The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit and amending previously-issued construction permits. Premdor Corporation has applied for a Class I operating permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 *et seq.* The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance. Notice also is given that certain requirements were found to no longer be appropriate in the construction permit dated September 2, 1999. These requirements are being modified by an applicability determination.

Premdor Corporation, Mississauga, Ontario, Canada, owns and operates a metal door manufacturing facility

located at 911 E. Jefferson, Pittsburg, Crawford County, Kansas. The finished doors are produced for residential and light commercial applications and manufactured in three phases: door framing, foam injection and painting. The major source of air pollutants are generated from door and door frame coating operations.

The United States Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the 30-day public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA 45-day review period. If the EPA waives its 45-day review period, the 60-day public petition period will start directly after the 30-day public comment period. 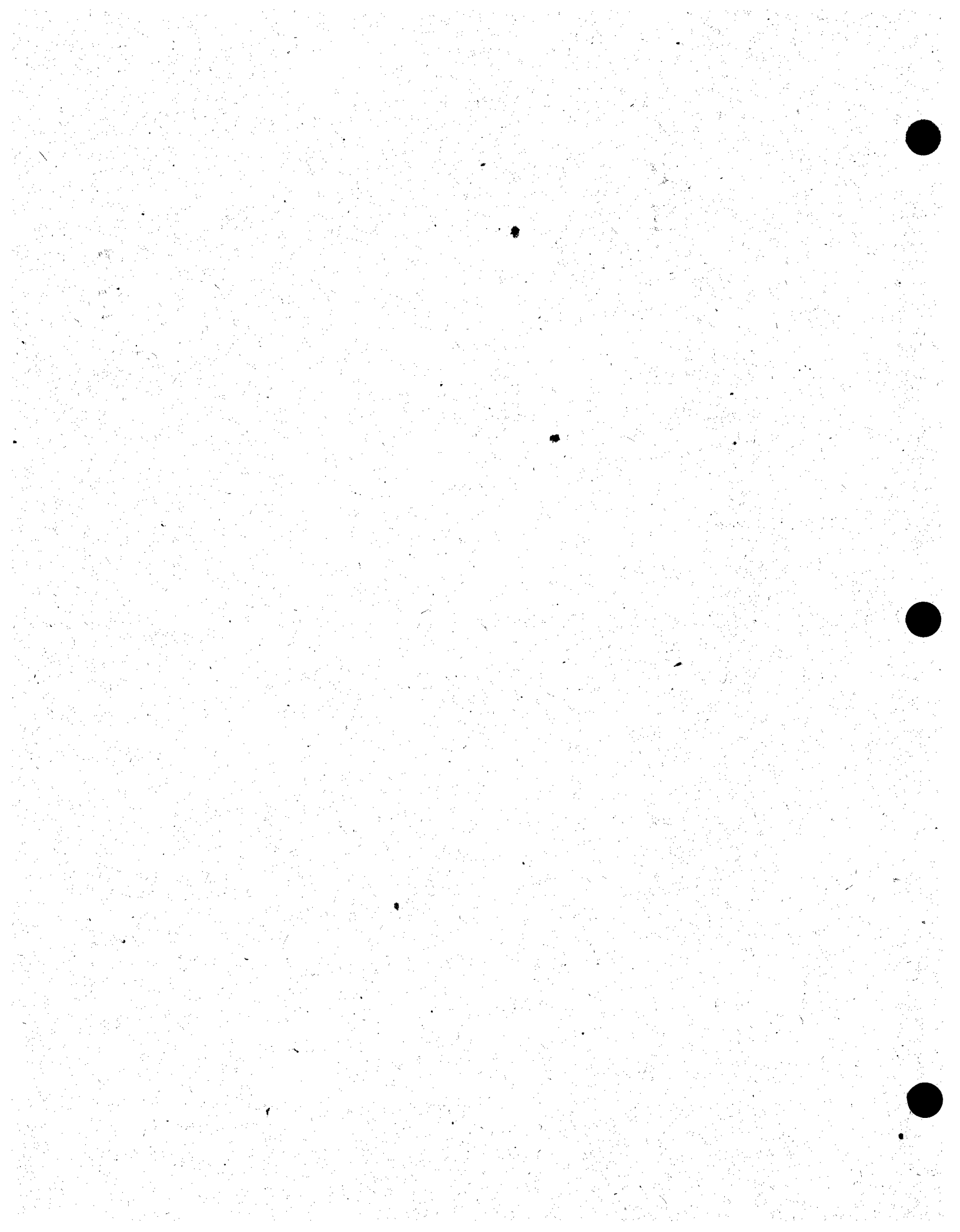

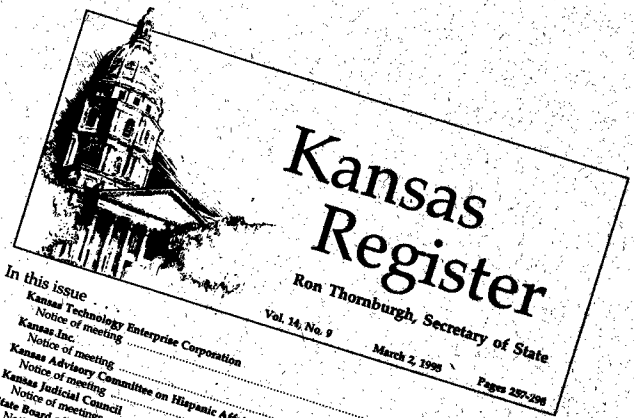
