Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday, January 23, in the Azure conference room on the fourth floor of the Signature State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of a new regulation related to insurance for solid waste facilities, the revocation of the current insurance regulation, the amendment of a used tire regulation and the amendment of two PCB regulations.

The regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed regulations follows.

**K.A.R. 28-29-2201. Insurance for solid waste disposal areas and processing facilities.** This proposed new regulation requires operators of solid waste disposal areas or processing facilities to provide evidence of insurance coverage for third part liability claims, and provides the minimum coverage limits for accidental occurrences. It also provides new rules for local governments subject to the Kansas tort claims act, and allows a financial test alternative to purchased insurance for private corporations.

**K.A.R. 28-29-18. Insurance required.** This regulation is proposed to be revoked. The updated insurance requirements are contained in the proposed new regulation K.A.R. 28-29-2201.

**K.A.R. 28-29-29. Waste tire processing and disposal standards.** During the 2001 session, the Legislature amended K.S.A. 65-3424a(b)(3) by removing the prohibition for the disposal of properly processed waste tires in municipal solid waste landfills (MSWLFs). The proposed amendments would add MSWLFs to the list of possible disposal options for processed waste tires and delete the July 1, 1999, deadline for disposal of waste tires in MSWLFs.

**K.A.R. 28-55-3. Procedures for review of PCB facility permit applications.** The PCB facility construction and permit standards have been in effect since May 1, 1987, and have never been amended. In 1992, the Legislature amended K.S.A. 65-3432 by abolishing the "hazardous waste disposal facility approval board." This regulation is proposed to be amended by removing references to the "hazardous waste approval board."

**K.A.R. 28-55-5. Standards for PCB facilities.** The PCB facility construction and permit standards have been in effect since May 1, 1987, and have never been amended. This regulation is proposed to be amended by updating the citations for the federal PCB and RCRA regulations from November 1, 1986 to July 1, 2000.

These new and amended proposed regulations will not impose any new requirements on the new regulated community.

The time period between publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing serves as the required public comment period of at least 60 days for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written

comments prior to the hearing to George McCaskill, Department of Health and Environment, Bureau of Waste Management, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 320, Topeka, 66612-1366. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

In accordance with Kansas Administrative Regulations 28-16-57 through 63, 28-18-1 through 15, 28-18a-1 through 32, 28-16-150 through 154, 28-46-7, and the authority vested with the state by the administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, draft permits have been prepared and/or permit applications have been received for discharges to the waters of the United States and the State of Kansas for the class of discharges described below.

#### Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 11 a.m. Friday, January 18, in the third floor conference room of the Kansas Insurance Department, 420 S.W. 9th, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed amendments to an existing rule and regulation.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rule and regulation. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Rebecca Sanders, Kansas Insurance Department, 420 S.W. 9th, Topeka, 66612-1678. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulation during the hearing.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance by contacting Rebecca Sanders at (785) 296-7811.

Copies of the regulation and the economic impact statement may be obtained by contacting Rebecca Sanders. A summary of the proposed amendments to this regulation and its economic impact follows.

**K.A.R. 40-1-46. Privacy of consumer financial and health information.** The proposed amendments to this regulation adopts by reference Article V of the National Association of Insurance Commissioners' model regulation governing the privacy of consumer financial and health information.

The amendments to this regulation govern the treatment of nonpublic personal health information about individuals by all licensees of the Kansas Insurance Department. This regulation and the proposed amendments require a licensee to provide notice to individuals about its privacy policies and practices. It also describes the conditions under which a licensee may disclose nonpublic personal financial and health information about individuals to affiliates and nonaffiliated third parties and provides methods for individuals to prevent a licensee from disclosing that information.

This regulation and the proposed amendments to this regulation apply to nonpublic financial and health information about individuals who obtain or are claimants or beneficiaries of products or services primarily for personal, family or household purposes from licensees. Neither the regulation nor the amendments apply to information about companies or about individuals who obtain products or services for business, commercial or agricultural purposes.

This model was adopted after Congress passed in 1999 the Financial Services Modernization Act, also known as the Gramm Leach Bliley Act (PL 102-106), which eliminated many of the barriers to access of information between banks, securities firms and insurance companies.

Title V of the Act requires states to issue regulations and enforce privacy requirements upon insurance companies. Section 507 of the Act provides that Title V is a federal floor and enables states to provide greater consumer protection than the federal regulations.

K.S.A. 40-2404(15) was amended effective February 2002 to clarify what makes it an unfair trade practice to disclose nonpublic personal information including health information to a non-nonaffiliated third party contrary to Title V of the Gramm Leach Bliley Act. This statute also authorizes the Commissioner of Insurance to adopt rules and regulations necessary to carry out this section.

This regulation and the proposed amendments in essence mirror the federal privacy regulations governing federally regulated banking and securities entities.

This regulation and the proposed amendments in Kansas gives insurance companies guidelines to ensure compliance with Title V of the Act and protects consumers by setting out what insurance companies must do to ensure that consumer nonpublic information is protected. Insurance regulation is the job of the state regulator, and this regulation ensures that mandate is carried out.

This regulation and the proposed amendments will impose no additional costs on Kansas insurers than what the federal law requires. The principal cost of the regulation will be to implement the notice requirement, particularly the annual notice, required under Title V of the Act. However, the regulation permits regulated entities to comply with these provisions through varying methods, which may vary in cost depending upon the regulated entity's business practices and business structure. In addition, there is tremendous variation in the size of different regulated entities. Both factors will impact the actual costs of implementing the requirements of this regulation and the federal law making actual cost difficult, if not impossible, to estimate. In implementing similar regulations in compliance with the Act, the federal banking regulators estimated that the initial burden of developing the required notices would require the expenditure of an average of 45 work hours for each licensee. The Kansas Insurance Department estimates the cost to comply with this regulation and the proposed amendments by insurers and licensees to be less than what is estimated by the federal banking regulators. Insurers and other licensees of the department are generally more familiar in developing the types of notices that the regulation requires to be sent to consumers and customers than financial institutions. As a result, the average expenditure of time would be less than what was estimated by the federal banking regulators.

The Kansas Insurance Department also believes that the additional postage incurred by the regulated entities in providing initial and annual notices, where such notices are required, will be minimal because the regulation provides the flexibility for regulated entities to include the required notices in mailings that are already being made. Further, regulated entities may reduce costs through the use of information technology, including, in some instances, the provision of notice by electronic mail.

The promulgation of this regulation and the proposed amendments will increase the regulatory responsibilities of the Kansas Insurance Department, but the department

believes that those regulatory responsibilities can be handled with present staff and budget. There are no additional costs imposed on local governmental entities or state agencies.

**111-2-131. Convenience Plus winner awareness "Starburst" promotion.** (a) In addition to compensation specified in K.A.R. 111-2-4 and 111-2-6, the Kansas lottery shall also conduct a "Starburst" promotion to enhance winner awareness at all Convenience Plus corporate locations.

(b) The winner awareness sales promotion will commence at 5:00 a.m. on Thursday, November 1, 2001, and end at the end of the business day as defined at K.A.R. 111-6-1 on Friday, November 30, 2001.

(c) Beginning November 1, 2001, and concluding November 30, 2001, the lottery will conduct a "Starburst" promotion at all the Convenience Plus corporate stores located in Kansas. The stores must place a starburst decal on a visible wall or counter for every winning instant or on-line ticket that is redeemed at that retailer which wins \$10 or more. **111-7-171. Name of drawing.** The Kansas lottery shall conduct a drawing entitled "Kansas Cash Vegas Getaway Drawing," and will accept entries starting November 1, 2001, for the drawing to be conducted at 10:00 a.m. on December 14, 2001. Rules applicable to this drawing are contained in K.A.R. 111-7-171 through 111-7-175 and K.A.R. 111-6-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-8710, as amended by L. 2001, Ch. 24, §6; implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-8710, as amended by L. 2001, Ch. 24, §6, and K.S.A. 74-8720; effective, T-111-11-6-01, Oct. 17, 2001.)

**111-7-172. Prize.** The 11 prize winners selected in the "Kansas Cash Vegas Getaway Drawing" on the date specified in K.A.R. 111-7-171 shall receive a vacation in Las Vegas, Nevada, at the Hard Rock Hotel and Casino for two people, including hotel room and room taxes for three days and two nights, round-trip coach air transportation from Wichita, Kansas, or Kansas City, Missouri, to Las Vegas, Nevada, round-trip ground transfers between the Las Vegas airport and the hotel, and \$500 cash. The prize of each trip, including the trip and cash, will have a total value of \$2,426. The following restrictions shall apply to the "Kansas Cash Vegas Getaway" prize packages:

(a) Reservations must be made at least 30 days prior to planned departure date.

(b) Vacation packages are transferable one time and cannot be redeemed for cash.

(c) Winners will have until July 31, 2002, to have their vacation travel completed.

(d) Winners may purchase upgrades to longer vacations at their own expense based on availability.

(e) Once a reservation has been confirmed, changes to the itinerary made up to 30 days prior to departure require a \$25 revision fee. Itinerary changes within 30 days of departure are not permitted.

(f) Vacations are subject to availability. Any meals, drinks, gratuities, and taxes that are not specifically mentioned are not included.

(g) Winners cannot schedule their vacations during peak holiday and convention periods.

(h) All prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs and deductions authorized by law.

(i) The winner of a prize as the result of the "Kansas Cash Vegas Getaway Drawing" shall return to the lottery a completed claim form as provided by the lottery within 45 days in which his or her entry was drawn or the person named on the entry drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn pursuant to subsection (e) of K.A.R. 111-7-175 shall be declared the winner. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-8710, as amended by L. 2001, Ch. 24, §6; implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-8710, as amended by L. 2001, Ch. 24, §6, and K.S.A. 74-8720; effective, T-111-11-6-01, Oct. 17, 2001.)

**111-7-173. Method of entry.** (a) Entry into the "Kansas Cash Vegas Getaway Drawing" to be conducted on December 14, 2001, shall be accomplished as follows: Obtain a valid entry form by purchasing a single Kansas Cash ticket costing \$5.00 or more from November 1, 2001, through December 1, 2001. Entry forms will automatically be issued by the terminal at any online Kansas retailer location upon making such a purchase. Entry forms shall include blank lines or spaces for the entrant's name, address, and phone number. Only valid entry forms issued on the above dates, which are mailed pursuant to subsection (d) and received by the time specified in subsection (g), shall be eligible for the drawing.

(b) Whether or not the \$5.00 Kansas Cash ticket itself is a winning ticket, the entry form is eligible for entry into the "Kansas Cash Vegas Getaway Drawing."

(c) Each individual entry form shall constitute one entry.

(d) Place one or more entry forms, not the Kansas Cash ticket itself, into an envelope with proper postage affixed and mail to: "Kansas Cash Vegas Getaway Drawing," P.O. Box 7777, Lawrence, Kansas 66044-7777. The mailing address shall also be printed on each entry form issued.

(e) The holder of the entry form must complete the information on each entry form in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on each entry form.

(f) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person can only win one time. The holder of the entry is not required to personally attend the drawing or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(g) All entry forms which are properly mailed and received by the morning mail pickup in Lawrence, Kansas, on Tuesday, December 11, 2001, shall be entered into the "Kansas Cash Vegas Getaway Drawing."

(h) Eligible entrants must be 18 years of age or older.

(i) Completing the information on the entry form and entering the form into the drawing constitutes authorization to publicly identify the person whose entry is drawn. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-8710, as amended by L. 2001, Ch. 24, §6; implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-8710, as amended by L. 2001, Ch. 24, §6, and K.S.A. 74-8720; effective, T-111-11-6-01, Oct. 17, 2001.)

**111-7-174. Certification of drawing.** (a) The “Kansas Cash Vegas Getaway Drawing” shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery.

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winner. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-8710, as amended by L. 2001, Ch. 24, §6; implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-8710, as amended by L. 2001, Ch. 24, §6, and K.S.A. 74-8720; effective, T-111-11-6-01, Oct. 17, 2001.)

**111-7-175. Selection of winners.** The following process shall be used for the selection of winners in the “Kansas Cash Vegas Getaway Drawing”:

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing “Kansas Cash Vegas Getaway Drawing” entries at the United States Post Office in Lawrence, Kansas, with final pick up after the morning delivery on Tuesday, December 11, 2001.

(b) Lottery personnel shall transport the mail to the mail room where the envelopes will be opened and emptied into the drawing receptacle or drum.

(c) The drawing shall be held at the lottery headquarters in a place accessible to the public and open for public attendance with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(d) At the start of the Friday, December 14, 2001, drawing, lottery security personnel shall present the receptacle or drum to the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. The receptacle or drum for the “Kansas Cash Vegas Getaway Drawing” shall contain all eligible entries. The designated individual shall then unseal the receptacle or drum, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove 11 tickets, one at a time, from the receptacle or drum and mark them in

order drawn, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11. The person whose name appears on each of the entries shall be the winner of the prize identified in K.A.R. 111-7-172, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(e) After the entries have been drawn and each entry has been verified as valid by lottery security, five more entries will be drawn, one at a time, to serve as alternate entries. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, and 5A.

The alternate entries will be used only if the original winners cannot be located or are declared ineligible, or fail to present a fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters by 5:00 p.m. of the forty-fifth day following the drawing. The alternates will be used, if necessary, in the order drawn.

(f) The Kansas lottery security official present shall review each entry drawn to determine the validity of the entry into the “Kansas Cash Vegas Getaway Drawing” in accordance with these regulations. If it is a valid entry and the name is legible, the event manager and the security person present shall record the name of the winner. Each winner shall be given or sent a prize claim form to be completed and returned to the lottery within 45 days of the drawing.

(g) If the entry is determined to be ineligible, it shall be discarded by the security person present and another entry drawn. This procedure will be repeated until valid selections are obtained.

(h) All “Kansas Cash Vegas Getaway” tickets remaining in the drum or receptacle on December 14, 2001, after the winners have been selected and certified, and all entries not received in compliance with these rules shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-8710, as amended by L. 2001, Ch. 24, §6; implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 74-8710, as amended by L. 2001, Ch. 24, §6, and K.S.A. 74-8720; effective, T-111-11-6-01, Oct. 17, 2001.)
