Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations

The State Board of Education will conduct a public hearing at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday, April 10, at the Horace Mann Magnet School, 1243 N. Market, Wichita, on proposed amendments to the Parents as Teachers regulations, K.A.R. 91-37-2, 91-37-3 and 91-37-4. The proposed amendments are necessary to comply with statutory changes and for updating. The following is a summary of the substance of each regulation and its anticipated economic impact:

K.A.R. 91-37-2. This regulation concerns grant applications. This regulation is being amended to delete an unduly restrictive deadline for the filing of applications. No economic impact is anticipated for the State Board of Education, school districts, other governmental entities, private businesses or individuals.

K.A.R. 91-37-3. This regulation concerns program plans and budgets. The regulation is being changed to conform with a statutory change. No economic impact is anticipated for the State Board of Education, school districts, other governmental entities, private businesses or individuals.

K.A.R. 91-37-4. This regulation concerns parent education program reports. The regulation is being amended

to delete an unduly restrictive deadline for the filing of reports. No economic impact is anticipated for the State Board of Education, school districts, other governmental entities, private businesses or individuals.

A copy of the proposed regulations and their economic impact statements may be obtained by contacting the secretary of the State Board of Education at the above address above prior to the date of the hearing.

All interested persons will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to present their views or arguments, either orally or in writing, in regard to the proposed regulations. In addition, the period of public notice hereby provided constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. Such written comments may be submitted to the secretary of the State Board of Education at the address above. The hearing shall be conducted in compliance with the public hearing procedures of the State Board of Education.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Wednesday, March 28, at the SRS Learning Center, 300 S.W. Oakley, Conference Room A, Topeka, to consider the adoption of amendments to existing rules and regulations on a permanent basis effective May 1, 2001. Telephone conference will not be available. This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to or during the public hearing to Hope Burns, Office of the Secretary for SRS, Room 603-N, Docking State Office Building, 915 S.W. Harrison, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views, but it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes. The phrase "Federal Mandate" following an item indicates that the change is required by federal policy. Optional changes in regulations related to federal programs are subject to approval by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

Copies of the regulations and the economic impact statements may be obtained by contacting Hope Burns at (785) 296-3969.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic im-

The adoption of the regulations will take place at 11 a.m. April 2 in the SRS executive conference room, 603-N Docking State Office Building. Telephone conference will not be available.

A summary of the proposed regulations and the economic impact follows.

Article 4.—PUBLIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

30-4-64. Work program requirements. This regulation is being amended to allow the work requirement exemption for persons 60 years of age or older in TAF two-parent situations. This change is consistent with food stamp policy and also is consistent with the department's recommendation to include caretakers age 60 and older in the TAF hardship criteria.

This regulation is being further amended to clarify that when either a parent or caretaker has reached the 48th month of TAF cash assistance, having a child under age one does not provide an exemption to the work requirement. This change will provide work program services to TAF clients before the family's 60-month lifetime limit is reached.

Economic Impact: These two changes in exemptions are expected to have the following economic impact:

- Adults age 60 or older in two-parent TAF cases will become exempt with this policy change. There will be a minimal reduction in expenditures for employment services if the now exempt adults do not wish to volunteer to utilize the services.
- There will be approximately 92 TAF cases each month that are exempt from work requirements because there is a child under age one when the family or the caretaker reaches the 48th month of TAF cash assistance. These families will no longer be exempt from work requirements. The annual expenditure to provide TAF employment services for this population is anticipated to be \$72,864 (TANF Block Grant). The annual expenditure for the child care costs for these families is anticipated to be \$242,512 (Child Care and Development Fund). The total annual economic impact for this change is anticipated to be \$315,376.

Article 5.—PROVIDER PARTICIPATION, SCOPE
OF SERVICES, AND REQUIREMENTS FOR THE
MEDICAID (MEDICAL ASSISTANCE) PROGRAM

30-5-108. Scope of services for durable medical equipment, medical supplies, orthotics, and prosthetics. This regulation outlines the scope of services for durable medical equipment (DME), medical supplies, orthotics and prosthetics. As currently written, this regulation requires that DME that is provided as a home health service shall be rented. The regulation also states that selected durable medical equipment shall be the most economical to meet the recipient's need. There are times when it is more economical to buy DME. Therefore, the requirement that DME must be rented will be deleted, allowing cost to be a determinant in the decision to rent or buy. The pro-

posed regulation change also updates the term "recipient" to "consumer."

Federal Mandate: This regulation, change is not federally mandated.

Economic Impact: This regulation change could result in savings of up to \$100,000 for the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services. There could be a cost to private business of up to \$100,000. There will be no economic impact upon individuals or other governmental agencies.

Other Methods: No other method was appropriate for the desired outcome.

The Kansas Department of Transportation is seeking qualified consulting engineering firms for the projects listed below. **Permanent Administrative
Regulations**

Article 6.—PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE

66-6-4. Rules of professional conduct. (a) For the purposes of this regulation, "licensee" means any architect, geologist, landscape architect, land surveyor, or professional engineer licensed by the board of technical professions.

(b) If any licensee's judgment is overruled under circumstances in which the safety, health, or welfare of the public is endangered, the licensee shall inform the employer or client of the possible consequences, and the licensee shall notify the authority who issued the building permit or otherwise has jurisdiction.

(c) The licensee shall not advertise to perform or undertake to perform any assignment involving a specific technical profession unless licensed and qualified by education and experience in that technical profession, as defined in K.S.A. 74-7003, and amendments thereto.

(d) Except as provided in K.S.A. 74-7023, and amendments thereto, a licensee shall not affix a personal signature, seal, or both to any plan or document dealing with subject matter that is outside of the licensee's field of competence by virtue of education or experience. Additionally, a licensee shall not affix a personal signature, seal, or both to any plan or document except after completion of a detailed review and evaluation of the documents.

(e) If the competence of any licensee to perform an assignment in a specific technical field is at issue, the licensee may be required by the board to pass an appropriate examination.

(f) In all professional reports, statements, and testimony, each licensee shall meet the following criteria:

- Be completely objective and truthful; and
- include all relevant and pertinent information.

(g) When serving as an expert or technical witness before any court, commission, or other tribunal, each licensee shall express only opinions founded on the following:

- An adequate knowledge of the facts at issue;
- a background of technical competence in the subject matter; and
- an actual, good-faith belief of the accuracy and propriety of the licensee's testimony.

(h) If a licensee issues any statements, criticisms, or arguments on public policy matters that are inspired or paid for by, any interested party or parties, those comments shall be prefaced by and include disclosure of the following:

- The identities of the party or parties on whose behalf the licensee is speaking; and
- the existence of any pecuniary interest of the licensee.

(i) Each licensee shall disclose all known or potential conflicts of interest to employers or clients by promptly informing them of any business association, interest, or any other circumstances that could influence that licensee's judgment or the quality of the licensee's services.

(j) A licensee shall not accept compensation, financial or otherwise, from more than one party for services on the same project or for services pertaining to the same project, unless the circumstances are fully disclosed and agreed to by all interested parties.

(k) A licensee shall not solicit or accept financial or other valuable consideration, directly or indirectly, from either of the following:

(1) Material or equipment suppliers for specifying their products; or

(2) contractors, their agents, or other parties in connection with work for employers or clients for which the licensee is responsible.

(l) A licensee shall not solicit a contract from a governmental body on which a principal or officer of the licensee's organization serves as a member, except upon public disclosure of all pertinent facts and circumstances and consent of the appropriate public authority.

(m) A licensee shall not offer, directly or indirectly, to pay a commission or other consideration or to make a political contribution or other gift in order to secure work, except for payment made to an employment agency for its services.

(n) In all contacts with prospective or existing clients or employers, each licensee shall accurately represent the licensee's qualifications and the scope of the licensee's responsibility in connection with work for which the licensee is claiming credit.

(o) A licensee shall not be associated with, or permit the use of the licensee's personal name or firm name in, a business venture being performed by any person or firm that the licensee knows, or has reason to believe, is engaging in either of the following:

(1) Business or professional practice of a fraudulent or dishonest nature; or

(2) a violation of K.S.A. 74-7001 *et seq.*, and amendments thereto, or the rules and regulations promulgated and adopted by the board.

(p) Each licensee with knowledge of any alleged violation of K.S.A. 74-7001 *et seq.*, and amendments thereto, or the rules and regulations promulgated and adopted by the board shall perform the following:

(1) Report the alleged violation to the board; and
(2) cooperate with the board in furnishing information or any assistance that may be required.

(q) A licensee shall not assist any person in applying for registration when the licensee knows that person to be unqualified with respect to education, training, experience, or character.

(r) Conviction of a felony or the revocation or suspension of a professional license by another jurisdiction, if for a cause that in the state of Kansas would constitute a violation of Kansas law or of these regulations, shall be grounds for a charge of violation of these regulations. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 74-7013; effective May 1, 1978; amended May 1, 1984; amended May 1, 1985; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993; amended Feb. 13, 1995; amended Feb. 4, 2000; amended Feb. 9, 2001.)

Article 10.—EXPERIENCE

66-10-1. Architectural experience of a character satisfactory to the board. Each applicant shall complete

the intern development program (IDP) as defined in the "intern development program guidelines, 2000-2001," as published by the national council of architectural registration boards (NCARB) and hereby adopted by reference. Each applicant shall provide a completed and bound record of architectural experience in the form transmitted by the NCARB. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7019; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993; amended Feb. 14, 1994; amended Feb. 13, 1995; amended March 1, 1996; amended Feb. 6, 1998; amended Feb. 9, 2001.)

66-10-4. Landscape architectural experience of a character satisfactory to the board. (a) The work experience required of each applicant shall expose the applicant to all phases of work integral to the practice of landscape architecture and shall be verified as set forth in paragraph (b)(1)(B) of this regulation.

(b)(1) Landscape architectural work experience shall meet the following conditions:

(A) Fall within the definition of "the practice of landscape architecture" under K.S.A. 74-7003 and amendments thereto; and

(B) if performed after February 22, 1993, be supervised and verified by a licensed landscape architect, architect, or engineer.

(2) Beginning April 1, 1995, each applicant for examination shall provide a record of landscape architectural experience that has been compiled and transmitted by the council of landscape architectural boards (CLARB).

(3) Beginning July 1, 2001, each applicant for reciprocity shall provide a record of landscape architectural experience that has been compiled and transmitted by the council of landscape architectural boards (CLARB).

(c) The following guidelines shall be used to assign credit for work experience.

(1) A master's degree in landscape architecture may equal one year of credit toward the four-year experience requirement for a graduate of an accredited, four-year curriculum in landscape architecture.

(2) Each applicant who is a graduate of an accredited, master's level curriculum in landscape architecture as the first professional degree shall be considered by the board to be equivalent to a graduate of a five-year curriculum and shall meet the experience requirements of that curriculum as specified in K.S.A. 74-7020 and amendments thereto.

(3) Teaching landscape architecture in a college or university that offers an approved landscape architectural curriculum of four years or more may be considered landscape architectural experience.

(4) Credit may be given for 50% of the verified work experience obtained after a student has achieved "junior status" in an LAAB-accredited landscape architectural curriculum. Credit for this work experience shall not exceed one year.

(d) Each applicant shall supply at least three references from licensed landscape architects who are familiar with the applicant's landscape architectural experience. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 74-7013; implementing

66-10-11. Surveying experience required of an applicant who is not a graduate of an accredited land surveying or engineering curriculum. Through June 30, 2009, each applicant for a land surveyor license under K.S.A. 74-7022, and amendments thereto, who is not a graduate of an accredited engineering curriculum, as defined in K.A.R. 66-9-4, and who is not a graduate of a land surveyor curriculum as defined in K.A.R. 66-9-5, shall provide a verified record of eight years of land surveying experience. At least six years shall have been in progressive land surveying, as defined in K.A.R. 66-10-12, and the remainder shall have been in either progressive or basic land surveying, as defined in K.A.R. 66-10-12. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7022; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993; amended Feb. 13, 1995; amended Feb. 9, 2001.)

66-10-12. Surveying experience of a character satisfactory to the board. (a) (1) Land surveying experience shall meet the following criteria:

(A) Fall within the definition of "the practice of land surveying" in K.S.A. 74-7003, and amendments thereto; and

(B) be under the direct supervision of a licensed land surveyor for work performed after May 1, 1988.

(2) Each applicant shall supply at least three references from licensed land surveyors or professional engineers who are familiar with the applicant's land surveying experience. At least one reference shall be from a licensed land surveyor.

(b) The following guidelines shall be used to assign credit for work experience.

(1) Progressive land surveying experience shall include each of the following elements of professional land surveying:

(A) Project management;

(B) research;

(C) measurements and locations;

(D) computations and analysis;

(E) legal principles and reconciliation;

(F) land planning and design;

(G) monumentation; and

(H) documentation and land information systems.

(2) Land surveying experience normally identified with engineering projects, including construction staking, curb and gutter projects, sanitary sewers, and design surveys for highways or bridges other than those that relate to right-of-way surveys, shall not be considered progressive land surveying experience. This experience, however, may be considered by the board as basic land surveying experience.

(3) Teaching experience in land surveying courses in an accredited engineering or land surveying curriculum may be considered as equal to one year of basic land surveying experience.

(4) Through June 30, 2009, if the applicant can provide a record of surveying and related technical education

courses, including mathematics and drafting, the applicant may be given credit for 0.5 years of experience in basic land surveying for every 15 semester hours of these educational courses. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 74-7022; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 4, 1992; amended Feb. 22, 1993; amended Feb. 13, 1995; amended Feb. 4, 2000; amended Feb. 9, 2001.)

66-10-13. Geology experience of a character that is satisfactory to the board. (a) The work experience required of each applicant shall expose the applicant to all phases of work integral to the discipline of geology in which the applicant claims qualification to practice and shall be verified as set forth in paragraph (b)(2) of this regulation.

(b) Geology experience shall meet these criteria:

(1) Fall within the definition of "the practice of geology" in K.S.A. 74-7003, and amendments thereto; and

(2) be directly supervised and verified by a licensed geologist for work performed after July 1, 2000. However, direct supervision of a licensed geologist shall not be required of the employees of any person, firm, or corporation that does not offer services in the technical professions to the public, although verification by the applicant's supervisor shall still be required.

(c) The following shall be used to assess credit for work experience:

(1) Experience credit shall not be allowed for work performed before graduation, except for experience gained under the provision of paragraph (c)(4) below.

(2) One year of credit toward the experience requirement may be given for a master's degree in geology or in a closely related specialty area acceptable to the board.

(3) Teaching geology in a college or university that offers an approved geology curriculum of four years or more may be considered geology experience.

(4) Credit may be given for 50% of the verified work experience obtained through a cooperative geology program approved by a school or university with an accredited geology curriculum. Credit for this work experience shall not exceed one year.

(d) Each applicant shall supply at least three references who are familiar with the applicant's geology experience. One reference may be a licensed professional engineer. Through June 30, 2002, an acceptable professional reference shall be either of the following:

(1) A licensed geologist; or

(2) an individual certified by any of the following:

(A) The American institute of professional geologists (AIPG);

(B) the American association of petroleum geologists' division of professional affairs (AAPG); or

(C) the society of independent professional earth scientists (SIPES). (Authorized by K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 74-7041; effective Feb. 4, 2000; amended Feb. 9, 2001.)

Article 14.—CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

66-14-10. Reciprocity. (a) Except as specified below in subsection (b), licensees of Kansas who are residents

of any other jurisdiction shall meet the continuing education requirements of the board or of their resident jurisdiction. The board's continuing education requirements may be satisfied if a non-resident licensee provides evidence of having met the continuing education requirements of that individual's resident jurisdiction.

(b) If a licensee resides in a jurisdiction that has no continuing education requirements, the licensee shall meet the continuing education requirements of the board.

(c) Proof of compliance shall be presented in conformance with these regulations. (Authorized by K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 1999 Supp. 74-7025; effective March 1, 1996; amended Feb. 9, 2001.)

Permanent Administrative Regulations

Article 34.—HOSPITALS

28-34-1a. Definitions. (a) "Authenticate" means to verify authorship by written signature, identifiable initials, or computer key. The use of rubber stamp signatures shall be acceptable if the following conditions are observed.

(1) The practitioner whose signature the rubber stamp represents shall be the only individual who has possession of the stamp and who uses the stamp.

(2) The hospital shall maintain, in its administrative offices, a signed statement by the practitioner indicating that the practitioner is the only person who possesses and uses the stamp.

(b) "Chief executive officer" means the individual appointed by the governing body to act on its behalf in the overall management of the hospital.

(c) "Consultant" means a person who provides professional advice or services on request.

(d) "Covering practitioner" means a member of the hospital's medical staff who is authorized by the patient's attending physician or other practitioner to provide care and treatment for the patient in the absence of the attending physician or other practitioner.

(e) "Dentist" means a person licensed in Kansas to practice dentistry.

(f) "Dietitian" means a person who is licensed in Kansas as a dietitian.

(g) "Dietetic services supervisor" means a person who is trained and experienced in food service administration and meets one of the following requirements:

(1) The person is a graduate of a dietetic technician training program approved by the American dietetic association or has completed the educational requirements for certification as a dietary manager. These programs may be conducted on either a classroom or correspondence basis. A program preceptor shall be a dietitian.

(2) The person has the training and experience in dietetic services supervision and management that is determined by the secretary of health and environment to be equivalent to the programs specified in paragraph (g)(1). Each dietetic services supervisor who qualifies under paragraph (g)(2) shall have a minimum of six months of experience as a supervisor in a health care institution.

(h) "Director" means a person with administrative responsibility for the direction of a service for the hospital. When this term is used in connection with a medical or clinical service, it is synonymous with "chairperson" and may not necessarily imply a salaried individual.

(i) "Drug administration" means the direct application of a drug or biological, whether by injection, inhalation, ingestion, or any other means, to the body of a patient by either of the following:

(1) A practitioner, or pursuant to the lawful direction of a practitioner, who is acting within the scope of that practitioner's license and who is qualified according to medical staff bylaws; or

(2) the patient at the direction and in the presence of a practitioner.

(j) "Drug dispensing" means delivering prescription medication to the patient pursuant to the lawful order of a practitioner.

(k) "Facilities" means buildings, equipment, and supplies necessary for the implementation of hospital services.

(l) "Licensed practical nurse" means an individual who is licensed in Kansas as a licensed practical nurse.

(m) "Licensing agency" means the Kansas department of health and environment.

(n) "Long-term care unit" means a unit that provides physician services and continuous nursing supervision for patients who are not in an acute phase of illness and who currently require nursing care that is primarily of a convalescent, restorative, or long-term nature. Medicare-certified, distinct-part, long-term care units shall be included.

(o) "Nursing care unit" means an organized jurisdiction of nursing services in which nursing services are provided on a continuous basis.

(p) "Nursing services" means patient care services pertaining to the curative, restorative, and preventive aspects of nursing that are performed or supervised by a registered nurse pursuant to the medical care plan of the practitioner and the nursing care plan.

(q) "Organized" means administratively and functionally structured.

(r) "Organized medical staff" means a formal organization of physicians and dentists, with the responsibility and authority to maintain proper standards for patient care as delegated by the governing body.

(s) "Outpatient services" means an organizational unit of the hospital that is designed to support the provision of nonemergency health care services to patients who do not remain in the hospital overnight. The term shall include a short-term procedure unit if applicable.

(t) "Pathologist" means either of the following:

(1) A person who is licensed in Kansas to practice medicine and surgery and who is a board-certified or board-eligible pathologist; or

(continued)

(2) a person licensed in Kansas as a dentist and certified as an oral pathologist.

(u) "Patient" means a person admitted to the hospital upon the order of a member of the medical staff.

(v) "Physician" means a person licensed in Kansas to practice medicine and surgery.

(w) "Practitioner" means a member of the hospital's medical staff and may include a physician or dentist.

(x) "Qualified nurse anesthetist" means any of the following:

(1) A registered nurse who has been certified as a nurse anesthetist by the council on certification of the American association of nurse anesthetists and has been authorized as a registered nurse anesthetist by the Kansas board of nursing;

(2) a student enrolled in a program of nurse anesthesia by the council on accreditation of the American association of nurse anesthetists; or

(3) a graduate of an accredited program of nurse anesthesia who is awaiting certification testing or the results of the certification test and has been granted temporary authorization as a registered nurse anesthetist by the Kansas state board of nursing.

(y) "Registered nurse" means a person who is licensed in Kansas as a registered professional nurse.

(z) "Service" means either of the following:

(1) A functional division of the hospital or of the nursing or medical staff; or

(2) the delivery of care.

(aa) "Supervision" means authoritative procedural guidance provided by a qualified person for the accomplishment of a function or activity within that person's sphere of competence. Supervision shall include initial direction and periodic inspection of the actual act of accomplishing the function or activity.

(bb) "Survey" means the process of evaluation or re-evaluation of a hospital's compliance with this article. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 65-431; effective June 28, 1993; amended Feb. 9, 2001.)

28-34-6a. Medical staff. (a) General provision. Each hospital shall maintain an organized medical staff. Admission to the staff and clinical privileges associated with membership shall be granted by the governing authority through a mechanism that evaluates each member's qualifications to engage in that member's area of clinical practice. Admitting privileges may be granted to any practitioner as defined in K.A.R. 28-34-1a(w).

(b) Membership. The medical staff shall be limited to practitioners who have made application in accordance with the bylaws of the medical staff and the governing body. The medical staff shall adopt bylaws that define the requirements for admission to staff membership and for the delineation and retention of clinical and admitting privileges. Each member shall be granted privileges that are commensurate with the member's qualifications, experience, and present capabilities and that are within the member's scope of practice. Although certification, fellowship, membership on a specialty board or society, or the completion of a general practice residency may be considered in determining an individual's qualifications for medical staff membership, membership decisions shall not be made solely upon any one of these factors.

(c) Medical staff status.

(1) Each hospital shall have an active medical staff to deliver the preponderance of medical services within the hospital. The active medical staff shall have primary responsibility for the organization and administration of the medical staff. Each member of the active medical staff shall be eligible to vote at staff meetings, hold office, and serve on staff committees.

(2) In addition to the active medical staff, the hospital may provide for additional kinds of medical staff privileges. These additional staff categories shall in no way modify the privileges, duties, and responsibilities of the active medical staff. These additional staff categories may be eligible to vote at staff meetings, hold office, and serve on staff committees.

(d) Appointment and reappointment. After considering medical staff recommendations, the governing body shall affirm, deny, or modify each recommendation for appointment to the medical staff and the granting of clinical privileges to any practitioner. Formal application for membership and for the granting of clinical privileges shall follow established procedures set forth in the bylaws, policies, and procedures of the medical staff.

(e) Medical staff bylaws, policies, and procedures. The medical staff shall develop and adopt, subject to the approval of the governing body, a set of bylaws that shall provide for at least the following:

(1) The organizational structure of the medical staff;

(2) qualifications for staff membership and procedures for admission, retention, assignment, and either reduction or withdrawal of privileges;

(3) procedures and standards for the review of staff credentials;

(4) a mechanism for an appeal by a practitioner who receives an unfavorable medical staff recommendation;

(5) delineation of clinical privileges and duties of professional personnel who function in a clinical capacity and who are not members of the medical staff;

(6) methods for the selection of officers and department or service chairpersons and a description of their duties and responsibilities;

(7) the composition and function of standing committees;

(8) requirements regarding the completion of medical records, including a system of disciplinary action for failure to complete the records of discharged patients within 30 days after dismissal or current records within 48 hours of admission;

(9) a mechanism by which the medical staff consults with and reports to the governing body;

(10) medical staff meetings for the purpose of reviewing the performance of the medical staff and each department or service and reports and recommendations of the medical staff and multidisciplinary committees; and

(11) a mechanism for review of medical staff performance that shall include consideration of relevant ethics and statutory codes of conduct.

(f) Medical care review. The medical staff shall develop and implement a system to review medical services rendered, evaluate their quality, and provide an educational program for medical staff members. This system shall include written criteria for the evaluation of medical

care that shall cover admission, length of stay, and professional services furnished and shall be conducted on at least a sample basis.

(g) Medical orders.

(1) Medication or treatment shall be administered only upon written and signed orders of a practitioner who is acting within the scope of that practitioner's license and who is qualified according to medical staff bylaws.

(2) A practitioner may give verbal orders, including telephone orders, for medication or treatment to personnel who are qualified according to medical staff bylaws. The person entering these orders into the medical record shall sign and date the entry as soon as possible. These orders shall be authenticated by the prescribing or covering practitioner within 72 hours of the patient's discharge or 30 days, whichever occurs first. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 65-431; effective June 28, 1993; amended Feb. 9, 2001.)

28-34-9a. Medical records services. (a) General provisions. Each hospital shall maintain medical records for each patient admitted for care. The records shall be documented and readily retrievable by authorized persons.

(b) Organization and staffing.

(1) Each hospital shall have a medical records service that is directed, staffed, and equipped to enable the accurate processing, indexing, and filing of all medical records. The medical records service shall be under the direction of a person who is a registered health information administrator or a registered health information technician as certified by the American health information management association, or who meets the educational or training requirements for this certification.

(2) If the employment of a full-time registered health information administrator or registered health information technician is impossible, the hospital shall employ a registered records administrator or an accredited records technician on a part-time consultant basis. The consultant shall organize the department, train full-time personnel, and make periodic visits to evaluate the records. There shall be a written contract between the hospital and the consultant that specifies the consultant's duties and responsibilities.

(3) At least one full-time employee shall provide regular medical records service.

(c) Facilities. The medical records department shall be properly equipped to enable its personnel to function in an effective manner and to maintain medical records so that the records are readily accessible and secure from unauthorized use.

(d) Policies and procedures.

(1) Each medical record shall be kept on file for 10 years after the date of last discharge of the patient or one year beyond the date that the minor patient reached the age of majority, whichever is longer.

(2) If a hospital discontinues operation, the hospital shall inform the licensing agency of the location of its records.

(3) A summary shall be maintained of medical records that are destroyed. This summary shall be retained on file for at least 25 years and shall include the following information:

- (A) The name, age, and date of birth of the patient;
- (B) the name of the patient's nearest relative;
- (C) the name of the attending and consulting practitioners;
- (D) any surgical procedure and date, if applicable; and
- (E) the final diagnosis.

(4) Medical records may be microfilmed after completion. If the microfilming is done off the premises, the hospital shall take precautions to assure the confidentiality and safekeeping of the records.

(5) Each record shall be treated as confidential. Only persons authorized by the governing body shall have access to the records. These persons shall include individuals designated by the licensing agency for the purpose of verifying compliance with state or federal statutes or regulations and for disease control investigations of public health concern.

(6) Medical records shall be the property of the hospital and shall not be removed from the hospital premises except as authorized by the governing body of the hospital or for purposes of litigation when specifically authorized by Kansas law or appropriate court order.

(e) Contents of medical records. Medical records shall contain sufficient information to identify the patient clearly, to justify the diagnosis and treatment, and to document the results accurately. At a minimum, each record shall include the following:

(1) Notes by authorized house staff members and individuals who have been granted clinical privileges, consultation reports, nurses' notes, and entries by designated professional personnel;

(2) findings and results of any pathological or clinical laboratory examinations, radiology examinations, medical and surgical treatment, and other diagnostic or therapeutic procedures; and

(3) provisional diagnosis, primary and secondary final diagnosis, a clinical resume, and, if appropriate, necropsy reports.

(f) Each entry in each record shall be dated and authenticated by the person making the entry. Verbal orders, including telephone orders, shall include the date and signature of the person recording them. The prescribing or covering practitioner shall authenticate the order within 72 hours of the patient's discharge or 30 days, whichever occurs first. Records of patients discharged shall be completed within 30 days following discharge. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 65-431; effective May 1, 1986; amended June 28, 1993; amended Feb. 9, 2001.)

28-34-32b. Construction standards. (a) General provisions. All hospital construction, including new buildings and additions or alterations to existing buildings, shall be in accordance with the standards set forth in the American institute of architects academy of architecture for health, publication no. ISBN 1-55835-151-5, entitled "1996-97 guidelines for design and construction of hospital and health care facilities," copyrighted in 1996, and hereby adopted by reference.

(b) Construction plans and specifications.

(1) Plans and specifications for each new hospital and each alteration and addition to any existing hospital,

(continued)

other than minor alterations, shall be prepared by an architect licensed in Kansas. "Minor alterations" means those projects that meet the following conditions:

(A) Do not affect the structural integrity of the building;

(B) do not change functional operation;

(C) do not affect fire safety; and

(D) do not add beds or facilities over those for which the hospital is licensed.

(2) The preliminary plan, plans and specifications at the outline specification stage, and plans and specifications at the contract document stage shall be made available to the licensing agency upon request.

(3) The preliminary plans shall include the following:

(A) Sketch plans of the basement, each floor, and the roof, indicating the space assignment, size, and outline of fixed equipment;

(B) all elevations and typical sections;

(C) a plot plan showing roads and parking facilities; and

(D) areas and bed capacities by floors.

(4) The outline specifications shall consist of a general description of the construction, air conditioning, heating, and ventilation systems.

(5) Contract documents shall consist of working drawings that are complete and adequate for bidding, contract, and construction purposes. Specifications shall supplement the drawings to fully describe the types, sizes, capacities, workmanship, finishes, and other characteristics of all materials and equipment. Before commencing construction, the architect shall certify, in writing, to the agency that the contract documents are in compliance with subsections (a), (b), and (c) of this regulation. The written certification shall also include the following:

(A) The name of the facility;

(B) a narrative description of extent of the project;

(C) the physical location of the project;

(D) any change in room numbers and bed assignments; and

(E) the expected completion date of the project to the licensing agency, which shall be provided at least 30 days before the project completion date.

(c) The administrator of the facility shall notify the state fire marshal's office of all hospital construction, alterations, or additions at the preliminary planning stage.

(d) Access. Representatives of the licensing agency shall, at all reasonable times, have access to work in preparation or progress, and the contractor shall provide proper facilities for the access and inspection. A complete set of plans and specifications shall be available on the job site for use by licensing agency personnel. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 65-431; effective June 28, 1993; amended Feb. 9, 2001.)

Article 5.—DRIVER AND TRAFFIC SAFETY EDUCATION COURSES

91-5-14. Motorcycle instruction. (a) (1) Motorcycle instruction shall be offered only to students who are 15 years of age or older and either have completed an approved course in driver education or hold a valid motor vehicle operator's license. Each course shall include a minimum of 20 hours of instruction, which shall include no fewer than eight hours of classroom instruction and an average of no fewer than six hours of behind-the-bar instruction per student. If on-street driving instruction is provided, the instruction shall not exceed one hour per day, except that one instructional period in each program may be extended to a maximum of two hours.

(2) Instructors of an approved motorcycle course shall hold a motorcycle instructor permit or a chief instructor permit.

(3) Students shall successfully complete all phases of an approved motorcycle education course to be eligible for the division of vehicles' certification of completion.

(4) No program shall have more than 12 students per instructor for off-street instruction or more than six students per instructor for on-street instruction.

(5) If on-street instruction is provided, during this instruction each student shall wear a bright orange or yellow riding vest inscribed with the words "student driver."

(6) All programs meeting the requirements for an approved course shall be eligible for reimbursement through the motorcycle safety fund.

(b) Qualifications for motorcycle instructor and chief instructor permits; duration of permits; renewals.

(1) A person shall be issued a motorcycle instructor permit if the person meets the following qualifications:

(A) Has a valid driver's license with a motorcycle endorsement;

(B) is at least 18 years of age;

(C) has no more than two moving traffic violations within two years of the date of application for a permit;

(D) has no conviction of any of the traffic violations specified in K.S.A. 8-254 and amendments thereto;

(E) has successfully completed a beginning rider's course approved by the state board; and

(F) has successfully completed a 60-hour instructor's course approved by the state board.

(2) A person shall be issued a chief instructor permit if the person meets the following requirements:

(A) Has a valid driver's license with a motorcycle endorsement;

(B) is at least 21 years of age;

(C) has no more than two moving traffic violations within two years of the date of application for a permit;

(D) has no conviction of any of the traffic violations specified in K.S.A. 8-254 and amendments thereto;

(E) has successfully completed a chief instructor's course approved by the state board; and

(F) has taught three beginning rider's courses within two years of the date of application.

(3) Each motorcycle instructor permit and each chief instructor permit shall be valid for three years, unless the person holding the permit has either of the following:

(A) Two or more moving traffic violations during the validity period of the permit; or

(B) a conviction of any of the crimes specified in paragraph (b)(1)(D) of this regulation.

(4) Each motorcycle instructor and each chief instructor may renew the permit if the instructor meets the following requirements:

(A) Has taught at least one beginning rider's course each year, if an instructor, or at least one instructor's course during the past three years, if a chief instructor;

(B) has taught at least one motorcycle riding course each year; and

(C) has no more than two moving traffic violations within the past three years and no conviction of any of the traffic violations specified in K.S.A. 8-254 and amendments thereto. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 8-272; effective May 1, 1978; amended May 1, 1979; amended May 1, 1980; amended May 1, 1982; amended, T-84-2, Feb. 10, 1983; amended May 1, 1984; amended Jan. 23, 1998; amended Feb. 9, 2001.)

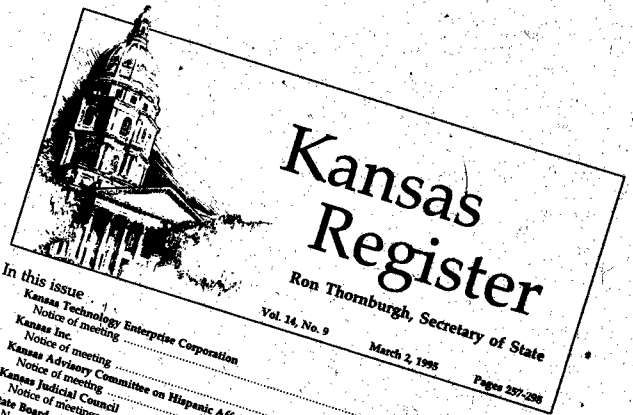
