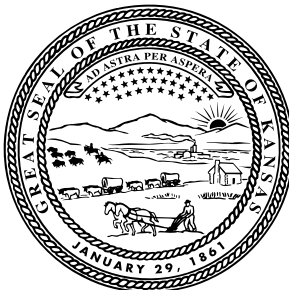

K.A.R. 40-1-42. Diskette filing and filing quarterly financial statements. This regulation sets out the requirements for filing quarterly and annual financial statements. The amendments add health maintenance organizations and nonprofit dental service corporations to the filing requirements. It also removes the requirement of all companies subject to this regulation of filing printed quarterly and annual statements with the Kansas Insurance Department. Entities such as health maintenance organizations and nonprofit dental corporations have filed quarterly and annual statements with the department and the National Association of Insurance Commissioners prior to this amendment. This amendment codifies the manner in which annual and quarterly statements are to be filed. Companies are still required to file quarterly and annual statements with the National Association of Insurance Commissioners. The department will obtain quarterly and annual financial information from the National Association of Insurance Commissioners as needed. The economic impact on the companies and the department is positive. Companies do not have to continue to file a printed statement every quarter and annually with the department, and the department will not need to file and maintain quarterly and annual statements on each company.

K.A.R. 40-1-46. Privacy of consumer financial information. This proposed regulation adopts by reference Articles I, IV and VI of the National Association of Insurance Commissioners model regulation governing the privacy of consumer financial information.

This regulation governs the treatment of nonpublic personal financial information about individuals by all licensees of the Kansas Insurance Department. This regulation requires a licensee to provide notice to individuals about its privacy policies and practices. It also describes the conditions under which a licensee may disclose nonpublic personal financial information about individuals to affiliates and nonaffiliated third parties and provides methods for individuals to prevent a licensee from disclosing that information.

This regulation applies to nonpublic financial information about individuals who obtain or are claimants or beneficiaries of products or services primarily for personal, family or household purposes from licensees. This regulation does not apply to information about companies or about individuals who obtain products or services for business, commercial or agricultural purposes.

This model was adopted after Congress passed in 1999 the Financial Services Modernization Act, also known as the Gramm Leach Bliley Act (PL 102-106), which eliminated many of the barriers to access of information between banks, securities firms and insurance companies. Title V of the Act requires states to issue regulations and to enforce privacy requirements upon insurance companies. Section 507 of the Act provides that Title V is a federal floor and enables states to provide greater consumer protection than the federal regulations.

K.S.A. 40-2404(15) makes it an unfair trade practice to disclose nonpublic personal information to a nonaffiliated third party contrary to Title V of the Gramm Leach Bliley Act. This statute also authorizes the Commissioner of Insurance to adopt rules and regulations necessary to carry out this section.

This regulation in essence mirrors the federal privacy regulations governing federally regulated banking and securities entities.

Adoption of this regulation in Kansas gives insurance companies guidelines to ensure compliance with Title V of the Act and protects consumers by setting out what insurance companies must do to ensure that consumer nonpublic information is protected. Insurance regulation is the job of the state regulator, and this regulation ensures that mandate is carried out.

This regulation will impose no additional costs on Kansas insurers than what the federal law requires. The principal cost of the regulation will be to implement the notice requirement, particularly the annual notice, required under Title V of the Act. However, the regulation permits regulated entities to comply with these provisions through varying methods, which may vary in cost depending upon the regulated entity's business practices and business structure. In addition, there is tremendous variation in the size of different regulated entities. Both factors will impact the actual costs of implementing the requirements of this regulation and the federal law, making actual cost difficult, if not impossible, to estimate. In implementing similar regulations in compliance with the Act, the federal banking regulators estimated that the initial burden of developing the required notices would require the expenditure of an average of 45 work hours for each licensee. The Kansas Insurance Department estimates the cost to comply with this regulation by insurers and licensee to be less than what is estimated by the federal banking regulators. Insurers and other licensees of the department are generally more familiar in developing the types of notices that the regulation requires to be sent to consumers and customers than financial institutions. As a result, the average expenditure of time would be less than what was estimated by the federal banking regulators.

The Kansas Insurance Department also believes that the additional postage incurred by the regulated entities in providing initial and annual notices, where such notices are required, will be minimal because the regulation provides the flexibility for regulated entities to include the required notices in mailings that are already being made. Further, regulated entities may reduce costs, through the use of information technology, including, in some instances, the provision of notice by electronic mail.

The promulgation of this regulation will increase the regulatory responsibilities of the Kansas Insurance Department, but the department believes that those regulatory responsibilities can be handled with present staff and budget.

There are no additional costs imposed on local governmental entities or state agencies.

The Kansas Insurance Department is proposing that this regulation be revoked. The National Association of Insurance Commissioners is revising the Accounting Practices and Procedures. K.S.A. 40-225 requires insurance companies to prepare their financial statement in accordance with the National Association of Insurance Commissioners Accounting Practices and Procedures. The revised standards, effective January 1, 2001, address the treatment of subrogation and salvage on financial statements; therefore, this regulation is no longer necessary. The impact on companies is neutral or nonexistent because Kansas Insurance Department

guidelines previously provided to the companies are consistent with the revised National Association of Insurance Commissioners Accounting Practices and Procedures.

K.A.R. 40-1-43. Reinsurance trust instruments. This regulation was amended to reflect changes in the enabling statute, K.S.A. 40-221a, which is the Kansas statute governing reinsurance agreements. This statute was amended in 1998 where the term "policyholders" was deleted from the statute. This regulation governs reinsurance trust agreements. To maintain consistency between the statute and the regulation, the Kansas Insurance Department is proposing the term "policyholders" be deleted from K.A.R. 40-1-43. The other proposed changes are grammatical and style changes recommended by the Department of Administration. The economic impact is at most minimal or nonexistent. The Kansas regulation is now consistent with the National Association of Insurance Commissioners' model law governing reinsurance agreements, and most companies are already complying with the model law.

K.A.R. 115-3-1, 115-3-2, 115-5-1 and 115-5-2. These regulations establish legal equipment, taking methods, and possession requirements for game birds; rabbits, hares and squirrels; and furbearers and coyotes, respectively. In response to Executive Order 00-03, several provisions in each of these regulations are proposed for consolidation and clarification, including updating language or making language consistent with other regulations. The only substantive regulatory changes proposed in these amendments would address the use of bait visible to birds, and prohibitions on possessing, transporting or selling live furbearers and coyotes.

Economic Impact Summary: Depending on the alternative chosen, prohibitions concerning live furbearers or coyotes may have an unknown impact on certain trapping practices. Otherwise, the proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any economic impact.

K.A.R. 115-4-2 and 115-4-4. These proposed new regulations would address general tagging and permit requirements, and legal equipment and taking methods, respectively, for big game species. These regulations are a consolidation of current regulations in response to Executive Order 00-03.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any economic impact.

K.A.R. 115-4-11. This regulation would address big game permit applications. The proposed amendments would consolidate provisions from current regulations in response to Executive Order 00-03. They also would establish a point system for mule deer permit applications and would simplify landowner and tenant permit applications.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any economic impact.

K.A.R. 115-4-13. This regulation defines deer permits. The proposed amendments would eliminate primary-secondary permit distinctions, separate white-tailed and mule deer permits, combine firearms and muzzleloader white-tailed deer permits, and make other related changes.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any economic impact.

K.A.R. 115-4-1, 115-4-3, 115-4-5, 115-4-7, 115-4-8, 115-4-9, 115-4-10 and 115-4-12. The provisions from each of these current big game regulations are proposed for consolidation into other regulations, as noted above. Consequently, each of these regulations are proposed for revocation.

Economic Impact Summary: The proposed amendments are not anticipated to have any economic impact.
