Attorney General**Notice of Available Grant Funding**

Grant funds are available from the State Crime Victims' Assistance Fund Child Abuse and Neglect Grant Program for fiscal year 2003. The purpose of this grant program is to provide funds for ongoing operating expenses of programs including court-appointed special advocate programs providing: (1) temporary emergency shelter for victims of child abuse and neglect; (2) counseling and assistance to those child victims; or (3) educational services directed at reducing the incidence of child abuse and neglect and diminishing its impact on the victim.

Available funds may be awarded to eligible applicants who meet the following requirements: (1) meet the requirements of Section 501 (c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986; (2) are duly registered and in good standing with the office of the Secretary of State as a not-for-profit corporation; (3) meet normally accepted standards for not-for-profit organizations; (4) have trustees or board of directors who represent the racial, ethnic and socioeconomic diversity of the county or counties served; (5) have received 50 percent or more of their funds from sources other than funds distributed through this fund (other sources may be public or private and may include contributions of goods or services, including materials, commodities, transportation, office space or other types of facilities or personal services); (6) demonstrate ability to successfully administer programs that meet the criteria defined above; (7) make available an independent certified audit of the previous year's financial records; (8) have obtained appropriate licensing or certification, or both; (9) serve a significant number of residents of the county or counties served; and (10) do not unnecessarily duplicate services already adequately provided to county residents (K.S.A. 2001 Supp. 74-7334(d)).

Each eligible applicant must receive 50 percent or more of its agency budget from sources other than funds distributed through this fund.

Administrative Regulations**

The Kansas State Board of Pharmacy will conduct a public hearing at 9 a.m. Tuesday, April 30, at the AmeriSuites meeting room, 6021 S.W. 6th Ave., Topeka, to consider changes in and adoption of proposed rules and regulations of the Board of Pharmacy. A regular meeting of the board will follow on May 1.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Susan A. Linn, Executive Director, State Board of Pharmacy, Room 513, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612-1231. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their view, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Susan A. The regulations are proposed for changes and adoption on a permanent basis. A brief summary of the proposed regulations and economic impact follows.

K.A.R. 68-1-1a. Application for registrations or permits. This regulation is being amended as substantive provisions are already contained in the Pharmacy Act.

K.A.R. 68-1-2a. Pharmacist-in-charge examination. The amended regulation specifies that the pharmacist is not required to retake the pharmacist-in-charge examination each time he or she assumes a new pharmacist-in-charge position. The amended regulation further requires the pharmacist-in-charge to acknowledge an understanding of the pharmacy law and the added responsibilities of being the pharmacist-in-charge.

K.A.R. 68-1-3a. Qualifying pharmaceutical experience. This amended regulation is needed to define the meaning of one year of pharmaceutical experience acceptable to the board; however, other sections of the regulation are no longer needed.

Notice to Private Activity Bond Applicants

Applications for allocation of 2002 Private Activity Bond (PAB) authority are now being accepted for qualified uses, as defined by the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, and amendments thereto.

The State of Kansas is projected to receive \$225,000,000 of federal authority for the issuance of PABs in calendar year 2002. Historically, the primary uses of this federal authority have included "qualified small issue bonds" used for construction and equipping of manufacturing facilities and beginning farmer programs; "exempt facility bonds" used by for-profit entities providing a public benefit, i.e., certain waste treatment facilities, qualified residential rental facilities, etc.; and "qualified mortgage bonds" issued to benefit first-time homebuyers. Allocations awarded by the Secretary of Commerce and Housing are subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 74-5060 et seq. and the limitations of the state volume cap.

Fees associated with PAB application and issuance are as follows:

(1) Application fee—A nonrefundable fee must accompany the application before the request can be processed. The application fee is determined as follows:

- \$250 for allocation requests up to \$5,000,000
• \$500 for allocation requests from \$5,000,001 to \$10,000,000
• \$1,000 for allocation requests of \$10,000,001 and above

(2) Issuance Fee—An issuance fee for allocation amounts utilized, other than "Qualified Mortgage Bonds" issued, shall be due and payable to the Kansas Department of Commerce and Housing at bond closing. Issuance fees shall be determined as follows:

"Qualified Mortgage Bond" programs will be assessed a fee, upon issuance of each mortgage loan assisted through the program, equal to .5% of the PAB allocation used.

Issuance fees shall be remitted within 30 days of bond closing. Checks for both the application and issuance fees should be made payable to the Kansas Department of Commerce and Housing Bond Fee Fund.

Notice of Septic Tank Design and Construction Standards

New design and construction standards for septic tanks installed in Kansas are effective July 1, 2002. All septic tanks installed on or after July 1, 2002, shall meet these standards.

Manufacturers marketing septic tanks in Kansas are asked to provide the Kansas Department of Health and Environment a certification that their septic tanks meet the Kansas specifications. The Kansas specifications are found on pages 7 through 9 of Bulletin 4-2, Minimum Standards for Design and Construction of Onsite Wastewater Systems, published March, 1997. KDHE is keeping a list of manufacturers that have certified their tanks meet the new requirements. In providing this certification, manufacturers are encouraged to confer with a licensed professional engineer. Manufacturers also are encouraged to include design plans and any special installation requirements with the certification statement. This information should be sent to the Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Bureau of Water - Watershed Management Section, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 420, Topeka, 66612-1367.

The bid form must be accompanied by a bidder's bond in the amount of at least 5 percent of the bid amount or a certified check payable to the watershed district in the amount of not less than 5 percent of the bid amount. After notification of award, the bond or check will be retained by the district as liquidated damages if within 10 days the successful bidder refuses or fails to enter into an agreement and furnish a performance bond, payment bond and proof of insurance in accordance with this bid. Any unsuccessful bidder will have the certified check returned. No bids may be withdrawn after the closing time for receipt of bids.

The successful bidder will be required to execute a formal contract and furnish performance and payment bonds in amounts of 100 percent each of the total amount of the contract.

Amendments to invitations for bids shall be identified as such and shall require that the bidder acknowledge receipt of all amendments issued. The amendment shall reference the portions of the invitation for bids it amends. Amendments shall, if possible, be distributed within a reasonable time to allow prospective bidders to consider them in preparing their bids before the date set for the bid opening. If the contracting officer finds that such conditions do materially so differ and cause an increase or decrease in part of the work, an equitable adjustment shall be made and the contract modified in writing accordingly.

Article 24.—MORTGAGE BUSINESS

17-24-3. Continuing education; requirements; waiver. (a) Each individual required to register as a loan originator pursuant to the Kansas mortgage business act, K.S.A. 9-2201 et seq. and amendments thereto, shall annually complete at least eight hours of approved continuing professional education (CPE) as a condition of registration renewal.

(b) Each CPE course shall first be approved by the office of the state bank commissioner (OSBC), or its designee, before granting CPE credit.

(c) CPE courses shall focus on issues of mortgage business, as defined by K.S.A. 9-2201 and amendments thereto, or related industry topics.

(d) One CPE hour shall consist of at least 50 minutes of approved instruction.

(e) Each request for CPE course approval shall be submitted on a form provided by the OSBC. A request for CPE course approval may be submitted by any person, as defined by K.S.A. 9-2201 and amendments thereto.

(f) Evidence of satisfactory completion of approved CPE courses shall be submitted on forms provided by the OSBC. The form may be submitted by the registrant seeking CPE credit or the entity sponsoring the CPE course. Each registrant shall be ultimately responsible for ensuring that CPE credit has been properly submitted to the

OSBC and shall maintain verification records in the form of completion certificates or other documents supporting evidence of attendance at approved CPE courses.

(g) Each CPE year shall begin on the first day of October each year and shall end on the 30th day of September the following year.

(h) Continuing professional education hours shall not be carried forward from one year to the next year, except that for the CPE year beginning October 1, 2001, up to eight hours of approved CPE taken in the preceding 10 months may be carried forward for that CPE year.

(i) Each registrant issued a certificate of registration on or after the first day of July of any year shall have until the 30th day of September the following year to comply with annual CPE requirements.

(j) Each registrant who fails to renew the registrant's certificate of registration, in accordance with K.S.A. 9-2205 and amendments thereto, shall obtain all delinquent CPE before receiving a new certificate of registration, unless the new certificate of registration is issued on or after the first day of July following the lapse of the prior certificate of registration.

(k) The requirement for completion of CPE may be waived, or the deadline for completion may be extended, by the OSBC under either of the following circumstances:

(1) The registrant is called to active duty in the armed forces of the United States for a period of time exceeding 120 consecutive days in any CPE year.

(2) The registrant experiences physical disability, illness, or any extenuating circumstances that prevents successful completion of CPE. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 9-2209, as amended by L. 2001, Ch. 88, § 10; effective March 1, 2002.)
