No Further Action Determination letters.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Environment, Bureau of Air and Radiation, will conduct a public hearing at 10:30 a.m. Wednesday, March 14, in the Kansas City-Wyandotte County Health Department auditorium, 619 Ann Ave., Kansas City, Kansas, to consider the adoption of a proposed new air quality regulation K.A.R. 28-19-719, "fuel volatility," and the revocation of existing air quality regulation K.A.R. 28-19-79, "fuel volatility." K.A.R. 28-19-79 limits the volatility of gasoline sold in Wyandotte and Johnson counties. In essence, the new K.A.R. 28-19-719 will replace the existing K.A.R. 28-19-79, while lowering the volatility level. In addition, public comment on the agency's Request for Waiver letter to the Environmental Protection Agency will be taken through March 14. This letter requests authority under the Clean Air Act for the state to adopt this fuel regulation.

The time period between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulatory action. All interested parties may submit written comments regarding either the proposed regulatory actions or the waiver request letter prior to the hearing to Ralph J. Kieffer, Bureau of Air and Radiation, Building 283, Forbes Field, Topeka, 66620. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the proposed regulatory action during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to require each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed amendments and the economic impact and environmental benefit statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Rob Bradford, (785) 296-1587.

Copies of the proposed new regulation and the economic impact and environmental benefit statements, as well as the waiver request letter, may be obtained from

the Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Bureau of Air and Radiation, (785) 296-6428. Questions pertaining to these proposed amendments should be directed to Ralph J. Kieffer, (785) 296-6428, or Chuck Layman, (785) 296-1579. A summary of the proposed regulation and its economic impact follows.

Proposed New K.A.R. 28-19-719

The State of Kansas is required under the federal Clean Air Act and its regulations to implement air pollution control measures that will achieve and maintain air quality in the state within the ambient air quality standards established by the EPA. Johnson and Wyandotte counties in the Kansas portion of the Kansas City metropolitan area (KCMA) air quality control region have experienced problems complying with the federal ambient air quality standard for ozone. In order to meet the requirement that the state maintain ozone levels within the national standards in the KCMA, KDHE is proposing a new regulation to reduce the level of fuel volatility during the ozone season (June 1 to September 15 of each year) from the current level of 7.2 pounds per square inch (psi) Reid vapor pressure (RVP) to 7.0 psi, beginning with the 2001 ozone season. This limit will reduce the emissions of volatile organic compounds from motor vehicle fuel. Volatile organic compounds are precursor pollutants that aid in the formation of ozone in the lower atmosphere. By limiting the fuel volatility, and thus the emissions of volatile organic compounds, the state anticipates that this control measure will improve compliance with the national ambient air quality standard for ozone in the Kansas City metropolitan area. Evaluation of the cost effectiveness of this control measure indicated that it was the most cost effective among those available for implementation prior to the 2001 ozone season that resulted in significant emission reductions. The consumers of motor vehicle fuel are expected to experience an increase in the price of gasoline during the ozone season not greater than approximately 1.5 to 2.5 cents per gallon of gasoline over current costs, depending on the individual refinery, throughout the KCMA.

Request to EPA for Fuel Waiver

The Clean Air Act reserves the authority to regulate fuel characteristics to the EPA, but provides a mechanism for the states to request authority from the EPA to regulate fuel characteristics in a specific area through a waiver of the federal authority. To do so, the state must demonstrate that such a waiver is necessary to attain or maintain the area's ambient air quality within the applicable levels. The bureau has prepared a letter requesting the necessary authority from the EPA through the waiver provisions of Section 211(c) of the Clean Air Act. Public comment is being solicited on the waiver letter through March 14, in addition to the proposed regulation changes. The waiver request letter will be available not later than February 12, providing a 30-day comment period on this document.

Article 3.—INSTANT GENERIC GAME RULES

111-3-12. Determination of instant prize winners.

The following subparagraphs specify how an instant prize winner is determined for instant games except where otherwise specified by individual game rules:

(a) The player must remove or "scratch off" the removable layer of material covering the play area to reveal the play symbols and captions. If the play symbols meet the requirements of the rules of the game, the player wins the prize designated by the rules of the game.

(b) In any event, only the highest instant prize shall be paid on a given ticket unless it is a multiple game ticket.

(c) Once a player has collected a prize from a retailer, the player shall not be entitled to any other prize from the lottery whether or not the prize paid by the retailer was less than the prize to which the player was entitled.

(d) Only play symbols and validation numbers are used for determination of entitlement to instant prizes. Play symbol captions, agent validation codes, book-ticket numbers, any portion of the display printing and any extraneous materials are not play symbols or validation numbers, and shall not be usable or playable to win instant prizes.

(e) In all events, the determination of instant prize winners shall be subject to the general ticket validation requirements set forth in K.A.R. 111-3-13 and the requirements set forth on the back of each instant game ticket.

(f) An instant ticket is a bearer instrument. The prize payable for an instant ticket shall be paid to the bearer or holder thereof unless the ticket has been signed on the back. Once a ticket has been signed on the back, any prize payable for such ticket shall be paid to the apparent owner of the ticket as evidenced by such signature. If the signature of more than one person appears on the back of the ticket in the designated place, all persons whose signatures appear must identify one person to whom payment should be made. If all persons whose signatures appear in the appropriate space cannot identify one person to whom payment should be made, the lottery shall keep the prize until a determination of entitlement is made by the parties. In no event shall more than one person be entitled to a particular prize.

(g) No particular prize may be paid more than once.

(h) All instant prizes must be claimed within 180 days following the termination of the game announced by the executive director, or in drawings involving non-winning instant tickets entered in a drawing, within 180 days of the drawing in which the prize was won. To claim a prize, the holder of the winning ticket must present or mail the winning ticket and claim form as set forth in K.A.R. 111-3-14, and the retailer or the lottery must receive it within the above time period. Any instant prize not claimed by such date and in the manner specified on the back of each ticket shall be forfeited.

(i) The right of any person to a prize shall not be assignable, except that payment of any prize may be paid

to the estate of a deceased prize winner or to a person designated pursuant to an appropriate judicial order. Article 4.—INSTANT GAME RULES

CARIBBEAN STUD POKER DRAWING

111-4-1795. Name of drawing. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a drawing entitled "Caribbean Stud Poker Drawing," and will accept entries starting the date "Caribbean Stud Poker" instant tickets become available for the drawing to be conducted at 10:00 a.m. on May 18, 2001. Rules applicable to the "Caribbean Stud Poker Drawing" are contained in K.A.R. 111-4-1795 through 111-4-1800 and K.A.R. 111-6-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-12-15-00, Nov. 17, 2000.)

111-4-1796. Prize. The seven prize winners selected in the "Caribbean Stud Poker Drawing" on the date specified in K.A.R. 111-4-1795 shall receive a four-day cruise on a Carnival Cruise Lines ship for two people, including round-trip coach air transportation from Wichita, Kansas, or Kansas City, Missouri, to departure port in Florida, all port charges, government fees and taxes, prepaid tipping and airport transfers, on-board meals, shows, entertainment, use of facilities, and \$200 on-board credit. The prize of each trip, including the trip and credit, will have a total value of \$3,234. The following restrictions shall apply to the "Caribbean Stud Poker" prize packages:

(a) Reservations must be made at least 30 days prior to planned departure date.

(b) Cruises are only valid on the Carnival Cruise ships Ecstasy, Fantasy, Imagination, or Tropicale.

(c) Vacation packages are transferable one time, cannot be redeemed for cash, are not refundable, and cannot be extended. All transfers require a certified authorization from the winner. All transfers must be made prior to reservation.

(d) Winners will have until March 31, 2002, to have their vacation travel completed.

(e) Winners may purchase upgrades to longer cruises or land packages.

(f) Once a reservation has been confirmed, winners may cancel or change their sailing dates up to 15 days prior to departure and must pay a \$25 per person fee. If cancellation occurs within 15 days of scheduled departure, Carnival Cruise Lines will provide the winner with a comparable cruise on a space available basis. At its sole discretion, Carnival Cruise Lines will confirm the future cruise approximately two weeks prior to departure based upon cabin availability.

(g) Vacations are subject to availability. Any meals, drinks, gratuities, and taxes that are not specifically mentioned are not included.

(h) Winners cannot schedule their cruises during the five holiday week sailings of Christmas, New Year's, Easter, President's weekend, or Thanksgiving, unless they purchase an upgrade to cruise during these periods.

(i) All prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs and deductions authorized by law.

(j) The winner of a prize as the result of the "Caribbean Stud Poker Drawing" shall return to the lottery a completed claim form as provided by the lottery within 45 days in which his or her ticket was drawn or the person named on the ticket drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn pursuant to subsection (e) of K.A.R. 111-4-1799 shall be declared the winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-12-15-00, Nov. 17, 2000.)

111-4-1797. Method of entry. (a) Entry into the "Caribbean Stud Poker Drawing" to be conducted on May 18, 2001, shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) Obtain a valid "Caribbean Stud Poker" Kansas instant lottery ticket;

(2) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with "Caribbean Stud Poker" instant game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the "Caribbean Stud Poker Drawing" and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules;

(3) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for the drawing and the holder of the ticket may enter the "Caribbean Stud Poker Drawing."

(4) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on a non-winning ticket entered.

(5) Place one or more non-winning "Caribbean Stud Poker" ticket(s) into an envelope with proper postage and mail it to: "Caribbean Stud Poker Drawing," c/o Kansas lottery, P. O. Box 3561, Topeka, Kansas 66601-3561. Mailed entries must be received by morning mail pickup on May 15, 2001.

(6) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the "Caribbean Stud Poker Drawing" or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner;

(7) The drawing will be conducted at the approximate times listed in K.A.R. 111-4-1795.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person may only win one time.

(c) All eligible non-winning tickets which are mailed and received by the morning mail pickup in Topeka, Kansas, on Tuesday, May 15, 2001, shall be entered into the "Caribbean Stud Poker Drawing."

(d) Eligible entrants in any "Caribbean Stud Poker Drawing" must be 18 years of age or older.

(e) Completing the information form on the non-winning ticket and entering the ticket into the drawing constitutes authorization to publicly identify the person whose entry is drawn. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-12-15-00, Nov. 17, 2000.)

111-4-1798. Certification of drawing. (a) The "Caribbean Stud Poker Drawing" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing

department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery.

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-12-15-00, Nov. 17, 2000.)

111-4-1799. Selection of winners. The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "Caribbean Stud Poker Drawing":

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing "Caribbean Stud Poker Drawing" entries at the United States Post Office in Topeka, Kansas, with final pick up on Tuesday, May 15, 2001.

(b) Lottery personnel shall transport the mail to the mail room where the envelopes will be opened and the ticket(s) contained therein stored in a secure location until immediately prior to the drawing, at which time all tickets will be placed into the drawing receptacle or drum.

(c) The drawing shall be held at the lottery headquarters in a place accessible to the public and open for public attendance with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn. •

(f) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each ticket drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the "Caribbean Stud Poker Drawing" in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner. Each winner shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and returned to the lottery within 45 days of the drawing.

(g) If the entry is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.

(continued)

(h) Non-winning "Caribbean Stud Poker" entry tickets are eligible for all drawings.

(i) All "Caribbean Stud Poker" tickets remaining in the drum or receptacle on May 18, 2001, after the winners have been selected and certified, and all entries not received in compliance with these rules shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34; (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-12-15-00, Nov. 17, 2000.)

111-4-1800. Rights of participants. Any Kansas "Caribbean Stud Poker" ticket entered into the "Caribbean Stud Poker Drawing" is disqualified from any other Kansas lottery prize or eligibility for which that ticket may have been redeemable. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-12-15-00, Nov. 17, 2000.)

WESTRIDGE MALL SIDEWALK SALE DRAWING

111-4-1801. Name, time, and place of drawing. (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant ticket drawing entitled "Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale Drawing." The date of the drawing shall be January 15, 2001.

(b) The draw receptacle shall be open during lottery selling hours at the Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale from January 12, 2001, through and including January 15, 2001, at 7:00 p.m. This drawing shall take place at the lottery selling booth at the Westridge Mall in Topeka, Kansas, at approximately 7:00 p.m. on January 15, 2001.

(c) Rules applicable to the "Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale Drawing" are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-1801 through 111-4-1805. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-12-15-00, Nov. 17, 2000.)

111-4-1802. Definitions. (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and amendments thereto and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference and govern unless otherwise indicated.

(b) "Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale Drawings" means the acts of drawing prizes conducted by the Kansas lottery at the Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale in Topeka, Kansas, in which participants are selected to win various prizes as described in K.A.R. 111-4-1804.

(c) "Non-winning ticket" means any valid Kansas instant game lottery ticket not eligible to win a prize under any instant game rules.

(d) "Receptacle" or "drum" means a container in which non-winning Kansas instant game lottery tickets are placed and from which the "Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale Drawings" are made. Receptacles or drums may be sealable and shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution.

(e) "Bare arm technique" means a type of drawing where the person drawing the winning ticket from the receptacle or drum wears a long-sleeved shirt with sleeve rolled up above the elbow, a short-sleeved shirt (sleeve not extending past the elbow) or a non-sleeve shirt which exposes the drawer's bare arm and looks away from the drawing drum or receptacle while drawing.

(f) "Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale Drawing" means the drawings which will occur at the times described at K.A.R. 111-4-1801. (Authorized by and implementing

K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-12-15-00, Nov. 17, 2000.)

111-4-1803. Entry into drawing. Entry into the "Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale Drawing" ("drawing") is accomplished as follows:

(a) Obtain a valid Kansas instant \$1.00 lottery ticket purchased from the lottery selling location at the Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale or the Street Corner News retail location at the Westridge Mall from January 12, 2001, through January 15, 2001, at 7:00 p.m.;

(b) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with any instant game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the drawing and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules;

(c) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for winning the drawing and the holder of the ticket may enter the drawing;

(d) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner;

(e) The holder of the non-winning ticket must take the non-winning ticket with the completed information form to the location of the drawing and place it in the receptacle or drum provided;

(f) The receptacle or drum shall be available and entries may be made at the times stated in K.A.R. 111-4-1801. Entries shall be allowed until the actual winner selection process begins;

(g) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the drawing or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner;

(h) There is no limit to the number of entries an entrant may make, but each entrant may only win one prize;

(i) All eligible entrants must be at least 18 years of age. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-12-15-00, Nov. 17, 2000.)

111-4-1804. Determination of "Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale Drawing" winners and prizes. (a) At least five minutes before the drawing, a lottery drawing official designated by the executive director shall announce to the audience that the winner selection process will begin. Any persons wishing to enter the drawing who have not yet done so, shall immediately place their tickets into the receptacle or drum at this time.

(b) The drawing official shall announce that entries into the drawing are closed. No further entries will be accepted.

(c) The receptacle or drum shall be sealed and capable of being mixed with a shovel or by other means for two minutes or rotated a minimum of 10 times to ensure random selection.

(d) The drawing official shall designate one individual of his or her choice to participate in the selection process.

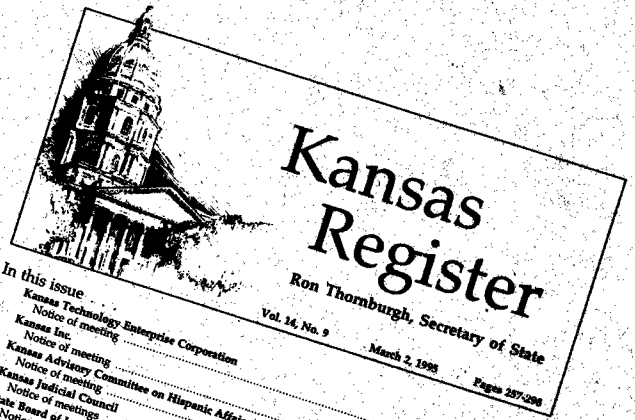
