Executive Order 01-05 Assistance to State Employees Reporting for Military Duty

WHEREAS, the State of Kansas recognizes that the military response to the terrorist attack on the United States of America on September 11, 2001 has resulted in activation of military personnel from reserve and National Guard units; and

WHEREAS, employees of the State of Kansas may be among those who are called or volunteer to serve our country; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate for the State of Kansas, as an employer of citizens who may be called or volunteer for active duty, to take steps to accommodate the employees who will be serving our country;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor and chief executive of the State of Kansas, I hereby propose that the Secretary of Administration prepare necessary personnel regulations, policies or procedures to assist state employees who are called or volunteer for active military service. Such regulations, policies or procedures shall include provisions for job protection; advance payment of wages, earned compensatory time and accrued vacation leave earned prior to being called to active duty; length of service continuation; group health insurance continuation and other benefits provisions.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order 01-05 and shall be effective immediately.

Executive Order No. 01-06

Designation of the Workforce Network of Kansas Board as the State Workforce Investment Board

WHEREAS, The Workforce Investment Act of 1998, 29 U.S.C. Sec. 2801 et seq., calls for the Governor to establish a State Workforce Investment Board, and the Act provides for the designation of any established State entity in existence on December 31, 1997 (including a State council, State workforce development board, or combination of regional boards) as the State workforce investment board [29 U.S.C. Sec. 2821 (a) & (e)]; and

WHEREAS, The Kansas Workforce Investment Partnership created through Executive Orders 99-6 and 96-3 fulfills the requirements of the Workforce Investment Act of 1998, 29 U.S.C. Sec. 2801 et seq.;

WHEREAS, The Kansas Workforce Investment Partnership was established to increase the effectiveness of the training and employment system through combined boards and enhanced cooperation and collaboration among stakeholders at the local and State levels;

WHEREAS, A multi-partner, multi-component system exists within Kansas comprised of Local Workforce Investment Area boards, Kansas state agencies, multi-service centers, single service centers, community based organizations and electronic job matching; and

WHEREAS, These individual components have valid and important missions which can be enhanced through continued cooperation and collaboration; and

WHEREAS, Benefits to the several components will be realized through identification as a partner within a system; and

WHEREAS, The Kansas Workforce Investment Partnership in its advisory capacity to such a system, has chosen the name of Workforce Network of Kansas to identify such a multi-partner, multi-component system;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby change the name of the Kansas Workforce Investment Partnership, created through Executive Order 96-3, to the Workforce Network of Kansas Board and designate the Workforce Network of Kansas Board as the State workforce investment board as set forth in 29 U.S.C. Sec. 2821 (a) & (c).

- (1) *Membership*. The membership provisions of Executive Order No. 96-3 and 99-6 shall remain in full force and effect and are:
- (a) Membership of the Workforce Network of Kansas Board shall be by official commission of appointment by the Governor, certified by and filed with the Secretary of State.
- (b) The membership shall be composed of such representatives as may be required by applicable federal or state law, including members from each of the following sectors:
 - (i) state government;
 - (ii) local units of government;
 - (iii) education;
 - (iv) private sector businesses;
 - (v) labor;
 - (vi) community-based organizations; and
 - (vii) the general public.
- (c) Consistent with federal law, the Governor may appoint ad hoc non-voting members to the Workforce Network of Kansas Board.
- (d) The Chairperson of the Workforce Network of Kansas Board shall be a member representing the private sector and appointed by the Governor by official commission of appointment of the Governor, certified by and filed with the Secretary of State. The Chairperson shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor. A Vice-chairperson shall also be appointed by the Governor by official commission of appointment of the Governor, certified by and filed with the Secretary of State, and shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor.
- (e) The Workforce Network of Kansas Board shall meet upon the call of the chairperson as necessary to carry out its duties under this Executive Order.
- (2) Compensation. Members of the Workforce Network of Kansas Board shall receive no compensation. To the

extent permitted by law, the Workforce Investment Act, and the School-to-Work and One-Stop Career Center grants, members of the Workforce Network of Kansas Board shall receive subsistence allowances, mileage, and expense reimbursements as provided in K.S.A. 75-3223 and amendments thereto for travel to and attendance at official meetings of the Workforce Network of Kansas Board. The subsistence allowances, mileage and expense reimbursements shall be paid from available appropriations of the Kansas Department of Human Resources, except that expenses of state agency representatives shall be paid by the agencies represented.

- (3) Duties. The duties of the Workforce Network of Kansas Board shall be to provide information to the Governor, Legislature, appropriate public and private agencies and the public on matters pertaining to employment and training programs, services and facilities, serve as a reviewing board for employment and training program implementation plans, serve as the advisory board to the Workforce Network of Kansas, and to assist the Governor in:
 - (a) Development of the State plan;
- (b) Development and continuous improvement of a seamless, collaborative, universally accessible "statewide workforce investment system";
- (c) Development of linkages to assure coordination and non-duplication of employment and training services:
 - (d) Designation of local areas;
- (e) Establishment of criteria for use by local elected officials in appointing members of local workforce investment boards;
 - (f) Review of local area plans;
- (g) Development of allocation formulas for distribution of funds for adult and youth employment and training activities to local areas;
- (h) Development and continuous improvement of comprehensive State performance measures;
- (i) Preparation of annual reports to the U.S. Secretary of Labor;
- (j) Development of the statewide employment statistics system described in the Wagner-Peyser Act;
- (k) Development of applications for incentive grants under Workforce Investment Partnership (WIA), successive legislation, and other applicable federal programs; and
- (l) Performing any additional duties as may be required by current and future applicable employment and training federal laws and amendments thereto.

Any provision of Executive Order 96-3 or Executive Order 99-6 inconsistent with the provisions provided above is hereby rescinded.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 01-06 and shall become effective immediately.

Executive Order 01-07

WHEREAS, the Kansas Bureau of Investigation and the Kansas City, Kansas Police Department are investigating the disappearance of Star Boomer; and

WHEREAS, circumstances of Ms. Boomer's disappearance strongly suggest that she has been a victim of foul play; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Boomer disappeared from a bar called "Uncle Mike's," located at 49th and Metropolitan, Kansas City, Kansas, during the evening hours on or about February 23, 1999; and

WHEREAS, according to witnesses, Ms. Boomer was involved in an altercation with a man who has been a lifelong criminal with a long history of violent criminal behavior, particularly towards women. At one point during the altercation, Ms. Boomer allegedly was knocked to the ground causing her to lose consciousness; and

WHEREAS, patrons of Uncle Mike's Bar who were present that evening have been generally unwilling to provide helpful information. It is also believed that many of the patrons are frightened of this man; and

WHEREAS, due to the passage of time since the homicide and the current status of the investigation, the offer of a reward may enhance the investigative efforts of the Kansas City, Kansas Police Department and the Kansas Bureau of Investigation in the investigation of the crime; and

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of authority vested in me by K.S.A. 75-113, I, Bill Graves, Governor of the State of Kansas, do hereby offer a reward of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the individual or individuals responsible for the disappearance of Star Boomer.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Tuesday, April 30, in Room 108, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed rules and regulations of the Department of Administration, Division of Personnel Services, on a permanent basis.

This 60-day notice of public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Secretary of Administration, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 500, Topeka, 66612-1300. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Faith Loretto at (785) 296-6000 or TTY (785) 296-4798. The north entrance to the Landon State Office Building is accessible. Handicapped parking is located at the south end of building, across the street from the north entrance to the building, and on Ninth Street just around the corner from the north entrance.

Summaries of the proposed regulations follow. Except as noted below, the proposed regulations are not expected to have any significant economic impact on the Department of Administration, other state agencies, state employees or the general public.

K.A.R. 1-2-31. Demotion. The proposed amendment will clarify that the demotion of an employee is either a disciplinary action taken under K.A.R. 1-10-6 or a voluntary action agreed to by the employee. The proposed

language is consistent with existing application of the regulation.

K.A.R. 1-2-42. Exempt employee; K.A.R. 1-2-42a. Nonexempt employee. The amendments proposed to these regulations will partially decentralize the authority to determine the exempt or nonexempt status of positions by allowing an appointing authority with delegated authority under K.S.A. 75-2938 to make these Fair Labor Standards Act determinations for positions in that agency.

K.A.R. 1-2-48. Limited term position; K.A.R. 1-6-26a. Limited term position. K.A.R. 1-2-48 is being revoked, and the content of the regulation is being relocated to a new regulation in Article 6 because that article relates to recruiting and staffing.

K.A.R. 1-5-22. Payment for two or more positions. The proposed amendment to subsection (b) clarifies that only regular positions are considered when determining benefit eligibility for employees holding multiple part-time positions. The proposed amendment to subsection (c) is a clarification that classified exempt employees may hold one or more additional unclassified exempt positions teaching or conducting research at a state educational institution without limit on total pay. Currently the regulation does not specify that both the classified and unclassified positions must be exempt. This clarification may have an economic impact on any employee in a classified, nonexempt position who might have been considered for an unclassified teaching or research position.

K.A.R. 1-5-29. Longevity bonus pay. This regulation is being amended to coincide with K.S.A. 75-5541, which does not require 12 months of satisfactory service as a condition for longevity bonuses. This amendment could have an economic impact on state agencies and a limited number of state employees if it increases the number of employees who are eligible to receive a longevity bonus.

K.A.R. 1-6-3. Filling vacancies. The proposed amendment to subsection (b) of this regulation will allow applicants who expect to complete a degree requirement for a class or position by the end of the current academic term to be certified to the pool of eligible candidates for the class or position and be extended a conditional offer of employment. The degree requirement must be met at the time of hire. Currently, to be certified to the pool of eligible candidates, the applicant must already meet the degree requirement, and therefore, there may be a positive economic impact on those applicants who are close to completing their degree requirements.

K.A.R. 1-6-21. Candidate pools for regular positions. Proposed amendments to this regulation allow the same pool of candidates to be used for two vacant positions that are in the same class and have substantially the same duties. The applicant for the second position must be hired within 30 days of the establishment of the eligible list for the first position. This amendment should have a positive economic impact on state agencies and applicants for vacant positions as it provides a more efficient hiring process.

K.A.R. 1-9-4. Vacations. The proposed amendment to subsection (a)(2) will allow for up to 40 hours of any accrued vacation leave over the maximum accumulation of hours at the end of the last payroll period paid in each fiscal year to be converted to sick leave. This provision

will have a positive economic impact on employees who accrue additional sick leave in this fashion. Because employees are paid for a portion of accumulated sick leave upon retiring, this amendment also may have a positive economic impact on retiring state employees and an economic impact on the sick leave reserve fund to the extent that employees do not use the additional sick leave accrued due to the conversion of vacation leave.

K.A.R. 1-9-5. Sick leave. The proposed amendment to subsection (d) partially decentralizes the authority to require a medical examination of an employee as a condition for approval of use of sick leave. Under the existing regulation, the director of Personnel Services must approve each instance in which a medical examination is required for this purpose. Under the proposed amendment, those appointing authorities with delegated authority under K.S.A. 75-2938 would be authorized to require such a medical examination for that agency's employees without obtaining the approval of the director.

K.A.R. 1-9-7b. Military leave; voluntary or involuntary service with reserve component of the armed forces. The proposed amendment to subsection (a)(1) will allow the director of Personnel Services to grant certain exceptions to the maximum of 12 working days of leave with pay per calendar year granted for military leave with pay for active duty for training purposes. For the good of state service, an employee may be granted more than 12 working days of leave with pay due to any conflict created because the 12 days of leave are based on the calendar year while active duty for training purposes is based on the federal fiscal year. This exception may provide more paid leave to certain employees under limited circumstances, and the employing agency will bear any associated costs.

K.A.R. 1-11-1. Resignation. The amendment to subsection (c) of this regulation partially decentralizes the process for terminating an employee based on a presumed resignation. Those appointing authorities who have delegated authority under K.S.A. 75-2938 would no longer be required to submit to the director of Personnel Services a summary of steps taken to obtain an explanation from the employee regarding the employee's unauthorized absence

K.A.R. 1-14-12a. Special provisions for employees affected by institution closings; global notice of layoff; right of first refusal, eligible pools, and interview procedures; accrued sick leave payout; health care coverage; extended death benefit coverage; and severance pay. This regulation is being revoked. The provisions of this regulation were designed specifically for the closure of Topeka State Hospital and Winfield State Hospital.

Article 7.—MOVEMENT OF LIVESTOCK INTO OR THROUGH KANSAS

- **9-7-19.** Equine passport. (a)(1) For the purposes of these regulations, the term "equidae" shall have the meaning in K.A.R. 9-7-14.
- (2) "Equine passport" means a document issued by a veterinarian licensed and accredited in the state of origin and written on a form approved by and bearing a certificate number issued by the animal health regulatory agency in the state of origin. This passport shall individually identify an equidae, show the date of a negative EIA test conducted on that equidae at an approved laboratory within the preceding six months, and provide the information specified below in subsections (b) and (c).
 - (3) "EĪA test" means an equine infectious anemia test.
- (b) Each equidae entering Kansas on an equine passport shall be identified by name and shall be further identified on the passport by the designation of one of the following:
 - (1) A description of any brands;
 - (2) a description of a lip tattoo;
- (3) a statement that a microchip is present, with the brand name and location of the microchip written on the passport; or
- (4) any alternate method of designation approved by the livestock commissioner.
- (c) The following information shall appear on the equine passport:
- (1) A description of the equidae that includes its age, breed, color, and sex, as well as any marks that help identify the equidae;
 - (2) the date of the EIA test used for validation;
 - (3) the type of test utilized;
 - (4) the test results;
 - (5) the name of the testing laboratory; and
 - (6) the laboratory accession number.

- (d) Each equine passport shall be accompanied by a valid, completed "equine infectious anemia laboratory test" report on USDA veterinary services form VS 10-11T. The equidae shall be identified on the report in the same manner as on the equine passport.
- (e) In order for an equidae passport to be valid in Kansas, the veterinarian who issued the equidae passport in another state shall have verified the following:
- (1) That the equidae listed on the VS 10-11T form is the same equidae listed on the equine passport, based on one of the methods of identification described in subsection (b); and
- (2) that the equidae listed on the equine passport was examined on the date of issuance and found to be free from evidence of contagious, infectious, or communicable disease.
- (f)(1) Each inspecting veterinarian who determines that an equidae originating in Kansas is eligible for an equine passport shall complete the passport form, including the EIA test results. The inspecting veterinarian then shall contact the department to obtain a passport certification number, validation date, and expiration date, which shall be recorded by the veterinarian on the equine passport.
- (2) The white copy of the completed equine passport form and the related EIA test information for equidae originating from Kansas shall be submitted to the department within 48 hours of issuance of the passport certification number and validation date.
- (3) The equidae owner shall be provided by the inspecting veterinarian with itinerary forms at the time the equine passport is issued. The itinerary forms shall be completed and returned to the department with the next application for an equine passport for that equidae. Additional equine passports shall not be issued for the identified equidae until the completed itinerary forms have been received by the department.
- (g)(1) Except as provided in paragraph (g)(2), each equine passport shall remain in effect for six months from the date of the EIA test listed on the passport.
- (2) Any equine passport issued in the state of Kansas may be suspended or revoked at any time due to a disease outbreak or another similar factor by the livestock commissioner. Any equidae with an equine passport issued in another state may be prohibited by the livestock commissioner from entering the state if the livestock commissioner determines that a disease outbreak or similar factor in the equidae's state of origin warrants such an action.
- (h) Equine passports shall not apply to equidae imported into the state of Kansas for the purpose of parimutuel racing. (Authorized by K.S.A. 47-607, K.S.A. 47-607d, and K.S.A. 47-610; implementing K.S.A. 47-607 and K.S.A. 47-610; effective, T-9-5-31-01, May 31, 2001; effective March 15, 2002.)
