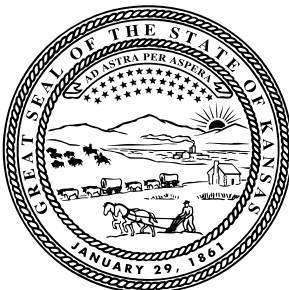

Notice of 2003 Medicaid/Medikan Copayments

The Kansas Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services administers the Kansas medical assistance program, commonly called Medicaid and Medikan. In the Medicaid and Medikan programs, the following copayments are currently in effect and will remain in effect during calendar year 2003: inpatient hospital, \$48 per admission; outpatient general hospital services, \$3 per nonemergency visit; ambulatory surgical center services, \$3; audiological services, \$3; community mental health center services, \$3; durable medical equipment, prosthetics and orthotics, \$3; home health services, \$3 or \$2 (depending on the service); nonemergency ambulance services, \$3; optometric or ophthalmologist services, \$2; outpatient general hospital surgery, \$3; prescribed drugs, \$3; physician or physician extender services, \$2; psychological services, \$3; dietician services, \$2; dental services, \$3; federally qualified health center services, \$3; and rural health clinic services, \$2.

Services exempt from copayments include: (1) services to residents in nursing facilities, including swing beds, intermediate care facilities for the mentally retarded, nursing facilities for mental health, and consumers participating in the home- and community-based services programs; (2) consumers who have reached the age of 18 but are not yet 22 years of age, who are age 65 or older, and who are inpatients in a state psychiatric facility; (3) consumers under age 18; (4) consumers enrolled in a Medicaid-funded health maintenance organization; (5) family planning purposes; (6) medical services relating to an injury incurred on the job during a community work experience project; (7) services related to pregnancy; and (8) emergency services.

This sworn statement shall be in the form of an affidavit executed and sworn to by the bidder before a person who is authorized by the laws of the state to administer oaths. The required form of affidavit will be provided by the state to each prospective bidder. Failure to submit the sworn statement as part of the bid approval package will make the bid nonresponsive and not eligible for award consideration.
