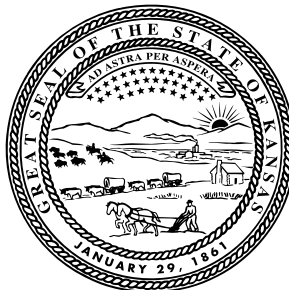

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Thursday, September 6, in the Secretary of State's Office, Room 120, Memorial Hall, 120 S.W. 10th Ave., Topeka, to consider proposed new Kansas Administrative Regulations 7-17-1 through 7-17-24, which pertain to Revised Article Nine of the Uniform Commercial Code. These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis.

K.A.R. 7-17-1 through 7-17-24 interpret and implement L. 2000, Chapter 142, concerning Article Nine of the U.C.C., and specifically address required forms, fees, delivery methods, search criteria and filing office procedures. These regulations will cause minimal economic impact on governmental agencies or the general public.

This 60-day notice of public hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted at 9:30 a.m. Friday, October 5, in Room 106 of the Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed changes in existing rules and regulations of the Board of Accountancy.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the executive director of the Board of Accountancy, Suite 556, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their reviews orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their reviews, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Tracy Barngrover at (785) 296-2162. Handicapped parking is located on the south end of the Landon State Office Building, and the north entrance to the building is accessible to individuals with disabilities.

These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of proposed regulations and their economic impact follows:

74-4-3a. Permit renewal. Amendments to this regulation provide for payment of renewals by credit card and what would constitute an insufficient application. There is no economic impact to governmental agencies or the general public. An insufficient renewal application may result in certified public accountants paying a late fee if the application is not corrected and returned by the date it is due.

74-4-4. Experience requirement for permits. Amendments to this regulation are for cleanup purposes only. There is no economic impact to governmental agencies, the general public or certified public accountants.

74-4-8. Continuing education programs; requirements. Amendments to this regulation are for cleanup purposes only. There is no economic impact to governmental agencies, the general public or certified public accountants.

74-5-2. Definitions. Amendments to this regulation are for cleanup purposes and a result of legislation passed in 2001 concerning compilation reports. There is no economic impact to governmental agencies, the general public or certified public accountants.

74-5-202. Auditing standards. Amendments to this regulation are for cleanup purposes. There is no economic impact to governmental agencies, the general public or certified public accountants.

74-5-205. Professional standards. Amendments to this regulation are for cleanup purposes. There is no economic impact to governmental agencies, the general public or certified public accountants.

74-5-302. Records. Amendments to this regulation provide for what is considered to be client records and providing for certified public accountants to be paid before providing certain documents to a client. There is no economic impact to governmental agencies, the general public or certified public accountants.

74-5-404a. Permit holders employed by non-CPA firms performing or offering to perform nonattest functions to the public. Amendments to this regulation provide for cleanup and clarification. There is no economic impact to governmental agencies, the general public or certified public accountants.

74-7-3. Revocable living trusts. This is a new regulation that provides for firm owners to establish revocable living trusts. There is no economic impact to governmental agencies, the general public or certified public accountants.

74-11-6. Definitions. Amendments to this regulation delete several definitions pertaining to peer review as a result of the revocation of certain peer review regulations. There is no economic impact to governmental agencies, the general public or certified public accountants.

74-11-7. Peer review required. Amendments to this regulation are for cleanup and clarification purposes. There is no economic impact to governmental agencies, the general public or certified public accountants.

74-11-8. General peer review provisions. This regulation is being revoked.

74-11-9. Team member. This regulation is being revoked.

74-11-10. Team captain. This regulation is being revoked.

74-11-11. On-site peer reviews. This regulation is being revoked.

74-11-12. Off-site peer reviews. This regulation is being revoked.

74-11-13. Letter of completion of peer review. This regulation is being revoked.

74-11-14. Waiver of peer review requirements. This regulation is being revoked.

74-11-15. Peer review oversight. This is a new regulation providing for the board to appoint a peer review oversight committee and the qualifications and duties of the committee. There is no economic impact to governmental agencies, the general public or certified public accountants.

74-12-1. Fees. This amendment increases reciprocal certificate fees from \$225 to \$250. There is no economic impact to governmental agencies or the general public. This is a \$25 increase to fees charged for certified public accountants applying for a certificate by reciprocity.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has received and reviewed an application for a permit modification for the existing Barber County municipal solid waste landfill. The modification incorporates three major changes to the previously approved design and closure plans: an increase of the final elevations of the north municipal solid waste disposal cell, an increase of the bottom elevations of the south municipal solid waste disposal cell, and the addition of a construction and demolition waste disposal cell. All disposal activities are contained within the existing permitted area. The Barber County landfill is in the SW¹/₄, SW¹/₄, Section 6, Township 34 South, Range 11 West. Barber County is the owner of the property. Based on current waste projections, the landfill has the capacity to receive municipal solid waste for approximately 11 years and construction and demolition waste for approximately 59 years. The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has prepared a draft National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit for the Johnson County Nelson Complex Wastewater Treatment Facility to discharge treated domestic wastewater into the Kansas River via Turkey Creek.

The proposed permit is based upon an average discharge flow of 15.0 MGD into Turkey Creek. This wastewater treatment facility is a combination of two mechanical treatment plants: Mission Township M.S.D. #1 and Turkey Creek M.S.D. #1. These two facilities are now known as the Myron Nelson Complex. The Mission Township M.S.D. #1 facility consists of bar screening and grit removal, primary, intermediate and final clarification, two-stage trickling filters, sludge thickening and holding tanks. The collection system also contains three extraneous flow/holding basins with physical/chemical treatment. The Turkey Creek M.S.D. #1 facility consists of bar screening and grit removal, primary and final clarification, trickling filters, sludge thickening and holding tanks, and one extraneous flow/holding basin with physical/chemical treatment located near the Turkey Creek plant. Sludge from the facility is hauled to a municipal solid waste landfill for disposal. An ultraviolet disinfection system has been installed on the combined outfall to replace the chlorination/dechlorination disinfection system previously used at the facility. The facilities receive domestic wastewater from the residential and commercial areas and industrial wastewater from local manufacturers.

The proposed permit includes limits for carbonaceous biochemical oxygen demand, total suspended solids, ammonia, fecal coliform, dissolved oxygen, chronic whole effluent toxicity and pH. Monitoring for total phosphorus, total Kjeldahl nitrogen, nitrate, nitrite, temperature, total residual chlorine, effluent flow and priority pollutants also will be required. In addition, the permittee is required to monitor the receiving stream above and below the plant discharge point and also discharges from the extraneous flow/holding basin.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has prepared a draft National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit for the City of Bonner Springs to discharge treated domestic wastewater into the Kansas River.

The proposed permit is based upon an average discharge flow of 1.4 MGD to the Kansas River. This facility is a mechanical treatment plant consisting of two oxidation ditches, two final clarifiers, gravity sludge thickening, a belt filter press and UV disinfection of effluent. The facility receives domestic wastewater from residential and commercial areas and industrial wastewater from local manufacturers. The proposed permit includes limits for biochemical oxygen demand, total suspended solids, fecal coliform and pH. Monitoring for ammonia, total phosphorus, total Kjeldahl nitrogen, nitrate, nitrite and effluent flow also will be required. The permittee is required to conduct chronic whole effluent toxicity and heavy metals testing annually, and a priority pollutant scan will be required once during the life of the permit.

Article 1.—RULES OF PRACTICE AND PROCEDURE

82-1-250. **Consumer information and education; telephone preference service subscribership; information for telephone solicitors.** (a)(1) On or before September 1, 2001, Southwestern Bell Telephone Company shall coordinate an industrywide forum of all interested local exchange carriers and telecommunications carriers to collectively develop a method or methods for annually notifying residential subscribers of the information specified in K.S.A. 50-675a(a), and amendments thereto.

(2) The forum shall, within two weeks after its conclusion, submit a report to the commission for approval as to the form and content of the method or methods developed to ensure compliance with K.S.A. 50-675a, and amendments thereto.

(b) In addition to the information required to be provided in paragraph (a)(1) above, the following information, to be provided to the forum by the Direct Marketing Association, shall also be provided to all residential subscribers by all local exchange carriers and telecommunications carriers using the method or methods developed:

(1) The procedure for registering with the Direct Marketing Association's telephone preference service;

(2) the frequency with which the Direct Marketing Association's database is updated;

(3) the types of calls residential subscribers should still expect to receive;

(4) the procedure for registration renewal if residential subscribers move or receive a new telephone number;

(5) the duration of the residential subscriber's registration period; and

(6) the procedure for registration renewal.

(c) Any of the following means may be used in attempting to inform telephone solicitors in Kansas of the criteria for membership in the Direct Marketing Association, the charges for members and nonmembers to access the Direct Marketing Association's database, and options for accessing Kansas-specific portions of the Direct Marketing Association's database:

(1) Beginning September 1, 2001, annual publication in the Kansas register by the commission of the criteria for telephone solicitors to become members of the Direct Marketing Association;

(2) inclusion by the commission of relevant information on its internet web site;

(3) inclusion of relevant information in a newsletter mailing by the Direct Marketing Association; or

(4) inclusion of relevant information by publishers of telephone directories in the consumer information pages in local telephone directories. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 50-675a; effective July 20, 2001.)

Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS

111-2-4. **Compensation.** Each lottery retailer shall be compensated for selling lottery tickets and/or shares in accordance with the terms of the contract or contracts currently in effect between the Kansas Lottery and the lottery retailer.

Effective at the start of the business day, as defined at subsection (p) of section K.A.R. 111-6-1, on August 22, 1999, as consideration for problem on-line game tickets erroneously produced either by terminal malfunction or by miscommunication between a player and retailer that cannot be sold and are not cancelled, a retailer shall receive an allowance of .25 percent of its net on-line sales. At the discretion of the executive director, credit may be applied to a retailer's account in the event of a major terminal or system malfunction that results in unsellable and uncancelable tickets being charged to the retailer. (b) On each Friday in March 2001, including March 2, 9, 16, 23, and 30, the above-mentioned retailers' personnel selling Kansas lottery tickets will ask every adult customer making a purchase if the customer would like to purchase a lottery ticket. If the employee fails to ask adult customers for the purchase of a lottery ticket and the customer brings it to the clerk's attention before leaving the premises, the retailer shall give the adult customer one \$1.00 instant lottery ticket at no charge.

(c) All retailer employees at each location shall wear promotional buttons and display special point-of-sale materials provided by the lottery each Friday during the hours specified on the promotional materials at each retail location. These promotional materials consist of:

(1) A tent card to be displayed at the point where tickets are sold.

(2) A window/monitor banner to be displayed at the front entrance of the business and/or below the lottery information display system monitor.

(3) Promotion specific buttons.

These materials must be on display during all hours of the promotion at the times and dates established in subsections (b) and (c) for a store to be eligible for a prize.

(d) The Kansas lottery will provide each location with a credit of \$25 to its account at the end of the promotion after each location has complied with all requirements of the promotion.

(e) Any tickets given away above the \$25 allowance representing 25 tickets per location will be the responsibility of each retailer.

(f) Each retail location shall maintain a ticket log form to be completed every time a lottery ticket is given away. The log will be picked up by the Kansas lottery district manager servicing the retailer location at the end of the promotion.

(g) At the end of the promotion, each retailer location which has complied with the requirements of the promotion will receive promotional items selected by the lottery. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8708; effective, T-111-3-14-01, Feb. 16, 2001; amended, T-111-6-19-01, May 18, 2001.)

Article 4.—INSTANT GAMES AND DRAWINGS

WESTRIDGE MALL SIDEWALK SALES DRAWING

111-4-1801. **Name, time, and place of drawing.** (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct two instant ticket draw-

ings per year, each of which shall be entitled "Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale Drawing." The date of each drawing shall coincide with the semi-annual "Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale" conducted each January and July at the Westridge Mall in Topeka, Kansas.

(b) The draw receptacle shall be open during lottery selling hours at the Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale through the final day of the Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale at 7:00 p.m. Each drawing shall take place at the lottery selling booth at the Westridge Mall in Topeka, Kansas, at approximately 7:00 p.m. on the final day of the Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale each January and July.

(c) Rules applicable to the "Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale Drawing" are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-1801 through 111-4-1805. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-12-15-00, Nov. 17, 2000; amended, T-111-6-19-01, May 18, 2001.)

111-4-1803. **Entry into drawing.** Entry into each "Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale Drawing" ("drawing") is accomplished as follows:

(a) Obtain a valid Kansas instant \$1.00 lottery ticket purchased from the lottery selling location at the Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale or the Street Corner News retail location at the Westridge Mall during the times the Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale is conducted that month until the final day of the Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale that month;

(b) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with any instant game rules. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the drawing and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules;

(c) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for winning the drawing and the holder of the ticket may enter the drawing;

(d) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner;

(e) The holder of the non-winning ticket must take the non-winning ticket with the completed information form to the location of the drawing and place it in the receptacle or drum provided;

(f) The receptacle or drum shall be available and entries may be made at the times stated in K.A.R. 111-4-1801. Entries shall be allowed until the actual winner selection process begins;

(g) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the drawing or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner;

(h) There is no limit to the number of entries an entrant may make, but each entrant may only win one prize;

(i) All eligible entrants must be at least 18 years of age. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-12-15-00, Nov. 17, 2000; amended, T-111-6-19-01, May 18, 2001.)

111-4-1805a. **Co-sponsor drawings.** Co-sponsors of the Westridge mall sidewalk sale may hold a co-sponsor drawing in conjunction with local retailers, businesses, and organizations at the drawing event. In no instance shall this drawing take place prior to the lottery

(continued)

“Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale Drawing.” Such drawing, if conducted, shall be a part of the lottery “Westridge Mall Sidewalk Sale Drawing” and prizes, in addition to those presented by the lottery, may be donated by the co-sponsor(s). The person drawing tickets for the lottery may draw additional tickets for the co-sponsor(s). At the end of the drawing event(s), all tickets, except tickets drawn for use by the lottery, shall be returned to the receptacle or drum. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-19-01, May 18, 2001.)

111-4-1828. **Selection of winners.** The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the “Kansas Speedway Winston Cup Weekend Race Package Drawings”:

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing “Kansas Speedway Winston Cup Weekend Race Package Drawings” entries at the United States Post Office in Topeka, Kansas, with final pick up for each weekly drawing after the morning mail delivery on each Tuesday prior to the drawing on the next following Friday.

(b) Lottery personnel shall transport the mail to the Kansas lottery mail room where the envelopes will be opened and emptied into the drawing receptacle or drum.

(c) The drawing shall be held at the lottery headquarters in a place accessible to the public and open for public attendance with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(d) At the start of each drawing, lottery security personnel shall present the receptacle or drum to the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. The receptacle or drum for the drawings shall contain all entries eligible for that weekly drawing. The drum shall be rotated 10 times or receptacle mixed thoroughly as may be applicable. The designated individual shall then unseal the receptacle or drum, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove five valid entries, one at a time, from the receptacle or drum and mark them in order drawn: 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5. The person whose name appears on each of the entries shall be the winner of the prize identified in K.A.R. 111-4-1826, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(e) After 10 entries have been drawn and verified as valid by lottery security, five more entries will be drawn, one at a time, to serve as alternate entries. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, and 5A. The alternate ticket entries will be used only if the original winners cannot be located or are declared ineligible, or fail to present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters as required by K.A.R. 111-4-1826(i). The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn.

(f) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each entry drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the “Kansas Speedway Winston Cup Weekend Race Package Drawings” in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner. Each winner shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and returned to the lottery within 21 calendar days of the drawing.

(g) If the entry is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another en-

try drawn. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.

(h) All “Kansas Speedway Weekend Race Package Drawings” entries remaining in the drum or receptacle after the winners have been selected and certified at each weekly drawing and all entries not received in compliance with these rules shall be retained by the lottery for entry into the drawing to be conducted at the 2001 Kansas state fair pursuant to separate rules pertaining to that drawing. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-5-15-01, April 20, 2001; amended, T-111-6-19-01, May 18, 2001.)

111-4-1832. **Prize.** (a) The winner of the grand prize at the “Bullitt Mustang Drawing,” which will be conducted on September 16, 2001, shall receive a 2001 Ford “Bullitt” Mustang automobile, together with a racing weekend package for two persons. The racing weekend package for two persons shall consist of two tickets for each day of the 2001 NASCAR Winston Cup Automobile race conducted at the Kansas Speedway in Kansas City, Kansas, on September 29, 2001, and September 30, 2001, one double occupancy hotel room and room taxes for the evenings of September 28, 2001, and September 29, 2001, round-trip transportation between the Kansas Speedway and the hotel, food and other amenities at the Kansas lottery hospitality chalet located at the Kansas Speedway, and \$300 cash. The following restrictions shall apply to this prize:

(1) The Kansas lottery is not responsible for any losses caused by delay or cancellation of said automobile race.

(2) Prize packages are not transferable and cannot be redeemed for cash.

(3) The lottery shall choose and reserve all hotel rooms.

(4) The lottery shall provide transportation to and from the Kansas Speedway on a scheduled basis. All other transportation is the responsibility of the prize winners.

(5) Prize winners will receive notification of their prize, but the actual prize will be delivered at a time and place to be announced by the lottery.

(6) Any meals, drinks, gratuities, taxes, and other expenses that are not specifically mentioned are not included.

(7) The hotel may require winners to produce a major credit card at the time of check-in. Winners are responsible for all hotel charges incurred in excess of the room charge.

(b) There will be 10 additional winners selected at the drawing and they shall each receive a \$1,000 cash prize.

(c) All prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs and deductions authorized by law.

(d) The winner of a prize shall return to the lottery a completed claim form as provided by the lottery within 21 days in which his or her ticket was drawn or the person named on the ticket drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn for that prize pursuant to subsection (f) of K.A.R. 111-4-1835 shall be declared the winner. The first valid entry drawn shall receive the prize package to St. Louis, Missouri. The second valid entry drawn shall receive the prize package to Columbus, Ohio. The third

(7) The drawing will be conducted at the approximate time listed in K.A.R. 111-7-166. Three entries and three alternate entries will be drawn at the drawing.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person may only win one prize in this drawing.

(c) All eligible entry forms which are mailed and received by the morning mail pickup in Lawrence, Kansas, on Tuesday, July 17, 2001, shall be entered into the drawing.

(d) Eligible entrants in this drawing must be 18 years of age or older.

(e) Completing the information on the entry form and entering the ticket into this drawing constitutes authorization to publicly identify the person whose entry is drawn. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-19-01, May 18, 2001.)

111-7-169. **Certification of drawing.** (a) The "Live the Music Flyaway Concert Drawing" shall all be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery (hereinafter "event manager").

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting each prize winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-19-01, May 18, 2001.)

111-7-170. **Selection of winners.** The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the "Live the Music Flyaway Concert Drawing":

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing entries for this drawing at the United States Post Office in Lawrence, Kansas, with final pick up for this drawing being the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, July 17, 2001.

(b) Lottery personnel shall transport the mail to the Kansas lottery mail room where the envelopes will be opened and securely stored in the mail room until the day of the drawing.

(c) The drawing shall be held at the lottery headquarters in a place accessible to the public and open for public attendance with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(h) All entries remaining in the drum or receptacle after the winners have been selected and certified at this drawing and all entries not received in compliance with these rules shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-6-19-01, May 18, 2001.)

K.A.R. 60-12-106—License renewal (mental health technicians). This proposed amended regulation pertains to continuing education for license renewal. This regulation, if adopted, will eliminate the maximum 12 contact hours of independent study in a renewal period, which will allow the LMHT to have a total of 30 contact hours that are independent study. This proposed regulation, if adopted, specifies the proof of completion documentation on the renewal notice. There is no economic impact anticipated for the State Board of Nursing, other governmental entities, private business or individuals.

K.A.R. 60-3-111—Inactive license (registered professional nurse or licensed practical nurse). This proposed amended regulation pertains to inactive license and clarifies the language used in the regulation. There is no change in the content of the regulation. There is no economic impact anticipated for the State Board of Nursing, other governmental entities, private business or individuals.

K.A.R. 60-13-112—Authorization renewal (registered nurse anesthetist). This proposed amended regulation pertains to continuing education for license renewal. This regulation, if adopted, will eliminate the maximum 15 contact hours of independent study in a renewal period, which will allow the registered nurse anesthetist to have a total of 30 contact hours that are independent study. There is no economic impact anticipated for the State Board of Nursing, other governmental entities, private business or individuals.

The Kansas Department on Aging hereby announces the availability of \$9 million from the Partnership Loan Program (PLP). These funds are generated by the Kansas Intergovernmental Transfer (KSIT) Program. They are to be utilized for:

- Converting all or part of adult care homes, such as nursing facilities, to alternative housing options;
- Converting private residences to Home Plus facilities, provided the owners intend to reside in the home;

- Modifying space in rural hospitals to provide a long-term care unit;
- Improving quality in adult care homes that serve the elderly population;
- Building or renovating congregate housing for seniors in cities with populations of 2,500 or less;
- Contracting by rural hospitals for physicians, physician assistants or professional nurses; or
- Other similar projects providing service and housing options for elder Kansans.

The loan funds also may be used to provide partial financing, ensuring that projects have the final amounts of funding necessary for completion.

Eligible applicants are owners of:

- Adult care homes, such as Adult Day Care, Boarding Care Homes, Home Plus, Residential Health Care, Assisted Living and Nursing Facilities;
- Hospitals or long-term care units that are certified to serve Medicaid residents;
- Private residences to be converted to Home Plus facilities; and
- Senior housing projects in Kansas cities with a population of 2,500 or less.

Interested parties should contact the KDOA for Application Instructions and Program Guidelines and the Partnership Loan Program Application forms to be used in explaining the proposed project. Submitted applications must be consistent with a current needs analysis and have professional quality, demonstrating organization, clarity and understanding of the proposed venture. Areas of the state where housing and service options for the elderly are limited will be targeted. Units of government, not-for-profit entities, for-profit organizations and individuals may apply for loan funds, and preference for the loans may be given in that order. Loans may be at current market rates or lower and may be fully secured, partially secured or unsecured. Applications proposing higher interest rates and loans with better security may be given preference. Facilities with fewer than 60 beds also will be given special consideration. Other factors to be considered include, but are not limited to, the elderly population and their economic status by county; the quality, quantity and type of existing housing units and services available and affordable for seniors; and community resources and supports available to the venture. Applications also will be evaluated based on project design, financial feasibility, organizational capacity and development readiness.

Applications must be received at the KDOA not later than 5 p.m. October 1. All interested parties are encouraged to apply.
