The Sunflower Foundation: *Health Care for Kansans* announces its first Request for Proposals (RFP) and funding guidelines on March 15. All proposals must be received at the foundation's offices, P.O. Box 1454, Topeka, 66601-1454, not later than 4 p.m. Monday, April 15. Awards will be announced on or before Friday, June 28.

To achieve greater impact with its resources, the foundation has identified priority areas in which to direct initial funding. This will be accomplished through both the RFP process and through foundation-directed initiatives. The first cycle grants are expected to be awarded in the range of \$10,000 to \$150,000. As a developing organization, the foundation intends to begin funding with short-term projects of one year or less; multiple year requests will be considered on a limited basis.

Wildlife and Parks Commission

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted by the Wildlife and Parks Commission at 7 p.m. Thursday, April 18, at the Best Western Hospitality House, 3021 W. Highway 50, Emporia, to consider the approval and adoption of proposed exempt regulations of the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks.

A workshop meeting on business of the Wildlife and Parks Commission will begin at 1:30 p.m. April 18 at the same location. The meeting will recess at 5 p.m., then resume at 7 p.m. at the same location for the regulatory hearing. There will be public comment periods at the beginning of the afternoon and evening meetings for any issues not on the agenda, and additional comment periods will be available during the meeting on agenda items. Old and new business also may be discussed at this time. If necessary to complete the hearing or other business matters, the commission will reconvene at 9 a.m. April 19 at the same location.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Sheila Kemmis, commission secretary, at (620) 672-5911. Persons with a hearing impairment may call the TDD service at 1-800-766-3777 to request special accommodations.

This 30-day notice period prior to the hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on proposed exempt regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the chairman of the commission, Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks, Suite 502, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity at the hearing to express their views

orally in regard to the adoption of the proposed regulations. During the hearing, all written and oral comments submitted by interested parties will be considered by the commission as a basis for approving, amending and approving, or rejecting the proposed regulations.

The exempt regulations that will be heard during the regulatory hearing portion of the meeting are as follows:

K.A.R. 115-25-5. This proposed exempt regulation establishes hunting unit boundaries, bag limits, application periods and season dates for the 2002 fall turkey season. The proposed regulation would make three changes. It would revise unit boundaries to match the unit for spring turkey, authorize unlimited archery permits in Unit 1 in northwest Kansas, and allow up to three game tags in Unit 2 in eastern Kansas.

Economic Impact Summary: It is anticipated that a total of over 9,000 fall turkey hunting permits of all types will be issued, which would create approximately \$127,000 in revenue. The department estimates more than 20,000 days of hunting activity would occur, thus providing economic benefit to businesses providing goods and services.

K.A.R. 115-25-7. This proposed exempt regulation establishes hunting units, bag limits, application periods and season dates for the 2002 firearm, muzzleloader and archery antelope seasons. The hunting units are unchanged from the 2001 season. Unlimited archery permits are proposed, and a total of 135 firearms permits and 38 muzzleloader permits are proposed.

Economic Impact Summary: It is anticipated that 300 antelope permits may be authorized, which would generate \$9,000 in revenue. Approximately 750 days of hunting activity may occur, thus providing economic benefit to businesses providing goods and services.

K.A.R. 115-25-8. This proposed exempt regulation establishes hunting units, bag limits, application periods and season dates for the 2002-2003 elk seasons. The regulation would allow elk permits to be used during muzzleloader, archery or firearm season. However, only eight antlerless-only elk permits would be valid for use at a single time on Fort Riley. In addition, unlimited hunt-on-your-own-land antlerless-only elk permits would be authorized off Fort Riley.

Economic Impact Summary: It is estimated that a total of 42 elk permits may be authorized. Estimated revenue if these permits are issued would be approximately \$4,500. Approximately 500 days of hunting activity may occur, thus providing economic benefit to businesses providing goods and services.

Notice Concerning Kansas Water Pollution Control Permits

In accordance with Kansas Administrative Regulations 28-16-57 through 63, 28-18-1 through 15, 28-18a-1 through 32, 28-16-150 through 154, 28-46-7, and the authority vested with the state by the administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, draft permits have been prepared and/or permit applications have been received for discharges to the waters of the United States and the State of Kansas for the class of discharges described below.

The determinations for permit content are based on staff review, applying the appropriate standards, regulations and effluent limitations of the State of Kansas and the EPA, and when issued will result in a State Water Pollution Control Permit and National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Authorization subject to certain conditions.

Kansas Permit No. A-URRA-M002

This is a new permit for an expanding facility that is constructing an additional sedimentation basin and earthen retention structure, and changing the operation from 100 head (140 animal units) of mature dairy cattle to 40 head (40 animal units) of dairy replacement heifers weighing greater than 700 pounds and 140 head (196 animal units) of mature dairy cattle, for a total of 180 head (236 animal units).

Wastewater will be impounded for subsequent application to agricultural land for beneficial use. Wastewater storage capacity is provided that meets or exceeds KDHE minimum requirements.

Soil sampling and analysis shall be conducted on soils from fields determined by the department to be located in a sensitive groundwater area and that have received manure or wastewater within the previous five years.

A public hearing will be conducted by the Kansas Department of Health and Environment at 7 p.m. Wednesday, April 17, in the Paola High School Theater, 401 N. Angela Drive, Paola, to receive comments prior to final action on the proposed issuance of an air quality construction permit. All comments should be presented in oral and/or written form at the public hearing or submitted in writing to Connie Carreno, Bureau of Air and Radiation, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, 66612-1366, by April 26 unless extended by the hearing officer. KDHE is proposing to issue the permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-17, Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD), which adopt the standards, procedures or requirements of 40 CFR 52.21 by reference. The permit authorizes Great Plains Power to install and operate eight simple cycle-combustion turbine generators, eight gas preheaters, eight evaporative coolers, two 1,000,000 gallon fuel oil storage tanks, one 1,000,000 gallon water storage tank, and a carbon dioxide (CO₂) fire protection system at the Paola Generating Station, Section 31, T17S, R23E, in Miami County, Kansas. The facility is owned and operated by Great Plains Power, P.O. Box 418679, Kansas City, MO 64141.

The Paola area is designated as an attainment area under the Clean Air Act, which means that the air quality meets or is better than the national ambient air quality

standards (NAAQS). Any major source or a major modification to a major source has to undergo a preconstruction review as required by the PSD regulations.

The PSD regulations require evaluation of emission reduction techniques to identify the best available control technology (BACT) for each pollutant for which the emission rate exceeds the PSD significant level. The purpose of BACT is to effect the maximum degree of reduction achievable, taking into account energy, environmental and economic impacts for each pollutant under review. Evaluation of the estimated emissions from the proposed Great Plains Power facility indicates that the emission rates of nitrogen oxides (NO_x), sulfur dioxide (SO₂), carbon monoxide (CO), particulate matter (PM), particulate matter less than 10 microns (PM₁₀) and sulfuric acid mist all exceed the significance levels. Great Plains Power conducted the required BACT analyses. KDHE has reviewed Great Plains Power's BACT analyses and concurs with its findings that dry low NO_x burners during natural gas firing and use of water injection when firing No. 2 fuel oil is BACT for NO_x; good combustion practices is BACT for CO; the use of inherently clean natural gas, low sulfur content No. 2 fuel oil and good combustion practices is BACT for SO₂ and sulfuric acid mist; and good combustion practices is BACT for PM and PM₁₀.

The PSD regulations also require an evaluation of the impacts, if any, that emissions from the proposed modifications may have on the ambient air quality, visibility, vegetation and soils. Great Plains Power has conducted the required analyses in accordance with methods approved by the United States Environmental Protection Agency. The results of the analyses conclude that there should be no significant impacts on the ambient air quality, visibility, local vegetation or soils.

Article 14.—LIQUEFIED PETROLEUM FUEL TAX

92-14-4. LP gas withdrawn from a motor vehicle's cargo tank and used to propel the vehicle on public highways. If LP gas from the cargo tank of a motor vehicle is used to propel the vehicle on public highways, the LP-gas user shall maintain an accurate record of the amount of LP gas consumed for highway use, unless taxes have been paid in advance or the vehicle is operating on a mileage basis as provided for by the liquefied petroleum motor fuel tax law, K.S.A. 79-3490 et seq. and amendments thereto. The records that show consumption shall be maintained for three years. If the director finds that the records do not accurately reflect the amount of fuel consumed for highway use, the tax owed shall be computed by the director based on the best evidence available, and the LP-gas dealer or user shall be required by the director to report and pay the tax on a mileage basis in the future. 92-14-5. Records. (a) Each LP-gas dealer shall maintain records showing the receipts from all LP-gas fuel sales and the tax collected thereon for three years. The records shall identify each sale made to an LP-gas permit user and shall include the user's permit number. The records shall document all purchases made by the LP-gas dealer, including those for the dealer's use and for resale.

(b) Each LP-gas user shall maintain records of LP-gas purchases for three years. The records shall include all purchase invoices issued to the purchaser.

(c) Each LP-gas dealer and wholesaler shall, at the time of sale and delivery, issue an invoice to the buyer that contains the following information:

- (1) The date of the sale;
- (2) the names and addresses of the seller and buyer;
- (3) the place of delivery;
- (4) the number of gallons of LP gas sold; and
- (5) if the sale is at retail, the amount of tax collected or the buyer's special LP-gas user permit number. (Authorized by K.S.A. 79-34,102; implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-3491a, as amended by L. 2001, Ch. 5, § 456, K.S.A. 79-3492, 79-3499; effective, E-73-20, July 1, 1973; effective Jan. 1, 1974; amended March 29, 2002.)

92-14-6. Sales of LP gas to special LP-gas permit users; use of special LP-gas permit user decals. (a) Each operator of any motor vehicle that bears a Kansas special permit LP-gas user decal shall either self-report tax on

the use of LP gas on a mileage basis or pay the tax in advance, as provided by K.S.A. 79-3492a through K.S.A. 79-3492c, and amendments thereto. LP-gas dealers who deliver gas into the tanks of vehicles that bear permit decals shall not collect tax on the sales, but shall record the user's permit number and name on the sales invoice.

(b) Except as provided in subsection (c), a motor vehicle that is authorized to operate under a special LP-gas user permit is destroyed, sold, traded or otherwise disposed of before the end of a calendar year, or if for any other reason the permit holder removes the decal from the vehicle, the permit holder shall immediately notify the director of taxation in writing of the nature of the vehicle transfer or the destruction of the decal. Failure to remove a permit decal from a vehicle that has been disposed of and to notify the director shall be grounds for cancellation of the authorization to operate on a mileage basis.

(c) If a permit holder sells a vehicle that is registered for LP-gas purposes to another permit holder or to a person who is applying for a permit, the purchaser may request the transfer of the permit, decal, and all other related rights and obligations to the purchaser. This transfer may be authorized by the director.

(d) If taxes have been paid in advance on a motor vehicle that is destroyed, sold, traded, otherwise disposed of, or converted from LP-gas use before the first of December in any year, the permit holder may apply for a refund of the taxes.

(e) Special LP-gas permit user decals shall be issued on a calendar year basis. The decals shall be placed inside on the lower driver's side of the windshield. (Authorized by K.S.A. 79-34,102; implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-3491a, as amended by L. 2001, Ch. 5, § 456, K.S.A. 79-3492a, K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 79-3492b, K.S.A. 79-3492c, 79-3492d; effective, E-73-20, July 1, 1973; effective Jan. 1, 1974; amended March 29, 2002.)

92-14-7. Special LP-gas permits. In determining if the taxes paid in advance by a special LP-gas permit user are wholly inadequate as provided by K.S.A. 79-3492c and amendments thereto, the taxes paid in advance by other permit holders on similar motor vehicles may be taken into consideration by the director of taxation. (Authorized by K.S.A. 79-34,102; implementing K.S.A. 79-3492c; effective, E-73-20, July 1, 1973; effective Jan. 1, 1974; amended March 29, 2002.)

92-14-8. License applications; bond requirements.

(a) Each individual, partnership, and corporation that applies for a liquefied petroleum gas license shall post a bond equal to its three months' average tax liability. New businesses shall estimate their tax liability for one year and submit a bond in an amount equal to 25 percent of the estimated annual liability, or \$1,000, whichever is greater. A license shall not be granted until the bond requirements are met.

(b) Bond requirements shall be satisfied by surety bonds executed by an approved corporate surety, escrow agreements entered into using department forms, or cash bonds posted with the department.

(c) The bond requirement may be reduced by the director to \$1,000 if a certified financial statement indicating a net worth in excess of one year's average tax liability is

submitted. The required bond may be reduced by the director to an amount equal to two months' tax liability, but not less than \$1,000, in consideration of a satisfactory reporting history for the prior 12 months in which there were no returned checks or other delinquencies.

(d) Motor fuel tax bonds and financial statements may be reviewed periodically by the department. An additional bond or a current certified financial statement may be required by the director if the existing bond or net worth shown on the financial statement is less than the current average three months' tax liability. (Authorized by K.S.A. 79-34,102; implementing K.S.A. 79-3496; effective May 1, 1979; amended March 29, 2002.)

92-14-9. Taxation of compressed natural gas; conversion formula. For purposes of converting the amount of compressed natural gas measured in cubic feet to the gallon basis used to tax LP-gas motor fuel tax, 120 cubic feet of compressed natural gas shall equal one gallon. (Authorized by K.S.A. 79-34,102; implementing K.S.A. 79-3490, 79-3492; effective May 1, 1982; amended May 1, 1983; amended March 29, 2002.)

Article 15.—NONRESIDENT CONTRACTORS

92-15-3. Change of name, address, or ownership. Each nonresident contractor shall perform each contract under the same name used to register the contract for purposes of K.S.A. 79-1008 et seq. and amendments thereto, unless the contractor secures and provides the department with a rider to the bond that shows the change of the business name. A rider shall not be used and shall not be accepted by the department if a business changes from operating as one kind of legal entity to another, including from a sole proprietorship to a corporation. Each nonresident contractor shall immediately report any change of name, address, or ownership to the secretary of revenue. (Authorized by K.S.A. 79-1014; implementing K.S.A. 79-1010; effective Jan. 1, 1968; amended March 29, 2002.)

92-15-4. Registration not assignable. The registration of a contract shall not be assigned or transferred to a different legal entity and shall be used only by the person, partnership, corporation, or other legal entity that the registration identifies as the person or entity that is performing the contract. Each assignment or transfer of the contract to a different legal entity, including to a successor entity that operates under the same business name, shall terminate registration of the contract and shall require the new entity to apply for a new registration and secure a new bond. (Authorized by K.S.A. 79-1014; implementing K.S.A. 79-1010; effective Jan. 1, 1968; amended March 29, 2002.)

92-15-8. Bond; release. The bond required under K.S.A. 79-1008 et seq., and amendments thereto, shall be released only after the contract or contracts secured by the bond are fully performed and the secretary of revenue has received the following written releases: (a) A certification from the secretary of human resources that all contributions and interest due from the nonresident contrac-

tor under the employment security law have been paid; and

(b) a certification from the county treasurer of each county where the nonresident contractor performed the contract or contracts under the bond, that all taxes accruing because of the performance of the contract or contracts have been paid, or that no taxes are due. Article 11.—COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS

44-11-111. Definitions. (a) "Active cases" means those cases that have been supervised in a manner that is consistent with contact standards adopted by the secretary.

(b) "Community corrections agency" means the structure that exists or is proposed to exist within a planning unit and that delivers the community corrections services outlined in a comprehensive plan.

(c) "Community corrections grant funds" means funds made available to a planning governing authority by the department of corrections, pursuant to the Kansas community corrections act, K.S.A. 75-5290 et seq. and amendments thereto.

(d) "Comprehensive plan" means the working document developed annually by a local corrections advisory board, setting forth the objectives and services planned for a local community corrections system.

(e) "Corrections advisory board" means a board appointed by a governing authority to develop and oversee a comprehensive plan.

(f) "Governing authority" means any county or group of cooperating counties that has established a local corrections advisory board for the purpose of establishing a community corrections agency.

(g) "Grant year" means the year covered in an annual comprehensive plan. This year shall be deemed to begin at the start of a state fiscal year.

(h) "Line items" means specific components comprising a major budget category.

(i) "Offender fees" means charges for drug and alcohol testing, electronic monitoring services, supervision services, housing in a residential center, and other services and assistance provided by community corrections agencies.

(j) "Program" means an adult intensive supervision program (AISP) or adult residential program (ARES) operated by a community corrections agency.

(k) "Reimbursements" means income generated by community corrections agencies and fees assessed and collected by community corrections agencies in prior fis-

cal years or in the current fiscal year, for expenses incurred.

(l) "Secretary" means the secretary of corrections.

(m) "Service" means a community corrections activity directed by a public or private agency to deliver interventions to offenders and assistance to victims, offenders, or the community.

(n) "Standards" means the minimum requirements of the secretary for the operation and management of community corrections agencies.

(o) "Unexpended funds" means state funds remaining in a program's accounts at the close of a grant year that are not obligated for expenses incurred during that funding period or that have not been approved for expenditure by the secretary beyond the grant year. 44-11-113. Comprehensive plan; comprehensive plan review. (a) The comprehensive plan shall be developed annually by the community corrections agency in collaboration with the corrections advisory board. The plan shall be submitted on or before May 1 as prescribed by the secretary and shall minimally include the following:

- (1) An agency profile;
- (2) signatory approval of the community corrections agency's director, the chairperson of the corrections advisory board, and the governing authority;
- (3) an advisory board membership detail;
- (4) the governing authority membership detail;
- (5) agency outcomes;
- (6) an agency summary of programmatic changes and significant events;
- (7) an organization chart;
- (8) personnel data;
- (9) new position data;
- (10) a description of collaboration that occurred or will occur to identify and address the community's correctional needs;
- (11) a program description, including goals and objectives to be achieved, data elements to be collected, and services to be provided;
- (12) a new service description;
- (13) an explanation of the relationship among the governing authority, corrections advisory board, community corrections director, and the program or programs described in the comprehensive plan;
- (14) a process for the advisory board to monitor the progress of the program or programs described in the plan;
- (15) a timeline for implementation of the plan; and

(16) any other information requested by the secretary in the comprehensive plan form.

(b) A detailed budget, addressing awarded community corrections grant funds and reimbursements maintained and anticipated to be collected or expended or both, and a narrative describing each line item, shall also be submitted annually as prescribed by the secretary.

(c) Each county desiring to establish a community corrections agency shall issue a resolution indicating the same and include a copy of this in its initial comprehensive plan. A county desiring to enter into an interlocal agreement with another county for the provision of community corrections services, as prescribed in K.S.A. 12-2901 through K.S.A. 12-2907 and amendments thereto, shall include an interlocal agreement, approved by the attorney general, in its initial comprehensive plan.

(d) A program review committee shall be appointed by the secretary to review each comprehensive plan. The committee shall make a recommendation to the secretary. The comprehensive plan shall be accepted, rejected, or accepted subject to specified modifications by the secretary. 44-11-119. Local programs. (a) A comprehensive plan may provide for community corrections programs to be administered by public or private agencies. A governing authority may enter into a contractual or other written agreement with a private agency to operate programs identified in the comprehensive plan or to provide specialized services to program participants.

(b) An annual audit of all programs identified in the comprehensive plan shall be conducted by the secretary. The audit may consist of a fiscal audit, standard compliance audit, performance audit, data accuracy audit, or any other type of review prescribed by the secretary.

(c) Each community corrections agency shall submit notice of the date, time, and location of each advisory board meeting to the deputy secretary of community and field services at least one working day before the scheduled meeting. Each community corrections agency shall submit a copy of the minutes of each advisory board meeting to the secretary within 30 working days after each meeting. (Authorized by K.S.A. 75-5294, 75-5296; implementing K.S.A. 75-5295, 75-5296, 75-52,103; effective May 1, 1981; amended Feb. 6, 1989; amended March 29, 2002.)

44-11-120. Cash match for other grant funds. A governing authority, in its comprehensive plan submitted

to the secretary, may propose to use a portion of community corrections grant funds as a cash match for a grant from another source and may use these funds in this manner only if proposed in the plan and approved by the secretary. (Authorized by K.S.A. 75-5294, 75-5296; implementing K.S.A. 75-5295, 75-52,103; effective May 1, 1981; amended March 29, 2002.)

44-11-121. Fiscal management; required reporting. (a) Each governing authority shall designate one person to be responsible for all fiscal matters related to the community corrections grant funds received. This person shall comply with generally accepted accounting principles governing the management of county funds and shall provide information to the corrections advisory board and the secretary on a monthly and quarterly basis as prescribed by the secretary.

(b) A monthly financial status report shall be submitted to the secretary within 20 calendar days after the end of each month as prescribed by the secretary. All reimbursements collected or maintained by the agency or governing authority for the agency shall be reported in the monthly financial status report.

(1) The monthly report shall note any purchases in the amount of \$5,000 or more that occurred in the prior month and shall include documentation of approval of the same by the corrections advisory board and governing authority. Like items whose aggregate purchase price equals or exceeds \$5,000 shall also be subject to disclosure.

(2) The monthly report shall note any bulk payments made for expenses that are incurred in or will be incurred in multiple months.

(c) Each county receiving grant funds shall submit to the secretary a quarterly financial report within 20 calendar days after the end of each calendar quarter as prescribed by the secretary. The governing authority shall certify in the quarterly report that all accounts containing community corrections grant funds have been balanced and reconciled with invoices and receipts.

(d) Each county shall be required to submit a final financial status report to the secretary within 60 calendar days after the end of each state fiscal year. The total amount of unexpended funds for each county receiving grant funds shall be determined by the secretary.

(e) Each county receiving grant funds shall submit to the secretary all portions of its annual financial audit pertaining to community corrections grant funds, including the report's cover letter and any exceptions applicable to community corrections grant funds, in the manner provided by K.S.A. 75-1124, and amendments thereto, within 60 calendar days after receipt by the county.

(f) All reimbursements maintained from current and prior fiscal years, collected, and expended by a community corrections agency shall be included on the monthly financial status report as prescribed by the secretary.

(g) Each community corrections agency shall annually submit to the secretary a plan, approved by the corrections advisory board and governing authority for the use of reimbursements, within 60 calendar days after the end of each state fiscal year. Each change in the plan shall require the prior approval of the corrections advisory

board and governing authority, and the community corrections agency shall send a copy of the approved change to the secretary at least 10 working days before implementation of the approved change.

(h) (1) If a community corrections agency complies with the requirements in subsections (f) and (g) of this regulation, the agency shall retain its reimbursements and use them in accordance with the approved plan.

(2) If a community corrections agency chooses not to comply with the requirements in subsections (f) and (g) of this regulation, all current reimbursements and those carried over from previous years may be deducted by the secretary from the agency's current or future allocations. These deductions shall be placed by the secretary in a special fund designated for community corrections.

(3) Agencies, except those that chose not to comply with the requirements in subsections (f) and (g) during the state fiscal year in question, may apply for these special funds to maintain or enhance current funded services or add new services, or support or enhance agency operations, or any combination of these uses. 44-11-123. Changes in the comprehensive plan and budget. (a) If a community corrections agency wishes to change or deviate from the comprehensive plan or budget during the grant year, it may do so if signatory approval of the corrections advisory board and the governing authority is first obtained. Documentation of signatory approval shall be submitted to the secretary before the change or deviation.

(b) Transfers of funds from the budget of one program to the budget of another program shall require the prior approval of the secretary. The signatory approval of the corrections advisory board and governing authority shall be submitted to the secretary along with a description of and justification for the proposed transfer. 44-11-127. Prohibition of use of state community corrections funds; maintenance and documentation of funds. (a) A governing authority shall not use community corrections grant funds to replace available public or private funding of existing programs.

(b) A governing authority may request community corrections grant funds to continue an existing program that would otherwise cease due to the exhaustion of pub-

lic or private funds that had been specifically allocated to the program as start-up monies with a predetermined termination date.

(c) A governing authority may request community corrections funds to supplement existing public or private funding of an existing program if these community corrections grant funds would enhance services.

(d) State community corrections grants funds shall be maintained in a separate fund.

(e) State community grant funds shall not be expended for services, supplies, equipment, or the payment of rent beyond the grant year in which the services, supplies, equipment, or payments are received or due. Only expenditures incurred within the grant year shall be charged to the community corrections grant.

(f) All community corrections expenditures shall be supported by a receipt or invoice.

(g) State community corrections funds shall not be used to fund depreciation.

(h) State community corrections grant funds shall be expended and obligated for operation and management of programs for adult offenders only. Nothing in this regulation shall prohibit the use of state community corrections grant funds to purchase equipment, supplies, and services shared by programs for adult and juvenile offenders if the use by the adult program is proportionate to the monetary contribution of that program.

(i) State community corrections grant funds shall not be expended and obligated for association memberships for individuals. State community corrections grant funds may be expended and obligated by community corrections agencies for staff uniforms or clothing and association memberships for the agency if specifically authorized by the agency's policies and procedures. Nothing in this regulation shall prohibit housing, transportation, clothing, and billing assistance to indigent offenders, or the acquisition of necessary safety equipment for staff, including bulletproof vests and latex gloves. (Authorized by K.S.A. 75-5294; implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 75-5291, K.S.A. 75-5296, 75-52,103, 75-52,105; effective, E-82-25, Dec. 16, 1981; effective May 1, 1982; amended March 29, 2002.)

44-11-129. Unexpended funds. Unexpended funds may be transferred by the secretary to another county or counties. Any county may make application to the secretary for the unexpended funds. The county shall provide the secretary with a statement of why the funds are necessary, documentation of need, a budget narrative describing the proposed services, and, if the funds are for a new program, a listing of measurable goals and objectives. The county shall be notified by the secretary of approval or disapproval of the application within 60 calendar days after receipt of the request. (Authorized by K.S.A. 75-5294; implementing K.S.A. 75-52,103; effective Feb. 6, 1989; amended March 5, 1990; amended March 29, 2002.)

44-11-130. Use of grant funds for real estate acquisition and capital construction; use of grant funds for the purchase of property and supplies. (a) Real estate acquisition and capital construction.

(1) Grant funds may be used for the purchase of real estate, land, or buildings, or for capital construction with the approval of the secretary of corrections. This approval may be granted only upon receipt and concurrence by the secretary of an amortization schedule covering the costs of purchase or construction, or both. The amortization schedule shall be such that the annual payments shall not exceed the cost of rent or lease payments for comparable space in the same market. Notification of completion of the acquisition or capital construction shall be filed by the program director in writing with the secretary. The prior approval of the secretary shall be required to cease use of the property for community corrections purposes. If the property ceases to be used for community corrections purposes during the period of amortization, the secretary shall have the option of either of the following:

(A) Requiring the county to refund the total amount of community corrections funds expended for purchase or construction, or both, to date including previous years; or

(B) assuming any remaining indebtedness and acquiring title to the property.

(2) Once the amortization period is completed, if the secretary has not exercised either option described above, title shall rest with the county, and any claim to the property shall be relinquished by the secretary. At no time shall the department of corrections or the state of Kansas be responsible for indebtedness for these transactions except as provided under paragraph (a)(1)(B).

(3) The governing authority shall not charge rent to a community corrections agency for lease of real estate acquired with state community corrections funds, unless only a portion of the real estate was purchased with state community corrections funds. If only a portion of the real estate was acquired using community corrections funds, any rent charged to a community corrections agency shall be commensurate with space occupied by the community corrections agency and the percentage of real estate not paid by state community corrections. Nothing in these regulations shall prevent a governing authority for charging a community corrections agency for maintenance and utilities for real estate purchased with state community corrections funds.

(b) Purchase of property and supplies.

(1) State community corrections grant funds may be used to purchase property with an expected service life of one year or more. Property and supplies purchased with community corrections grant funds shall remain with the community corrections program for its use. An inventory shall be maintained of all property purchases at a cost of \$1,000.00 or more as prescribed by the secretary, including amortization amounts of real estate purchases, renovations, and capital improvements. If property is acquired using more than one funding source, the amount of each contribution and the source of the contribution shall be recorded on the agency's inventory.

(2) If a community correction program ceases using property or supplies for community corrections purposes and the property and supplies have an aggregate value of over \$75.00, the community corrections agency shall have the option of one of the following:

(A) Transferring the property or supplies to the county and requiring the county to refund to the community corrections agency or state, if the agency has ceased operations, the fair market value of the property;

(B) transferring the property or supplies to the state; or

(C) selling the property or supplies and receiving compensation, in cash, services, or goods, in the amount of the fair market value of the property.

(3) Transfers of property or aggregate supplies purchased for over \$1,000 shall require prior notice to the secretary. All funds received by a community corrections agency as a result of property disposal shall be used as an offset to the expenses in that line item in the agency's current fiscal year budget.

(4) If a community correction program ceases using for community corrections purposes any property or supplies that have an aggregate value of \$75.00 or less, the property shall be deleted from the agency's inventory as unusable, and the agency shall adhere to local county policy to dispose of the property or supplies. Such property or supplies may be transferred to the inventory of a non-profit agency.

(5) If a community corrections program with property or supplies acquired by using funds from multiple funding sources ceases using the property or supplies or disbands to form more than one program, the value of the property and supplies in proportion to the contribution to its purchase price by community corrections grant funds, minimally, shall be the value retained by the agency, through sale, reimbursement by the other fund, or trade or barter. (Authorized by K.S.A. 75-5294, 75-5296; implementing K.S.A. 2000 Supp. 75-5291, K.S.A. 75-5296; effective March 5, 1990; amended March 29, 2002.)

44-11-131. Use of grant funds for remodeling or renovation. (a) Grant funds may be used to remodel or renovate space for community corrections use. Any remodeling or renovation with an aggregate cost of \$5,000 or more shall require the prior approval of the secretary. This space may be rented, leased, or owned by the county. Plans detailing the nature and cost of the renovation or remodeling shall be provided to the secretary at the time funds are requested for that purpose. Notification of completion of the renovation or remodeling shall be filed by the program director in writing with the secretary within 30 calendar days of completion of the work. Within 30 calendar days, completion of the work shall be verified by the secretary.

(b) If the renovated or remodeled property ceases to be used for community corrections purposes for reasons other than fire, flood, or other such occurrences that render the property unusable or continued use financially impractical, within five years of the date on which the secretary verified completion of the work, the county or counties shall immediately notify the secretary of the same and shall refund the amount expended for remodeling or renovation, or both.

(c) Leases that include renovation or remodeling costs shall clearly delineate those costs from basic space costs. A copy of the lease shall be provided to the secretary upon execution. Community corrections agencies shall be

required to amortize over the period of the lease, not to exceed five years, the value of remodeling and renovations. The amortized value shall be noted in the agency's property inventory. (Authorized by K.S.A. 75-5294, 75-5296; implementing K.S.A. 75-5295, 75-5296; effective March 5, 1990; amended March 29, 2002.)

44-11-132. Use of grant funds to contract for services. (a) Grant funds may be used to contract for services or to provide services directly.

(b) All non-contract employees other than the program director shall be supervised by community corrections personnel.

(c) Each agency shall use a competitive bid process and shall obtain three written bids for the purchase and lease of, or contracting for, any of the following in the aggregate amount of \$1,000 or more:

- (1) Goods;
- (2) equipment; or
- (3) services.

(d) The community corrections agency shall make all contracts between the agency and other entities and individuals available to the secretary for review. (Authorized by K.S.A. 75-5294, 75-5296; implementing K.S.A. 75-5295, 75-5296; effective March 5, 1990; amended March 29, 2002.)

44-11-133. Use of grant funds to purchase jail space. Grant funds may be used to purchase jail space for purposes of operating a work release program. Grant funds shall not be used to purchase jail space as part of a sentence or to detain an offender pending revocation proceedings. Each community corrections program shall provide a copy of each contract between the program and any detention facility to the secretary at the time of execution. The contract shall specify the purposes for which the purchased jail space will be used and shall acknowledge the restrictions of use imposed by this regulation. (Authorized by K.S.A. 75-5294, 75-5296; implementing K.S.A. 75-5295; effective March 5, 1990; amended March 29, 2002.)

44-11-135. Use of grant funds for copyrights and patents; research projects. An item that is developed, designed, or otherwise created with community corrections funds and that is copyrighted, patented, or placed under similar restrictions shall be made available to state agencies and other community corrections programs. The holder of the copyright, patent, or other restriction may recover justified expenses but shall not profit from the sale of these items to state agencies and other community corrections programs.

(b) Research conducted by a community corrections agency or with use of community corrections resources, including staff, funds, and services, shall become part of the public domain. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 75-5294, 75-5296; effective March 5, 1990; amended March 29, 2002.)
