Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Wednesday, September 26, in Room 108, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed rules and regulations of the Board of Technical Professions.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Board of Technical Professions, Suite 507, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least 10 working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Betty Rose at (785) 296-3053.

There is no anticipated economic impact on the Board of Technical Professions or other governmental agencies. (See fiscal impact statement for economic impact on the public.)

The following is a brief summary of the substance of the proposed regulations:

K.A.R. 66-6-1. Seal. This regulation states that technical professions must seal their documents when a project is completed unless exempted by law. Exemptions for geologists were added to the regulation.

K.A.R. 66-6-4. Rules of professional conduct. This regulation has been modified to clarify that a licensee in one technical profession may not sign or seal a plan or document with subject material that is outside the licensee's field of practice as defined by law. Also, a licensee in one technical profession may not sign or seal any plan or document of an individual licensed in another state unless licensed in the same technical profession.

K.A.R. 66-10-12. Surveying experience of a character satisfactory to the board. In this regulation, two minor changes have been made regarding surveying experience. In section (b), "guidelines" was changed to "requirements." Also, an additional category of experience was added for those attending a cooperative land surveying program.

K.A.R. 66-10-13. Geology experience of a character that is satisfactory to the board. This regulation clarifies the qualifications of geologists who are supplying references for individuals applying for geology licenses. After July 1, 2002, the board will only accept references from licensed geologists. The board also will accept one reference from a licensed professional engineer.

K.A.R. 66-14-5. Computation of credit. One section of this regulation was changed to allow some flexibility for educators of the technical professions. While not getting teaching credit for professional development hours for regularly assigned classes, they can get credit for workshops and seminars that are taught on an occasional basis.

A public hearing will be conducted by the Wildlife and Parks Commission at 7 p.m. Thursday, August 23, at the El Dorado Civic Center, 201 E. Central, El Dorado, to consider the approval and adoption of a proposed regulation of the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks.

A workshop meeting on business of the Wildlife and Parks Commission will begin at 1:30 p.m. August 23 at the above location. The meeting will recess at 5 p.m., then resume at 7 p.m. at the same location for the regulatory hearing. There will be public comment periods at the beginning of the afternoon and evening meetings for any issues not on the agenda, and additional comment periods will be available during the meeting on agenda items. Old and new business also may be discussed at this time. If necessary to complete the hearing or other business matters, the commission will reconvene at 9 a.m. August 24 the same location.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Sheila Kemmis, commission secretary, at (620) 672-5911. Persons with a hearing impairment may call the TDD service at 1-800-766-3777 to request special accommodations.

This 30-day notice period prior to the hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed exempt regulation.

All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the chairman of the commission, Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks, Suite 502, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to express their views orally in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulation. During the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the commission as a basis for approving, amending and approving, or rejecting the proposed regulation.

The exempt regulation that will be heard during the regulatory hearing portion of the meeting, in addition to the administrative regulations for which public notice has previously been published, is as follows:

K.A.R. 115-25-6. This proposed exempt regulation establishes hunting unit boundaries, bag limits, application periods and season dates for the spring turkey hunting season. The proposal would revise management units for the spring turkey hunting season and establish one new unit in Southcentral Kansas. The proposal also would establish an early youth season for the weekend immediately preceding the open season, for youth 16 years of age or younger. Authorized permits for the unit in Southwest Kansas would be increased from 100 to 150, with an additional 25 permits available to youth.

Economic Impact Summary: It is anticipated that 35,000 permits and 8,000 turkey game tags will be issued in 2002, which may result in an estimated \$660,000 in revenue. That amount represents an equal expenditure for those individuals desiring to participate in the spring turkey season. No other economic impact on the department, other state agencies or the public is anticipated.
