The Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks is providing notice that it is initiating development of a recovery plan for the Topeka shiner (*Notropis topeka*). The department is required to develop recovery plans for species designated by the state as threatened, endangered, and species in need of conservation. The Topeka shiner was designated a threatened species in Kansas by department regulation published in the Kansas Register, Vol. 18, No. 45, November 11, 1999. A recovery plan is defined as "a designated strategy or methodology that, if funded and implemented, is reasonably expected to lead to the eventual restoration, maintenance, or delisting of a species."

The recovery planning process includes development of a local advisory committee to identify immediate needs for the conservation and restoration of the species, as well as actions to address those needs. Kansas Ave., Suite 202, Topeka, on the proposal for the Kansas Development Finance Authority to issue its Agricultural Development Revenue Bond for the project numbered below in the respective maximum principal amount. The bond will be issued to assist the respective borrower named below (who will be the owner and operator of the project) to finance the cost in the amount of the bond of acquiring the project or for the purpose of refunding a bond previously issued to finance the project. The project shall be located as shown:

**Project No. 000528—Maximum Principal Amount: \$60,000.** Owner/Operator: Brent G. and Tanya S. Hatcher. Description: Acquisition of 133 acres of agricultural land and related improvements and equipment to be used by the owner/operator for farming purposes. The project is located at the Northeast Quarter of Section 4, Township 24, Range 20, Osage Township, Allen County, Kansas, approximately 4 miles north of Moran and 3 miles east at Texas Road and 4600 Street.

The bond, when issued, will be a limited obligation of the Kansas Development Finance Authority and will not constitute a general obligation or indebtedness of the State of Kansas or any political subdivision thereof, including the Authority, nor will it be an indebtedness for which the faith and credit and taxing powers of the State of Kansas are pledged. The bond will be payable solely from amounts received from the respective borrower, the obligation of which will be sufficient to pay the principal of, interest and redemption premium, if any, on the bond when it becomes due.

All individuals who appear at the hearing will be given an opportunity to express their views, and all written comments previously filed with the Authority at its offices at 555 S. Kansas Ave., Suite 202, Topeka, 66603, will be considered. Additional information regarding the project may be obtained by contacting the Authority.

Notice of Available Grant Funding

Grant funds are available from the State Crime Victims' Assistance Fund for fiscal year 2003. The purpose of the grant program is to provide services and assistance to victims of crime in order to speed their recovery from the financial loss, physical suffering and emotional trauma of victimization, and to assure proper and sensitive treatment of crime victims in the criminal justice process.

It is the intention of this grant program to provide as wide a range of coverage as possible to the citizens of the state. In distributing grant funds among urban and rural areas of the state, priority shall be given to those areas with the greatest need. Assistance may encompass a wide range of support services. Specific services to be provided and the specific target group should reflect local needs and priorities. Examples of critical elements include, but are not limited to, an analysis of the community's crime victims needs and problems; the targeting of existing and planned activities and services to respond to the local situation; and the formulation of agreements for cooperation between criminal justice system agencies and public and private crime victims service providers. Activities may include, but are not limited to, 24-hour crisis intervention and support or emergency services; counseling; assistance with compensation claims; creditors, community referrals and restitution, with the exception that no direct compensation may be paid to a crime victim; prosecutor or court-related services; and shelter support counseling, social services support and criminal justice advocacy.

Available funds may be awarded to units of state or local government or private, not-for-profit organizations for defined grant project activities. Each eligible applicant must receive 50 percent or more of its total agency budget from sources other than funds distributed through this grant fund. No grant award will be made for more than \$25,000.

Written bids will be received by the secretary of the Board of Trustees of Garden City Community College, Finney County, Kansas (the college), on behalf of the Board of Trustees at 801 Campus Drive, Garden City, KS 67846, until 5 p.m. February 20, 2002, for the purchase of \$3,820,000 principal amount of Certificates of Participation, Series 2002, evidencing a proportionate interest of the owners thereof in basic rent payments to be made by the college pursuant to a lease purchase agreement (the Series 2002 Certificates).

**Certificate Details**

The Series 2002 Certificates will be issued pursuant to a Declaration of Trust by the trustee identified below. The Series 2002 Certificates will consist of fully registered certificates in the denomination of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof. The Series 2002 Certificates will be dated March 1, 2002, and the principal portion thereof will become due annually on April 1 in the years as follows:

Each of the Series 2002 Certificates shall represent the right to receive a proportionate share of the interest portion and principal portion of basic rent paid by the college to the trustee identified below under a lease purchase agreement (the lease). The interest portion due on the Series 2002 Certificates will accrue from the date of the Series 2002 Certificates, at rates to be determined when the Series 2002 Certificates are sold as hereinafter provided, which interest portion will be payable semiannually on certificate payment dates, which shall be April 1 and October 1 in each year, beginning October 1, 2002.

**Good Faith Deposit**

Each bid shall be accompanied by a good faith deposit in the form of a cashier's or certified check drawn on a bank located in the United States or a qualified financial surety bond in the amount of \$76,400 (2 percent of the principal amount of the Series 2002 Certificates).

**Authority, Purpose and Security**

The lease is being entered into for the acquisition, construction and equipping of a new student union facility, improvements to existing student housing facilities, a new student housing facility and other appurtenant improvements (collectively, the improvements), all pursuant to K.S.A. 71-201 *et seq.*, as amended. The Series 2002 Certificates are secured by and payable from the Trust Estate established under the Declaration of Trust, which consists, in part, of basic rent payments received by the trustee under the lease. The obligation of the college to make basic rent payments under the lease is a limited obligation, payable from available revenues of the college, including those raised through ad valorem taxation, but shall not in any way be construed to be a general obligation or indebtedness of the college. The term of the lease extends to June 30, 2011, and is subject to extension by the college for an additional seven years. The lease is also subject to change or termination by an act of the Kansas Legislature.

**Conditions of Bids**

Proposals will be received on the Series 2002 Certificates bearing such rate or rates of interest as may be specified by the bidders, subject to the following conditions: (a) the same rate shall apply to all of the principal portion due in each year; (b) each interest rate specified shall be a multiple of 1/8th or 1/20th of 1 percent; (c) no interest rate may exceed a rate equal to the daily yield for the 30-year Treasury Certificate published by *The Bond Buyer* in New York, New York, on the Monday next preceding the day on which the Series 2002 Certificates are sold, plus 2 percent; and (d) no supplemental interest payments will be considered. The difference between the highest rate specified and the lowest rate specified cannot exceed 3 percent. No bid shall be for less than 98 percent of the total principal portion evidenced by the Series 2002 Certificates and accrued interest thereon to the date of delivery will be considered. Each bid shall specify the total interest cost (expressed in dollars) during the term of the lease on the basis of such bid, the discount, if any, the premium, if any, offered by the bidder, the net interest cost (expressed in dollars) on the basis of such bid and the average annual net interest rate (expressed as a percentage) on the basis of such bid. Each bidder shall certify to the college the correctness of the information contained on an official bid form; the college will be entitled to rely on such certification. Each bidder agrees that, if it is awarded the Series 2002 Certificates, it will provide the certification as to initial offering prices described under the caption "Certification as to Offering Price" in this notice.

**Basis of Award**

The award of the Series 2002 Certificates will be made on the basis of the lowest net interest cost (expressed in

dollars), which will be determined by subtracting the amount of the premium bid, if any, from or adding the amount of the discount bid, if any, to the total interest cost to the college. If there is any discrepancy between the net interest cost specified and the interest rates specified, the specified net interest cost shall govern and the interest rates specified in the bid shall be adjusted accordingly. If two or more proper bids providing for identical amounts for the lowest net interest cost are received, the Board of Trustees of the college will determine which bid, if any, will be accepted, and its determination is final.

The college reserves the right to reject any and/or all bids and to waive any irregularities in a submitted bid. Any bid received after the submittal hour on the sale date set forth above will be returned to the bidder. Any disputes arising hereunder shall be governed by the laws of Kansas, and any party submitting a bid agrees to be subject to jurisdiction and venue of the federal and state courts within Kansas with regard to such dispute.

#### **Certification as to Offering Prices**

To provide the college with information necessary for compliance with Section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, the successful bidder will be required to complete, execute and deliver to the college prior to the delivery of the Series 2002 Certificates, a certificate regarding the "issue price" of the Series 2002 Certificates (as defined in Section 148 of the code), reflecting the initial offering prices (excluding accrued interest and expressed as dollar prices) at which a substantial amount (*i.e.*, 10 percent or more) of the Series 2002 Certificates of each maturity have been or are expected to be sold to the public. The term "public" excludes bond houses, brokers or similar persons or organizations acting in the capacity of underwriters or wholesalers. Such certificate shall state that 10 percent or more of the Series 2002 Certificates of each maturity have been or are expected to be sold to the public at prices no higher than such initial offering prices. However, such certificate may indicate that the successful bidder will not offer the Series 2002 Certificates for sale to the public.

#### **Mandatory Prepayment**

A bidder may elect to have all or a portion of the Series 2002 Certificates scheduled to be paid in consecutive years issued as term certificates scheduled to be paid in the latest of said consecutive years and subject to mandatory prepayment requirements consistent with the schedule of serial payments set forth above, subject to the following conditions: not less than all Series 2002 Certificates to be paid in the same year shall be converted to term certificates with mandatory prepayment requirements and a bidder shall make such an election by completing the applicable paragraph on the official bid form.

#### **Delivery**

The college will pay for printing the Series 2002 Certificates and will deliver the same properly prepared, executed and registered without cost to the successful bidder on or about March 5, 2002, to such bank or trust company in the contiguous United States as may be specified by the successful bidder, or elsewhere at the expense of the successful bidder.

#### **Approval of Series 2002 Certificates**

The Series 2002 Certificates will be sold subject to the legal opinion of Gilmore & Bell, P.C., Wichita, Kansas, special counsel, whose approving legal opinion as to the validity of the lease and Series 2002 Certificates will be furnished and paid for by the college, printed on the Series 2002 Certificates and delivered to the successful bidder when the Series 2002 Certificates are delivered.

#### **Request for Comments**

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality construction permit. Farmland National Beef, LP has applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300 to replace four existing boilers with new boilers. Emissions of nitrogen oxides (NO<sub>x</sub>), carbon monoxide (CO), sulfur oxides (SO<sub>x</sub>), volatile organic compounds (VOCs), particulate matter (PM) and PM equal to or less than 10 microns in diameter (PM<sub>10</sub>) were evaluated during the permit review process.

Farmland National Beef, LP owns and operates the stationary source located at 2000 E. Trail, Dodge City, Ford County, Kansas, at which the existing boilers are to be replaced.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during review of the permit application is available for public inspection for a period of 30 days from the date of publication during normal business hours at the KDHE, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. In addition to the administrative regulations for which public notice has previously been published, the exempt regulation that will be heard during the regulatory hearing portion of the meeting is as follows:

**K.A.R. 115-25-9.** This proposed exempt regulation establishes hunting bag limits, application periods and season dates for the 2002 firearm and archery deer seasons. The main change would establish hunt-on-your-own-land permit in units 17 and 18 as any-deer permits, as they are in all other units. Otherwise, the proposal changes season dates to fit the 2002 calendar.

Economic Impact Summary: Total numbers of permits sold are not expected to change substantially from the 2001-02 seasons. Consequently, the economic impact to the department, the general public and other agencies

from the 2002-03 seasons is anticipated to be similar to the 2001-02 seasons, and is estimated to be approximately \$4,500,000. Approximately 700,000 days of hunting activity by 100,000 hunters are anticipated, which, based on survey estimates, may generate \$51 million of economic benefit to businesses providing goods and services.

The proposed permit is a modification based upon a proposed upgrade from a design flow of 1.5 MGD to 3.0 MGD to Walnut River via Four Mile Creek. This facility is a mechanical treatment plant consisting of an extended aeration activated sludge process, final clarification and disinfection via chlorination/dechlorination. Sludge is dewatered on a belt filter press and land applied. The facility receives domestic wastewater from residential and light commercial areas. The proposed permit includes limits for biochemical oxygen demand, total suspended solids, ammonia, fecal coliform, total residual chlorine, dissolved oxygen and pH. Monitoring for total phosphorus, total Kjeldahl nitrogen, nitrate, nitrite and effluent flow also will be required. The permittee is required to conduct chronic whole effluent toxicity and heavy metals testing annually, and a priority pollutant scan will be required once during the life of the permit.

OTHER DEPARTMENT ISSUES**115-9-4. Hunting or furharvester license purchase.**

(a) Any individual required to have a certificate of completion of an approved hunter education course before purchasing a hunting license, or an approved furharvester education course before purchasing a furharvester license, may purchase a hunting or furharvester license by attesting to the individual's successful completion of an approved hunter or furharvester education course, respectively, at the time of purchase.

(b) The signature of the individual on the hunting or furharvester license, respectively, shall satisfy the attesting requirement of subsection (a). (Authorized by K.S.A. 32-807; implementing K.S.A. 32-807, K.S.A. 32-912, as amended by L. 2001, Ch. 13, Sec. 1, and K.S.A. 32-920; effective Dec. 26, 1989; amended Feb. 22, 2002.)

## Article 11.—CONTROLLED SHOOTING AREAS

**115-11-1. Controlled shooting areas; license application, issuance priority, and reporting.** (a) Each application for a controlled shooting area license shall be made on forms provided by the department.

(b) Each applicant shall provide the following information:

- (1) The size of the area;
- (2) a map of the area;
- (3) the legal description of the area;
- (4) the species of game birds to be released and hunted;
- (5) a description of the premises and facilities; and
- (6) any other information required by the secretary.

(c) Each applicant for renewal of an existing controlled shooting area license shall provide information as required by paragraphs (b) (1) through (b) (5) only if a change of status has occurred.

(d) The applicant shall submit, with the application, proof of ownership or lease for a five-year period of the area described in the application.

(e) An application for a controlled shooting area license that is not a renewal application may be submitted at any time.

(f) Each application for a renewal of a controlled shooting area license shall be submitted not later than July 1.

(g) A renewal application shall have priority over a new application for a controlled shooting area license in order that the maximum county controlled shooting area acreage limitation not be exceeded.

(h) A renewal application received after July 1 shall be considered a new application for purposes of subsection (g).

(i) Each licensee shall maintain daily records of game bird releases, a register of hunters, the number of animals or birds taken for each species of game animal hunted on the controlled shooting area, and any other information required by the secretary on forms provided by the de-

partment. These records shall be available for department inspection.

(j) A final report consisting of the records and any other information required by the secretary shall be submitted to the department as a part of the renewal application or by August 1 if the controlled shooting area license is not renewed. A controlled shooting area license shall not be issued or renewed until a final report has been received by the department.

(k) This regulation shall be effective on and after July 1, 2002. (Authorized by K.S.A. 32-948; implementing K.S.A. 32-944, K.S.A. 32-945, and K.S.A. 32-948; effective Dec. 4, 1989; amended July 1, 2002.)

**115-11-2. Controlled shooting areas; operational requirements.** (a) Controlled shooting areas shall be posted as follows:

(1) Signs shall be made of metal, plastic, or wood and shall be not less than 15 inches by 15 inches.

(2) Signs shall legibly display the words "controlled shooting area" in block lettering that is not less than two inches in height.

(3) Signs shall be placed along the boundary of the controlled shooting area, at intervals of not more than 500 feet.

(b) The licensee shall keep the license and a copy of the laws and regulations pertaining to the controlled shooting areas posted in a conspicuous and readily available place at the headquarters of the area.

(c) If the license of the controlled shooting area is cancelled or revoked, the licensee shall remove all controlled shooting area signs from the boundary of the area within 30 days of the cancellation or revocation date.

(d) If a licensee fails to renew a controlled shooting area license, all controlled shooting area signs shall be removed from the boundary of the area before September 1.

(e) Only those game birds released on the controlled shooting area from August 15 through March 31 of the license period shall be credited toward the allowable take for the area.

(f) The licensee shall not take or permit the taking of more than 100 percent of the number of each species of game bird released on the controlled shooting area. These game bird species shall not be hunted on the area until a release of the game bird species has been made.

(g) The shooting hours for the taking of game birds released on controlled shooting areas shall be from ½ hour before sunrise to sunset.

(h) Game birds taken on a controlled shooting area shall be accompanied during transportation from the area by a form provided by the department and completed by the licensee, which shall include the number and species of game birds being transported, the name and license number of the licensee, the date of harvest, and any other information required by the secretary.

(i) Except as authorized under Kansas dog training and field trial regulations, only hand-reared mallard ducks may be recaptured by trapping after release.

(j) Hunting during established seasons and in compliance with all laws and regulations governing the hunting

activity may occur on a controlled shooting area for wildlife species not included in K.S.A. 32-943, and amendments thereto, or for any wildlife species not included in the license issued for that controlled shooting area, including big game animals for which the hunter has a valid permit issued by the department. The hunting, shooting, or taking of wild migratory waterfowl, however, shall be prohibited on each controlled shooting area used for the shooting of hand-reared mallard ducks.

(k) This regulation shall be effective on and after July 1, 2002. (Authorized by K.S.A. 32-948; implementing K.S.A. 32-945, K.S.A. 32-946, K.S.A. 32-947, and K.S.A. 32-948; effective Dec. 4, 1989; amended Aug. 31, 1992; amended July 1, 1999; amended July 1, 2002.)

**91-1-206. Professional development plans for license renewal.** (a) Any person filing a professional development plan with a local professional development council for licensure renewal purposes under S.B.R. 91-1-

205 (b) shall develop a plan that includes activities in at least two of the following areas:

(1) Content endorsement standards as adopted by the state board;

(2) professional education standards as adopted by the state board; or

(3) service to the profession.

(b) Each person who is employed by or who works or resides within any Kansas unified school district shall be eligible to file a professional development plan with that district's local professional development council for licensure renewal purposes.

(c) Each individual submitting a professional development plan shall ensure that the plan meets the following conditions:

(1) The plan results from cooperative planning with a designated supervisor.

(2) The plan is signed by the individual submitting the plan and by the individual's supervisor, if the supervisor agrees with the plan.

(3) The plan is reviewed and approved by the local professional development council.

(d) If a person is unable to attain approval of an individual development plan through a local professional development council, the person may appeal to the licensure review committee for a review of the proposed individual development plan.

(e) This regulation shall be effective on and after July 1, 2003. (Authorized by and implementing Article 6, Section 2(a) of the Kansas Constitution; effective July 1, 2003; amended July 1, 2003.)

**91-1-215. In-service education definitions.** (a) "Content endorsement standards" means those standards adopted by the state board that define the skills and knowledge required for the specific content endorsements prescribed in K.A.R. 91-1-202.

(b) "Educational agency" means a public school district, accredited nonpublic school, area professional development center, institution of postsecondary education authorized to award academic degrees, the Kansas state department of education, and any other organization that serves school districts.

(c) "In-service education" means professional development and staff development and shall include any planned learning opportunities provided to licensed personnel employed by a school district or other authorized educational agency for purposes of improving the performance of these personnel in already held or assigned positions.

(d) "In-service education plan" and "plan" mean a detailed program for provision of professional or staff development, or both.

(e) "Noncontractual times" means periods of time during which an employee is not under a contractual obligation to perform services.

(f) "Professional development" means continuous learning that is based on individual needs and meets both of the following criteria:

(1) The learning prepares a person for access to practice, maintains the person's access to practice, builds an individual's knowledge or skills, or is requested by the employing educational agency.

(2) The learning positively impacts the individual or the individual's students, school or school district.

(g) "Professional development council" and "PDC" mean a representative group of licensed personnel from an educational agency that advises the governing body of the educational agency in matters concerning the planning, development, implementation, and operation of the educational agency's in-service education plan.

(h) "Professional development plan" means a written document describing the in-service education activities to be completed during a specified period of time by the individual filing the plan.

(i) "Professional development point" means one clock-hour of in-service education. One semester hour of college credit shall count as 20 professional development points.

(j) "Professional education standards" means those standards adopted by the state board that specify the knowledge, competencies, and skills necessary to perform in a particular role or position.

(k) "Service to the profession" means any activity that assists others in acquiring proficiency in instructional systems, pedagogy, or content, or that directly relates to licensure of professional educators, accreditation processes, or professional organizations.

(l) "Staff development" means continuous learning offered to groups of professionals that develops the skills of those professionals to meet common goals, or the goals of a school or school district.

(m) "State board" means the state board of education.

This regulation shall be effective on and after July 1, 2003. (Authorized by and implementing Article 6, Section 2(a) of the Kansas Constitution; effective July 1, 2003.)

Procedures for promulgation of in-service education plans; approval by state board; area professional development centers' in-service programs.** (a) An in-service education plan to be offered by one or more educational agencies may be designed and implemented by the board of education or other governing body of an educational agency, or the governing bodies of any two or more educational agencies, with the advice of representatives of the licensed personnel who will be affected.

(b) Procedures for development of an in-service plan shall include the following:

- (1) Establishment of a professional development council;
- (2) an assessment of in-service needs;
- (3) identification of goals and objectives;
- (4) identification of activities; and
- (5) evaluative criteria.

(c) Based upon information developed under subsection (b) of this regulation, the educational agency shall prepare a proposed in-service plan. The proposed plan shall be submitted to the state board by August 1 of the school year in which the plan is to become effective.

(d) The plan shall be approved, approved with modifications, or disapproved by the state board. The educational agency shall be notified of the decision by the state board within 60 days of submission of the plan.

(e) An approved plan may be amended at any time by following the procedures specified in this regulation.

(f) Each area professional development center providing in-service education for licensure renewal shall provide the in-service education through a local school district, an accredited nonpublic school, an institution of postsecondary education, or an educational agency that has a state-approved in-service education plan.

(g) This regulation shall be effective on and after July 1, 2003. (Authorized by and implementing Article 6, Section 2(a) of the Kansas Constitution; effective July 1, 2003.)

**91-1-217. In-service education professional development council.** (a) Each professional development council shall meet the following criteria:

(1) Be representative of the educational agency's licensed personnel; and

(2) include at least as many teachers as administrators, with both selected solely by the group they represent.

(b) Each council shall have the following responsibilities:

(1) To participate in annual training related to roles and responsibilities of council members, including responsibilities under these regulations, K.A.R. 91-1-215 through K.A.R. 91-1-219;

(2) to develop operational procedures; and

(3) to develop a five-year plan that may be approved by the governing body of the educational agency and is based upon criteria established by the state board.

(c) This regulation shall be effective on and after July 1, 2003. (Authorized by and implementing Article 6, Section 2(a) of the Kansas Constitution; effective July 1, 2003.)

**91-1-218. Awarding of professional development points.** (a) In awarding professional development points, each educational agency shall designate that one professional development point is equal to one clock-hour of in-service education.

(b) If a person documents completion of an in-service activity, the person shall be awarded professional development points equal to the number of clock-hours completed.

(c) If a person who has earned points for completion of an in-service activity later verifies that the person has applied the skills or knowledge gained, the person shall be awarded two times the number of professional development points that were earned for completion of the in-service activity. Evidence of application of the knowledge gained through the in-service activity shall be presented to the professional development council and may include any of the following:

(1) Independent observation;

(2) written documentation; or

(3) other evidence that is acceptable to the PDC.

(d) If a person who has earned points for application of knowledge or skills learned through in-service activities verifies that the application of the knowledge or skills has had a positive impact on student performance or the educational program of the school or school district, the person shall be awarded three times the number of professional development points that were earned for completion of the in-service activity. Evidence of impact upon student performance or school improvement shall be pre-

(continued)

sented to the professional development council and may include any of the following:

- (1) Independent observation;
- (2) written documentation;
- (3) evidence of improved student performance; or
- (4) other evidence that is acceptable to the PDC.

(e) A person shall be awarded professional development points for activities related to service to the profession upon the basis of the number of clock-hours served. The person shall be awarded one point for each clock-hour of service. The person shall submit verification of service to the professional development council.

(f) For purposes of renewing a license, a professional development council shall not impose a limit on the number of professional development points that may be earned. However, a council may impose limits on the number of professional development points that may be earned for purposes related to employment or other local matters.

(g) This regulation shall be effective on and after July 1, 2003. (Authorized by and implementing Article 6, Section 2(a) of the Kansas Constitution; effective July 1, 2003.)

**91-1-219. Expenditures for an in-service education program.** (a) Education agencies may receive in-service education funds for the following expenditures:

- (1) Consultant fees and honorariums;
- (2) travel expenses for consultants;
- (3) cost of materials used in training;
- (4) salaries of substitute teachers for certified staff who have filed an individual development plan, but these salaries shall not exceed 25 percent of the total in-service education expenditures;
- (5) registration fees for, and travel expenses to, in-service workshops and conferences, both in state and out of state, for certified individuals who have individual development plans on file;
- (6) salaries of secretarial personnel, but these salaries shall not exceed the amount of one hour of secretarial wages for each certified employee having an approved individual development plan on file; and
- (7) salaries paid to certified staff, during noncontractual times, for participation in district-level or building-level training or other staff development activities.

(b) Education agencies shall not receive in-service education funds for the following expenditures:

- (1) Rental or facilities;
- (2) utilities;
- (3) equipment;
- (4) administrative expenses; and
- (5) salaries of teachers attending in-service workshops or conferences during contractual times, or the salaries of council members.

(c) This regulation shall be effective on and after July 1, 2003. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 72-9603; effective July 1, 2003.)

Article 23.—BINGO

**92-23-10. Verification of winners.** The winning numbers on the card or face of each announced winner of each call bingo game shall be verified by the following individuals: (a) At least one other call bingo player unrelated by blood or marriage to either the winning player or the caller of that bingo game; and

(b) one or more of the bingo workers using one of the following methods:

(1) The bingo worker shall call back the winning numbers while the other call bingo player looks at the face or card and verifies that the correct numbers are being called back. The winning numbers shall be called out loud so that the other players present can hear the numbers. The caller shall announce whether the card or face is a winner. In the case of a blackout game, the numbers not selected may be called by the bingo worker and other call bingo player to verify the winners.

(2) The bingo worker shall call out the card or face number while the other call bingo player verifies that the correct card or face number was called. The caller shall type the card or face number into the bingo machine with an electronic verifier and announce the bingo machine's response as to whether the card or face is a winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4708; effective May 1, 1985; amended Feb. 22, 2002.)

**92-23-15. Bingo trust accounts.** Each licensee required to establish and use a bingo trust account pursuant to K.S.A. 79-4706, and amendments thereto, shall comply with all of the following:

(a) The bingo trust account name shall include the word "bingo."

(b) Only receipts from the conduct of call and instant bingo games shall be deposited into the trust account. Funds from other sources shall not be deposited in the account.

(c) Cash prizes from call bingo games under \$500 and all prizes from instant bingo games may be paid from the daily gross bingo receipts before depositing these receipts in the bingo trust account, if a detailed written record is kept of the gross receipts, cash prizes paid, and net deposit made to the bingo trust account for the day.

(d) All payments made from the bingo trust account shall be made by check.

(e) Excess funds in the bingo trust account that are not needed for the payment of bingo prizes, taxes, and expenses may be removed from the account by writing a check. These excess funds may be used for any lawful purpose of the organization pursuant to K.S.A. 79-4706, and amendments thereto. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4708; implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4706; effective May 1, 1985; amended Feb. 22, 2002.)

**92-23-16. Cashing of prize checks.** Checks written by licensees for call bingo game prizes of \$500 or more shall not be cashed by any licensee or member of the li-

censed organization, any lessor of the premises, any employee or agent of the lessor, or any other person located upon the premises where the licensee is conducting bingo games. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4708; implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4706; effective May 1, 1986; amended Feb. 22, 2002.)

**92-23-17. Bond required for bingo distributors.** Each distributor shall post a cash bond of \$1,000 at the time of initial registration. A distributor may subsequently be required by the director to increase the cash bond to an amount equal to three times the average monthly tax liability based upon the distributor's sales for the previous 12 months. If a distributor does not have 12 months of tax liability history to use for this calculation, then an estimate of the tax liability may be made by the director based upon the best information available. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4708; implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4704; effective Feb. 22, 2002.)

**92-23-18. Due date of tax return by bingo distributors.** Each distributor shall submit a return and remit the tax due for each month's sale of bingo faces and instant bingo tickets by the 25th day of the month following the month in which the sales were made. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4708; implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4704 and 79-4705; effective Feb. 22, 2002.)

**92-23-19. Bingo; persons selling refreshments or performing janitor work.** A person who is only selling refreshments or providing janitorial services for bingo games shall not be deemed to be participating in the management, conduct, or operation of bingo games. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4708; effective Feb. 22, 2002.)

**92-23-20. Bingo; house rules.** Any licensee may impose restrictions on player eligibility and game procedures through the use of "house rules" if these house rules meet all of the following conditions:

(a) The "house rules" do not conflict with state laws and regulations and local ordinances.

(b) The "house rules" are conspicuously posted at the location where the call bingo cards and instant bingo tickets are sold.

(c) The "house rules" are uniformly and consistently enforced by the licensed organization. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4708; effective Feb. 22, 2002.)

**92-23-21. Bingo; reduction in value of prizes.** Any licensee may make the value of the prize awarded to the winner of any call bingo game contingent upon the number of players participating, if the exact terms of the contingency are posted or announced to all of the players before their purchase of the cards for the game. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4708; effective Feb. 22, 2002.)

**92-23-22. Bingo; limitations on number of games and daily prize limit.** If a licensee's call bingo game program is designed so that, under certain conditions, it could violate the statutory limit on the number of regular or special games per day or the statutory limit on the total prizes awarded in any one day, then the licensee shall

design contingencies to prevent the violations. The licensee shall publicize the terms of these contingencies to the players before their purchase of cards for that day's call bingo games. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4708; effective Feb. 22, 2002.)

**92-23-23. Bingo; procedure for correction if wrong number called.** (a) If a caller calls a number different from what is on the ball or other object selected by chance and this fact is brought to the caller's attention before the prize is awarded for that game, then the mistake shall be corrected by announcing that the correct number will be used rather than the incorrect number.

(1) If this correction results in one or more immediate winners, then the game shall be deemed complete at that point. If it can be determined who would have won first if the mistake had not been made, then the prize or prizes shall be awarded to this winner or these winners. If it cannot be determined which winner would have won first, then the prize or prizes shall be split as equally as possible among the winners.

(2) If this correction does not result in at least one winner, then the game shall be continued until there is a winner.

(b) If a caller calls a number different from what is on the ball or other object selected by chance and this fact is brought to the caller's attention after the prize or prizes have been awarded for that game, then no correction shall be made and the winner or winners shall retain their prize or prizes. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4708; effective Feb. 22, 2002.)

**92-23-25. Bingo; multiple winners.** (a) Before the beginning of the first call bingo game of a session, the licensee shall notify the players of how the licensee intends to pay out the prize for each bingo game of that session if there are multiple winners.

(b) If a bingo player has a winning pattern simultaneously on two or more call bingo cards or faces, then that player shall be treated as a separate winner for each such winning card or face when determining the awarding of the prize or prizes for that game.

(c) If a bingo player has two or more winning patterns simultaneously on the same call bingo card or face, then the licensee may treat the player as a separate winner for each winning pattern when determining the awarding of the prize or prizes for that game only if the licensee has published a house rule to that effect. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4708; implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4706; effective Feb. 22, 2002.)

**92-23-30. Bingo; instant bingo.** (a) Each licensee shall maintain and enforce written procedures to assure that its instant bingo tickets are sold only at the times and places permitted by law.

(b) Each prize for a winning instant bingo ticket shall be paid out to the winner only within the premises designated by the licensee for the conduct of bingo games and only during the time period during which instant bingo tickets may be sold as defined by law.

(c) Once sold, instant bingo tickets shall remain within the premises designated by the licensee for the conduct of bingo games and shall be disposed of by placing them

(continued)

in receptacles provided by the licensee no later than the end of the bingo session. Subsequently, the licensee shall be responsible for arranging for the removal and disposal of the instant bingo tickets, except for winning tickets that the licensee may choose to retain.

(d) An instant bingo game in which the prize is awarded by matching the winning number in a call bingo game shall not be carried over from one bingo session to another. If not all of the tickets from a game have been sold before awarding a prize, then the amount of the prize may be reduced based upon a formula or schedule that has been made known to the players before the commencement of the instant bingo game. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4708; implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4706; effective Feb. 22, 2002.)

**92-23-31. Bingo; use of hard cards commencing July 1, 2003.** Commencing July 1, 2003, a licensee may sell hard cards to, or permit the use of hard cards for the following: (a) Any person who has a mental or physical infirmity of such a nature that it is difficult or impossible for that person to use disposable bingo faces to play call bingo games. If the total receipts from the sale or rental of hard cards to these persons exceed \$100 in any one month, then these receipts shall be subject to the three percent bingo enforcement tax as provided in K.S.A. 79-4704, and amendments thereto; and

(b) any person at a bingo session if the licensee conducts not more than two bingo sessions during the license year. If the total receipts from the sale or rental of hard cards at a session exceed \$1,000, then these receipts shall be subject to the three percent bingo enforcement tax as provided in K.S.A. 79-4704, and amendments thereto. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4706; effective Feb. 22, 2002.)

**92-23-38. Bingo; books and records; inspection and preservation.** (a) Each licensee shall keep and maintain records that are necessary to determine the amount of tax due and to determine that the games of bingo operated or conducted by the licensee are operated or conducted in compliance with the bingo act, K.S.A. 79-4701 *et seq.*, and amendments thereto. The records shall show the following:

- (1) The date and location of each call bingo game conducted;
- (2) the name of the operator or manager who conducted or operated each bingo game;
- (3) the number of regular, special, mini, and progressive call bingo games played daily;
- (4) the value of all prizes awarded for each call bingo game played;
- (5) the value of all other prizes awarded in connection with games of bingo;
- (6) the date that every call bingo prize was awarded;
- (7) the name and address of each winner of a call bingo game in which the prize awarded was more than \$100 in value, and of all winners of prizes in disputed bingo games. A prize shall not be awarded to any individual who refuses to give the individual's name and address to a licensee in compliance with this regulation;
- (8) the daily total of receipts received by the licensee for admission, charges for participation, and any other

charges in connection with games of bingo, with separate totals for call bingo and instant bingo;

(9) the number of players present each day that bingo games are conducted.

(10) for each progressive call bingo game, the winning and consolation prizes offered and the number of bingo balls required to win each of these prizes; and

(11) the occurrence of any drawing conducted during each session and, if any drawing occurred, a description of the prize awarded and its fair market value.

(b) All books and records required by subsection (a) shall be preserved for a period of three years following the date on which the game to which they pertain was managed, operated, or conducted.

(c) All books and records maintained in compliance with this regulation shall be available for, and subject to, inspection by the director of taxation or the director's authorized agents and employees at a location previously designated by the licensee. The books and records shall be subject to inspection at any reasonable time. The books and records for the preceding four months shall be available for inspection without advance notice at all times that the licensee is operating or conducting games of bingo.

(d) Each licensee shall provide all information, tax returns, and records regarding or related to the operation, management, or conduct of bingo games that is requested by the department of revenue. Failure to provide all requested information shall constitute grounds for revocation of a bingo license. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4708; implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4706; effective, E-77-49, Sept. 30, 1976; effective Feb. 15, 1977; amended, E-81-27, Sept. 10, 1980; amended May 1, 1981; amended May 1, 1985; amended May 1, 1986; amended Feb. 27, 2002.)

**92-23-38a. Disputed bingo game.** (a) "Disputed bingo game" shall mean a game of bingo at which a participant or observer registers a complaint with a representative who is operating, conducting, or managing bingo games for a licensee. If the participant is not satisfied with the manner in which the complaint is handled, then the participant or observer may file a written complaint with the administrator of charitable gaming.

(b) Each bingo licensee shall, on the premises at which bingo games are played, post in plain view of the participants the address where bingo complaints may be filed. The address shall be provided to each licensee by the Kansas department of revenue. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4708; implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4706 and 79-4708; effective, E-81-27, Sept. 10, 1980; effective May 1, 1981; amended May 1, 1985; amended Feb. 22, 2002.)

**92-23-40. Advertising.** Each advertisement of any bingo game shall include the full name of the organization licensed to conduct the bingo game. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4708; implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-4706; effective, E-80-12, Aug. 8, 1979; effective May 1, 1980; amended Feb. 22, 2002.)

(b) The "play symbols" and "play symbol captions" for this game are as follows:
